Tonight, The City is looking for authorization for the:

PURCHASE OF "HOT RED" MOBILE RADIOS AND "the" APPROVAL OF THE AMENDMENT TO THE JOINT AGREEMENT FOR OPERATION, MAINTENANCE AND FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT OF THE ORANGE COUNTY 800 MEGAHERTZ COUNTYWIDE COORDINATED COMMUNICATION SYSTEM

In 2005, parties which included the City of Garden Grove, executed a document entitled Joint Agreement for Operation, Maintenance and Financial Management of the Orange County 800 Megahertz Countywide Coordinated Communication System, which provides for the management and governance of the 800 MHz Countywide Coordinated Communications System. This system is utilized countywide by Police, Fire, Public Works, and other public agencies.

The current 800 MHz Radio System, is becoming obsolete and unsustainable. In response, to ensure future continued operation, Orange County Communications is planning for an extension and upgrade to the countywide "backbone" of the 800MHz radio system. However, with this improvement many of the older radios, approximately 75%, will no longer function on the upgraded "backbone" requiring that all future radios be Project 25 (P25) compliant, which is the latest generation.

The proposed purchase of "Hot Red" radios and the proposed Amendment to the Agreement will allow the County to make necessary upgrades to the 800 MHz Radio System, which will improve performance and extend the working life of the system. Once these improvements are made to the system, it has an expected life span of ten to fifteen additional years of operation past the 2018-19 improvements.

Approval of the attached agreement will, also allow for participation in the countywide

finance option. The City's cost share responsibility will be based upon the number of subscriber radios used on the 800 MHz Radio System, as the City's proportionate share of the System Extension. If the City does not participate in the finance option, the City will have to pay its total cost share in five fiscal year payments beginning in fiscal year 2014-15 through fiscal year 2018-19.

If the City participates in the finance option the cost will be spread over the term of the finance period that has yet to be determined (10-15 years) for the total financed cost of approximately \$4,633,973.

It is recommended that the City Council:

- Approve the purchase of "Hot Red" radios in the 2015-16 budget, in the amount of \$634,468;

- Approve the First Amendment to the Joint Agreement for Operation, Maintenance and Financial Management of the Orange County 800 Megahertz Countywide Coordinated Communication System;
- Authorize the Mayor to sign and execute the Agreement, including making any modifications during the contract period on behalf of the City; and
- Authorize the City Manager to sign and execute all related agreements and documents with regards to the countywide pooled financing arrangement.

This concludes my report. Staff is available for questions.

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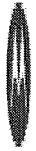

**AMENDMENT TO JOINT AGREEMENT
FOR THE OPERATION, MAINTENANCE AND FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT
OF THE ORANGE COUNTY 800 MEGAHERTZ
COUNTYWIDE COORDINATED COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM**

THIS AMENDMENT (“**Amendment**”) is entered into on _____, 2015 by and between the Parties listed on Exhibit A, attached hereto, which are sometimes individually referred to as “**Party**” or collectively referred to as the “**Parties**.”

RECITALS

A. On November 23, 2004, the Parties executed that certain document entitled *Joint Agreement for the Operation, Maintenance and Financial Management of the Orange County 800 Megahertz Countywide Coordinated Communications System* (“**Agreement**”), which provides for the management and governance of the 800 MHz Countywide Coordinated Communications System (“800 MHz CCCS”).

B. The 800 MHz CCCS requires significant enhancement in order to extend the life of the system.

C. Pursuant to Section 15.10 of the Agreement, the Governance Committee and the County have developed a long-range implementation plan to extend the CCCS, and have developed a scope of work, which includes all the activities, infrastructure and project schedule information for fiscal years 2014-19 described on Exhibit B, attached hereto (“**System Extension**”).

D. The Governance Committee and County have also developed the overall estimated cost of the System Extension, including each Party’s estimated funding share by fiscal year described on Exhibit C, attached hereto.

E. A Party’s funding plan for the System Extension may consist of one or more of the following: 1) a Party’s cash contribution, 2) a Party or a group of Parties financing all or a portion of the System Extension through the issuance of tax exempt bonds or other public financing mechanisms, and/or 3) a Party or group of Parties financing all or a portion of the System Extension through the County approved System Extension vendor.

F. The Parties desire to amend the Agreement to provide their commitment to the System Extension and describe their implementation and funding obligations.

G. This Amendment has been approved by the Governance Committee.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Implementation Obligations. The Parties hereby commit to fund and implement the System Extension as described on Exhibit B and Exhibit C.

a. California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"). The County shall be the lead agency for purposes of CEQA and shall obtain all necessary approvals for the System Extension.

b. Party Cost Share. The Parties intend to implement and fund the System Extension over several years beginning in fiscal year 2014-15 through fiscal year 2018-19. Each Party is responsible for its fair share contribution to the System Extension. The total estimated budget for the System Extension and each Party's fair share contribution is depicted on Exhibit C ("**Cost Share**"). A Party's Cost Share is determined by the number of subscriber radios used by the Party on the CCCS, as well as the Party's proportionate share of the System Extension dedicated to System Backbone. Each Party shall pay its total Cost Share in five fiscal year payments beginning in fiscal year 2014-15 through fiscal year 2018-19 in accordance with the procedures in Subsection (c) below. Each Party acknowledges that its Cost Share for the System Extension is an estimate and is expressed as a not to exceed amount. Each Party's Cost Share will be based on an actual quote by a third party vendor who will perform the System Extension under a contract or series of contracts approved and managed by the County ("**Contractor**"). A Party's actual Cost Share amount will be determined prior to the beginning of each fiscal year in which it is due and will be based on the Contractor's scope of work for the respective fiscal year. Therefore, the Cost Share depicted on Exhibit C may change, and may be periodically updated by the Parties to reflect any changed equipment or authorized System Extension modification expenses.

c. Invoicing & Payment. The County will calculate the actual Cost Share amount due the following fiscal year, and will invoice each Party by July 1. Each Party shall pay its respective Cost Share to the County within thirty (30) days of the start of the fiscal year. A Party is exempt from the payment procedures of this Subsection 1.c for the relevant fiscal year if it has:

- i. Executed a binding agreement with the County approved Contractor, agreeing to pay or finance its Cost Share through the Contractor directly, or
- ii. Executed a binding agreement with the County agreeing to jointly finance its Cost Share.

d. Cost Share Responsibility. Upon execution of this Amendment, each Party is responsible for its actual Cost Share regardless of the form and manner of payment described herein, such that the Party cannot terminate its Cost Share obligation for any reason. In the event of a withdrawal from the system in accordance with Section 20 of the Agreement or in the case of a default for failure to pay its Cost Share in accordance with this Amendment, each Party remains obligated to pay to County the Party's outstanding Cost Share as that obligation becomes due. Should any Party fail to pay its respective Cost Share when due, the County shall take action as is appropriate to obtain such payment. Nothing herein shall be construed as the County's exclusive remedy for the remediation of defaults by a Party or Parties,

and the County reserves the right to pursue any and all available rights and remedies at law or in equity.

e. County Trust Account. The County shall deposit all Cost Share contributions into a trust account that is managed solely for the purpose of the System Extension.

2. System Extension Administration. The Orange County Sheriff-Coroner Department/Communications & Technology Division shall administer all agreements for the System Extension, and regularly report such progress to the Governance Committee.

3. Participating Agencies. The Parties hereby update the list of Participating Agencies described on Exhibit D, attached hereto, which shall replace in its entirety Exhibit C of the Agreement. Participating Agencies will continue to contribute to overall backbone costs through the payment of a separate and established entry fee for every radio added to the system.

4. Capitalized Terms. Any capitalized terms not defined herein shall have the meanings set forth in the Agreement.

5. Counterparts. This Amendment may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

6. Full Force. Except as expressly set forth herein, the Agreement shall remain unmodified and in full force and effect.





GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF SYSTEM EXTENSION AND PROJECT SCHEDULE

1.0 Overview

The System Extension plan will focus on extending the life of the existing CCCS radio system by systematically replacing end-of-life equipment in strategic phases culminating in an upgrade to P25 compliance with the goal of continuing to provide quality radio communications to the law, fire, lifeguard and public works agencies in Orange County.

2.0 Description of System Extension

- 2.1 *System Backbone* – Radio infrastructure equipment that is at or near the end of its expected life will be directly replaced with the current version of the same equipment that will maintain all existing features and functionalities and is able to work with the existing backhaul network. Specifically, this will involve the replacement of 565+ existing Quantar radio base stations and ancillary equipment at 25 radio sites with 800 MHz 3600 baud GTR8000 base stations and ancillary equipment. This will be accomplished in accordance with the following schedule:

System Backbone schedule:

Northwest Cell = 24 Quantars replaced in 2015
Southwest Cell = 40 Quantars replaced in 2015
Laguna Cell = 33 Quantars replaced in 2016
Moorhead IR Site = 8 Quantars replaced in 2016
North Cell = 105 Quantars replaced in 2016
South Cell = 135 Quantars replaced in 2017
Crystal Cove IR Site = 4 Quantars replaced in 2017
Countywide Cell = 210 Quantars replaced in 2017
Carbon Canyon IR Site = 3 Quantars replaced in 2017
Silverado IR Site = 3 Quantars replaced in 2017

- 2.2 *Law Enforcement Dispatch Consoles* – Police Dispatch Gold Elite consoles will be out-of-service by the vendor in 2018 and will need to be replaced prior to 2018 to maintain the existing console priority feature once the system is upgraded to P25. Console priority is a feature unique to law enforcement dispatch and allows dispatch to have the ability to transmit and receive audio simultaneously and is an officer safety necessity. Existing Gold Elite Console equipment will be replaced with its successor console, the MCC7500. Due to the complexity of the replacement at each law dispatch center, only 6 dispatch centers can be upgraded each year. A schedule has been developed to address the 20 law dispatch centers on the system, as shown below.

Console schedule:

FY14/15 - Loma Ridge, Irvine, Laguna Beach, Huntington Beach

FY15/16 - Anaheim, Brea, West Comm, Santa Ana, Tustin

FY16/17 - Orange, Fullerton, Costa Mesa, Garden Grove, Westminster

FY17/18 - Placentia, La Palma, Newport Beach, Fountain Valley,
Buena Park, La Habra

- 2.3 *System Field Equipment* – When the System Backbone is upgraded to the P25 standard in FY 2018/2019, all subscriber radio equipment will also need to be P25 capable. Subscriber radios that are capable of being upgraded will need to receive the software/firmware upgrade prior to the backbone upgrade. Older subscriber radio equipment that is not capable of being upgraded to the P25 standard will need to be replaced prior to the P25 upgrade. Each agency will be responsible for the purchase of either replacement radios, or the necessary subscriber upgrade package for upgradable radios.
- 2.4 *P25 Upgrade* – When all backbone sites and law dispatch consoles have completed their equipment replacement, the vendor will initiate the necessary equipment and software update to bring the system up to the 7.18 software platform for P25 compliance. This final phase of the System Extension plan is scheduled for FY 2018/2019.

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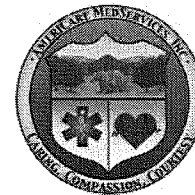

AmeriCare MedServices, Inc. (“AmeriCare”) a privately family-owned and operated Orange County-based California Corporation which is qualified and licensed to provide emergency ambulance service throughout Orange County and that has been serving Orange County since its corporate organizational formation in 1996.

We are writing to you today at the direction of Dr. Samuel Stratton, Medical Director, Orange County EMS (“OCEMS”) a division of the Orange County Health Care Agency. As you may know, the Orange County Board of Supervisors has designated OCEMS to serve as its designated Local Emergency Medical Services Agency (“LEMSA”) pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 1797.200. In its 2014 EMS Plan, which has been submitted to and approved by the California EMS Authority pursuant to California Health and Safety Code sections 1797.250 and 1797.105, OCEMS has determined that its designated Ambulance Response Zone OA 8 – Garden Grove is a non-exclusive operating zone pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 1797.224.

Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 1797.94, on February 25, 2015 we submitted a written request to OCEMS wherein we sought to be placed on rotation within OCEMS designated non-exclusive Ambulance Response Zone OA 8 – Garden Grove. On March 18, 2015 we received a written reply wherein Dr. Stratton directed us to contact the City Manager for the incorporated city within the zone. Therefore, we are requesting that the City arrange for AmeriCare to be placed into rotation for all 9-1-1 prehospital emergency medical services requests for emergency ambulance service within Zone OA 8 – Garden Grove in a manner that results in AmeriCare receiving an equal proportionate share of all such 9-1-1 prehospital emergency service requests within the zone.

We are making this request as we have reason to believe that as a non-exclusive Ambulance Response Zone, whichever entity (the County or the City) has the responsibility and authority related to the oversight, regulation and administration of prehospital emergency medical services and/or emergency ambulance operations within Ambulance Response Zone OA 8 – Garden Grove, also bears the liability of anti-trust claims as restrictions of trade within this Zone would not be provided with state action immunity under federal antitrust laws for such actions taken which run afoul of such federal antitrust laws.

If on the other hand, the City maintains the position that it does not has the responsibility and authority related to the oversight, regulation and administration of prehospital emergency medical services and/or emergency ambulance operations within Ambulance Response Zone OA 8 – Garden Grove, upon such timely written confirmation of such a position in response to this written communication, AmeriCare will redirect its communications to the County in an effort to seek relief for our desire to enjoy the fruits of a free and competitive market for the industry in which we are engaged in.

We note that the City entered into an Ambulance Contract City Agreement with the County on 09/24/1986. Based on this, we believe the matter of administration, and regulation of private ambulance services providing emergency ambulance service within the City has long been delegated by the City to the County pursuant to the above referenced agreement. Please let us know the City believes otherwise.

This letter is in reply to your letter sent via email on February 25, 2015.

The February 25 letter was in reply to a letter I had sent that same day in which it was understood from previous electronic communications that without financial relief from the Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA) or the County of Orange, AmeriCare would not be providing services after March 2, 2015, for the Villa Park Exclusive Operating Area (EOA) # 24. With this understanding in mind, it was the responsibility of the Orange County Emergency Medical Services Agency to arrange for 9-1-1 emergency ambulance coverage for the operating area.

While a number of other issues were raised in the February 25 AmeriCare letter, please be mindful that there was a need to assure that EOA # 24 had 9-1-1 emergency ambulance coverage after March 2 and there was no intent to interfere with AmeriCare-OCFA negotiations or to exert legal authorities.

With respect to the AmeriCare February 25 letter request to provide service in the twelve cities listed that administer their own 9-1-1 emergency ambulance contracts, please contact the City Manager of those cities for further information. At present, each of the cities asserts that they retain statutory administrative rights for prehospital emergency medical services.

The Orange County EMS Agency very much appreciates the dedication and support of AmeriCare with continuing services to the Orange County community. Please feel free to contact me for questions or comments you may have.

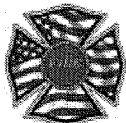

Yesterday afternoon I attended the County's Public Financing Advisory Committee meeting. At the meeting the committee heard a request from the County Executive Office for the financing for the 800 MHz CCCS upgrade and selection of KNN Public Finance as financial advisor and Citigroup Global Markets as underwriter for the proposed financing. The presentation was given by Suzanne Luster who did an outstanding job explaining the project and reason for the request. Frank Kim (County Financial Officer) and I answered specific questions from the committee. It seemed to go well, although the committee did have concerns with the County financing their subscriber equipment (due to the shorter life expectancy of that equipment). The committee approved the request in concept, and CEO Public Finance will continue working on the overall plan. The item will likely be brought to the Board of Supervisors in May. As an FYI, at this time we have 10 cities that have expressed an interest in joining the county with financing the backbone portion of the project (Anaheim, Buena Park, Fullerton, Garden Grove, La Habra, Laguna Niguel, Orange, Placentia, Santa Ana, Yorba Linda).

There are concerns regarding student safety around Garden Grove High School (GGHS). The purpose of this memo is to provide an update of the current status.

To date, staff has met twice in an all hands meeting with the School District, School Administrators, and parents representing the Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA).

The first meeting was on 3/24/15, City Staff listened to the concerns as they were expressed from members of the PTSA and Administration on site.

Primary issues raised by the school site were:

- Crosswalk locations,
- Use of crossing guards,
- Possibility of an additional stop sign at Seventh and Stanford.

Other points brought up by the City Staff included:

- Student/parent education through the school's website,
- Possible use of a traffic plan posted on the website,
- Median fence to prevent mid-street jay walking.

Both sides agreed to go back and research these issues further:

- The school was going to check with their risk management on the use of volunteer crossing guards. (Administrators/Teachers/parents/volunteer and students)
- The City's traffic engineering would conduct a traffic count, and research a potential stop sign at Seventh and Stanford, and the best location of a crosswalk at the west end of Stanford.

The second meeting was on 4/23/15. At this meeting, staff provided background information regarding the current City contract with All City Management Services (ACMS) for crossing guards. The City conducted an evaluation including GGPD, the School District and ACMS in June of 2013 and agreed on the use of crossing guards at 18 locations within the City. These locations are all elementary schools with the exception one intermediate school and the crossing guards are primarily used on arterial streets. The City's cost is approximately \$197,000 for this contract per year.

Another factor discussed at this meeting that is impacting the use of Stanford is the school's modernization process. This is a three year construction project and the School is about 18 months into it. The modernization project has dislocated the student parking area to make room for modular classrooms. This has forced additional driving students on to Stanford and into neighboring parking lots.

As follow up items from the previous meeting, the School's Administration consulted with their Risk Management and found that administrators and teachers were not allowed to be used as crossing guards. They were also not comfortable with students being used. They did say they had volunteers and parents participating at other sites, however the Administration did not feel it was a viable option for GGHS.

From the City side, Traffic Engineering conducted the traffic study for the stop sign at Seventh and Stanford. That study did not meet warrants; therefore, Traffic Engineering is not recommending any modifications. They also looked at the current crosswalk location versus a new location for the west crosswalk. Traffic Engineering found the current crosswalk location was the most appropriate location. As a solution, Traffic Engineering is recommending the use of a median fence to prevent the random crossings of pedestrians and to encourage the use of the current crosswalks. The goal is to get the fence up as soon as possible and get feedback this school year on its effectiveness.

Another suggestion the City presented to the Administration was for the School District to enter into an agreement with the First Baptist Church of Garden Grove, located just west of the school on Euclid, for use as a drop off and pick up location for students. This could keep the additional traffic off Stanford and the students would be utilizing a controlled crosswalk to enter the north side of Stanford, then into the school. If this agreement can be secured, the School would then publicize the plan on its website to reach out to parents and students.

The School was in favor of installing the fence as soon as possible and they were going to reach out to the church to attempt to secure an agreement for use of the parking lot. The use agreement was identified as being a longer process and the school administration did not want to wait on the installation of the median fencing trail.

Presently, Traffic Engineering will be requesting the installation of a temporary fence in the median and reviewing its effectiveness through the end of this school year. Staff plans to meet just prior to the end of the school year to discuss the results with the all hands group.

As follow up items from the previous meeting, the School's Administration consulted with their Risk Management and found that administrators and teachers were not allowed to be used as crossing guards. They were also not comfortable with students being used. They did say they had volunteers and parents participating at other sites, however the Administration did not feel it was a viable option for GGHS.

From the City side, Traffic Engineering conducted the traffic study for the stop sign at Seventh and Stanford. That study did not meet warrants; therefore, Traffic Engineering is not recommending any modifications. They also looked at the current crosswalk location verses a new location for the west crosswalk. Traffic Engineering found the current crosswalk location was the most appropriate location. As a solution, Traffic Engineering is recommending the use of a median fence to prevent the random crossings of pedestrians and to encourage the use of the current crosswalks. The goal is to get the fence up as soon as possible and get feedback this school year on its effectiveness.

Another suggestion the City presented to the Administration was for the School District to enter into an agreement with the First Baptist Church of Garden Grove, located just west of the school on Euclid, for use as a drop off and pick up location for students. This could keep the additional traffic off Stanford and the students would be utilizing a controlled crosswalk to enter the north side of Stanford, then into the school. If this agreement can be secured, the School would then publicize the plan on its website to reach out to parents and students.

The School was in favor of installing the fence as soon as possible and they were going to reach out to the church to attempt to secure an agreement for use of the parking lot. The use agreement was identified as being a longer process and the school administration did not want to wait on the installation of the median fencing trail.

Presently, Traffic Engineering will be requesting the installation of a temporary fence in the median and reviewing its effectiveness through the end of this school year. Staff plans to meet just prior to the end of the school year to discuss the results with the all hands group.
