Dear Mayor Nguyen:

As you know, Governor Brown released his 2016-2017 budget proposal on January 7th. The \$170.5 billion budget includes \$124 billion in General Fund and \$45 billion in Special Fund expenditures. The Governor's proposal begins the budget process for the 2016-17 fiscal year budget debate. In the next few months, the Legislature will hold hearings on the Governor's proposal and then make suggested changes. The final budget is required to be passed by midnight on June 15th. I wanted to share a few of the highlights that will affect local governments and would appreciate any feedback on the various proposals.

Redevelopment: As you know, in 2011, the state eliminated approximately 400 Redevelopment Agencies (RDAs) and replaced them with locally organized successor agencies that are tasked with retiring the former RDAs' outstanding debts and other legal obligations. The Administration is not proposing any additional legislative changes to the redevelopment law because they are currently in the process of implementing SB 107, which passed as part of last year's budget.

<u>Transportation:</u> The budget includes \$3.6 billion annually for transportation, of which \$3 billion would be generated by increased gas and diesel taxes and a road user fee (\$65 annually per car), while continuing to diverting existing transportation revenues to fund the General Fund's debt service obligation. This proposal is a continuation of the Governor's proposal from last year and is the subject of the First Extraordinary Special Session. The proposed tax increase would require a 2/3rds vote of the Legislature.

Cap and Trade Allocations: The budget proposes to allocate \$3.1 billion from Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds, which includes the balance of auction proceeds that were not allocated in FY 2015-16. 60% of the annual proceeds do not require a vote of the Legislature because they are continuously appropriated to High-Speed Rail Projects (\$500 million), Low Carbon Transit Operations, Transit and Intercity Rail projects (\$200 million) and Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities programs (\$400 million). Under existing law, 40% of the money is appropriated in the budget process. In 2015-16, the Legislature failed to appropriate that year's uncommitted Cap and Trade

Allocations. As such, the Legislature will have double the money to appropriate as part of the 2016-17 budget. The Governor's budget proposes to use the funding for a laundry list of projects including Transit and Intercity Rail Capital program for additional competitive grants to support capital improvements, provide competitive grants for improvements to local streets and roads that encourage active transportation, such as walking and bicycling, transit, and other carbon-reducing road investments, and to provide financial incentives for capital investments that expand waste management infrastructure. This appropriation may be tied to the negotiations over new transportation funding.

Public Safety:

Prison Population Reduction: The budget acknowledges that the passage of Proposition 47 and the state effort to reduce its inmate population, is expected to result in 8,700 fewer state prisoners, thereby impacting local communities. Proposition 47 requires state savings from the Proposition to fund the Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Fund. The first transfer of state savings to the new fund will occur in August 2016. Currently, the Governor is estimating net savings of \$29.3 million. Ongoing savings are expected to be approximately \$57 million.

Reentry Facilities: The budget includes \$32.1 million to continue the community re-entry facilities. The program currently houses 220 inmates. The Governor proposes to increase the number of beds to 680 and to increase the eligibility criteria from 120 days prior to release to 180 days. \$25 million will be available for incentive payments to local governments to aid in the siting of these community-based facilities.

Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act:

The Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act enacted in 2015 created a regulatory framework for the licensing and enforcement of the cultivation, manufacture, transportation, storage, and distribution of medical marijuana in California. The Budget includes \$12.8 million (General Fund), \$10.6 million Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act Fund, \$1.2 million other special funds, and 126 positions to implement the regulation of medical marijuana in California in 2016.

<u>City Law Enforcement Grants:</u> The Budget includes \$20 million to increase positive outcomes between city police and the homeless community, persons with mental health needs, and high-risk youth populations. The Board of State and Community Corrections will allocate funds to individual cities acting as a fiduciary agent within each county receiving the funds.

Racial and Identity Profiling Act of 2015: Last year the Legislature passed the Racial and Identity Profiling Act which revises the definition of racial profiling and, among other things, requires the Attorney General to report on citizen complaints alleging racial or identity profiling for each state and local agency that employs peace officers. Beginning in 2018-19, these local agencies will also have to report data on all stops conducted by the agency's peace officers, including the time, date, and location of the stop, and the reason for the stop.

The Budget includes \$10 million General Fund to allocate to local law enforcement agencies for costs incurred through June 2017 related to increased citizen complaint reporting activities. The administration indicates there will be a stakeholder effort to develop an allocation methodology for these funds and the overall program that limits future mandate reimbursement claims.

I hope this information is helpful. You can access the full Governor's proposal at www.dof.ca.gov. In a few weeks, the non-partisan Legislative Analyst will release their analysis of the Governor's proposal and you can access that proposal at www.lao.ca.gov. As you can see, the Governor will be engaging stakeholders on a number of his proposals. I would appreciate hearing from you on the various proposals. Dear Mayor Nguyen:

As you know, Governor Brown released his 2016-2017 budget proposal on January 7th. The \$170.5 billion budget includes \$124 billion in General Fund and \$45 billion in Special Fund expenditures. The Governor's proposal begins the budget process for the 2016-17 fiscal year budget debate. In the next few months, the Legislature will hold hearings on the Governor's proposal and then make suggested changes. The final budget is required to be passed by midnight on June 15th. I wanted to share a few of the highlights that will affect local governments and would appreciate any feedback on the various proposals.

Redevelopment: As you know, in 2011, the state eliminated approximately 400 Redevelopment Agencies (RDAs) and replaced them with locally organized successor agencies that are tasked with retiring the former RDAs' outstanding debts and other legal obligations. The Administration is not proposing any additional legislative changes to the redevelopment law because they are currently in the process of implementing SB 107, which passed as part of last year's budget.

<u>Transportation</u>: The budget includes \$3.6 billion annually for transportation, of which \$3 billion would be generated by increased gas and diesel taxes and a road user fee (\$65 annually per car), while continuing to diverting existing transportation revenues to fund the General Fund's debt service obligation. This proposal is a continuation of the Governor's proposal from last year and is the subject of the First Extraordinary Special Session. The proposed tax increase would require a 2/3rds vote of the Legislature.

Cap and Trade Allocations: The budget proposes to allocate \$3.1 billion from Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds, which includes the balance of auction proceeds that were not allocated in FY 2015-16. 60% of the annual proceeds do not require a vote of the Legislature because they are continuously appropriated to High-Speed Rail Projects (\$500 million), Low Carbon Transit Operations, Transit and Intercity Rail projects (\$200 million) and Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities programs (\$400 million). Under existing law, 40% of the money is appropriated in the budget process. In 2015-16, the Legislature failed to appropriate that year's uncommitted Cap and Trade

Allocations. As such, the Legislature will have double the money to appropriate as part of the 2016-17 budget. The Governor's budget proposes to use the funding for a laundry list of projects including Transit and Intercity Rail Capital program for additional competitive grants to support capital improvements, provide competitive grants for improvements to local streets and roads that encourage active transportation, such as walking and bicycling, transit, and other carbon-reducing road investments, and to provide financial incentives for capital investments that expand waste management infrastructure. This appropriation may be tied to the negotiations over new transportation funding.

Public Safety:

Prison Population Reduction: The budget acknowledges that the passage of Proposition 47 and the state effort to reduce its inmate population, is expected to result in 8,700 fewer state prisoners, thereby impacting local communities. Proposition 47 requires state savings from the Proposition to fund the Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Fund. The first transfer of state savings to the new fund will occur in August 2016. Currently, the Governor is estimating net savings of \$29.3 million. Ongoing savings are expected to be approximately \$57 million.

Reentry Facilities: The budget includes \$32.1 million to continue the community re-entry facilities. The program currently houses 220 inmates. The Governor proposes to increase the number of beds to 680 and to increase the eligibility criteria from 120 days prior to release to 180 days. \$25 million will be available for incentive payments to local governments to aid in the siting of these community-based facilities.

Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act:

The Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act enacted in 2015 created a regulatory framework for the licensing and enforcement of the cultivation, manufacture, transportation, storage, and distribution of medical marijuana in California. The Budget includes \$12.8 million (General Fund), \$10.6 million Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act Fund, \$1.2 million other special funds, and 126 positions to implement the regulation of medical marijuana in California in 2016.

<u>City Law Enforcement Grants:</u> The Budget includes \$20 million to increase positive outcomes between city police and the homeless community, persons with mental health needs, and high-risk youth populations. The Board of State and Community Corrections will allocate funds to individual cities acting as a fiduciary agent within each county receiving the funds.

Racial and Identity Profiling Act of 2015: Last year the Legislature passed the Racial and Identity Profiling Act which revises the definition of racial profiling and, among other things, requires the Attorney General to report on citizen complaints alleging racial or identity profiling for each state and local agency that employs peace officers. Beginning in 2018-19, these local agencies will also have to report data on all stops conducted by the agency's peace officers, including the time, date, and location of the stop, and the reason for the stop.

The Budget includes \$10 million General Fund to allocate to local law enforcement agencies for costs incurred through June 2017 related to increased citizen complaint reporting activities. The administration indicates there will be a stakeholder effort to develop an allocation methodology for these funds and the overall program that limits future mandate reimbursement claims.

I hope this information is helpful. You can access the full Governor's proposal at www.dof.ca.gov. In a few weeks, the non-partisan Legislative Analyst will release their analysis of the Governor's proposal and you can access that proposal at www.lao.ca.gov. As you can see, the Governor will be engaging stakeholders on a number of his proposals. I would appreciate hearing from you on the various proposals. 

Dear Mayor Nguyen:

As you know, Governor Brown released his 2016-2017 budget proposal on January 7th. The \$170.5 billion budget includes \$124 billion in General Fund and \$45 billion in Special Fund expenditures. The Governor's proposal begins the budget process for the 2016-17 fiscal year budget debate. In the next few months, the Legislature will hold hearings on the Governor's proposal and then make suggested changes. The final budget is required to be passed by midnight on June 15th. I wanted to share a few of the highlights that will affect local governments and would appreciate any feedback on the various proposals.

Redevelopment: As you know, in 2011, the state eliminated approximately 400 Redevelopment Agencies (RDAs) and replaced them with locally organized successor agencies that are tasked with retiring the former RDAs' outstanding debts and other legal obligations. The Administration is not proposing any additional legislative changes to the redevelopment law because they are currently in the process of implementing SB 107, which passed as part of last year's budget.

<u>Transportation</u>: The budget includes \$3.6 billion annually for transportation, of which \$3 billion would be generated by increased gas and diesel taxes and a road user fee (\$65 annually per car), while continuing to diverting existing transportation revenues to fund the General Fund's debt service obligation. This proposal is a continuation of the Governor's proposal from last year and is the subject of the First Extraordinary Special Session. The proposed tax increase would require a 2/3rds vote of the Legislature.

Cap and Trade Allocations: The budget proposes to allocate \$3.1 billion from Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds, which includes the balance of auction proceeds that were not allocated in FY 2015-16. 60% of the annual proceeds do not require a vote of the Legislature because they are continuously appropriated to High-Speed Rail Projects (\$500 million), Low Carbon Transit Operations, Transit and Intercity Rail projects (\$200 million) and Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities programs (\$400 million). Under existing law, 40% of the money is appropriated in the budget process. In 2015-16, the Legislature failed to appropriate that year's uncommitted Cap and Trade

Allocations. As such, the Legislature will have double the money to appropriate as part of the 2016-17 budget. The Governor's budget proposes to use the funding for a laundry list of projects including Transit and Intercity Rail Capital program for additional competitive grants to support capital improvements, provide competitive grants for improvements to local streets and roads that encourage active transportation, such as walking and bicycling, transit, and other carbon-reducing road investments, and to provide financial incentives for capital investments that expand waste management infrastructure. This appropriation may be tied to the negotiations over new transportation funding.

Public Safety:

Prison Population Reduction: The budget acknowledges that the passage of Proposition 47 and the state effort to reduce its inmate population, is expected to result in 8,700 fewer state prisoners, thereby impacting local communities. Proposition 47 requires state savings from the Proposition to fund the Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Fund. The first transfer of state savings to the new fund will occur in August 2016. Currently, the Governor is estimating net savings of \$29.3 million. Ongoing savings are expected to be approximately \$57 million.

Reentry Facilities: The budget includes \$32.1 million to continue the community re-entry facilities. The program currently houses 220 inmates. The Governor proposes to increase the number of beds to 680 and to increase the eligibility criteria from 120 days prior to release to 180 days. \$25 million will be available for incentive payments to local governments to aid in the siting of these community-based facilities.

Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act:

The Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act enacted in 2015 created a regulatory framework for the licensing and enforcement of the cultivation, manufacture, transportation, storage, and distribution of medical marijuana in California. The Budget includes \$12.8 million (General Fund), \$10.6 million Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act Fund, \$1.2 million other special funds, and 126 positions to implement the regulation of medical marijuana in California in 2016.

<u>City Law Enforcement Grants:</u> The Budget includes \$20 million to increase positive outcomes between city police and the homeless community, persons with mental health needs, and high-risk youth populations. The Board of State and Community Corrections will allocate funds to individual cities acting as a fiduciary agent within each county receiving the funds.

Racial and Identity Profiling Act of 2015: Last year the Legislature passed the Racial and Identity Profiling Act which revises the definition of racial profiling and, among other things, requires the Attorney General to report on citizen complaints alleging racial or identity profiling for each state and local agency that employs peace officers. Beginning in 2018-19, these local agencies will also have to report data on all stops conducted by the agency's peace officers, including the time, date, and location of the stop, and the reason for the stop.

The Budget includes \$10 million General Fund to allocate to local law enforcement agencies for costs incurred through June 2017 related to increased citizen complaint reporting activities. The administration indicates there will be a stakeholder effort to develop an allocation methodology for these funds and the overall program that limits future mandate reimbursement claims.

I hope this information is helpful. You can access the full Governor's proposal at www.dof.ca.gov. In a few weeks, the non-partisan Legislative Analyst will release their analysis of the Governor's proposal and you can access that proposal at www.lao.ca.gov. As you can see, the Governor will be engaging stakeholders on a number of his proposals. I would appreciate hearing from you on the various proposals. Snowman Shelter:

Building a snowman shelter: Students will study snow and ice to create a "snowman shelter" that will slow down the melting process. Using the STEM format offers many learning experiences that lead to higher level cognitive development and greater creativity.

Time elapsed photography, graphing, engineering concepts, and project portfolios will be incorporated into Adobe Voice. The class will demonstrate an enhancement level on the SAMR Model, taking technology tools (time elapsed photography) with Adobe Voice, and include that in our project based learning activity. This project took about one week and students were required to come up with a blueprint as to what would make the best snowman shelter.

Disaster Simulation/Preparedness

- Students will simulate a disaster (earthquake or tornado) that would cause considerable damage to buildings and surrounding areas. Models were created by students that-simulate these conditions. Then using iPads and drones, students follow the urban search and rescue models to respond to trapped people or locate missing people.
- This projects takes students to the redefinition stage of SAMR by having a purpose to program drones and other devices. This project does not just use drones for fun, but provides students with the real life task of search and rescue (performed similar to the Urban Search and Rescue teams around the world). This project also connected students with engineers and rescue team members that promote possible career choices for the future.

"Innovation Experience" will provide over 40 student/teacher exhibits from across the District's twenty schools. Fellow students, parents, staff and the community will be able to experience and explore the talent and innovation of Fullerton School District students and teachers.



Dear Community Stakeholder,

As part of Orange County Water District's (OCWD) commitment to providing a reliable and sustainable water supply to Orange County, it is exploring ocean desalination as a way to increase local water supplies. Specifically, it is evaluating the feasibility of purchasing and distributing water from the proposed Poseidon Water Huntington Beach Ocean Desalination Project. This new source of clean water would reduce the region's dependence on imported water sources from Northern California and the Colorado River that are vulnerable to drought, natural disasters, environmental concerns, and regulatory restrictions.

Based upon a Term Sheet OCWD and Poseidon agreed to in May 2015, Poseidon would construct the necessary treatment plant and OCWD would construct the necessary pipelines to distribute the desalinated water throughout the Orange County region. OCWD staff has researched and developed different options for distributing the ocean desalinated water. The OCWD Board of Directors will be conducting a public workshop on Wednesday, February 3, at 5:30 p.m. to review these options. The meeting will take place in the OCWD board room, located at 18700 Ward Street in Fountain Valley.

Mr. Stiles,

By now you and our council-members should have had a chance to review attachments 1 & 2 and attachment 3 is a follow up article dated 1/13/2016 from the Voice of OC regarding this matter. I call your attention to the quote made by Mr. Vu Mai at the recent city council meeting of 1/12/2016:

"When it comes to my home, the way I look at it, I'm going to get the most tax write off,

that's why I put in for San Clemente...the home here is not worth as much as San Clemente," Mai said.

In order for one to make the claim of a homeowners tax exemption on one's property tax bill/assessment, the following residency requirement shall be met:

The California Constitution provides for the exemption of \$7,000 (maximum) in assessed value from the property tax assessment of any property <u>owned and occupied as the owner's</u> <u>principal place of residence</u>. The exemption reduces the annual property tax bill for a qualified homeowner by up to \$70. (Article XIII Section 3 of the California Constitution, Rev & Tax 218).

Since Mr. Mai does not deny that he actually lives in San Clemente then he would not be in violation of Revenue & Tax Code 218 and/or California Constitution Article XIII, Section 3. However, if he's going to claim coverage under California Government Code 6254.21 for his property in San Clemente because he's an "appointed official" in Garden Grove, then he appears to be in violation of California Government Code 6254.21 or at the very least misusing this particular code. At this point Mr. Mai clearly does not meet the requirement(s) of GGMC 2.21.015 and he needs to either resign his position on our planning commission or he needs to be removed by the authority set forth in our municipal code(s).

Please take the appropriate action and in the interest of transparency, please let the People of Garden Grove know which action you will be taking.

California Election Code

- 349. (a) "Residence" for voting purposes means a person's domicile.
- (b) The domicile of a person is that place in which his or her habitation is fixed, wherein the person has the intention of remaining, and to which, whenever he or she is absent, the person has the intention of returning. At a given time, a person may have only one domicile.
- (c) The residence of a person is that place in which the person's habitation is fixed for some period of time, but wherein he or she does not have the intention of remaining. At a given time, a person may have more than one residence.

California Government Code

- 244. In determining the place of residence the following rules shall be observed:
- (a) It is the place where one remains when not called elsewhere for labor or other special or temporary purpose, and to which he or she returns in seasons of repose.
 - (b) There can only be one residence.
 - (c) A residence cannot be lost until another is gained.
- (d) The residence of the parent with whom an unmarried minor child maintains his or her place of abode is the residence of such unmarried minor child.
- (e) The residence of an unmarried minor who has a parent living cannot be changed by his or her own act.
 - (f) The residence can be changed only by the union of act and intent.
- (g) A married person shall have the right to retain his or her legal residence in the State of California notwithstanding the legal residence or domicile of his or her spouse.

Cal NORML is tracking bans or proposed bans on medical marijuana cultivation and delivery in over 200 locations across California. The bans are the result of what Rep. Wood has called a "drafting error" in MMRSA, the set of bills that passed last year in the state to regulate medical marijuana.

Those regulations won't be fully enacted until at least January 1, 2018; yet there was a provision in MMRSA saying:

In cities and counties without cultivation regulations of their own, the state shall be the sole licensing authority as of March 1, 2016.

The League of Cities advised any locality that did not have a medical marijuana ordinance to ban cultivation in order to protect their land use authority. (They have now said this is because meaningful land use regulations take time to write and there simply wasn't time before the deadline.)

Rep. Wood has introduced a bill, AB 21, which would repeal the March 1 deadline; however his intent to pass the bill as an urgency measure has not slowed down the stampede to ban. A few locales are opting to regulate instead of ban, and some excluding personal use cultivation from the ordinance, but others are banning all cultivation and deliveries too. Even though some are now calling the bans "temporary," it's important to start gathering forces to push for repealing the bans in place of meaningful regulation at all local levels.

CAL NORML NEEDS YOUR HELP TO ALERT US TO PENDING BANS IN CITIES AND COUNTIES WE HAVE NOT HAD REPORTS ON. There are 58 counties and 482 cities and towns in California. If your city and/or county is not on the list posted at http://www.canorml.org/bansbycounty.xlsx and you can provide information on ordinances that have passed or are pending where you live, please respond ASAP.

You can:

- check your city council or board of supervisor's website for upcoming meeting agendas, and search for marijuana. Report back when a marijuana ordinance is on an agenda, with the URL to the agenda and the agenda packet (with proposed ordinance)
- follow local press accounts and send in URLs
- send us corrections or provide missing data for the spreadsheet at http://www.canorml.org/bansbycounty.xlsx, such as dates bans passed or will be heard

If you can check on other cities in your county, contact us for a list of those in your area.

If you are facing a ban in your area, start reaching out to your local elected officials and let them know you oppose the ban and why. Talk to your friends and neighbors and get them involved, and write letters to the editor of local newspapers.

We have developed some talking points on the topic:

- Representative Jim Wood has introduced legislation, AB 21, to repeal the March 1 deadline in state law MMRSA. That bill is on the fast track to be passed and signed by the Governor before March 1. (See Rep. Wood's letter to local officials http://www.canorml.org/woodsletter.pdf)
- Even if the March 1 deadline is not repealed, it is NORML's opinion that this does not mean the city (or county) will lose its right to regulate medical marijuana activities. (See Cal NORML letter at http://canorml.org/openletter.pdf). At a joint hearing before The California Assembly Business & Professions, Agriculture, & Health Committees about MMRSA on January 19, Rep. Wood said that even if the March 1 deadline stays in place and/or is repealed later, cities and counties won't be punished.
- If you feel you must act now, please consider three (or four) things:
- make it a 45-day moratorium instead of a ban, as Solano County did. At that time we will know better about the March 1 deadline's fate.
- include a "sunset" clause as Alameda county did, meaning the ordinance will automatically sunset at such time as the March 1 deadline is repealed, (see: http://www.canorml.org/sunsetletter.pdf)
- It's sadly ironic that now that the state has finally moved to regulate commercial-sized medical marijuana activities, something local jurisdictions have been calling for, many local governments are moving to ban what would be better regulated, taxed, and brought into the light of day. Please protect patient rights and work with us towards meaningful regulations instead.
- (if this bans all cultivation) the ordinance should be rewritten to ban commercial cultivation only; this is the only activity covered by MMRSA. There is no need to strip all patients in your (city or county) of their rights even if you feel you must pass a cultivation ban. Cities across the state such as Santa Barbara, Grover Beach, Morro Bay, Livermore, Suisun, Del Mar, Port Hueneme and Jurupa Valley have banned commercial cultivation but have made an exemption for personal-size gardens. Other places like Coalinga, Watsonville Adelanto and Desert Hot

Springs have regulated commercial grows instead of banning them, and San Jose, Monterey County, Long Beach and others are developing licensing regulations.

- last, and most importantly, appoint an ad hoc committee or other group to study the issue and come up with meaningful land regulations in (city or county) that will protect both public safety and patient access, as well as allow for the enforcement of environmental regulations and the taxation of commercial medical marijuana activities. Tell them you are willing to serve on such a committee (if you are) or recruit community members who will serve.
