SPECIFICATIONS FOR WORK: COMPLETE TRIM, THIN, SHAPE, BALANCE, Item H, currently states: "The Contractor shall use lopper type trimming tools when requested. Standard chain saw type cutting tool will be acceptable." shall be revised as follows:" The contractor shall use chain saws, or when requested, lopper type trimming tools and hand saws. When requested and trimming Canary Island Date Palms, the contract might be asked to use hand saws and disinfect tools before trimming each palm to prevent the spread of lethal fungal disease.
- 3. The contractor is hereby notified that Addendum No. 1 must be acknowledged and submitted as part of the proposal. Failure to do so could result in the City designating said proposal as "Non Responsive". All the terms and conditions of the PROPOSAL shall remain the same.

 - 2. What is the estimated annual budget for this contract? **This information** is not available at this time.
 - 3. What is the estimated start date for this contract? July 1, 2016
 - 4. Are there any full-time tree workers on the city's staff? Yes
 - If yes, what are their responsibilities? *Please* see the City's website for this information.
 - 5. How many trees, currently, are in the city? **Approximately 20,000**
 - 6. Does the City perform general pruning on a grid? Yes
 - Can we be provided with a grid map indicating the last grid that was completed and the next grid due to be pruned. Yes, please see the attached grid map. Grid #17 was last trimmed and the next trim is grid #06.
 - For the Grid that was most recently completed; is the City satisfied with the pruning pattern that was used? **Yes**
 - 7. How many years is your general pruning cycle? **2-6**

- Are there any specific species, or areas that are pruned more frequently? If so, please elaborate in detail. Yes. This information is not available at this time.
- 8. Do you trim trees throughout the year or in specific seasons? If so, please elaborate. *Throughout the year*.
- 9. Are Parks included as part of this Contract? Yes
- If so, are we allowed to drive areal lifts on the turf? Yes
- What is the pruning cycle? By districts or on an as-needed basis
- 10. Are there any City owned facilities or properties that are not included as part of this contract? **No**
- 11. What is the current inventory you are using? City pick file.
- 12. When was the inventory last updated? *The system is updated as the work is completed.*
- 13. Can the City please provide a detailed inventory list which breaks out the quantities of all species, by DBH, and grid. If this can be provided in Excel format that would be best. **This information is not available**,
- 14. Is equipment staging allowed in the City? Yes, contractor is to adhere to all parking requirements of the City of Garden Grove including street sweeping days.
- 15. Please confirm that the Prevailing Wage Rate is Determination: SC-102-X-20-2015-1
- Can we please be provided with a copy of the Wage Rate for the above mentioned determination? This information is available from the Department of Industrial Relations.
- 16. For the tree planting cost, is the cost of the physical tree included? No
- 17. Is the contractor required to warrantee newly planted trees for any period of time? **Yes, 30 days.**
- What are the watering requirements for newly planted trees? Weekly
- Will the Contractor be compensated for watering? No
- Hypothetical Confirmation: if the warrantee period is 90 days and we do a
 warrantee replacement at 45 days, please confirm that the residual warrantee
 period is the remaining 45 days. Not applicable
- 18. How many trees and what size do you plan on planting over the next (3) years? **This information is not available.**
- 19. What are some instances where you would use crew rental instead of unit price? *Emergencies, Urgent Requests or as needed by the City.*
- Is mobilization included in crew rental hours? No

- 20. Please amend the GIS inventory timeline from 6 months to in advance of upcoming grids/districts. *RFP states that the inventory must be completed and operational within 6 months.*
- 21. License requirements should include C61/D49 (Tree Trimmer / Arborist). **No**
- 22. The specifications state: "Once a proposal has been found to be technically qualified, the CITY will make an award on the basis of the lowest priced technically qualified proposal." (Pg. 7_Item 9)
- Does this mean that if there are multiple bidders that our found to be "technically qualified" the City will award the contract strictly based on lowest price? The contract will be awarded based on the evaluation criteria found on Page 6 of the RFP document and availability of funds in the budget.
- 23. The specifications state that the City has the right to: "Award a contract to one or more Proposers." (Pg. 8_Item 12.11)
- How will the City split the contract up in a way that does not negatively affect the bidder's overall/comprehensive pricing? **The City's intent is to award one contract for these services.**
- 24. Did the previous Contractor assist in the development of this RFP Document? **No**
- 25. The sample contract states that Contractor: "Understands the facilities, difficulties, and restrictions of the work under this agreement." (Pg. 8_Item 12)
- Can you please expand on this detailing any specific items that would not be common knowledge to those other than the existing contractor? **This is standard language that requires the Contractor to perform their due diligence.**
- 26. The specifications state: "Contractor shall, if necessary, make all arrangements necessary to have all power lines or utility lines temporarily disconnected for the safe trimming of the tree." (Pg. 24_Item IV.E)
- Shouldn't high voltage trimming be deferred to SoCal Edison? *Contractor* will be responsible to make these arrangements.
- 27. Specs required that: "All trees on which vines are growing shall have said vines removed." This could potentially be very time intensive; would this be an instance for the use of crew rental? (Pg. 24_Item V.D) **No**
- 28. Specs require that: "All loose fronds sheaths shall be removed from the entire length of the palm." (Pg. 27_Item VII.B)
- Inspecting a 50ft+ palm for loose frond sheaths will be an incredibly time intensive task. Can "the entire length" be replaced with "the top three feet."? Anything beyond that should be charged under the Palm Skinning line-item. **No**
- 29. Specs state that: "Work in trees shall be suspended during the periods of inclement weather." (Pg. 27 Item VIII.C)

- Will Crews be required to remain on stand-by during inclement weather?
 No
- If so, how will they be compensated for their time? Not applicable
- 30. Specs require that: "Flagmen shall be stationed as reasonably necessary." (Pg. 28_Item VIII.F)
- How will this added support personnel be compensated? It will not be.
- 31. Specs reference "Attached BMP R-6 Disposal of Green Wastes," however no attachment can be found. Can the City please provide (Pg. 28_Item VIII.G) Please see the attached document.
- 32. Specs state: "The Contractor shall reimburse the City for the actual cost of overtime inspection." (Pg. 29_Item VIII.O)
- How can the contract be responsible, or dictate, how the City chooses to issue overtime to its staff? *If Contractor chooses to work overtime to complete the work, the City needs to inspect the work.*
- 33. Specs state: "The Contractor shall be required to remove and dispose of any fallen or hanging limbs or palm fronds for a period of thirty (30) calendar days after the completion of tree pruning in a project area." (Pg. 30_Item VIII.Q)
- This requirement seems to be in place to ensure that contractors are diligent with their post trimming clean-up; how would the City handle this requirement after a wind-storm or heavy rain that is in excess of responsible clean-up? The Contractor shall be responsible for thirty (30) calendar days after completion of tree pruning project in the project areas.
- 34. Specs state: "The Contractor, at their own expense, shall be responsible for contacting a licensed pest control applicator to eradicate beehives when they are located in a city tree." (Pg. 30_Item IX.A)
- Typically this would be the Cities responsibility; not the contractors. Can the Proposal Pricing Sheet include an hourly line item for Licensed Pest Control Applicator? That will probably also come in handy for the Sycamore Trees. **No**
- 35. The Proposal Pricing Sheet has Service Request Line Items for Palms (Items 8-10). When trimming palms in as part of a grid, which line item is the contractor to use? *Grid trim*
- 36. The Proposal Pricing Sheet has Root Pruning (Item 18) and Root Shaving (Item 23); please explain the difference? *Consider them both root pruning.* Root pruning is by the foot and root shaving is by the hour.
- 37. Proposal Pricing Sheet: Please explain how Service Request Pruning (Item 24) unique from Service Request Pruning (Items 2-10). *Item 24 is hourly.*
- 38. Will the City consider including a daily cost for the watering of juvenile trees that are not under warrantee? **No**
- 39. How will you determine the Lowest Overall Cost since there are no quantities on the proposal pricing page? *This will be based on the rates provided on the Proposal Pricing page.*

- \bullet $\,$ Would the City consider included estimated quantities into the pricing page to ensure apples to apples comparison? No
- 3. The contractor is hereby notified that Addenda No. 1 and 2 must be acknowledged and submitted as part of the proposal. Failure to do so could result in the City designating said proposal as "Non Responsive". All the terms and conditions of the PROPOSAL shall remain the same.

During the term of the contract, City shall have full and complete access to inventory system

Upon termination of the contract, the GIS tree inventory system and all information collected, shall become property of the City.





Benefits of a Grid Tree Pruning Program

We can assist the Agency with updating or establishing grids for a long term pruning program. Maintenance should be performed throughout the entire fiscal year on a consistent basis.

Regardless of the amount of an Agency's tree management budget, systematic tree maintenance reduces costs in the long term.



Improved Public Relations

Citizens can be informed in advance when their trees are scheduled for service. This is a pro-active approach to manage the Agency's urban forest.

Equal Service

Every citizen receives service whether requested or not.

Maintenance is not dependent on a formal request or individual. This helps reduce the need for "emergency" or "service request" pruning, and can prevent liability problems (such as dead or weak branches).

Preventive Maintenance- All Agency trees receive routine maintenance; problems are corrected before they reach crisis levels.

Improved Health- Grid/area pruning improves the health of the tree population through routinely pruning weakened or pest infested branches and developing sound and vigorously growing crowns.

Maintain a Capital Asset- The urban forest is one of the most valuable and overlooked capital assets. By investing in the systematic maintenance concept the Agency is maintaining its overall and real financial value to the community.

Reduced Liability- Due to the efficiency of grid trimming, all trees are serviced in a timely manner reducing liability exposure.

Efficient Record Keeping- The Foreman is able to update tree characteristic information on trees that our crew maintains over the trim cycle period. Records are maintained for current status and returned to the Agency for their files.

Clearance Pruning

Clearance pruning consists of removing branches to provide clearance from the top of the curb and sidewalk when practical, or as specified by the Agency. This operation also involves clearing limbs or branches away from wires, lights, building, and/or traffic signal devices. We will remove all trunk sprouts and suckers and clear limbs to provide for pedestrian travel above Agency-owned walkways.

Line Clearance

Trees that interfere or have the possibility of interfering with utility lines will be trimmed in a manner to achieve the required clearances as specified and in accordance with the California Public Utilities Commission. It is our goal to protect the current health and

condition of the tree and to maintain its symmetry and direct growth away from the utility lines.

Small Tree Care

Proper pruning and care during the early stages of the tree's life will save money in the future, and create a safer, more beautiful, healthy, easy-to-maintain tree. We believe that tree care that is performed early will affect its shape, strength and life span. Our specialized small tree care team consists of certified personnel trained to perform the following:

- Selective structural pruning
- Removal of dead, interfering, split and/or broken limbs
- Pre-conditioning the water retention basin built around the tree
- Staking or re-staking
- Adjusting tree ties
- Adjusting trunk protectors
- · Weed abatement
- Tree watering

Each tree is inspected to determine specific needs and maintenance activities are then performed accordingly.

Palm Trunk Skinning

Palm tree skinning consists of the removal of dead frond bases (only), at the point they make contact with the trunk without damage to the live trunk tissue.

Tree Removal Operations

With a minimum of 48 hours advanced notice, WCA will inform Underground Service Alert (USA) of the location of work for the purpose of identifying any and all utility lines. The removal process consists of lowering limbs delicately onto the ground to prevent any hardscape damage. Immediately following the removal, the stump will be ground down.

Root Pruning

We strongly recommend against any root pruning, however, should you want to proceed, we recommend that it be done no closer than 3 times the diameter of the trunk. Roots will be pruned to a depth of approximately 12 inches by cleanly slicing through the roots, so as not to tear or vibrate the root causing damage to the tree. The excavated area will be backfilled with native soil and debris will be hauled away.

Tree Planting


We can replace trees that have been removed and plant new trees in accordance with specifications. We are prepared financially and logistically to acquire and purchase selected tree species for tree planting. At a minimum of 48 hours in advance we will inform Underground Service Alert (USA) of the location of work for the purpose of identifying any and all utility lines. A well-trained planting team will perform the soil preparation and installation of the tree.

Tree Watering

Tree watering will be performed by a full-time, WCA team member on various routes, when requested by the Agency. This team will also be responsible for reporting special care needs to the small tree care team. This could include reporting weeds, soil that has settled, and/or staking and tying needs.

Emergency Response

We are prepared for emergency calls 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, including holidays. The toll free number is 866-LIMB-DOWN (866-546-2369). This number will be provided to the Agency, Police Department and/or Fire Department. Our emergency response team will do what is necessary to render the hazardous tree or tree-related condition safe until the following workday.

Shot Hole Borer

The Polyphagous Shot Hole Borer (PSHB) is a new pest in Southern California. This boring beetle drills into trees and brings with it a pathogenic fungus (*Fusarium euwallacea*), as well as other fungal species. When heavily infested, the resulting Fusarium causes the decline and death of trees. Over 120 different tree species are affected in Southern California and over 30 reproductive hosts are of high concern. As tree care professionals, we have a responsibility to understand and report when we see a tree we are working on infested with PSHB.

New invasive beetle/disease complex on California avocado and landscape trees: Polyphagous Shot Hole Borer (Euwallacea sp.) and Fusarium dieback (Fusarium euwallaceae)

Status: Recently a new beetle/fungal complex was detected on avocado and other host plants in Los Angeles, Orange and San Bernardino Counties. The two fungal species are Fusarium euwallaceae and Graphium sp., which form a symbiotic relationship with a recently discovered beetle that is commonly known as the polyphagous shot hole borer (PSHB, Euwallacea sp.) (Fig. A). Together, they cause the disease Fusarium dieback (FD). When the beetle burrows into the tree, it inoculates the host plant with the fungus (Fig. D), which is carried in its mouthparts in a structure called mycangia. The fungus attacks the vascular tissue of the tree, blocking the transport of water and nutrients from the roots to the rest of the tree, and eventually causing branch dieback. The beetle larvae live in galleries within the tree and feed on the fungus. FD has been observed on more than 110 different plant species in California, including many species common in urban landscapes and on such agriculturally important species as avocado, olive and persimmon.

Symptoms: Each host species shows different symptoms depending on the response to infection. Sycamore, box elder, maple, red willow, and castor bean are good trees to search for signs and symptoms of the beetle, as it tends to prefer to infest these hosts first. Depending on the tree species attacked, PSHB injury can be identified either by staining, gumming, or a white-sugar exudate on the outer bark in association with a single beetle entry hole.

The beetle: An exotic ambrosia beetle (Euwallacea sp.) is very small and hard to see. At the advanced stage of infestation, there are often many entry/exit holes on the tree (Fig. E-F). Females are black and about 1.8 – 2.5 mm (0.07-0.1 inch) long (Fig. A-B (right)); males are brown colored and about 1.5 mm (0.05 inch) long (Fig. B ((left)). The entry/exit hole is about 0.85 mm (0.033 inch).


Known Hosts: The following is a selective list from over 110 hosts: Box elder (Acer negundo), castor bean (Ricinus communis), avocado (Persea americana), coast live oak (Quercus agrifolia), English oak (Q. robur), valley oak (Q. lobata), California sycamore (Platanus racemosa), big leaf maple (Acer macrophyllum), Japanese maple (A. palmatum), red willow (Salix laevigata), goldenrain (Koelreuteria paniculata), olive (Olea europaea), persimmon (Diospyros sp.), silk tree (Albizia julibrissin), American sweet gum (Liquidambar styraciflua), coral tree (Erythrina corallodendon), weeping willow (Salix babylonica), blue palo verde (Parkinsonia florida), palo verde (Parkinsonia floridium), tortuosa (Salix matsudana), white alder (Alnus rhombifolia).

What to do:

- -Look for a single entry/exit hole surrounded by wet discoloration of the outer bark -Scrape off the bark layer around the infected area to look for brown discolored necrosis caused by the fungus.
- -Follow the gallery to look for the beetle (may or may not be present).
- -Avoid movement of infested firewood and chipping material out of infested area.
- -Look for other hosts (Castor bean, sycamore, maple, coast live oak, goldenrain, liquidambar) showing symptoms of the beetle/disease.
- -Sterilize tools to prevent to spread of the disease with either 25% household bleach, Lysol* cleaning solution, or 70% ethyl alcohol.





JUAN MARQUEZ, SUPERVISOR

As Site Supervisor, Mr. Marquez is a full-time employee and speaks fluent English. 



Scheduling of Work

The Area Manager is responsible for scheduling work which shall conform to the Agency's schedule of performance. We recommend equal distribution of work throughout the course of the fiscal year. Notifications will be provided to residents prior to the start of pruning operations in said area. All work will be performed in a cooperative manner as to cause the least amount of interference or inconvenience.

Public Notification

Upon Agency staff approval, WCA will post a door hanger notice prior to commencement of grid pruning (within 24-48 hours). After tree plantings, door hangers will be provided to residents instructing them on the proper care for their newly planted tree. For more comprehensive outreach we can also submit a press release for special projects or routine maintenance. The Agency may modify the procedures and materials to which we notify residents.

Communication Systems

Dur use of modern and reliable communication systems affect our daily job performance by increasing our efficiency. Management and Field Personnel utilize tablets as both navigational and communication devices in the field. Tablets have proven to be a convenient method to input data as related to tree inventories, daily work records, timesheets, photos, and billing information; eliminating the need to handwrite data and improving customer service by minimizing response time.




Right-of-Way

ArborAccess

ArborAccess is an Internet driven program that was developed by tree care professionals at West Coast Arborists, Inc. and was based on the tree maintenance needs of our customers. This user-friendly program allows customers to store, retrieve, update, delete and add tree records and work histories. The information contained in ArborAccess is live data that can also be linked directly to a GIS program, such as ArcView, for geo-coding purposes and can assist your Agency in meeting GASB34 requirements. ArborAccess provides an unlimited resource of information regarding your urban forest.

Software Training

Our IT Department is based out of our corporate office in Anaheim, CA. Local satellite offices are located throughout the state of California in: Stockton, San Jose, Fresno, Ventura, Riverside, San Diego, including Las Vegas, NV and Phoenix, AZ. Each office has the ability to provide software training to our customers. We are also available to provide training sessions onsite at the customer's discretion. On-site training is proven to be effective as it provides a guided hands-on experience.

We offer periodic tree maintenance and management workshops each year. These free workshops are provided to our customers regionally and educate over 500 people annually. They have proven to be a great round-table and networking opportunity for

the different agencies in attendance. Presentations are provided by WCA management staff and complimented with guest speakers in the industry. The advanced technology provides a valuable tool to urban forestry professionals by displaying specific tree site information along with a representative photograph of the species type and a recommended maintenance field. ArborAccess' built-in quality control features assist in data accuracy. As maintenance is performed, the work history is updated and accompanied with biweekly invoices. This process eliminates the need for dual-inputting and helps keep the tree inventory current and accurate.




