### **OBJECTIVE**

For City Council to proclaim Sunday, March 7, 2010, as Arbor Day in the City of Garden Grove.

## BACKGROUND

The City of Garden Grove has a tradition to join various community volunteer groups in tree planting events on Arbor Day or during Arbor Week. The City's Public Works Department utilizes Arbor Day to educate and inform residents about the benefits of trees and to encourage tree planting and stewardship. For the past 16 years Garden Grove has earned the status of a "Tree City USA" from the National Arbor Day Foundation for its efficient tree management program. An Arbor Day observance and Proclamation are requirements that must be met to receive the annual "Tree City USA" recertification.

# **DISCUSSION**

This year, Arbor Day is being observed March 7 through March 14, 2010, at various locations in Garden Grove. On March 10, 2010, Brookhurst Elementary School will participate in an official tree-planting event along with Central Garden Grove Neighborhood Association, Living Springs Christian Fellowship, the Malabar Apartments and the Moose Lodge.
