JOINT HEARING BETWEEN THE CITY COUNCIL AND THE GARDEN GROVE
PUBLIC FINANCING AUTHORITY REGARDING THE ISSUANCE OF WATER
REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2010, A, B, AND C, TO FINANCE THE ACQUISITION,
EXPANSION, CONSTRUCTION, AND IMPROVEMENT OF CERTAIN ADDITIONAL
WATER FACILITIES OF THE WATER SYSTEM OF THE CITY, AND TO FUND A
RESERVE FUND FOR THE BONDS (F: P-60.1) (XR: 60.1)

Staff report dated April 27, 2010, was introduced and reviewed by staff.

In July 2007, a Ten-Year Water Financial Plan (Plan), which included five years of incremental annual rate adjustments and the issuance of a \$32 million debt obligation used to fund the identified capital program, was adopted by the City Council. A Water Master Plan was completed in

September 2008, which included a detailed list of capital projects with costs and timelines for execution to be funded over the next ten years with the 2010 revenue bond proceeds, augmented with revenues. On December 8, 2009, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 8936-09 authorizing the issuance of the Water Revenue Bonds. The Water Revenue Bonds Series 2010 are to be issued in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$20 million. The Bonds may be issued in three series, designated Series 2010A, Tax-Exempt, in the estimated principal amount of \$10.8 million (Series A Bonds); Series 2010B, Federally Taxable Direct Pay Build America Bonds, in the estimated principal amount of \$3.5 million (Series B Bonds), and Series 2010C, Federally Taxable Direct Pay Build America/Recovery Zone Economic Development Bonds, in the estimated principal amount of \$3.2 million (Series C Bonds). Series B and C Bonds will only be issued if they present net interest cost savings to the City over a traditional tax-exempt series. The closing and sale of the Bonds is scheduled for May 5, 2010, but could change based upon the bond sales conditions that exist during the order period.

The finalized principal amount of the Bonds is estimated at \$17.5 million. The finance structure includes a debt service reserve fund with initial funding estimated at \$715,000. The net proceeds of the bond sale are estimated at about \$16.5 million in the projects fund and will be used to begin the rehabilitation, replacement, and improvement of the Garden Grove Water System. The true interest cost will be a 4 percent interest rate, and the overall annual debt service payment is approximately \$1.3 million over the life of the bond. It has been determined that water revenues are sufficient to pay the bonds, support water operations, cover wholesale water costs, and begin the capital improvement work.

In response to Authority/Council Member Broadwater's inquiry, staff responded that conditions surrounding Well No. 28 are not related to the City acquiring bonds for capital improvements.

In response to Authority/Council Member Nguyen's inquiries, staff clarified that the matter before the City Council this evening concerns the first installment of the bond, in the amount of approximately \$17.5 million, and that analysis show sufficient revenue to cover the cost of the bonds at this time.

MATTERS FROM THE MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS, AND CITY MANAGER

Council Member Nguyen requested staff look into the traffic at Dawson Street and Westminster Avenue; and she reminded residents to buy and do business in Garden Grove. In commemoration of April 30, 1975, she offered a prayer to all those who gave their lives in the Vietnamese War. She announced celebrations scheduled throughout Orange County, and thanked those who have fought and sacrificed for freedom and democracy.

Council Member Do explained his absence from the last City Council meeting. He was part of the County of Orange's Delegation to South Korea. One of the reasons for the trip was to foster a bond between the County and some of South Korea's bigger businesses. Should this trip result in bringing additional businesses to the county, it will provide a better economic future for the County and the City of Garden Grove. His recent Washington D.C. trip offered him an opportunity to lobby at the Federal level on behalf of the City.

Council Member Do shared his experience leaving Vietnam as a boy right before the Fall of Saigon. Looking back on April 30, 1975, he reminded Vietnamese-Americans and Americans alike to pay tribute and recognize the sacrifices made and continue to be made for our freedom and our way of life.

Mayor Dalton expressed his condolences to the Vietnamese community as they remember the tragic events leading up to April 30, 1975. And offered his prayer for the survivors and descendents of those who suffered, the American soldiers, Vietnamese soldiers, and civilians who gave up their lives on behalf of freedom.

Mayor Dalton offered his condolences to the Morabito Family, on the passing of Sylvia Morabito Mutz, a Garden Grove resident since 1957, and adjourned the meeting in her memory.
