**** GE2 ****

FIRE - Structure Fire

Responded as part of a structure assignment to a reported structure fire at the Malabar Apartments. Upon arrival, found heavy fire showing from a second floor, end unit. GE2 went into an offensive attack mode, initiated a primary search & requested a second alarm.

As the need for early scene management became apparent, I established Malabar Command while GE2's medics prepared to make entry with a preconnect. GGPD was requested for crowd & traffic control. GE1 was assigned as Fire Attack, GT1 was Ventilation Group, GE6 was assigned to Exposure Group and GE7 was assigned to perform a 360 size up. GB1 arrived on scene, assumed command and assigned AE26 as RIC, GE3 as Salvage & established a Rehab area. AB2 became Fire Attack

The fire was knocked down & a primary "all-clear" was announced. The fire was contained to the unit of origin, with adjacent units sustaining smoke & water damage.

The Red Cross was requested for approximately 18 displaced residents. Investigator Erickson was requested for cause & origin determination.

The fire appeared to have started in the kitchen, on the stovetop. The occupant stated that he was heating a pot of oil to cook chicken wings, but then had to leave to go to the store. He believed he turned the burner off. His brother was sleeping in a bedroom, awoke to the smoke detector sounding

and exited the apartment uninjured. Upon closer inspection of the stovetop, the control for one of the burners was found to be in a different position than the others, indicating that it was most likely in the "on" position at the time of ignition. The cause appears to be cooking related, with the pot of oil igniting & spreading to the rest of the kitchen & dining area of the apartment. See Investigator Erickson's report for the details of his investigation.

I made contact with the apartment manager, Laura Carrillo, & advised her to contact a board-up company to secure the involved unit & a plumber to cap broken water lines in the kitchen.

After the investigation was complete, the unit was overhauled and checked for hidden fire both visually & with the thermal imaging camera. A property release form was explained to the apartment manager and understood then signed. Occupants were advised of the dangers present inside the apartment and allowed to retrieve necessary personal items.

The scene was released back to the apartment manager.
