4.e. <u>AMENDMENT NO. A 101-03</u> – The City of Garden Grove, is requesting to amend the City of Garden Grove Municipal Code (Title 9), Section 9.08.050, subpart 44 (Second Units); Section 9.08.030, Table 1 (Land Use Matrix); and Section 9.16.060, Subsection D (Detached Accessory Structures). The amendment will bring the Municipal Code into compliance with the State Assembly Bill No. 1866, by eliminating the requirement for discretionary review for second unit proposals and authorizing ministerial approval.
