Re: Staff Recommendations on Natural Gas Leakage Abatement following SB 1371 (Leno, 2014)

Dear President Picker:

On behalf of the above organizations, we write to thank you for your leadership on climate change and to express our support for the staff recommendations on the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) rulemaking (R. 15-01-008) on natural gas leakage abatement as discussed in SB 3171 (Leno, 2014).

The CPUC staff recommendations call for better training programs, more trained, experienced personnel in the field, better leak detection processes, and a defined timeline to fix known leaks. These recommendations, if adopted and implemented as proposed, will reduce the risk of damage to the environment and workplaces from explosions, air pollution and other climate change impacts while simultaneously employing California workers.

Natural gas is an integral part of California's energy portfolio and economy – over 12 million households in the state heat their homes, food and water with it – and it accounts for more than 40 percent of the state's electricity production. Statewide, utilities maintain more than 150,000 miles of natural gas distribution pipe serving homes, apartments and businesses.

Unfortunately, as Aliso Canyon demonstrated, it is more critical than ever that we take action to protect Californians from the dangers of natural gas pollution.

In 2014, the Governor signed the Gas Pipeline Leak Repair and Emissions Reduction Act (SB 1371) to require all public utilities and storage providers in California to use the most advanced technology to find leaks, and require them to repair the leaks they find. The CPUC was then tasked to determine and to implement best practices for leak identification, repair, and avoidance, as well as better accounting of the climate change impact of natural gas leaks in the distribution systems throughout our cities and communities.

On March 24, the CPUC issued staff recommendations on best practices for natural gas leak detection and repair. These recommendations represent a new way of doing things to include changes to policies and practices, better training programs, new job classifications and staffing levels, and better leak detection processes, and a defined timeline to fix known leaks.

These rules are sorely needed. For example, in 2014 the Southern California Gas Company reported a backlog in repairing of over 9,400 leaks, of which more than 1,000 may wait a year or longer to be fixed. Furthermore, more than 2.4 million (out of 5.9 million) natural gas services – which connect buildings to gas mains – have been identified as leak-prone.

While the majority of these leaks may not pose an immediate threat to life and property, significant climate change and air pollution impacts of methane leaks natural gas systems are increasingly coming into focus. Methane – the primary component of natural gas – is a significant contributor to climate change. The uncontrolled emissions from leaky pipes and components are estimated to be the equivalent of millions of cars on the road. Worse yet, many of these leaks are in proximity to homes, schools, hospitals, and other public facilities where they may develop into larger leaks that can pose more of an immediate hazard.

We applaud CPUC's draft recommendations to minimize methane emissions from the natural gas transmission and distribution system. These recommendations are a significant and necessary step to reducing, finding and fixing natural gas leaks.

Thank you again for your leadership on climate change. We welcome you in joining us to see that these recommendations are adopted by the CPUC and implemented by the utilities.

Amercanex does not share in any revenues collected by the white label relationship and in turn has arranged for any rebates or commissions due to Amercanex rather be implemented as reduced costs to our ACE Marketplace transacting members.





We believe the ACE Marketplace benefits small farmers and business owners more so than other industry participants by providing a level playing field against big corporations via our rapidly growing distribution network. History has demonstrated that a free and open marketplace awards a premium to the best quality products available and clearly Garden Grove cannabis businesses are known to be the best in their trade. Amercanex's goal is to open the cannabis markets across not only the counties of California but also across the United States and around the globe. Perhaps one day in the not so distant future a medical cannabis patient in China may be treated with Garden Grove grown cannabis!

Accordingly, we would like the opportunity to formally demonstrate and discuss our capabilities to Garden Grove lawmakers and regulators in person at your earliest convenience so that we may present the idea of conducting a free 6 month pilot program for all professional cannabis industry participants in your county.

While we traditionally provide our regulatory framework and reporting technologies free to all government agencies, we are also prepared to offer the ACE Marketplace, including both our ACEtrak and ACEpay solutions, free of charge to all City of Garden Grove professional cannabis industry participants, waiving any and all fees associated with ACE Marketplace membership including transaction and technology fees for this 6 month period.

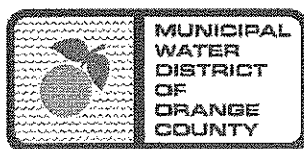

SUBJECT: Monthly Water Usage Data, Tier 2 Projection & Water Supply Information

The attached figures show the recent trend of water consumption in Orange County (OC), an estimate of Tier 2 volume for MWDOC, and selected water supply information.

- Fig. 1 OC Water Usage, Monthly by Supply OCWD Groundwater water was the main supply in February.
- Fig. 2 OC Water Usage, Monthly, Comparison to Previous Years Water usage in February 2016 was about low compared to the last 5 years. Lower usage is primarily due to strong conservation efforts and mandatory restrictions set by the governor. Rainfall for February 2016 was below the historical average and temperatures were above average. The February weather outcome resulted in very few O.C. water agencies achieving their SWRCB goal for the month.
- Fig. 3 Historical OC Water Consumption OC water consumption was 571,000 AF in FY 2014-15 (*this includes ~17 TAF of agricultural usage and non-retail water agency Usage*). This is about 50,000 AF less than FY 2013-14 but is about 16,000 AF higher than FY 2010-11 (Fiscal year with lowest usage). Water usage per person was the lowest it has been for Orange County at 164 gallons per day. Although OC population has increased 20% over the past two decades, water usage has not increased, on average. A long-term decrease in per-capita water usage is attributed mostly to Water Use Efficiency (water conservation) efforts. High Temperature, precipitation and the economy all remain indicators to O.C. water consumption.
- Fig. 4 MWDOC "Firm" Water Purchases, 2016 "Firm" water above the Tier 1 limit will be charged at the higher Tier 2 rate. Our current projection of Tier 2 purchases is zero in 2016.

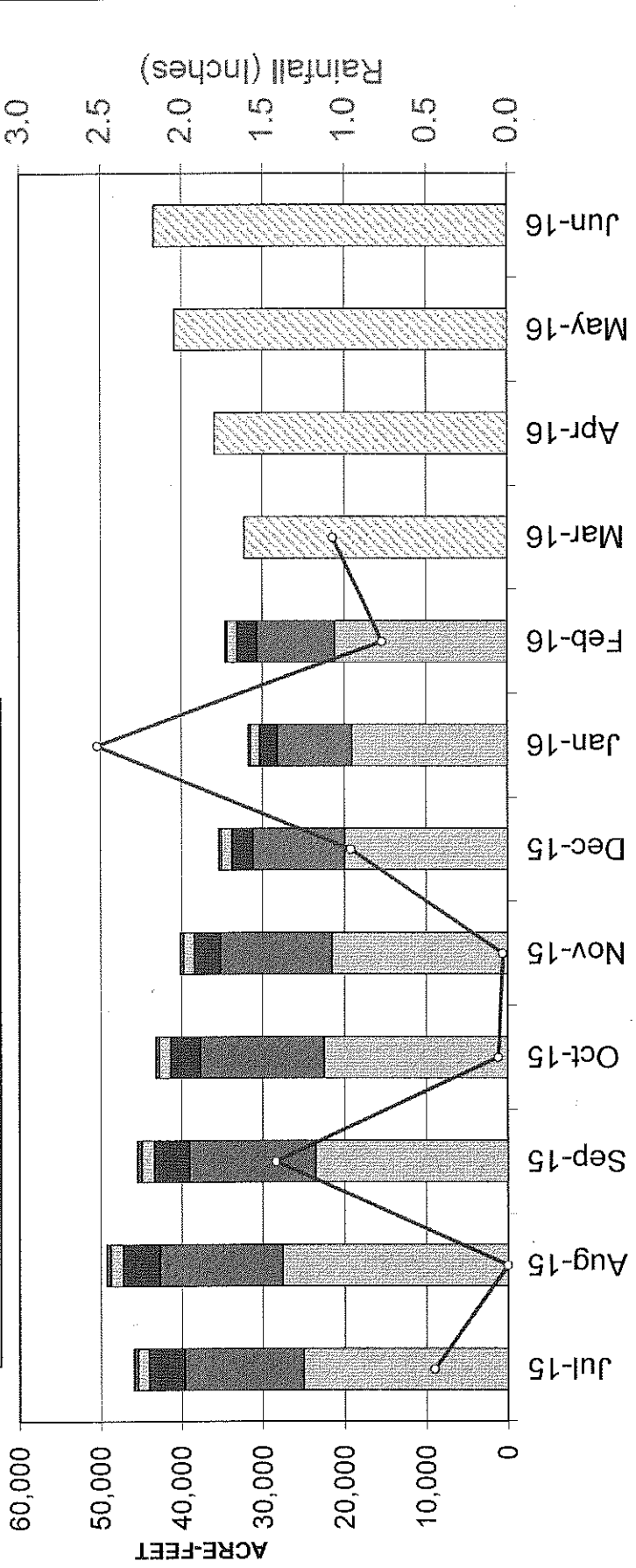
Water Supply Information Includes data on: Rainfall in OC; the OCWD Basin overdraft; Northern California and Colorado River Basin hydrologic data; the State Water Project

(SWP) Allocation, and regional storage volumes. The data has implications for the magnitude of supplies from the three watersheds that are the principal sources of water for OC. Note that a hydrologic year is Oct. 1st through Sept. 30th.

- Orange County's accumulated rainfall through March was below average for this period. This continues the impact of the previous four hydrologic years' below-normal rainfall in reducing those local supplies that are derived from local runoff. El Nino conditions are present but unfortunately there has not been amounts of precipitation for Southern California.
- Northern California accumulated precipitation in March was around 130% of normal for this period. The Northern California snowpack is 99% of normal. This follows three below-average hydrologic years. The State of California has been in a declared Drought Emergency since January 2014. The State Water Project Contractors Table A Allocation is only 45% as of the end of March.
- Colorado River Basin accumulated precipitation in March was 94% average for this period. The Upper Colorado Basin snowpack was 94% of average for this time period. However, this follows two below-average hydrologic years, and this watershed is in a long-term drought. Lake Mead and Lake Powell combined have about 61% of their average storage volume for this time of year. If Lake Mead's level falls below a "trigger" limit at the end of a calendar year, then a shortage will be declared by the US Bureau of Reclamation (USBR), impacting Colorado River water deliveries for the Lower Basin states. As of Late July Lake Mead Levels were hovering around the "trigger" limit but fortunately levels are expecting to increase from the large amounts of precipitation that hit the Colorado River Basin this summer and spring. The USBR predicts that the "trigger" level will not be hit by the end of 2016.



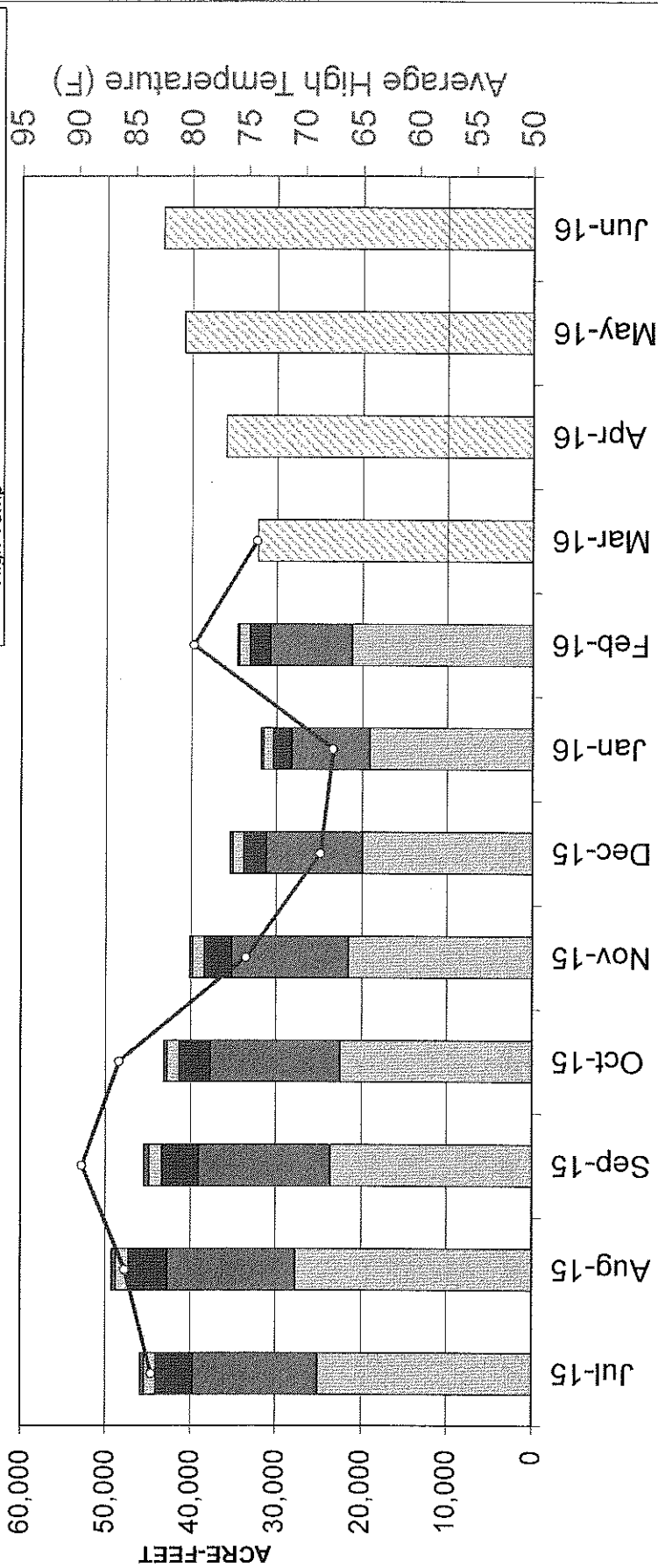
Fig. 1A OC Water Usage, Monthly by Supply with projection to end of fiscal year

with projection to end of fiscal year

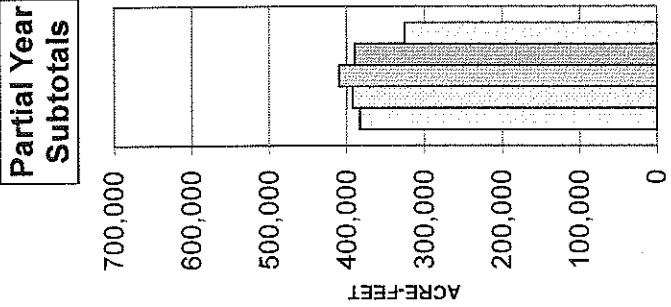
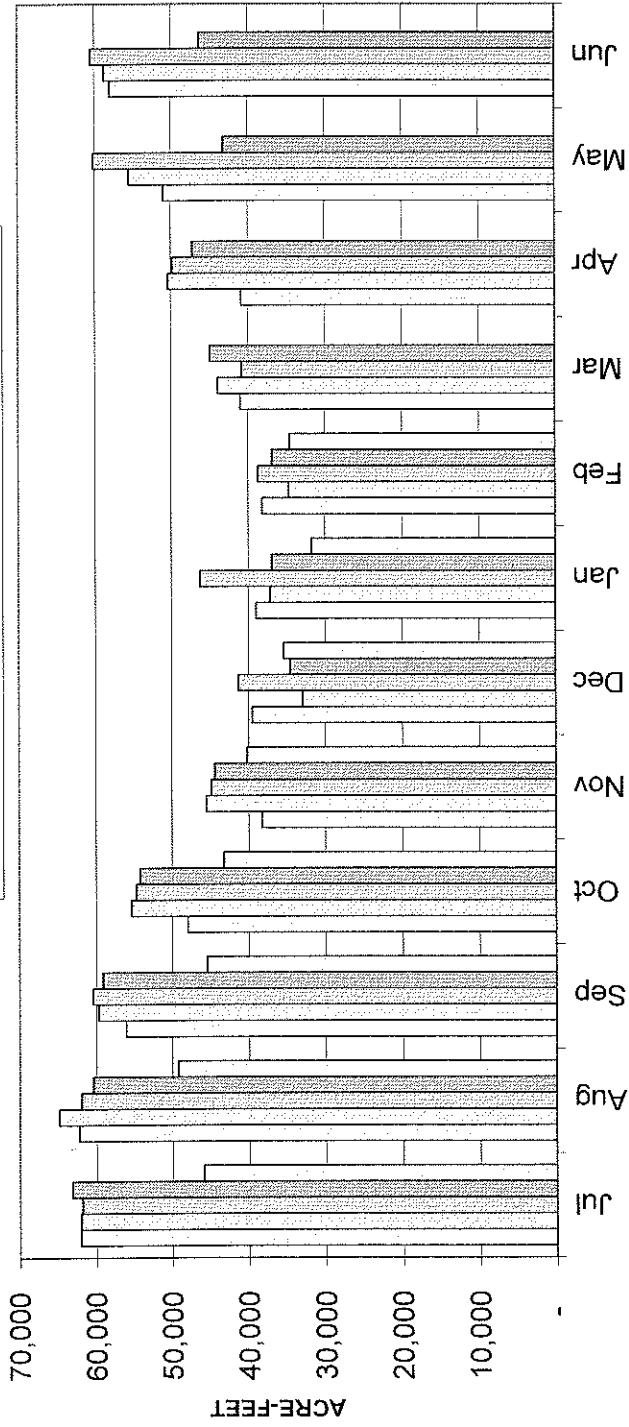

Fig. 2A OC Monthly Water Usage [1]: Comparison to Last 4 Fiscal Years

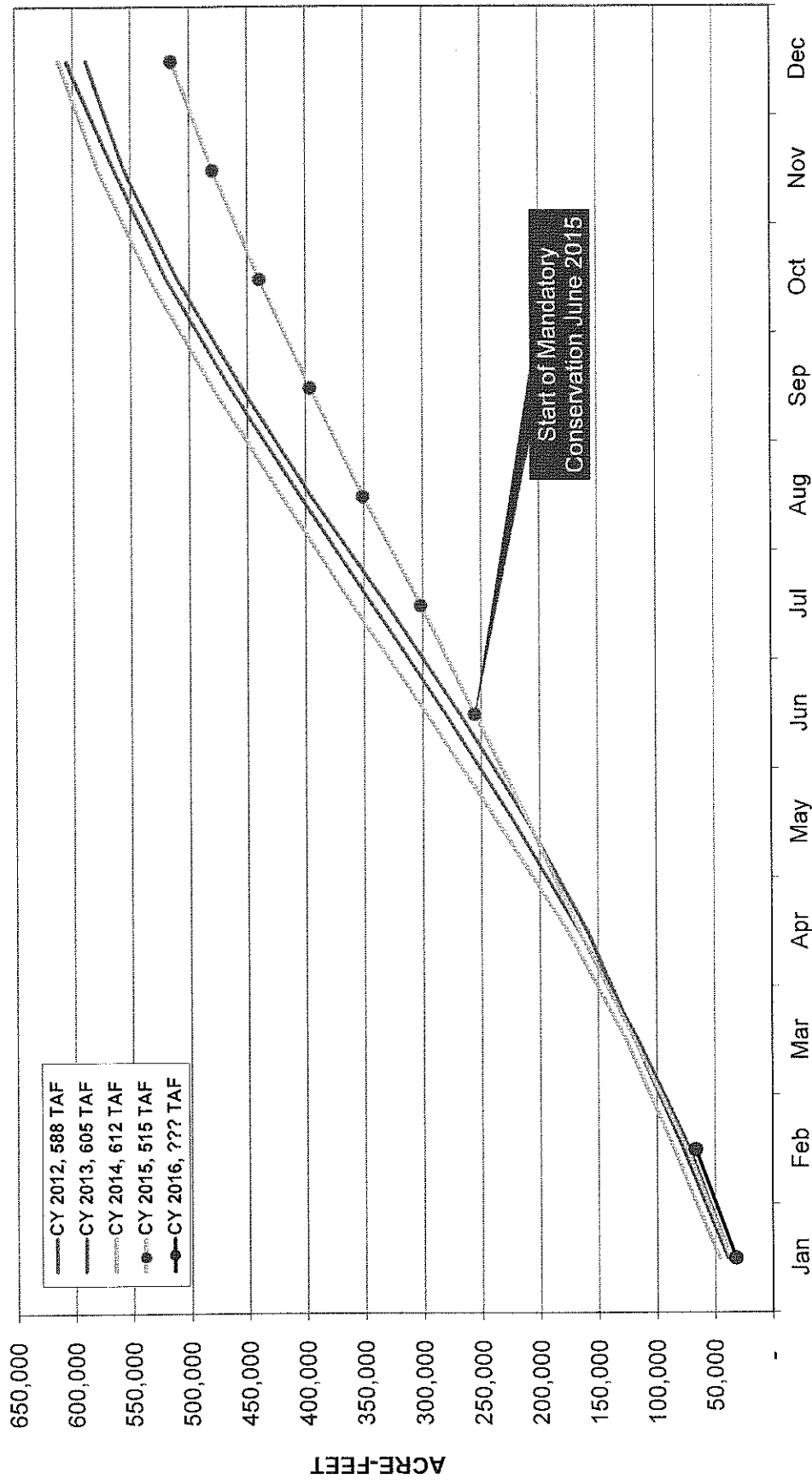

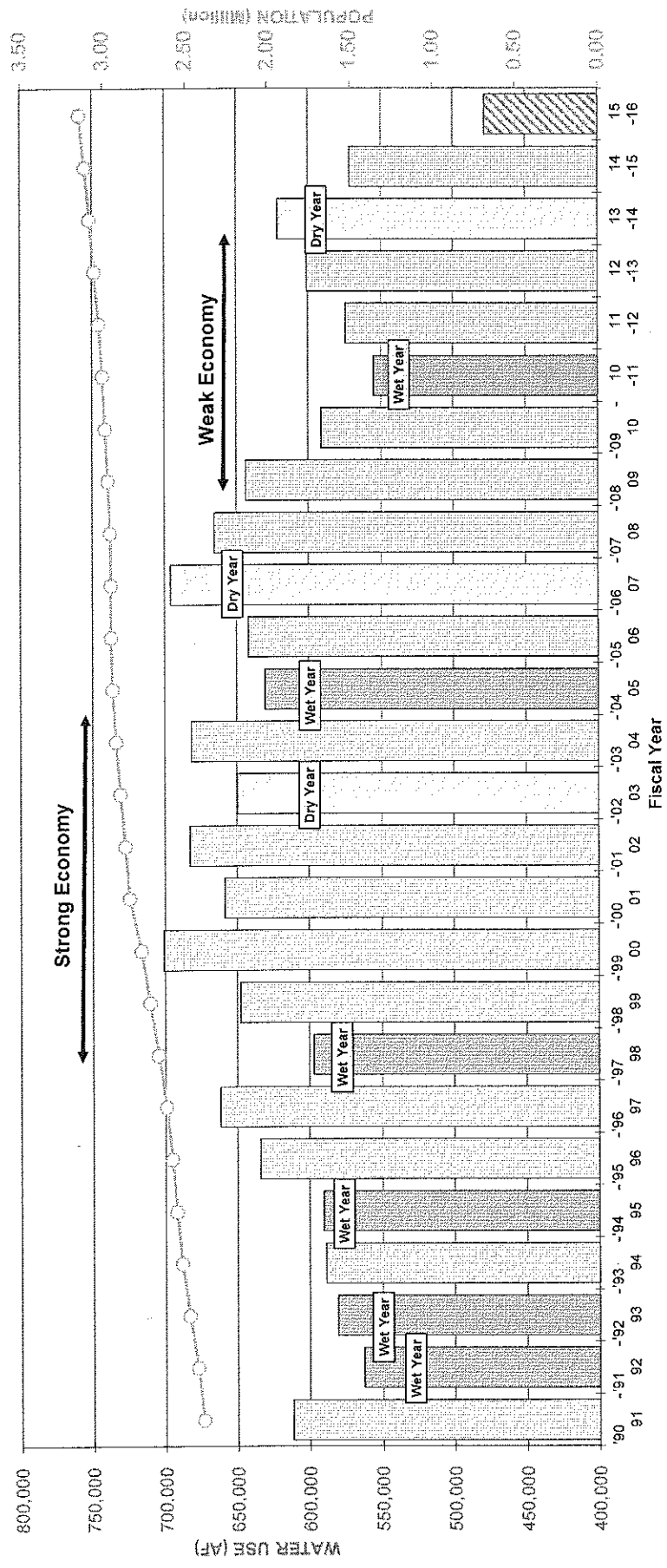
Fig. 2B Orange County Cumulative Monthly Consumptive Water Usage [1]:

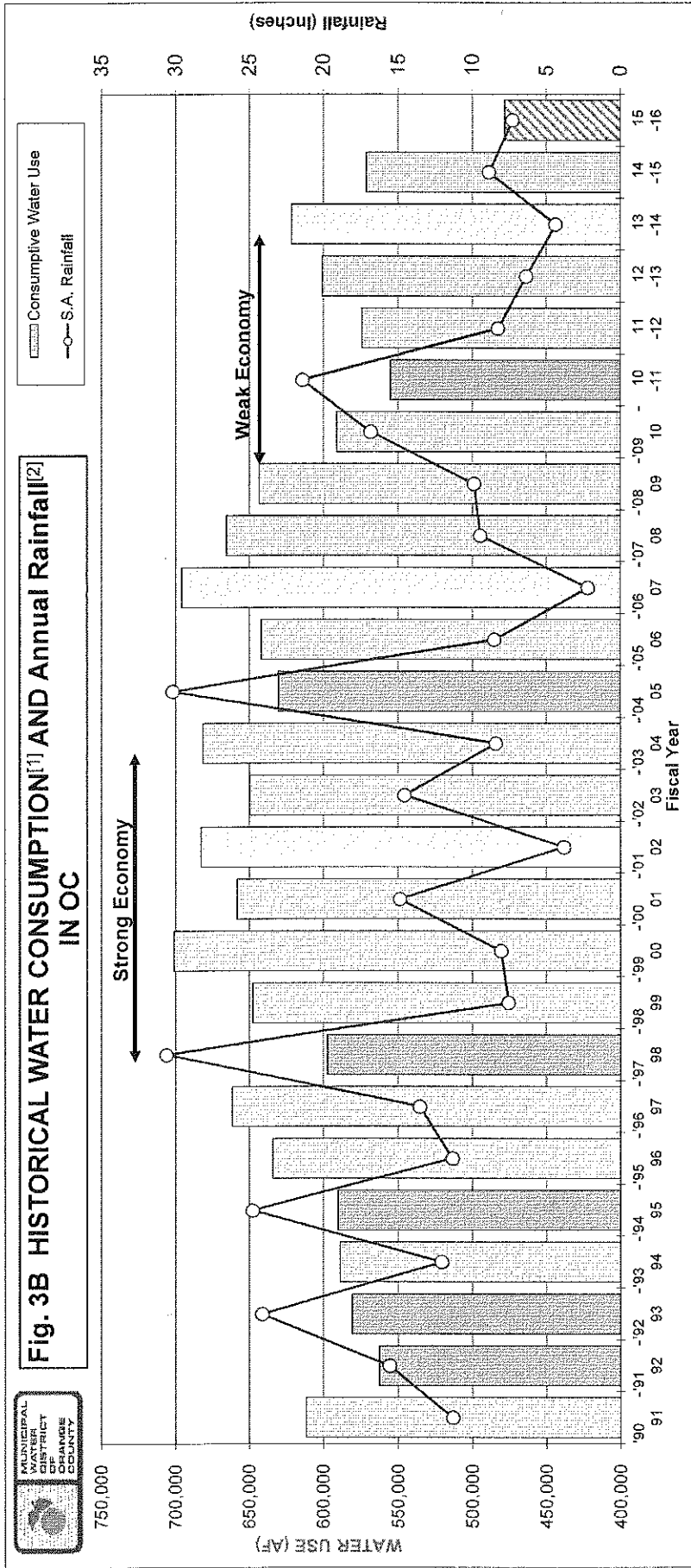
Fig. 3A HISTORICAL WATER CONSUMPTION[1] AND POPULATION[2] IN OC

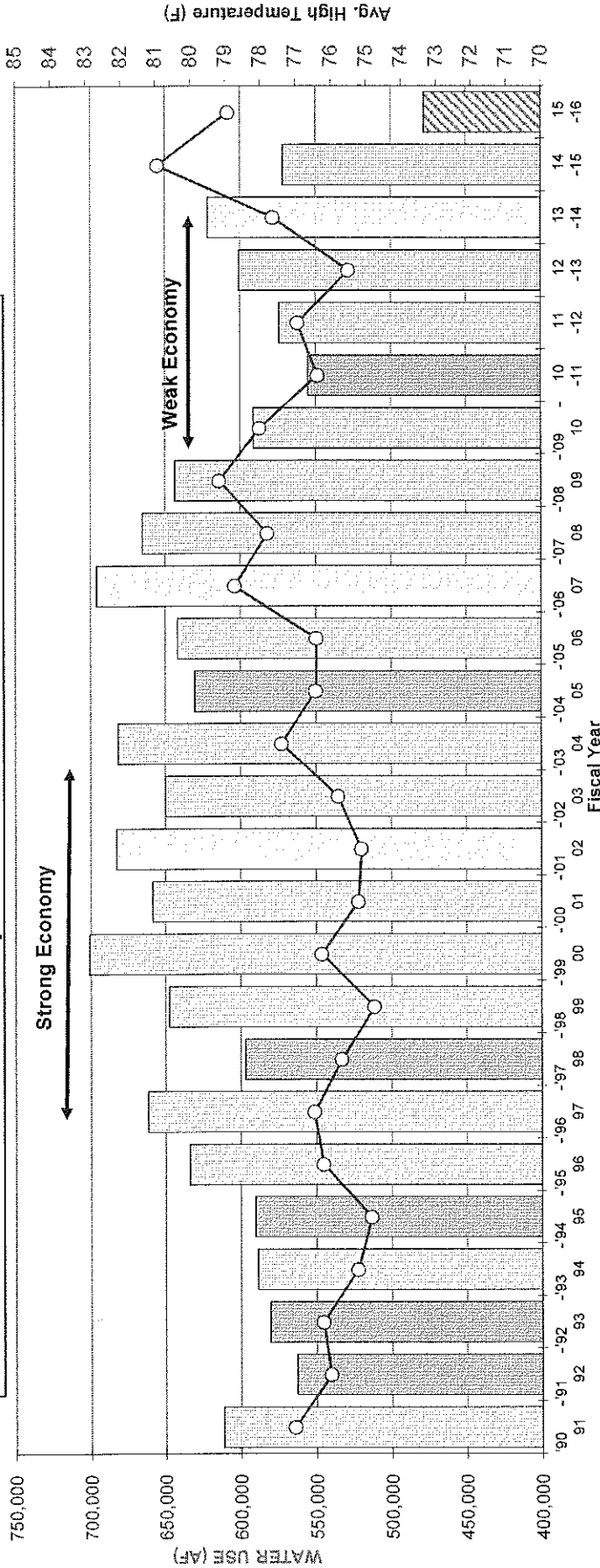

Fig. 3C HISTORICAL WATER CONSUMPTION^[1] AND Annual Average High Temperature^[2] IN OC

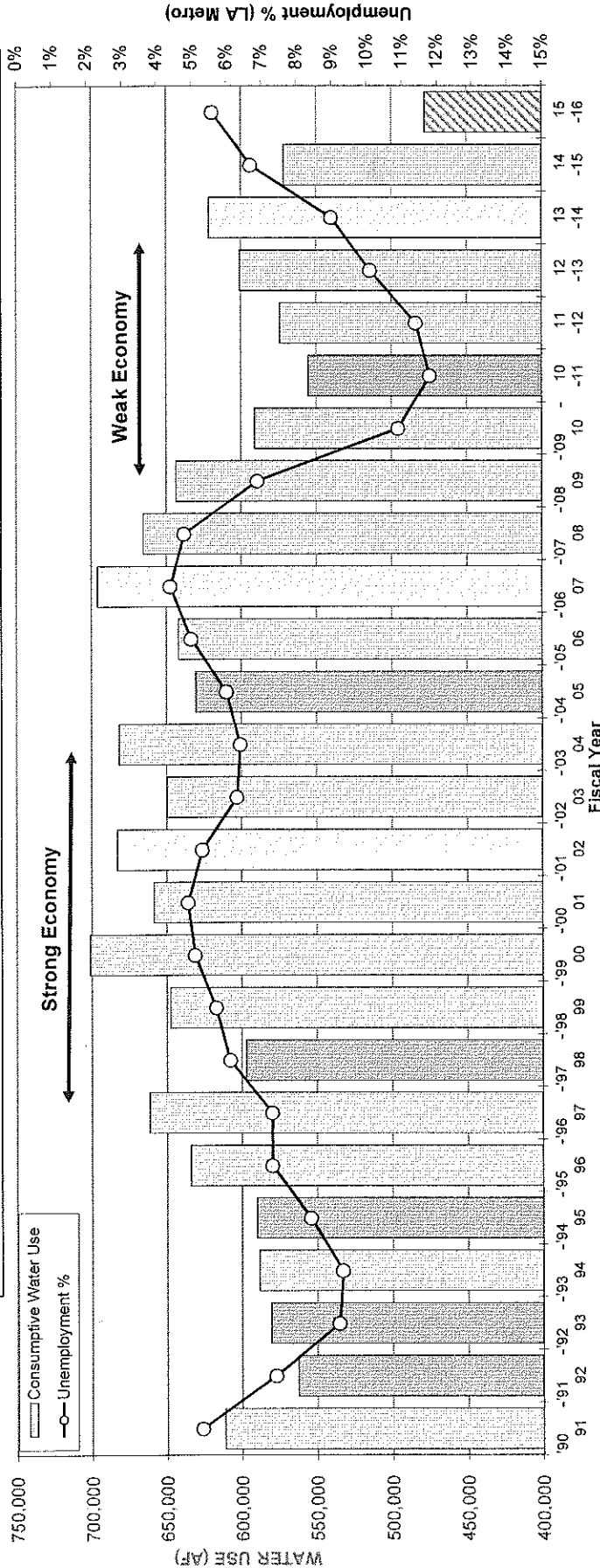

Fig. 3D HISTORICAL WATER CONSUMPTION[1] AND Average Unemployment[2] IN OC



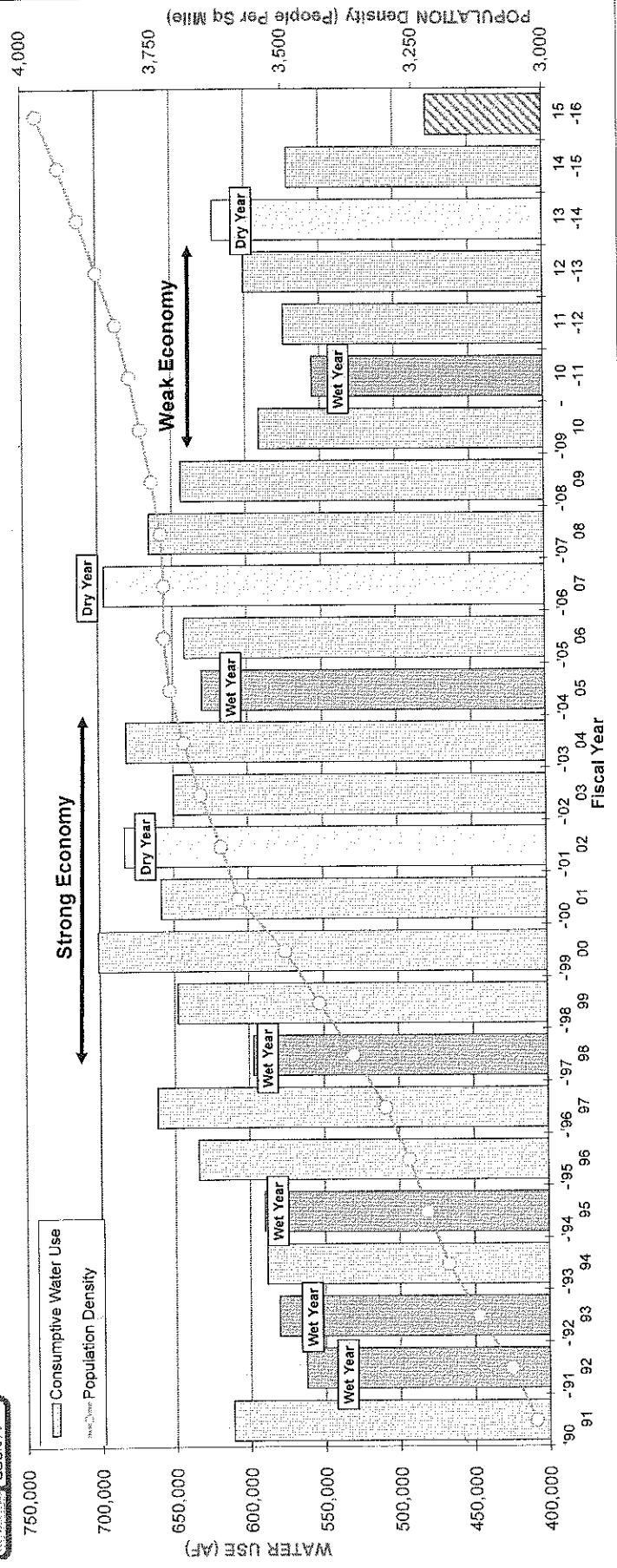

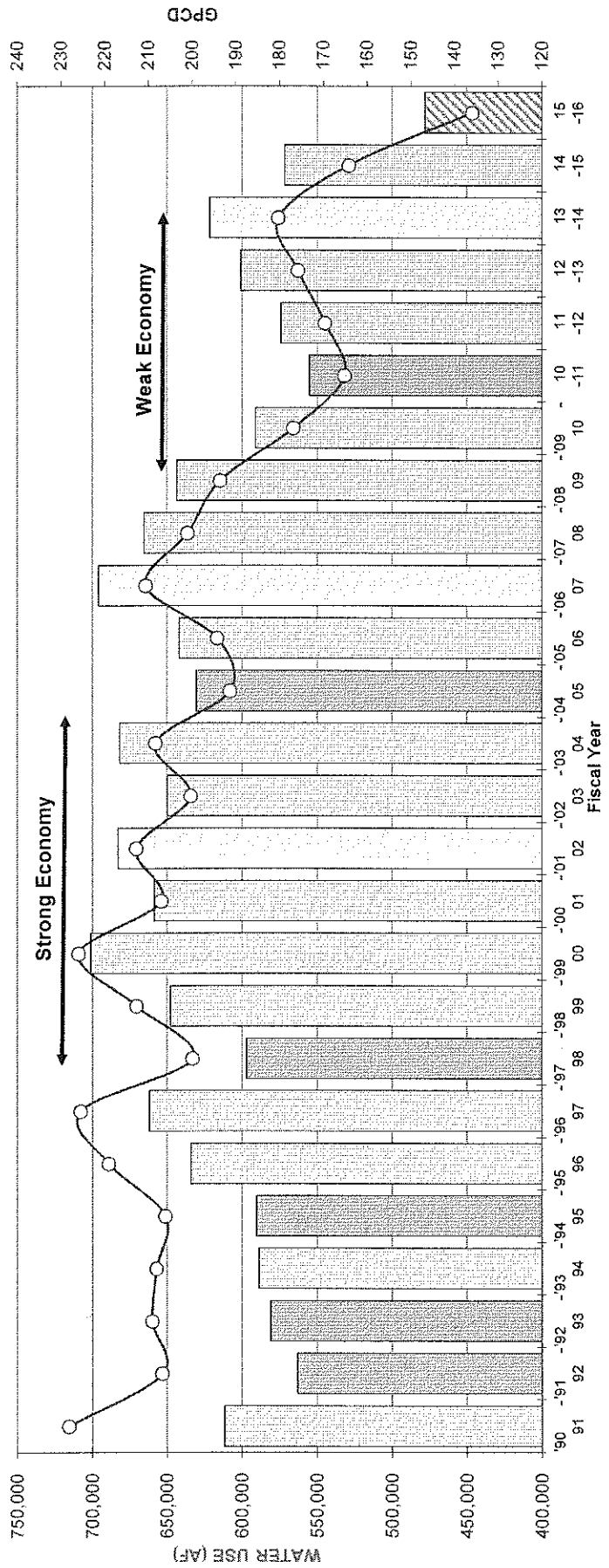
Fig. 3E HISTORICAL WATER CONSUMPTION^[1] AND POPULATION DENSITY^[2] IN OC

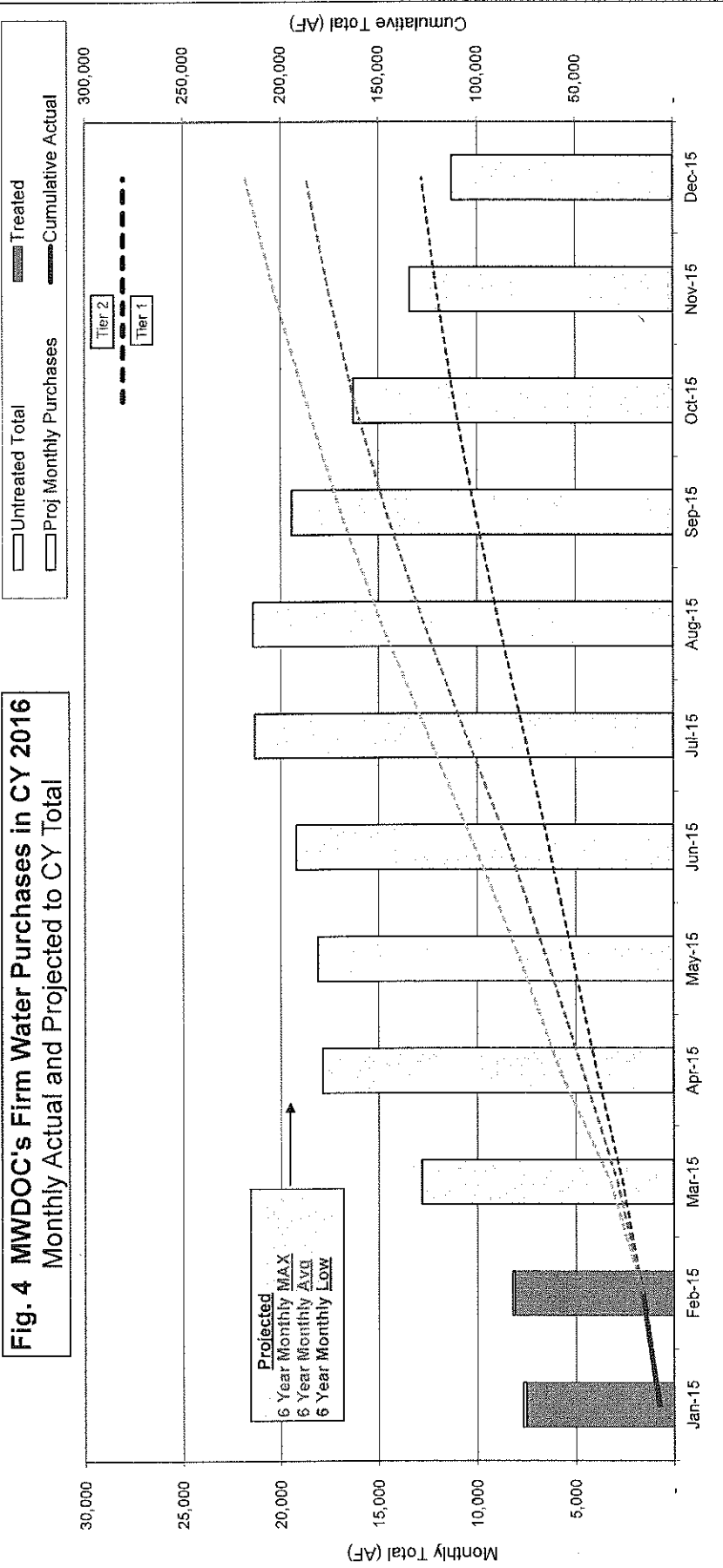


Fig. 3F HISTORICAL WATER CONSUMPTION[1] AND GPCD [2] IN OC

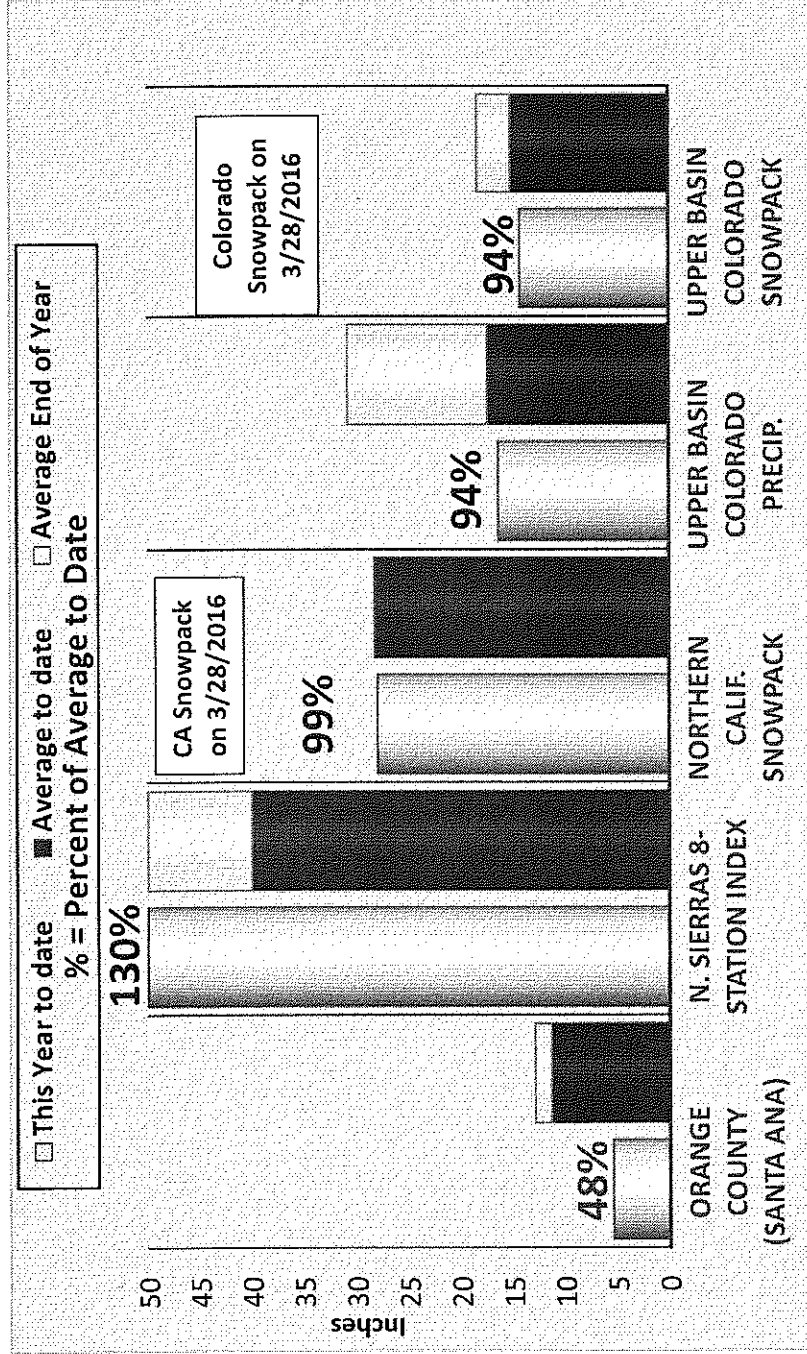

for the Oct.-Sep. water year, through late March 2016



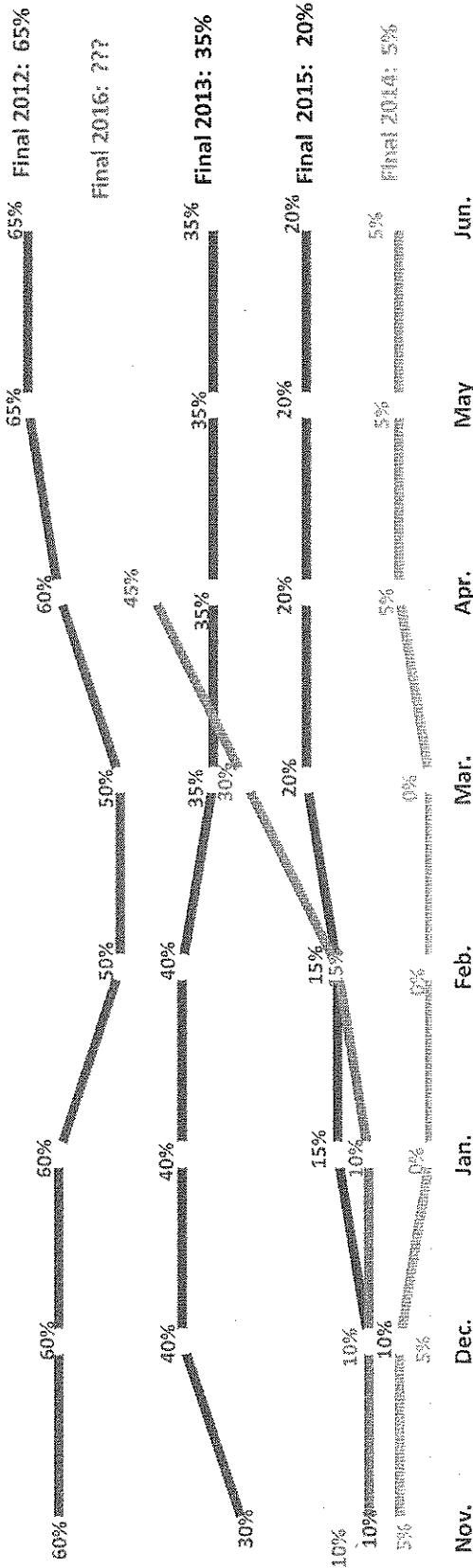

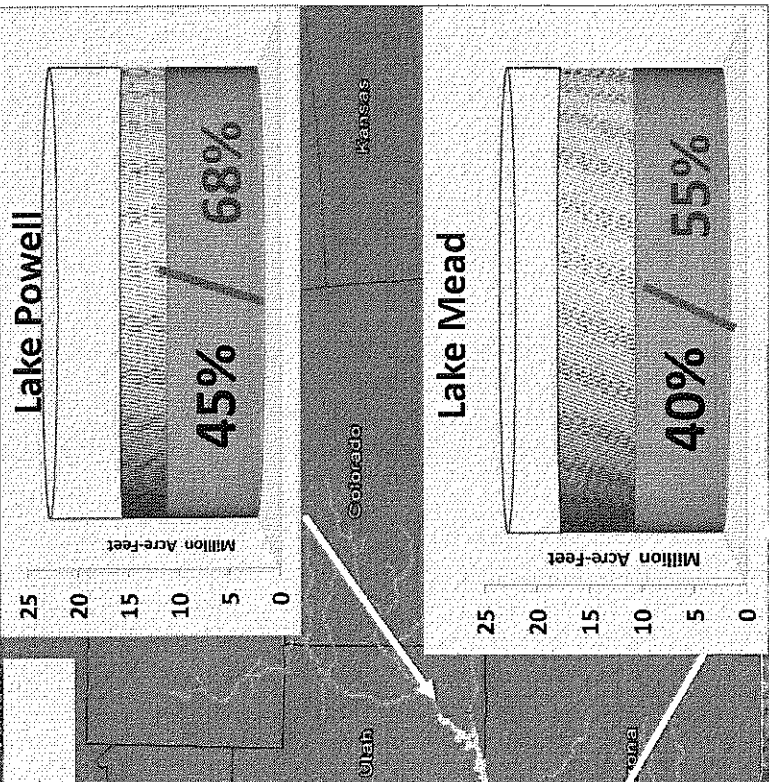
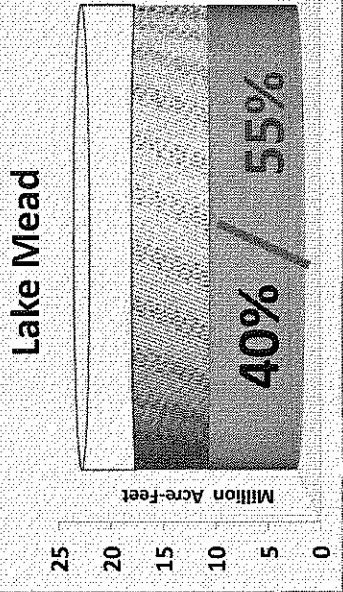
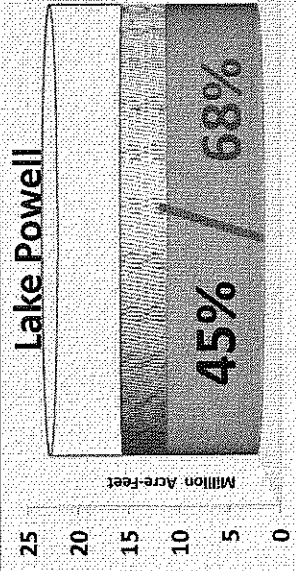
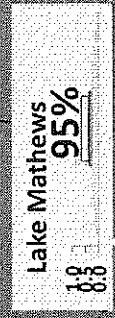
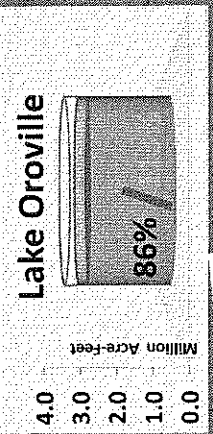
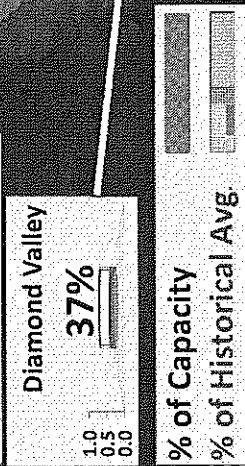
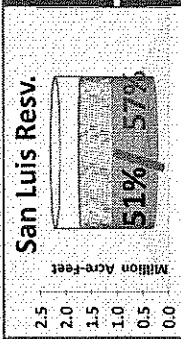
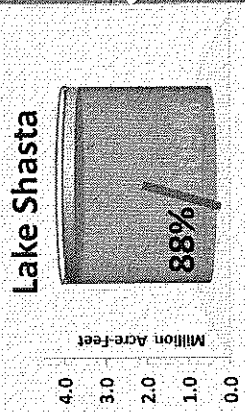
Imported Water Deliveries Vs. California Population Growth

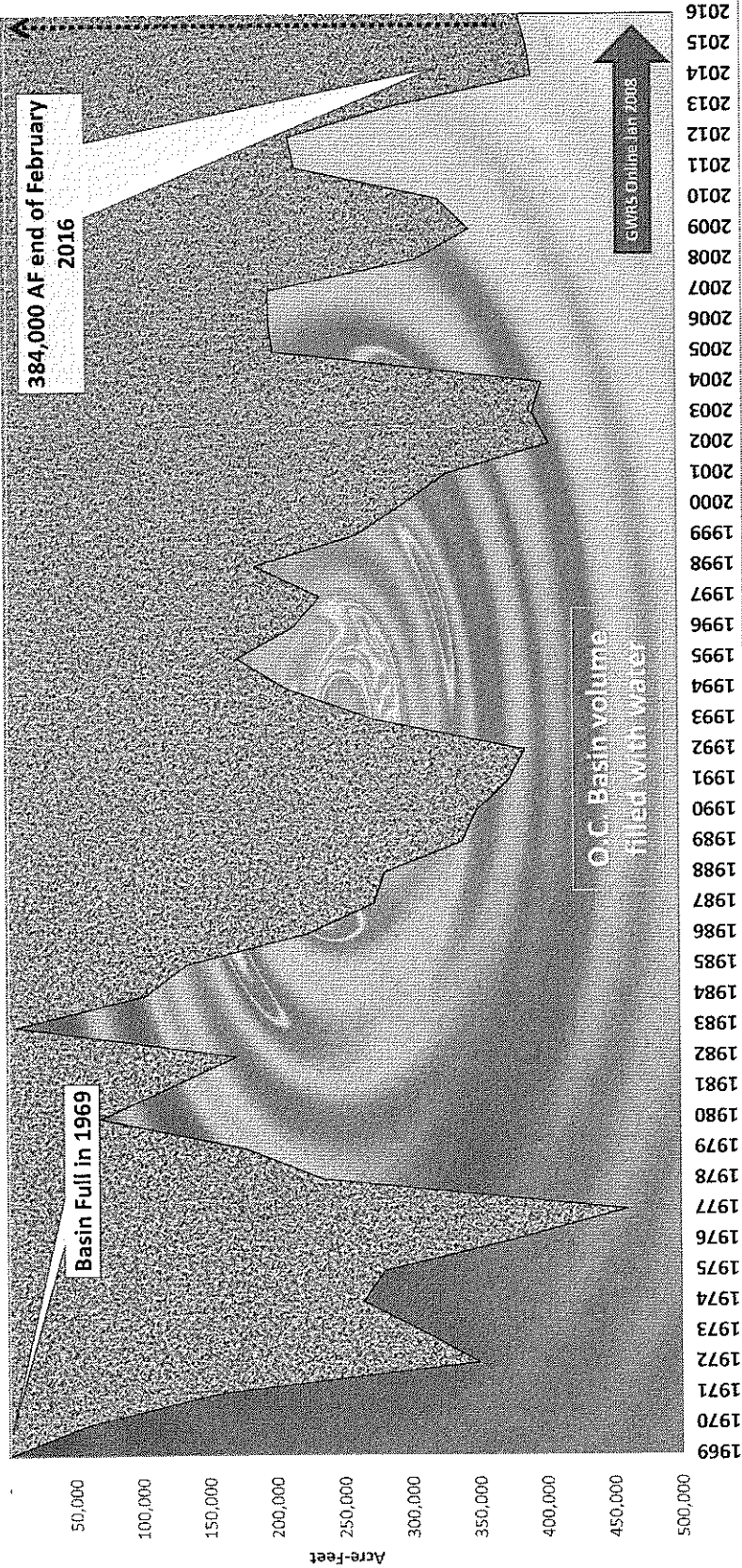

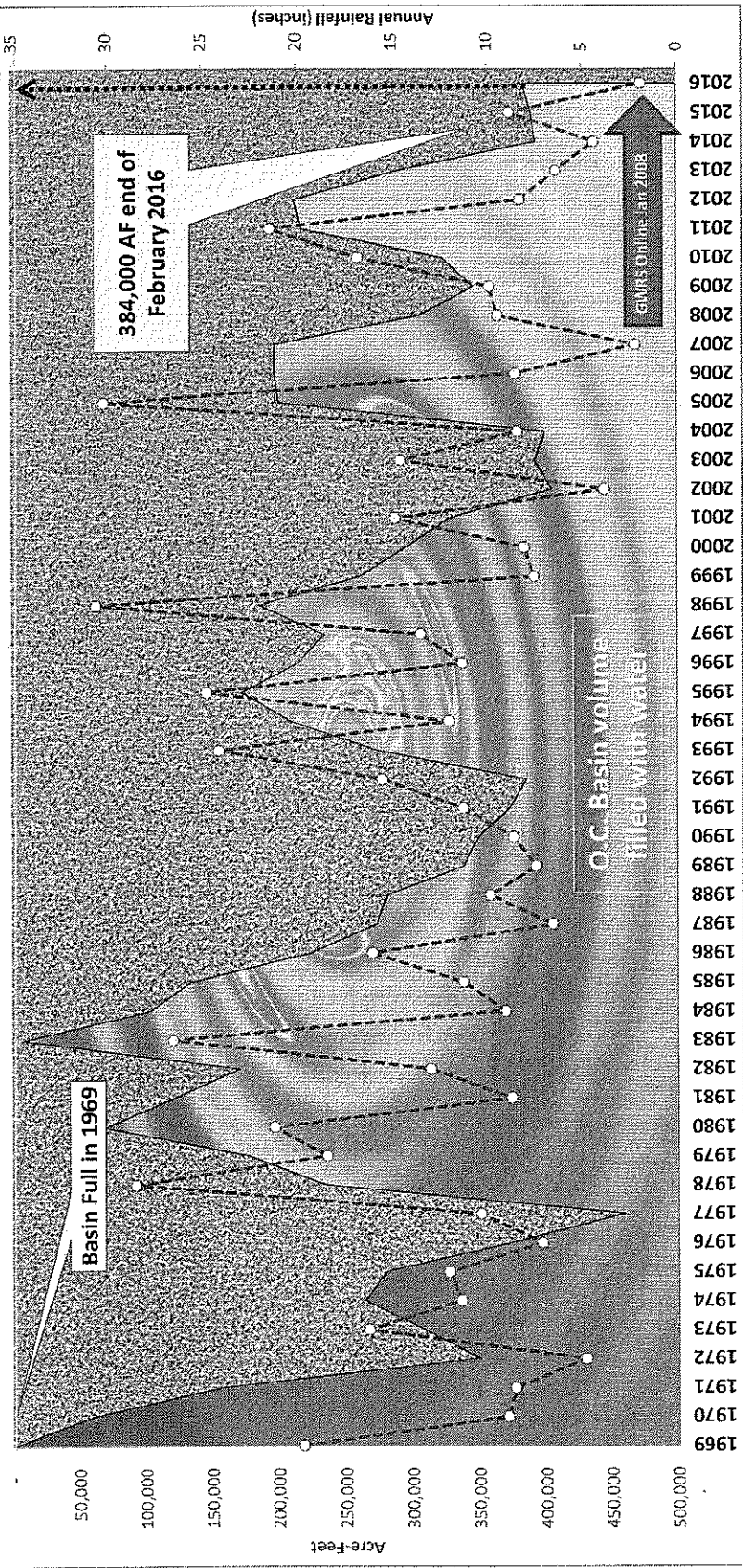


O.C. Basin Accumulated Overdraft Vs. Annual Rainfall

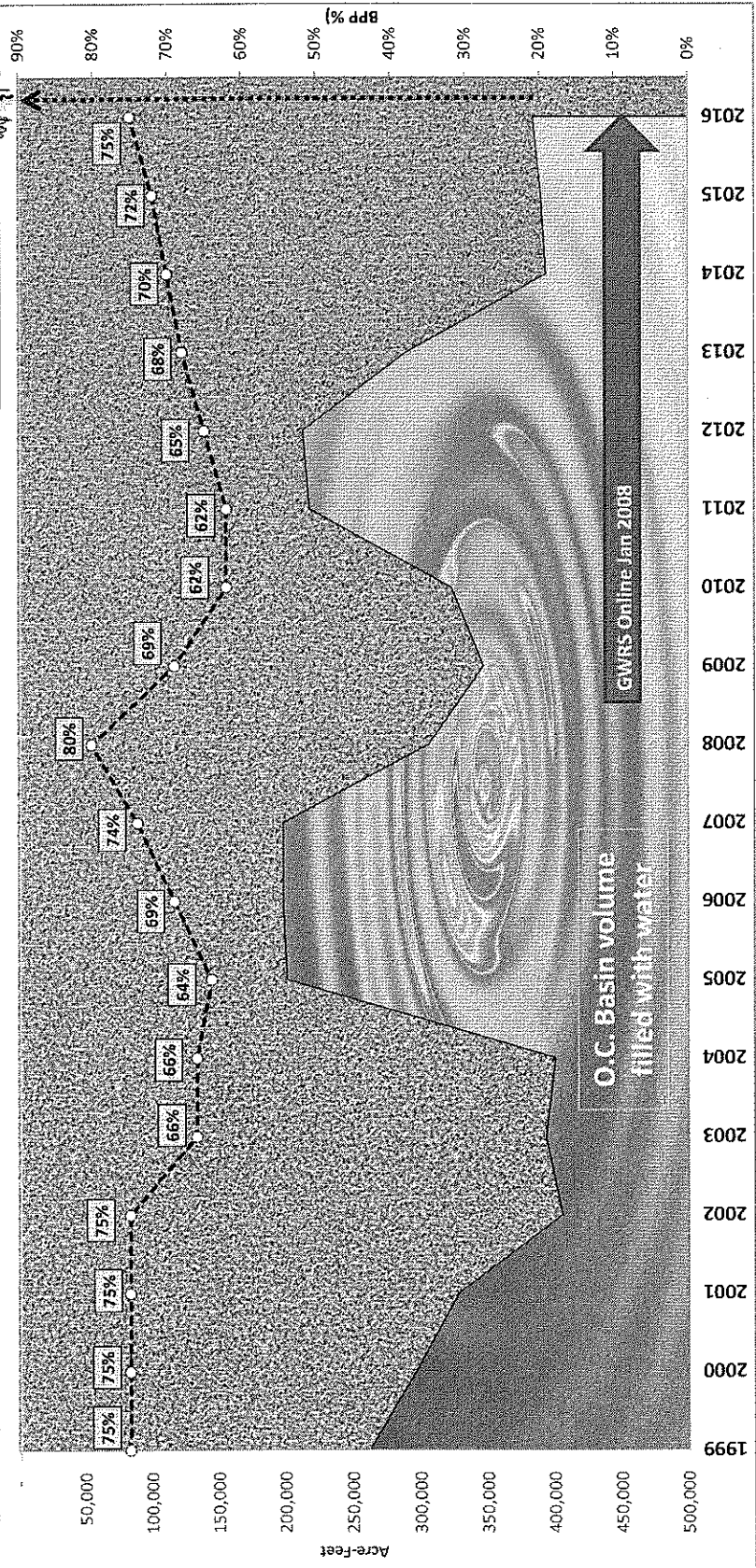

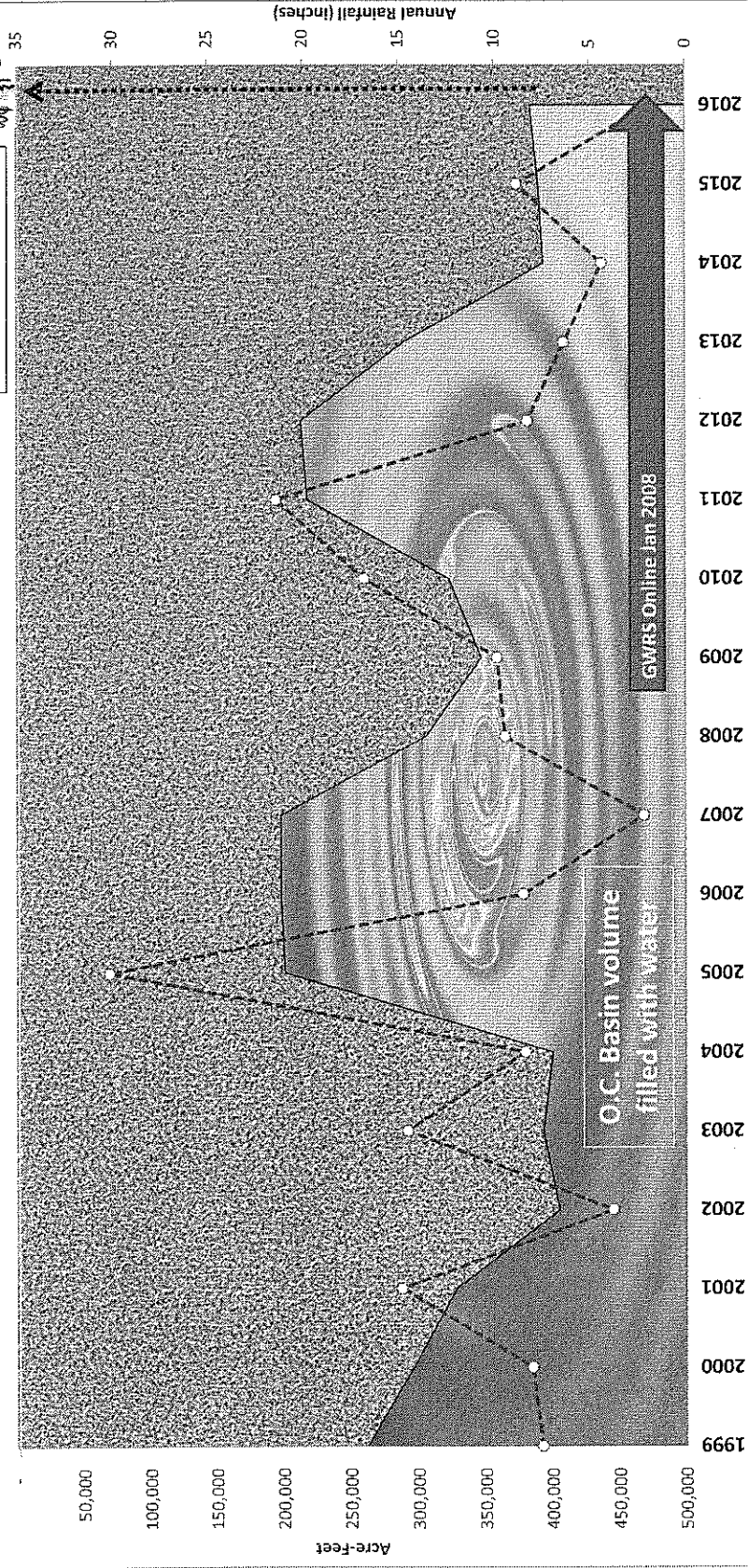

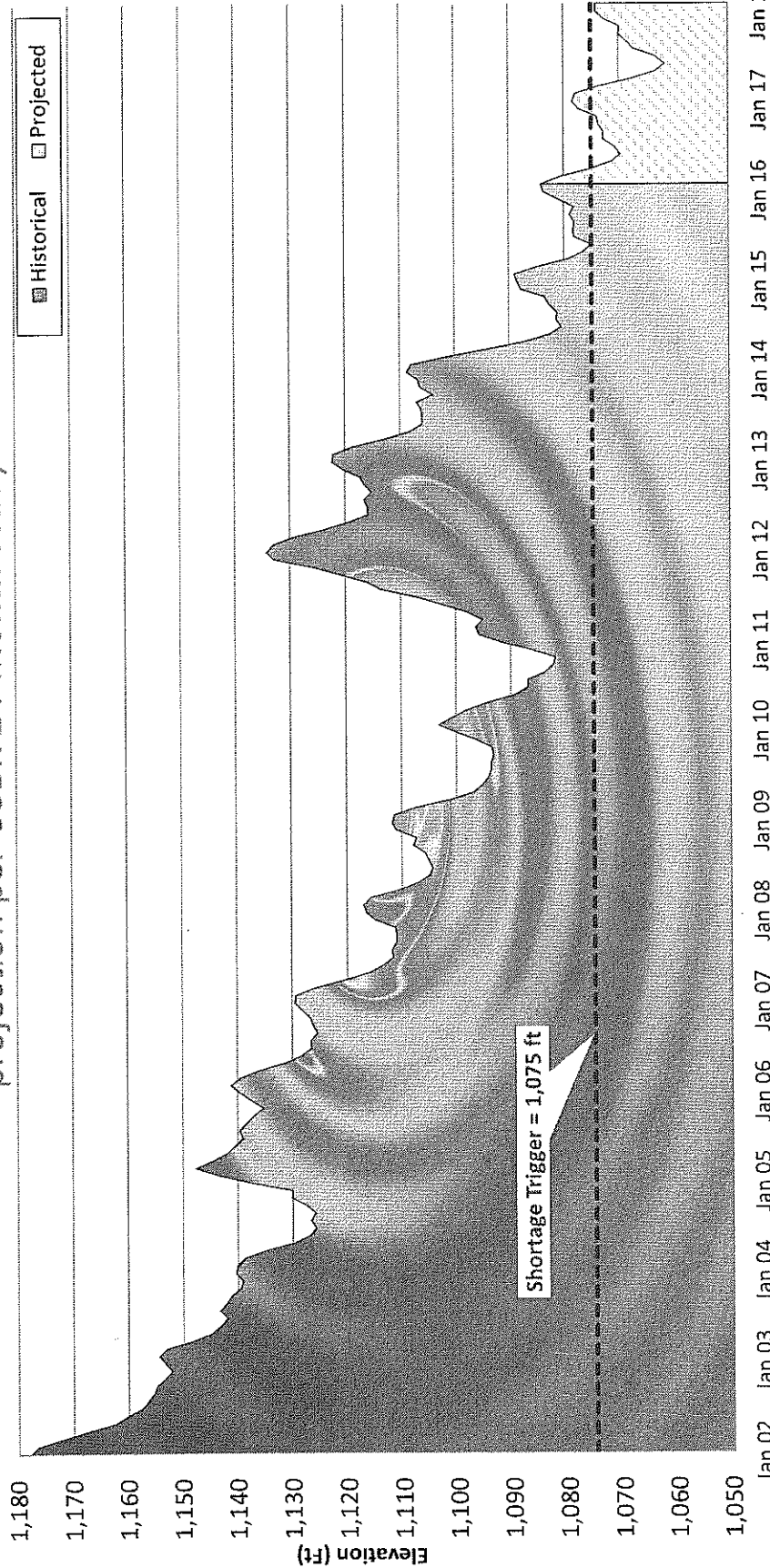

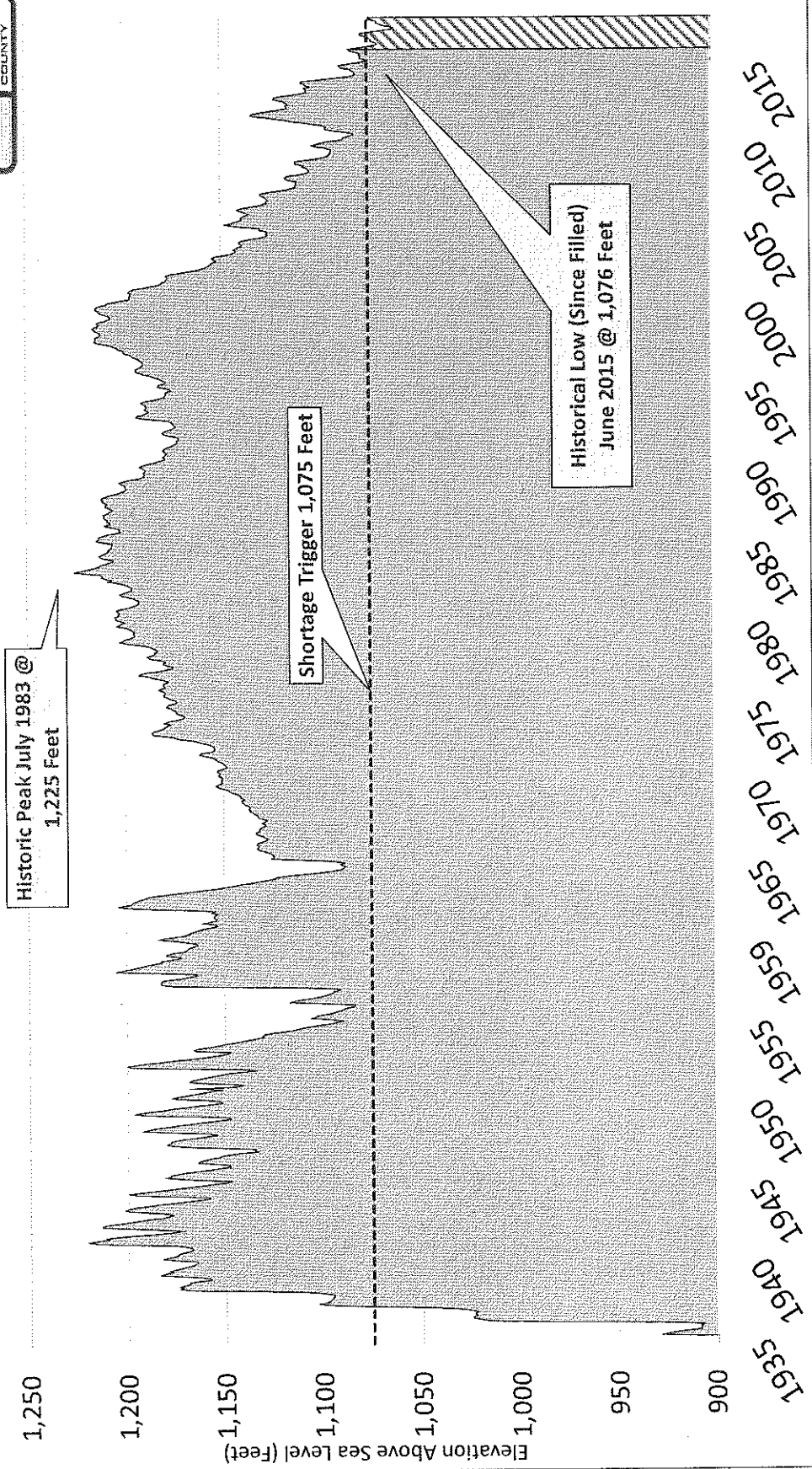
Lake Mead Levels: Historical and Projected projection per USBR 24-Month Study

A few years ago more than half of the cities in Orange County contracted with the County for animal care services. Now with the defection of Laguna Hills and RSM, the number is down to 16 and here in Lake Forest we are meeting to plan our own local shelter. I know your city is also considering a break with the County and toward that end I attached two articles.

"OCAC Data Errors Unmasked" demonstrates how the County has been lying about the euthanasia rates and the licensing compliance rates. After my articles were published, they admitted to both errors and changed the calculations for euthanasia but still haven't changed the compliance data.

"Death by Truck" demonstrates that the farther away your city is from the OC Shelter, the more likely your animals are to die while being transported.

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Scott Voigts and I have been working with the Lake Forest City staff trying to develop an RFP that the City could use in order to move away from the Orange County shelter. Readers of my columns need no reminder about the horrors of the County shelter, but in case you're new to this issue, here is a summary of 5 Grand Jury investigations, an internal audit, and documented evidence from animal activists –

- The County produces false information that exaggerates their licensing compliance and under-states their euthanasia rates.
- The County is noted for being under-staffed and under-trained and for violating some basic humane care standards
- The County has been criticized for lack of leadership and poor management.
- The County has numerous lawsuits against it.
- The County kills nearly 40% of the live animals who are admitted, compared to local shelters who euthanize less than 10%.

There is nothing new here. The County Supervisors are well aware of these facts and yet they continue to talk about building a \$35,000,000 monolith and charging the cities for it even though they are aware that none of these problems will be solved by switching an old shelter for a new one, with the same Management, same employees, and same oversight by the same Supervisors.

In the course of our investigations, we came upon the fact that a large number of animals are placed in a County animal control truck and then shipped back to the shelter in Orange, where they arrive dead. In 2014 this was about 25% of all animals in Lake Forest, but in 2013 it was even higher – 35%. This suggested to Scott and I that the long wait and travel from Lake Forest to the County shelter may have contributed to the high Dead on Arrival (DOA) rate.

Bear in mind that when someone sees dead animals at the side of the road and calls the County, these animals are eventually picked up (it can take more than a week) but they are counted separately, as “Dead Animal Pickup”. So the presumption is that the animals who are otherwise picked up by animal control are alive at the time that the County is called.

“But how many would die regardless of how long the trip is?” became the obvious question. Some of these animals are so injured when they are picked up, it's conceivable they were going to die regardless of how long it took to get to the shelter. But for how many was the trip itself a contributor to their death?

I reasoned that we could partially determine this by doing a study of all the cities served by the County, determining their distance to the Shelter, and computing their DOA rate. If there was

a systematic relationship between miles traveled and DOA rate, then the trip itself could be considered a contributing factor to their death.

If true, this grim fact argues strongly for having local shelters. It would demonstrate that the County Supervisor's plan for a single monolith, regardless of where it was situated, was a death trap for those cities at the farthest extreme from the shelter. Indeed, no other County our size in California (perhaps even elsewhere) has a single shelter.

Here are some disturbing facts from a research study I conducted a few years ago –

- Orange County provided the poorest level of coverage: one shelter serving the needs of more than 2,000,000 people. The next poorest provider was the City of Los Angeles, where each shelter served an average of more than 600,000 people. Riverside had the best coverage, providing a county shelter on average for 162,639 people.
- Examining the number of cities served by each shelter, the Orange County shelter served 22 cities (now it is 18, soon to be 16 or less), while the closest comparison is Los Angeles County where each county served an average of 8 cities. San Bernardino served an average of 3.5 cities. San Diego and Riverside county shelters serve approximately 2 cities per shelter.
- Orange County, which is by far the smallest county geographically (less than a quarter the size of San Diego and Los Angeles counties), nonetheless had the second largest average miles from city center to closest shelter, the second longest average time to travel, and also has the second longest overall mileage and the longest overall travel time. Only some San Bernardino county shelters were less accessible than Orange County, yet San Bernardino has more than 20,000 square miles to cover while Orange County has less than 1,000 square miles.

Yet despite these numbers, the Orange County Supervisors stick to their plans for a single shelter.

I went to the County website and found comprehensive data for only one year – 2013. I compared the percent of animals arriving DOA with the distance from the shelter.

Yesterday I discussed the fact that Scott Voigts and I have been working on the RFP for animal care in Lake Forest and we came upon what looked like a large number of animals who arrived at the OC shelter dead. These were not the animals who were dead by the roadside and someone called to have them picked up. These were mainly animals that were injured who were reported to the County. A small number of animals were from owners that called requesting them to be picked up, but these constituted a handful among more than 100.

The finding of so many animals arriving Dead on Arrival (DOA) led to a study of the DOA rate by distance, for all 18 cities managed by the County. Distance was measured from the individual City center to the OC shelter. DOA rate was calculated by taking the total number of animals admitted divided by the number who arrived dead.

Here are the results

- For the half of the 18 cities closest to the shelter, the average distance was 5.7 miles and the average DOA rate was 16.3%
- For the half that were farthest away from the shelter, the average distance was 16.4 miles and the average DOA rate was 33.9%

The chances of an animal dying in the animal control truck were more than twice as high for cities farthest away from the shelter.

Taking the 6 closest and the 6 farthest cities (in other words, the top 1/3 and the bottom 1/3) the differences were even greater. The distances were 4.6 vs. 19.1 miles and the DOA rate was 15.1% vs. 34%. In this comparison the furthest cities had a DOA rate 2.3 times higher.

These unfortunate cities are

- San Juan Capistrano – 26 miles, 25% death rate
- RSM – 24.9 miles, 32% death rate
- Laguna Hills – 19.2 miles, 28% death rate
- Lake Forest – 17.2 miles, 35% death rate
- Huntington Beach – 14 miles, 37% death rate
- Yorba Linda – 13.6 miles, 30% death rate

For the County as a whole, the DOA numbers were 1,169 dogs, 2,171 cats, and 3,682 "other " for a total of 7022 out of 35,399 or 20% overall.

These results are so horrifying they call out for action. It's bad enough when the largest single way of being released from the Orange County shelter is to be killed. In 2014 (the latest figures

available on the County website), 9,982 animals who entered Orange County shelter were killed - 3,498 of them were killed because they were "too young", which means that the staff did not have the resources to care for them. Only 7,951 got adopted, which is the second most likely way to leave the OC shelter.

Now we learn that thousands more die before they can even reach the shelter, but were picked up alive and died in transit. Though that might be expected to some degree, the farther away your home is from the one single shelter, the more your beloved pet's chances of dying in the truck.

It can be argued that some of the animals picked up by animal control were already dead, even though someone thought they were alive when they called. This would be no fault of animal control, yet if this factor accounted for a substantial number of animals, we would not find the high correlation between distance and DOA.

It can also be argued that some of the animals were alive when the County was called, but died before the animal control truck got there. That's indeed possible since animal control sometimes has to cover vast areas and their response time can be slow as a result. This can account for the high correlation but it reinforces the need for local shelters that are closer to cities, rather than the single shelter that the Supervisors are trying to build with one animal control officer handling South Orange County.

Because the data kept by the County is so poor, we can never know what's really going on. In doing our work to prepare the RFPs we got detailed information from the County but even these details had empty spaces and mis-aligned classifications, so that it's impossible to determine how many die on route, how many are actually dead when animal control arrives, etc.

The bottom line is that there is a very disturbing trend that the further away your City is from the single shelter, the more likely your animals are to arrive dead. The only plausible explanation for this is that the ability of animal control to respond quickly and the long time it takes to get an injured animal from distant areas to the single shelter are the causal factors. Alone, in a dark truck where the a/c is often inoperable, the long trip to the County shelter constitutes the last few minutes for the lives of thousands of animals. This is shameful.

The County Supervisors are hell bent on building a new single shelter which will do nothing to end this tragedy. Along with every other piece of evidence put before the Supervisors, this latest study strongly suggests that the people of Orange County are better served with regional shelters, something every other County of our size has.

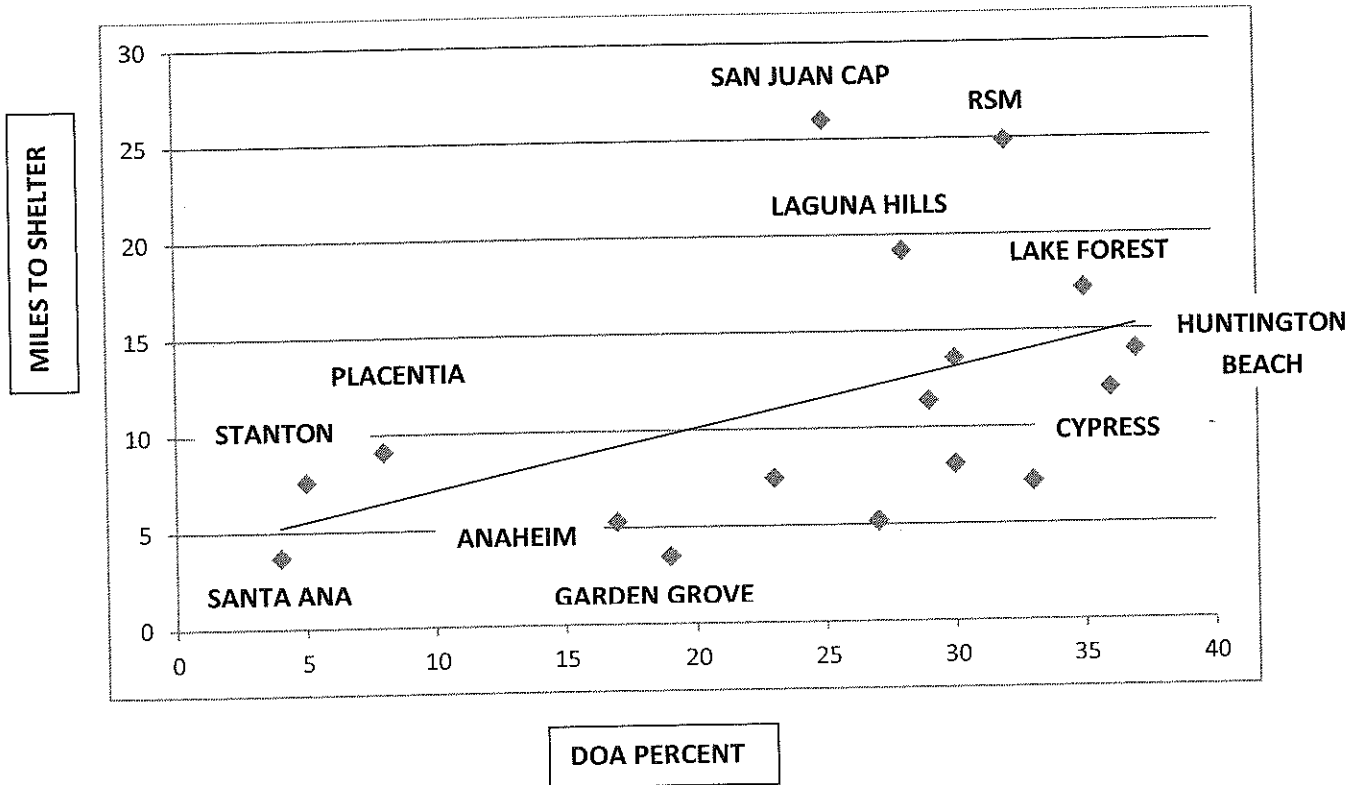

Unmasking the Data Disseminated by Orange County Animal Care

Summary

Orange County Animal Care (OCAC) is a county agency that serves 18 cities and the unincorporated areas of Orange County. They cover 1,000 square miles and take in more than 30,000 animals a year into their lone shelter, located next to the county jail in the City of Orange.

In recent years they have been harshly criticized by several Grand Juries as well as animal advocates for

- Poor leadership
- Poor management
- Manpower problems
- Training problems
- High kill rates
- Violating state law with regard to euthanasia

In looking at what OCAC actually does, discrepancies arose in how they calculate their euthanasia rates and how they calculate their licensing compliance rates. In both cases, OCAC produces numbers that favor their performance, while in actuality the numbers are much less favorable.

- Looking at euthanasia rates for dogs, OCAC claims that the rate in 2014 was 9.6%, however, they achieve this rate by using a formula unique to OCAC and not used by any other shelter. When using the formula most commonly used, their rate is 23%.
- Looking at “license compliance” rates, OCAC claims that the rate in 2014 for the City of Lake Forest (the only city checked) was 51.84%, however, OCAC used the wrong population figures and made errors in math. The correct figure is 43.5%.

Hence, OCAC over-estimates their level of compliance and under-reports their true euthanasia rate. The details for each of these calculations follow.

¹ The real figure is 1,111, but OCAC makes an error by equating the number admitted (1,444) with the number euthanized (1,373), and subtracting 1,444 from the total 2484.

² None of the 30+ shelters reviewed included DOA animals in the admission figures but OCAC uses 5,477 in their calculations to arrive at 11,987. Less than half the shelters separately considered “owner relinquished” when calculating rate. The rest used my method of total euthanized and total admitted with outcomes.

E-mail from Dr. Gardner to OCAC Director (Sep 2)

I'm surprised that the kill rate for dogs has decreased from 23% to less than 6%, 2015 vs. 2014. If so that's great. But I wonder if we are using the same numbers. Here is how I calculate the kill rate -

In 2014, 11,987 dogs were admitted of whom 925 were dead. Of the 11,062 dogs, outcomes were not available for 50 of them, leaving us 11,012 for whom there were outcomes. Of these, 2,369 were killed. That's a rate of 22% (2,369/11,012).

In 2013 the figures were -13,270 dogs admitted of whom 1,169 were dead and 53 had no outcomes. That gave 12,048 dogs of whom 2,860 were killed. That's a rate of 24% (2,860/12,048).

I am using the owner euthanized as well as the other euthanized and I am subtracting out the dead animals and the outcomes that are undetermined. I think this is the proper way to do this type of research.

Can you share your numbers?

E-mail from OCAC Director to Dr. Gardner (Sep 2)

Actually, owner surrendered euthanasia are not typically included in shelter euthanasia rates. Most shelters use the Asilomar statistics which are actually more generous in that they qualify the variables even more. Thus, many shelters quote even lower stats than OC Animal Care as, not only do they report differently, but they limit admission of animals to the shelter. The formula is dogs euthanized/(total impounds – owner requested impounds). This represents a number of animals for which the determination was made by staff, not by an owner or act of nature; a number for which we are held accountable.

For 2014, 11,987 dogs were impounded. Subtract the 1,444 owner requested euthanasia. 10,543 dogs were humanely euthanized out of the remaining 10,543 dogs or about 9.6%.

For 2015, from Jan 1 to 8/31 (what was available to me early yesterday), 7,504 dogs have been impounded. 914 were owner surrendered for the purpose of euthanasia. 394 dogs were humanely euthanized at OC Animal Care out of the remaining 6,590 dogs or about 5.9%.

This a.m., April 12, 2016, the OC Board of Supervisors approved the award of a contract, to design and build one new county animal shelter, further away from North County, to serve more than 2 million residents of Orange County, to a company which has no experience in building animal shelters.

Supervisor Spitzer thanked the staff and Supervisor Nelson “recused” himself, present and former Board of Supervisors of responsibility for the 20 year delay.

The Advisory Design Board will include people from the former FOAB committee which for at least 8 years attended monthly meetings on site at the county shelter and essentially “aided” in the neglect of the animal shelter... case in point..... 5 Orange County Grand Jury Reports.

Animal advocates have consistently and assertively been requesting oversight of the operations at the county shelter and also attendance at the “clandestine” FOAB meetings, but to no avail. (The FOAB committee was made up of mostly assistant city managers and supposedly representing the 18 contract cities.) Supervisor Spitzer asked OC Community Resources Director, Steve Franks, if the public would be engaged in the progress of the new shelter. To this Mr. Franks replied there would be “public presentations”????????!!!!

1st District Supervisor Andrew Do, who has the 2nd and 3rd cities responsible for largest amount of animals killed at the county shelter, Santa Ana, Garden Grove, was silent throughout the discussion of this agenda item.

Below is a letter from Garden Grove City Manager, Scott Stiles. But keep in mind Garden Groves Deputy City Manager, Maria Stipe, is one of the FOAB members who has been meeting monthly on site at the county animal shelter for at least the last 8 years.

At the Garden Grove City Council meeting on March 22, our staff provided an update to the City Council regarding the City's existing contract with the County of Orange for animal care services and the County's current efforts to move forward with a design-build contract to construct a new animal shelter at the former Tustin Marine Base. Accordingly, the City Council was advised that the County is requiring its partnering cities to commit to both a capital contribution and a 10-year service agreement by April 30, 2016. Following that discussion, the City Council directed the City Manager to forward the following concerns and questions to the Board of Supervisors.

As the City of Garden Grove is considering the future of animal care services, the City Council is concerned about rising program costs, the potential \$35 million cost of building a new animal shelter and the need for enhanced communication with the public. Since FY 2011-12, Garden Grove's costs have increased 79% from \$729,000 to a projected \$1,307,631 for FY 2015-16. Additionally, the City is being asked to pay 13.8% of the new animal shelter cost, adding an annual shelter payment of \$430,828 to current service costs. For FY 2016-17, Garden Grove's estimated program cost, including the new shelter payment is \$1,738,459. This is a 138% cost increase over a six-year period. Moreover, if any cities opt out of the program, we understand that costs will be reallocated based on a new percentage, potentially increasing costs further.

Although the County has provided a justification for the increase in service costs, the City's revenues have not increased accordingly and the City is struggling with a structural deficit. Therefore, the City of Garden Grove would like to understand the strategies to control the costs of animal care and procedures that would assist the City with managing future costs. For example, can the County provide adequate animal care with a less expensive shelter and can the City be assured it will be allowed to participate in the new shelter design? Also, the City of Garden Grove would benefit from data and supporting cost calculations for the uncollectable fee revenue planned to be written-off by the County and billed to the City of Garden Grove. In order for the City to manage its limited resources, the County would need to provide accurate

calculations for the uncollectable fee revenue along with supporting justification indicating Garden Grove is responsible for the debt.

The City Council also expressed concern that Orange County Animal Care could provide better communication with the residents of Garden Grove. With a community as diverse as Garden Grove, it is essential that communication and public outreach by Orange County Animal Care be conducted in English, Vietnamese, and Spanish. A more effective communication program could assist Orange County Animal Care in increasing revenues through licensing compliance and decreasing the need for field and shelter services.

Although the City of Garden Grove has generally been pleased with the services provided by the County, the steep increase in costs over a short period of time is of great concern. As the City continues to deliberate this issue, any information that offers long-term cost containment assurances will be helpful to the City Council and the staff.

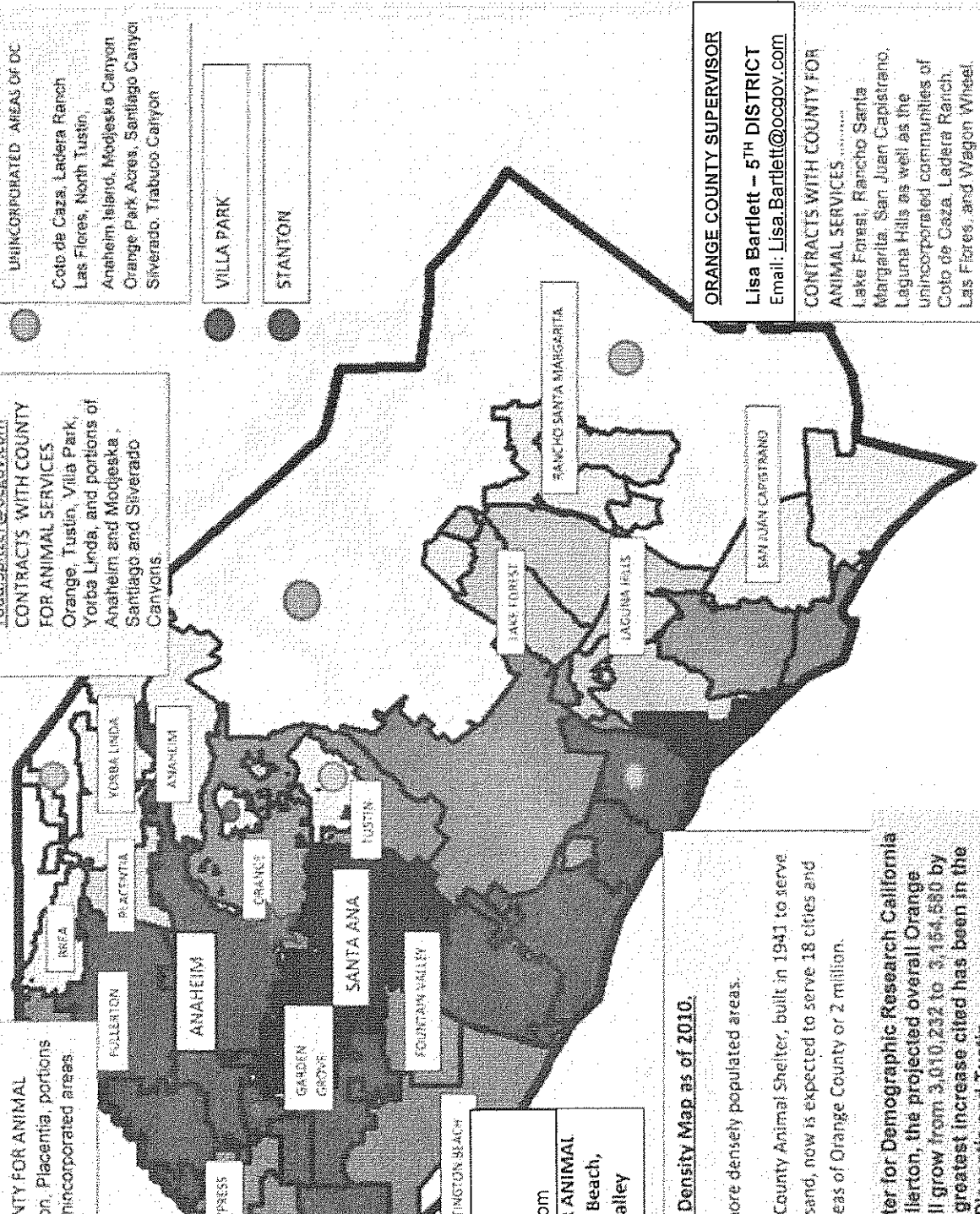

Now with the defection of Laguna Hills and RSM, the number is down to 16 and here in Lake Forest we are meeting to plan our own local shelter. I know your city is also considering a break with the County and toward that end I attached two articles.

"OCAC Data Errors Unmasked" demonstrates how the County has been lying about the euthanasia rates and the licensing compliance rates. After my articles were published, they admitted to both errors and changed the calculations for euthanasia but still haven't changed the compliance data.

"Death by Truck" demonstrates that the farther away your city is from the OC Shelter, the more likely your animals are to die while being transported.

If you have any questions, feel free to contact me.

I wish you luck in your search for a viable alternative to the OC Shelter.

Dear Mayor,

My name is Cindy Widdall and I am the lead volunteer for rabbits at the Orange County Animal Care Center for the past 2 ½ years and a resident of Garden Grove. During that time, the OC Animal Care Center has been very proactive helping to promote education and spay/neuter for rabbits.

Our euthanasia rate is extremely low because of this. We have placed thousands of rabbits into loving homes. We have also created a new Rabbitat that will be completed soon with new cages to house the rabbits. We also exercise and socialize them on a daily basis and provide them with proper diet.

We do our very best there. The dog and cat volunteers also do a terrific job there! OC Animal Care Center has events every 6 weeks it seems. These events include discounts on adoption fees, spaying/neutering, and micro-chipping. They are well attended!

In an effort to save money, Garden Grove is considering moving their contract from the OC Animal Care Center to the much smaller Orange County Humane Society in Huntington Beach on Newland Street and Pacific Coast Highway.

Taking Garden Grove animals to the OC Humane Society (with a five year contract) is NO savings for the animals. That shelter euthanizes unclaimed animals after just four days. It is what many of us would call an extremely "high kill" shelter. I am beyond concerned that Garden Grove would even dream of signing a contract with that place!

Garden Grove would be paying for this shelter to house their animals...not to help re-home them. They would be euthanized quickly after a few short days.

OC Animal Care Center tries very hard to help the animals that come into its care. It's not perfect but I continue to volunteer there for a reason! They are improving all the time and work closely with rescues and the public.

The current shelter at OC Animal Care and their future location in Tustin are both easy to get to and have freeway access whereas the OC Humane Society shelter (not so humane) is privately owned and is all the way down on PCH.

The new OC Animal Care Center will be opening in the fall of 2017 in Tustin.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Greenhouse LLC, a non-profit mutual benefit company is proposing to redevelop a 28,000 sf building located at 10451 Park Ave in the City of Garden Grove, California into a commercial medical cannabis cultivation and dispensary. The building has been on the market for purchase or for lease for close to 2 years. The 2 story industrial building with no loading docks or elevator is most suitable for cultivation, not any other heavy industrial type of business.

The facility would include commercial scale cultivation area, processing area, safe dispensing area, and some office space totaling 28,000 sq ft.

This economic impact analysis estimates the potential annual revenues associated with the proposed project and its potential effect on the City's General Fund. Currently there is a special tax on the retail sale of medical cannabis and the cultivation of medical cannabis.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ The project is designed to create local well-paid jobs and to generate a consistent source of direct revenue for the City of Garden Grove.
- ◆ The project includes a total of 28,000 sq ft of building space on 0.59 acre
- ◆ The cultivation area would operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. While the dispensary be open from 9-8 Mon-Sun.
- ◆ The proposed production capacity associated with the project would represent less than .5% of the current estimated demand in California.¹

- ◆ The estimated average production from the center would equal about 5,000 pounds of medical grade cannabis per year. The daily production rate is expected to vary between 14 pounds and 18 pounds (low and high scenarios).
- ◆ The projected wholesale price ranges from \$2,000 to \$2,500 per pound. For this analysis, we use the current wholesale market price of \$2,300 per pound.
- ◆ 75% or 21,000 sqft will be actual grow area and the dispensary, processing, and office will occupy the remainder.
- ◆ The City of Garden Grove cultivation tax will benefit \$255,000 annually from the cultivation if the city were to have similar cultivation tax as Adelanto and Desert Hot Springs which is \$25 per sf for first 3,000 sf and \$10 per sf remaining of the grow area.
- ◆ No part of the plant is wasted, thus the unsold or the trim from the plant began the extraction process for its beneficial oils.
- ◆ The Dispensary will have the potential to \$2.5 mill in sales its first year and \$16 mill annually once established. With marijuana local taxes being 10% for retail sales, this can potentially put another \$1.6 mill into the City of Garden Grove's Fund.

LOCAL ECONOMIC BENEFITS

- ◆ **Special Cannabis Tax:** The City of Desert Hot Springs could receive \$255,000 annually from the special cultivation tax proposed at \$25 & \$10.
- ◆ **Retail Sales Tax:** Other direct General Fund revenues from the facility could generate an additional \$250,000 first year and \$1,600,000 once established. Those would include utility tax, business license tax and other miscellaneous city revenues.
- ◆ **Property Tax:** Property taxes from the facility are estimated at about \$35000 per year.
- ◆ **Employment:** Total expected direct employment is about 40 jobs, or FTEs, and could be as high as 50 jobs under the high production scenario.
- ◆ **Type of Jobs:** Of these jobs, about 10 would be associated with the grow facility, 10 with the processing, and 20 in the dispensary store.

- ◆ **Wages:** Total wages and salaries are estimated at about \$1,400,000 per year; the average salary of all jobs would be about \$36,000 per year (excluding benefits).

Redevelopment

The facility will follow all state safety guidelines and environmental guidelines. All plant products will be disposed of properly, only the most efficient water system method will be used for growing of the plants. LED lighting systems will also be used.

Video cameras will be installed and monitored throughout the inside and exterior of the facility. Fencing around the building.

Legal Cannabis

- ◆ August 29, 2013 The Cole Memorandum provides guidance to United States Attorneys on the proper prioritization of marijuana enforcement in their districts given the number of states that have moved to legalize marijuana for medicinal, agricultural, or recreational use. Dear Dr. Choi,

On October 22 of last year, I sent the attached email to the mayor and city manager of Garden Grove, where I operate my massage clinic. Last year, Two marijuana dispensaries have moved into the business plaza, and my business has suffered as a result. The dispensaries are in Suite 103 and 103B(Staff?), Suite 105. I am in Suite 104, and therefore have to deal with dispensaries on both sides.

I have also emailed the Garden Grove police. The police department, however, is not able to close down the dispensaries, even though it is illegal for dispensaries to operate in the city. They could only dissuade patrons of the dispensaries by announcing (over police car loudspeakers) that the dispensaries were operating illegally. While this worked to reduce the number of patrons of the dispensaries, it also drove away clients from my business, so I asked the Garden Grove police department to stop.

Please read the attached email, and do what you can to influence the city of Garden Grove to remedy this problem. I appreciate your time and your attention in this matter.

To recapitulate:

- 1) We are experiencing disruption from the patrons of the dispensaries: littering, reckless driving, etc.
- 2) My customers' vehicles have been damaged from reckless driving in the lot. Some regular customers have not returned. We have witnesses that the damage was caused by the patrons of the dispensaries.
- 3) We have talked to the owner in person regarding these issues, without a satisfactory result.
- 4) We have emailed the owner and property manager, without a satisfactory result.
- 5) We have sent an email to the Garden Grove police department asking for help.
- 6) We have sent an email to the city manager of Garden Grove asking for help.
- 7) We have sent an email to the mayor of Garden Grove asking for help.
- 8) We have problems with a leaky roof, and brought this to the attention of the building owner; however, the needed repairs have not been completed.
- 9) My business is fully up-to-date with licensure and tax payments.

I live in the city of Irvine. Because I have been unable to resolve these issues on our own, I am seeking your help. I am even considering filing a lawsuit (against the property owner; or against the city of Garden Grove; or against both). If you are unable to help me directly with the city of Garden Grove, I would appreciate any legal advice, or your recommendation of a good lawyer to pursue this matter further.



The EPA both State and Federal register the chemicals and DO NOT CONDUCT SAFETY TESTS ON THEM - they rely on the manufacturer having one end point that acute poisoning did not happen immediately - clearly this is not a very comprehensive measure of safety. As there are no other safety tests conducted by either of the EPA's and both of their websites state the dangers of pesticides especially for children - exposure equals risk.

When - this is the statement found from the CDC - The Center for Disease Control (CDC) has said that aerial spraying for mosquitoes is the least effective method of control. Also, on October 6, 2003, the U.S. Supreme Court set an important precedence for environmental protection. The Court upheld the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals' ruling in, League of Wilderness Defenders vs. U.S. Forest Service, that aerial spraying constitutes a point source of pollution under the Clean Water Act; and, therefore, requires a National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Permit (NPDES). In defining aerial spraying as "point source" pollution, the Court has provided us with an additional tool to protect water and the rest of the environment from the detrimental impacts of aerial pesticide spraying. This may apply to mosquito spraying.

chronic (long-term) health affects, depending upon the type of pesticide and the amount of exposure. Signs of acute poisoning may include diarrhea, pinpoint pupils, rashes, nausea, headache, and vomiting. Some pesticides may cause eye, skin, or throat irritation. Chronic exposure (greater than 1 year) to some types of pesticides may aggravate asthma symptoms; other types may increase the risk for certain types of cancers and birth defects, or cause damage to the genetic and immune systems.

Infants and children may be especially sensitive to health risks posed by pesticides because their internal organs are still developing and maturing. Children eat and drink more in relation to their body weight, possibly increasing their exposure to pesticides in food and water. In addition, playing on floors or lawns or putting objects in their mouths can increase a child's exposure to pesticides used in homes and yards.

Exposure to pesticides should be avoided whenever possible. CDPH recommends that people use common sense measures, such as washing fruits and vegetables before eating and carefully following the directions on products, in order to minimize their exposure to pesticides. Remember to wash skin and clothing promptly if contact with pesticides occurs.

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Dear Mayor Nguyen,

I am writing to you regarding the issue of animal care and control services within the city of Garden Grove. I am a homeowner in Garden Grove and have worked in the animal care and control field for approximately 19 years where I have held a number of positions and assignments which have allowed me to gain a thorough understanding of what is required to run an effective program. The purpose of this letter is to hopefully bring to light just a small handful of items to consider before making this very important decision which will drastically impact the lives of our pets and the safety of our community.

I would first like to commend you and the other council members and your staff for taking the time to review the best options for our city, our residents and our pets. I understand the County is asking for a long term commitment and at an increased price. Thank you for your diligence in trying to make the best decision.

I watched the city council meeting several weeks ago where it was proposed that the city of Garden Grove start their own animal control program and contract with the Orange County Humane Society for sheltering services. I have to admit that, based on the proposal that I heard, I am extremely concerned for a number of reasons as it appears the city is grossly underestimating what goes into creating a quality program. If this program is not administered properly the city and its employees can expose themselves to a great deal of liability should the sheltering system not be maintained properly or someone is injured by an aggressive animal, for example.

First, I would like to address the grand jury report that was released approximately one year ago detailing a number of issues at OC Animal Care. I think you will find in the response a number of the items were either unfounded or included in the report due to a lack of understanding. OC Animal Care is now under new management and has seen tremendous improvement on all fronts. Yes, there were some items in the report relating to the shelter facility itself that need to be addressed. The fact is that the shelter is 75 years old and simply must be replaced. The Director of OC Animal Care has worked tirelessly and has gained the support needed to finally accomplish this monumental task. This is an accomplishment the entire county should be proud of as it will greatly benefit the animals and allow OC Animal Care the ability to provide even better service to the community.

Second, there are a number of important items it seems were left largely unaddressed in the proposal to start our own program. It has been proposed that animal control will be managed by a current Public Works supervisor and that parking enforcement will now be tasked with animal control duties. The animal care and control industry has seen dramatic change over the past 20 years. There is much more to this than just picking up friendly strays and deceased animals in the road way.

Animal control officers are not peace officers but do have full police powers when on duty. They are responsible for investigating crimes against animals which in some cases are felonies (i.e. animal cruelty and neglect), gathering and properly storing evidence and writing detailed reports that will ensure successful prosecution. Officers are responsible for preparing search and inspection warrants and working with local police and sheriff in the execution of those warrants. They issue criminal citations and are oftentimes required to provide courtroom testimony. Animal control has been a tremendous

asset to police departments because those officers are relieved of handling animal related calls. Additionally, some police officers struggle with animal related calls because they lack the in depth knowledge of proper care for the wide variety of animal species animal control comes across.

I should also mention that in criminal abuse or neglect cases where an impoundment or seizure has occurred the owner has the right to a hearing under CA Penal Code 597.1. Garden Grove, unfortunately, makes up a high percentage of these cases. Has the city considered who might be able to hear these cases and if they have the expertise in proper animal husbandry and veterinary care to do so?

Taking this very brief, yet important, description of job duties into consideration, if you decide to start your own program I not only feel but know it would be a huge mistake for public works to oversee animal control. I don't know of any agency that does this as the two have nothing to do with one another. Animal control is generally under the police department in city programs. I can't think of one time that animal control has worked with public works.

It was mentioned that a public works supervisor has already been identified and that that person will be promoted so they can develop and oversee this program. This statement alone has made it abundantly clear that the city has no idea what they are getting us residents into. Animal Control is a huge program with countless legal mandates that must be followed, huge liability issues and extremely passionate and sometimes very hostile animal right activists to contend with. Wouldn't the residents of this city be best served by opening a recruitment to find an animal control manager that is best suited for the job based on their qualifications and experience? I don't know what qualifications this mystery supervisor has but if they do not come from an animal care and control background the city will be making a grave mistake that will ultimately cost us residents and their pets.

I would like to touch on the issue of declared Potentially Dangerous and Vicious Dogs in the city of Garden Grove of which there are many. Many cities have failed to administer a solid program to address these dangerous animals. When dealing with dogs that injure or kill other animals or cause injuries to or maul humans they must be dealt with expeditiously and effectively. What we are seeing in the courts today is that animal control agencies that fail to adequately address dangerous animals are now being held liable for damages to the victim. The burden no longer lies on the attacking animal owner alone. I have yet to see an agency in Orange County with a program as robust and solid as OC Animal Care. As a resident of this city I want the assurance of knowing that my family is safe from dangerous animals. Many city run animal control programs lack the ability to effectively address and monitor these animals through regular compliance checks. Why would the city want to take on such liability? By contracting with OC Animal Care that burden is lifted as the city would be indemnified should a civil lawsuit be filed. Consider this contract an insurance policy and a valuable one considering the number of currently declared Potentially Dangerous and Vicious dogs in the city.

I'd like to address the issue of sheltering with the Orange County Humane Society. I saw in the council meeting that the city of Westminster is being used as the model for your proposed program. What was not mentioned when the question was asked about which agencies contract with the humane society was that Westminster also ended their contract with them and began their current sheltering system,

WAGS. In addition to Westminster, the city of Newport Beach recently left. If you haven't already, I encourage you to contact Westminster and Newport Beach to find out why they decided to shelter elsewhere.

OC Animal Care will offer a beautiful, state of the art shelter, very well trained and knowledgeable staff, robust programs that comply with legal mandates and all under the direction of a very well respected veterinarian, Dr. Jennifer Hawkins. Mayor Nguyen, you mentioned in the city council meeting that you would like to see more public education to cut the number of animals from Garden Grove coming into the shelter. OC Animal Care offers numerous very well publicized adoption and public education events throughout the year organized by the Community Outreach Team. They have partnered with the Anaheim Angels and Anaheim Ducks to encourage adoptions; two huge names when considering partnerships. They work collaboratively with hundreds of rescue organizations and volunteers which have helped drop the euthanasia rate for dogs to the lowest ever, 6%. They have implemented programs that have cut the euthanasia rate in cats by nearly half. A new intervention program was recently implemented where a volunteer meets with owners at the shelter intending to relinquish their pets. The volunteer has access to funds through a local non-profit group to help with whatever situation might help keep the pet in the home and out of the shelter. The list goes on.

Have you looked into how many events the humane society holds each year or how they intend to reach out specifically to the citizens of Garden Grove to educate them on responsible pet ownership and adoption as you've suggested? Do they offer trap, neuter, release programs for cats in an effort to cut euthanasia numbers in our city? Please understand that many of the animals that come from Garden Grove are not desirable to adopters. The dogs coming from the city are made up largely of Pit Bulls and Chihuahuas that without the assistance of animal rescue organizations would probably be euthanized. What is the plan for the city of Garden Grove to address no-kill and animal rights activists who are extremely passionate about this cause when the euthanasia rate of animals from Garden Grove skyrockets? Is this what we want for our pets? Please don't put a perceived cost savings above the welfare of our pets.

Another thing to consider is how a shelter the size of Orange County Humane Society will house hundreds of cats from hoarding homes, for example. One of OC Animal Care's worst cat hoarders resides in the city of Garden Grove where hundreds of cats have been seized between her two homes in the city. Do they have the capacity to hold large numbers of fighting cocks that may need to be seized? I understand OC Animal Care is currently housing over 100 cocks seized in a cock fighting case. These large scale seizures pose a unique challenge because the animals are considered evidence yet they are live animals that require care unlike traditional evidence that can be placed on a shelf in a secured warehouse. These animals are required by law to be held until the courts allow for them to be made available for adoption or euthanized or the criminal case makes its way through the court system which can take months, sometimes over a year. There have been a number of cases such as these that have literally closed down shelters due to lack of space. Others rent out temperature controlled, secured warehouse space to keep their shelters open. However, in these cases the cage space is small and there is typically no drainage which puts an incredible burden on staff that have to clean the facility and cages and on the mental state of the animals which will be forced to be housed in small quarters. Where does

the city intend to house these animals if the humane society shelter does not have space? How much additional money will this cost us?

I'm also curious to know how the council intends to monitor animal related businesses and performances to ensure animals are being treated humanely and that the public's health is not placed in danger. Many businesses including pet stores, grooming parlors, mobile groomers as well as entertainment performances that utilize animals are currently required to obtain permits and submit to regular inspections to ensure they are following the agreed upon rules and regulations that ensure both animal and human health.

These are just a small handful of things to take into consideration when determining whether or not to start a program here in Garden Grove. I could go on for many more pages as there are countless items to consider; emergency management, GIS technology that will help to cut cost and lower animal intake, etc. Councilmember Bui mentioned in the meeting that, according to his calculations, the city of Garden Grove would save approximately \$250k per year by starting their own program. I can very confidently say that as a professional in this field that is very familiar with programs in Orange County and considering what I saw in the meeting, the cost to the city is being grossly underestimated as is the impact to the police department when citizens or even the one Garden Grove animal control officer needs immediate assistance due to safety concerns and the impact to your constituents and the animals in our city who will have to deal with the repercussions of leaving one of the best programs in the state for the idea that money will be saved. The old saying is true; you get what you pay for.

In closing, we purchased our home in early 2009. We moved here from Huntington Beach and were very impressed with Garden Grove. Since that time we have seen a steady decline in our area primarily due to the increase in homelessness that is impacting everyone. We have homeless all over the place breaking into our homes and cars, leaving their trash all over the place, etc. The last thing we need is to start dealing with animal issues too because the city council decided to move away from one of the best resources available to them. Please don't try to fix what isn't broken.

I live on the boarder of Stanton and I see all the great things going on in that city. Stanton is opening a new sports complex. They are redeveloping their portion of Beach Blvd. and so on. Then I look at the Garden Grove side of the street where I see run down hotels that are housing all sorts of shady people. I no longer shop at the Wal Mart market at Beach and Garden Grove Blvd because I am fearful of my family's safety when we are there. I now leave Garden Grove for my grocery shopping. I'm left to wonder where Garden Grove is in all this and what efforts are being made to clean up and improve my part of town? Please don't add to the frustration by leaving OC Animal Care for a far inferior program. Please allow the residents and animals that come from this city to have a top quality animal care and control program and beautiful state of the art animal shelter. I understand the city had their own program at one point and went back to the County. This has happened to other cities as well. Have you researched what happened and why Garden Grove went back to the County? There had to be a good reason. You will not find a stronger program than OC Animal Care. Agencies from all over the state look to OC Animal Care for input when building programs.

There was an issue of cost brought up by the City Manager and the fact that there is no money in the budget for this contract. I don't understand why there is no budget. There has been serious talk for some time now about a new shelter being built. It seems the city should have been holding money aside just as the County has in anticipation of the new shelter. We're supposed to be seeing increased revenue from the Great Wolf Lodge. Is there no money from that project that can be allocated to a new contract with OC Animal Care?

If you do make the terrible decision to start your own program I urge you to please reconsider putting the program under Public Works. It would be most appropriate to have the police department oversee the program due to the law enforcement aspect. I would also like to reiterate the importance of hiring someone with an animal care and control background to oversee this program. There are so many things to consider. Again, as a resident of this city and a person with a great deal of experience in this arena I urge you and the other councilmembers to make the right decision and renew the contract with OC Animal Care just as several others already have.

It is imperative that the Trustee **Votes at the OC Vector Control Board meeting to not give your power away and the voice of your residents.** I understand from other Trustees on the Board that most people there go along to get along and the Board makes it not only difficult to have anyone ask questions but to present the current concerns of the residents.

OC has NEVER been sprayed they want to save a hypothetical 5 people from becoming ill - the problem is the pregnant woman and children, the people with cancer and pediatric lymphoma, asthma etc.

Doctors that spoke at the meeting last week shared that even this small quantity will have a large ill effect and consequences that undermine all of our health. It will without a doubt kill the pollinators, poison our air and water.

Did you know when they use this word it only means 4 - 5 mosquitos have been found and a dead bird? That is NOT invasive and it is NOT an epidemic, however 101 new cases of pediatric cancer a year in OC that will undoubtedly will increase after the spraying of pesticides on our children.

I pray that you stay strong and realize that you are the voice of your people in our City and NEVER give away your vote to anyone it is undemocratic and not acceptable when the stakes for our health and violation of our properties rights are under attack

The Truth About Mosquitoes and West Nile virus

While communities have good intentions, many existing policies and programs may be dangerous to children and inadequate by relying too heavily on spraying pesticides to kill adult mosquitoes.

Not All Mosquitoes Carry West Nile virus

n There are 150 different species of mosquitoes in the U.S. and only a small fraction of those actually transmit disease.

n Mosquitoes go through four stages in their life cycles – egg, larva, pupa, and adult. The complete cycle can take as little as four days or as long as one month, depending on the temperature.

- n Only adult female mosquitoes bite animals and require blood meals; males feed on the nectar of flowers.
- n West Nile virus (WNV) and St. Louis encephalitis are primarily associated with the *Culex* mosquitoes.[i]
- n Adult *Culex* females live between 2-4 weeks or more, depending on climate, species, predation, and a host of other factors. *Culex* mosquitoes are generally weak fliers and do not move far from their larval habitat, although they have been known to fly up to two miles.[ii]
- n Mosquitoes are most active at 80°F, become lethargic at 60°F, and cannot function below 50°F.[iii]

The Real Threat Of West Nile virus

- n Less than one percent of those infected with WNV will develop severe illness, according to the Centers for Disease Control.
- n A 2000 analysis of the West Nile outbreak published in the *New England Journal of Medicine* found that risk for severe illness was most closely correlated with increasing age. In the U.S., people older than 50 years and those with weakened immune systems have the highest risk of severe encephalitis.
- n Brian Rogers, D.O., MPH, City of Fort Worth Health Authority states "The risk of becoming seriously ill and dying from West Nile is extremely minimal. Fewer than 1 percent of mosquitoes in areas where the virus has been found actually carry the virus."
- n According to the Centers for Disease Control, West Nile virus infected .0017% of Mississippi's population, one of the hardest hit states in 2002, and only .008% in the hardest hit county.[iv]
- n The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services states, "Contrary to media descriptions of 'the deadly West Nile virus,' [it] is rarely fatal in humans. Less than one percent of people who acquire the disease will experience severe illness. Within this small proportion, the fatality rate is about 3-15%."
- n Most people that become infected will have mild symptoms that include fever, head and body aches, skin rash and swollen lymph glands. It may take 3 to 15 days for any of these symptoms to show.
- n A person who has been infected with WNV is likely to have life-long immunity to the disease whether or not they showed symptoms.[v]

Pesticide Spray Programs Are Ineffective

- n The Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) state that spraying adulticides, pesticides intended to kill adult mosquitoes, is usually the least efficient mosquito control technique.[vi]
- n Adulticiding programs spray pesticides indiscriminately and do not get at the mosquitoes until they have matured and are biting.
- n Adulticides do not restrict or control mosquitoes from continue to breed.
- n Mosquitoes develop resistance to chemical pesticides over time, which render the chemicals ineffective and have an increased prevalence of the virus within their bodies.[vii]
- n A 2003 study finds that mosquitoes carrying West Nile virus and malaria are resistant to organophosphate and carbamate insecticides. The study shows that the resistance is a result of a single genetic mutation.[viii]

- n According to David Pimentel, Ph.D., an entomologist at Cornell University, close to 99.9 % of sprayed chemicals go off into the environment where they can have detrimental effects on public health and ecosystems, leaving 0.10% to actually hit the target pest.[ix]
- n Ray Parsons, Ph.D., a medical entomologist and assistant director for the Houston, Texas Mosquito Control Division says it is difficult to determine the effectiveness of pesticide spraying because there are currently no accurate means of measuring *Culex* mosquito populations.[x] Therefore, scientists cannot accurately determine what percentage of the population has decreased after spraying.

Pesticide Spray Programs Affect Public Health and the Environment

- n The U.S. EPA warns that “no pesticide is 100 percent safe.”[xi]
- n A study conducted by the National Research Council found that pregnant women, infants, and children have a greater risk of getting sick from pesticides.[xii]

<p>Synthetic pyrethroids, which include resmethrin (Scourge) and sumithrin (Anvil), are adulticides patterned after pyrethrum, yet have been chemically engineered to have greater toxicity and longer breakdown times.[xiii] Additionally, almost all synthetic pyrethroid mosquito products are combined with synergists, which increase potency and compromise the human body's ability to detoxify the pesticide.</p>	<p>n According to the New York State Department of Health, more people were reported to have gotten sick from pesticide spraying than from exposure to WNV in 2000.[xvi]</p> <p>n Adulticides present considerable risk to all living things, and kill beneficial insects and natural mosquitoes predators, [xvii] such as dragonflies, damselflies, and beetles, potentially increasing the number of mosquitoes.</p> <p>n Additionally, mosquitoes that survive the spraying may become resistant, longer-lived, more aggressive, and have an increased prevalence of the virus within their bodies.[xviii]</p> <p>n Brian Rogers, D.O., MPH, City of Fort Worth Health Authority states that Fort Worth has a high rate of Asthma Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease and other respiratory disorders and therefore believes that “Spraying for mosquitoes would harm more people than it would help.”</p> <p>n New York State Department of Health, during or after a widespread aerial or ground spraying of adulticides, states that adverse health outcomes might include acute asthma attacks, other respiratory problems, and/or dermatological problems.[xix]</p>
<p>Symptoms of exposure include: dermatitis and asthma-like reactions, nasal stuffiness, headache, nausea, incoordination, tremors, convulsions, facial flushing and swelling, and burning and itching sensations.[xiv] Synthetic pyrethroids are endocrine disruptors and have been linked to breast cancer.[xv] Deaths due to exposure have resulted from to respiratory failure. People with asthma and pollen allergies should be</p>	<p>n Synthetic pyrethroids, used widely across the country for mosquito control, are neurotoxic and have been linked to cancer. Children with respiratory problems, such as asthma, are particularly vulnerable to these pesticides and will suffer disproportionately from exposure.</p> <p>n On June 26, 2001, <i>The Post Star</i> reported that 37 young ball players and spectators at a softball game in upstate New York were sent to the hospital after being poisoned by a pesticide being sprayed behind the ballfield to control mosquitoes that could be carrying the West Nile virus. According to Moreau Emergency Squad Captain Andre Delvaux, the Tree Care by Stan Hunt Company was applying Fyfanon ULV, a pesticide containing the organophosphate malathion, near the baseball field while a game was in progress.</p> <p>n A recent study by Duke University researchers found that combined exposure to DEET (N,N-diethyl-m-toluamide) and permethrin could lead to motor deficits and learning and memory dysfunction.[xx]</p>

especially cautious. Breakdown times range from a few hours in direct sunlight, to several months in damp, dark environments.

- n In 1998, EPA rejected "child safety" claims for DEET products and requires all to be removed from existing products. [xxi]
- n DEET is quickly absorbed through the skin and has caused effects ranging from large blisters to brain damage in children, with three deaths in the last 40 years tied to exposure.

Organophosphates, which include **malathion (Fyfanon)**, **naled (Dibrom)** and **chlorpyrifos (Mosquitomist)**, are a highly toxic class of pesticides that affect the central nervous, cardiovascular and respiratory systems. **Symptoms of exposure** include: numbness, tingling sensations, headache, dizziness, tremors, nausea, abdominal cramps, sweating, incoordination, blurred vision, [xxii] difficulty breathing, slow heartbeat, unconsciousness, incontinence, convulsions and fatality. [xxiii] Some organophosphates have been linked to birth defects and cancer. Breakdown times range from a few days in direct sunlight, to several months in damp, dark environments.

Safer Mosquito Management Strategies

- n The first step in managing mosquitoes should be to remove any and all potential breeding areas – anyplace that water collects and is slow

moving or standing water.

- n If mosquitoes do breed, larvaciding (killing mosquitoes in their larvae stage) allows control measures to be used in targeted areas, while mosquito larvae are still concentrated in breeding pools and before adult mosquitoes spread throughout the community.
- n Use herbal repellents that contain cedarwood, garlic, lemongrass, frankincense, cinnamon, geranium, eucalyptus, basil, rosemary, cloves, peppermint, lemon balm (citronella), onions, feverfew, thyme, neem oil, and/or merigold.
- n Prevent mosquito populations by maintaining window screens and keeping doors closed; removing or regularly draining all water-retaining objects such as tin cans, buckets, holes in trees, clogged gutters and down spouts, old tires, birdbaths, trash can lids and shallow fishless ponds. Stock permanent water pools, such as ornamental ponds with mosquito larvae eating fish. Fix dripping outside water faucets. Enhance the drainage of flood canals, irrigation ditches and fields; keep street gutters and catch basins free of debris and flowing properly.
- n Monitoring includes checking ponds and sources of water for signs of mosquito larvae.
- n *Bacillus thuringiensis var. israelensis* is one of the most popular and most effective least hazardous biological controls. It is a bacterial strain that, when sprayed into larval pools, is ingested by feeding larvae and kills them. (Mosquito Dunks™ can be bought at local lawn and garden stores or on-line a www.realgoods.com or www.groworganic.com. The dunks are safer for birdbaths, rain barrels, ponds, ditches, tree holes, roof gutters, etc. – anywhere water collects.)
- n The Mosquito Magnet, a machine much like a gas grill, burns propane gas that sends out a plume of carbon dioxide, which attracts mosquitoes that are then sucked in and killed. One magnet can control adult mosquitoes over an acre of land, though different levels of success have been reported. (See www.mosquitomagnet.com or call American Biophysics Corp at 877-699-8727.)
- n Vegetable based horticultural oils are effective in killing larvae in water and sinking egg rafts on the surface. They also can kill non-target organisms including some mosquito predators that breathe from the surface.

Communities That Have Adopted Safer Mosquito and WNV Management Programs

- n The City of **Lyndhurst, Ohio**, a suburb of Cleveland, passed a landmark ordinance on July 7, 2003 prohibiting the spraying of pesticides "in an effort to help control the spread of the West Nile virus." The City's action follows a

community forum in which a panel of experts discussed the hazards and the lack of efficacy associated with the spraying of adulticides. The City Council stated, "[T]here is substantial belief that the more effective way of controlling the mosquito population is by larvacide treatment and thorough education of the City's residents regarding methods and procedures to minimize exposure to the virus." In adopting the ordinance, the Council found that "the risk/benefit analysis conducted by experts clearly indicates that the dangers of WNV are minimal and affect a very small segment of the population and that the long-term health and environmental risks of spraying with synthetic pesticides poses a much greater risk." [xxiv] (A copy of the policy can be found at www.beyondpesticides.org/mosquito.)

- n In **York County, Virginia**, officials are distributing fish that eat mosquito larvae and pupae to residents in order to decrease pesticides used for mosquito control, according to *The Virginia Gazette*. Several thousand of these fish, *Gambusia holbrooki*, or mosquito fish, have been bred by the county's fishery as part of its mosquito prevention program. So far, county officials have provided 50 to 60 fish to residents and stocked retention ponds and other areas with standing water large enough for the fish to survive. In order to control mosquitoes that breed in small containers such as birdbaths, old tires, and buckets, local officials are sending out an information card to all its residents on the necessity of preventing mosquito breeding grounds.

- n In **Dallas, Texas**, the City Council's Health, Environment and Human Services Committee adopted a mosquito control plan in 2003, which calls for more public education and allows the use of pesticide sprays as a last resort and on the approval of the council members, according to the *Dallas Morning News*. Preventing mosquito breeding grounds and killing mosquito larvae with natural bacterium, *Bacillus thuringensis*, is the heart of the new plan. A West Nile virus infected bird, mosquito, or horse is not a trigger to spray pesticides, but a trigger to increase outreach to community residents. The policy also establishes a city fine of up to \$2,000 for any property owner who ignores stagnant water.

- n **Washington, DC** health officials continue their no spray policy stating that pesticide spraying is inappropriate in a heavily populated area with many asthma patients according to a Washington Post article. Instead, officials are focusing on prevention through larviciding and public education.

- n According to the **Ft. Worth, Texas** Department of Public Health, city officials there have not sprayed for mosquitoes since 1991. Health officials say there are many reasons including the questionable effectiveness of insecticides and the negative impacts they pose to the environment. Brian Boerner, director of Environmental Management, states that, "the spraying of chemicals also has the potential of contaminating our waterways, killing the beneficial fish and organisms that feed on mosquito larva, adding harmful volatile organic chemicals to the atmosphere—a precursor chemical to ozone formation—and providing a potential inhalation or ingestion hazard to residents who are in affected areas shortly after spraying occurs."

- n In February 2003, **Seattle, Washington** adopted an Integrated Pest Management Plan for Mosquito Control, which outlines the City's general approach to managing the risks to human health and the environment from mosquito-borne diseases and mosquito control options. According to the plan, "The premise of the plan is that the most effective and appropriate techniques for the City to use to manage these risks are to reduce mosquito bites by providing education and personal protection advice to City employees and to reduce mosquito breeding habitat on City property. When determined appropriate, the City will consider using larvicides to control mosquitoes on City-owned property."

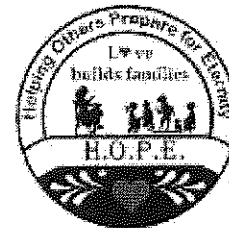

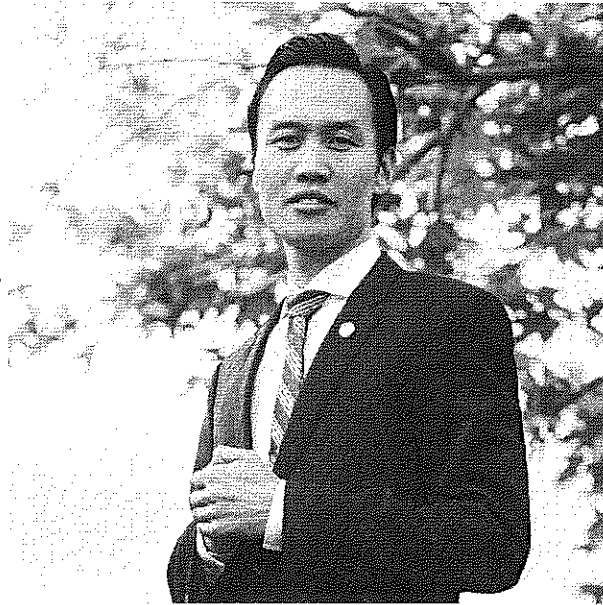

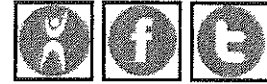

Good morning Maria,

On Wednesday, April 13th, the applicant held a neighborhood meeting, with City Staff in attendance observing, regarding their proposed funeral home (with on-site cremation). Eight (8) persons from the public showed up to the meeting. The citizens who showed up represented (mostly) each of the property owners who directly abut the subject site at the rear. They are all single-family home owners in the R-1 (Single-Family Residential) zone. All eight persons voiced the same sole concern, which was superstition related, and a fear of living next to dead bodies/ghosts. None of them had any environmental/health concerns.

Following the meeting, in the past week, I have received some calls/emails from other nearby property owners who are voicing additional concerns related to health (i.e., emissions of from burning of bodies and more specifically, the mercury from teeth fillings/crowns).

I just spoke to a property owner, Mr. Chu Tran, who spoke of his concerns related to a fear of ghosts as well as environmental/health concerns. He stated he was in the process of putting together a petition on change.org with attention to Bao Nguyen and Janet Nguyen.

I also just spoke to another property owner, Mrs. Margaret Fuentes, who stated she was in process of reaching out to the OC Register including Loretta Sanchez, and anyone else she could, to garner enough attention on the matter to oppose the project. Mrs. Fuentes' concerns were primarily environmental/health related.

The item is currently scheduled for the May 19, 2016, Planning Commission meeting.

Noteworthy facts so far:

- an initial study for the Mitigated Negative Declaration has been prepared by the applicant. The lone mitigation measure, recommended by the environmental consultant, includes the following: "All emissions controls present on the cremator must be inspected on a weekly basis to ensure that the cremator and its ancillary emissions and operational equipment are in perfect working order."
- A parking study was conducted to demonstrate that the subject site provides sufficient parking to accommodate the projected parking demand generated by the proposed funeral home.
- The applicant is preparing their HRA (Health Risk Assessment) report for submittal to SCAQMD (Southern California Air Quality Management District) for their review and approval.

- The applicant noted that it is their practice as well as existing CA law that requires that all metals (gold/silver/etc.), pacemakers, any any foreign objects in a person's body to be removed prior to being placed in a cremation chamber. Thus, there would be no burning of or emissions of mercury, or any other foreign substances. The applicant will be forwarding me documentation confirming this. However, I just made contact with the California Cemetery and Funeral Bureau (of the Department of Consumer Affairs), and he stated that there is no existing CA law that requires the removal of the aforementioned foreign items from a person's body, except for typically a pacemaker. He stated that any burning of gold or silver from dental fillings/crowns would produce emissions that are negligible, which is why CA law does not prohibit this act. I found an excerpt from the CA Health and Safety Code, which states: "Dental gold or silver, jewelry, or mementos, to the extent that they can be identified, **may** be removed by the employee prior to final processing if the equipment is such that it will not process these materials." However, as previously mentioned, the applicant has stated that it is their practice to remove all such items prior to cremation. From a Planning standpoint, I believe we can also add as a Condition of Approval requiring the removal of foreign metals/substances from a person's body prior to cremation.

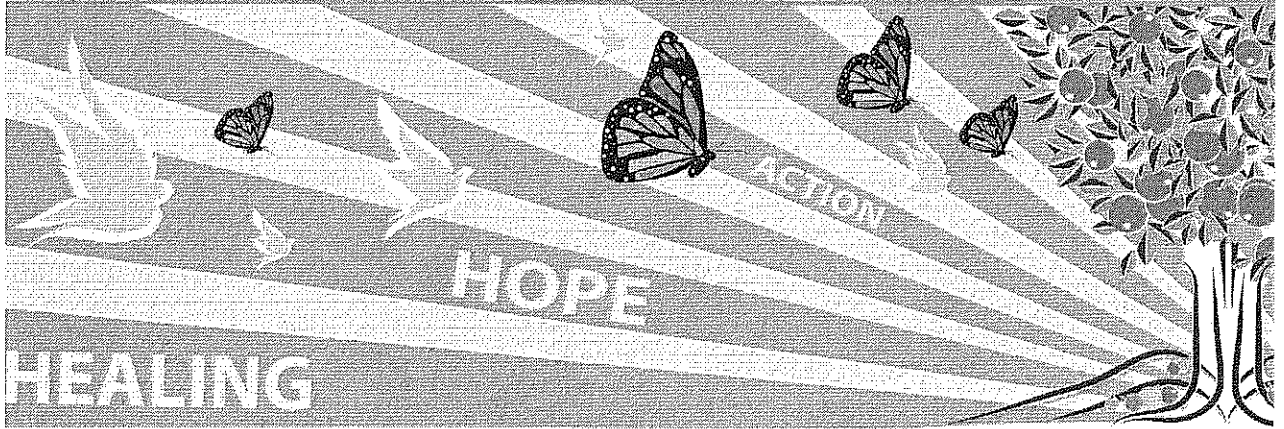

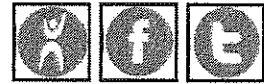

Good morning Maria,

On Wednesday, April 13th, the applicant held a neighborhood meeting, with City Staff in attendance observing, regarding their proposed funeral home (with on-site cremation). Eight (8) persons from the public showed up to the meeting. The citizens who showed up represented (mostly) each of the property owners who directly abut the subject site at the rear. They are all single-family home owners in the R-1 (Single-Family Residential) zone. All eight persons voiced the same sole concern, which was superstition related, and a fear of living next to dead bodies/ghosts. None of them had any environmental/health concerns.

Following the meeting, in the past week, I have received some calls/emails from other nearby property owners who are voicing additional concerns related to health (i.e., emissions of from burning of bodies and more specifically, the mercury from teeth fillings/crowns).

I just spoke to a property owner, Mr. Chu Tran, who spoke of his concerns related to a fear of ghosts as well as environmental/health concerns. He stated he was in the process of putting together a petition on change.org with attention to Bao Nguyen and Janet Nguyen.

I also just spoke to another property owner, Mrs. Margaret Fuentes, who stated she was in process of reaching out to the OC Register including Loretta Sanchez, and anyone else she could, to garner enough attention on the matter to oppose the project. Mrs. Fuentes' concerns were primarily environmental/health related.

The item is currently scheduled for the May 19, 2016, Planning Commission meeting.

Noteworthy facts so far:

- an initial study for the Mitigated Negative Declaration has been prepared by the applicant. The lone mitigation measure, recommended by the environmental consultant, includes the following: "All emissions controls present on the cremator must be inspected on a weekly basis to ensure that the cremator and its ancillary emissions and operational equipment are in perfect working

order."

- A parking study was conducted to demonstrate that the subject site provides sufficient parking to accommodate the projected parking demand generated by the proposed funeral home. - The applicant is preparing their HRA (Health Risk Assessment) report for submittal to SCAQMD (Southern California Air Quality Management District) for their review and approval.

- The applicant noted that it is their practice as well as existing CA law that requires that all metals (gold/silver/etc.), pacemakers, any any foreign objects in a person's body to be removed prior to being placed in a cremation chamber. Thus, there would be no burning of or emissions of mercury, or any other foreign substances. The applicant will be forwarding me documentation confirming this. However, I just made contact with the California Cemetery and Funeral Bureau (of the Department of Consumer Affairs), and he stated that there is no existing CA law that requires the removal of the aforementioned foreign items from a person's body, except for typically a pacemaker. He stated that any burning of gold or silver from dental fillings/crowns would produce emissions that are negligible, which is why CA law does not prohibit this act. I found an excerpt from the CA Health and Safety Code, which states: "Dental gold or silver, jewelry, or mementos, to the extent that they can be identified, **may** be removed by the employee prior to final processing if the equipment is such that it will not process these materials." However, as previously mentioned, the applicant has stated that it is their practice to remove all such items prior to cremation. From a Planning standpoint, I believe we can also add as a Condition of Approval requiring the removal of foreign metals/substances from a person's body prior to cremation.

Dear City Council Member:

OC Animal Care has a whole department that is dedicated to getting homes for the animals from your city and providing public education, a rescue coordinator and community advertising for your pets. They also have a new intervention program to help keep owner's from turning their pets into the shelter. OC Animal Care has also recently started hosting monthly mobile spay/neuter clinic to help citizens get their pets sterilized and vaccinated at a greatly discounted fees. OC Animal Care is one of the top agencies in animal control. They have a very dedicated professional staff to care for your animals and take care of your city's needs.

OC Humane is a very old facility that will not likely be changing much. The owner and veterinarian, Dr Botros has been investigated for charges concerning neglect and letting untrained people perform medical procedures illegally to the animals in his care. Their staff has also had many complaints, including people not being able to call in to ask about their pet, due to full mail boxes on the phone. That information is public knowledge and very concerning. His contract with Newport Beach AC was cancelled due to his negligence of animals and mishandling of funds. It was found that he was keeping adoption funds that should have been given to the City of Newport Beach to offset their costs. He does not appear to be a reputable business man. If you choose to go with him, I would make sure your contract is very detailed. There have also been some concerns that he was overcharging Newport Beach for veterinary care. I have included a document regarding the end of the contract between him and the City of Newport Beach. 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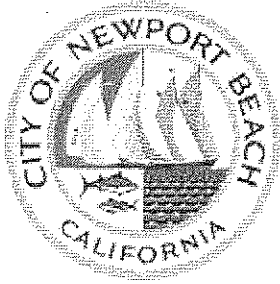

SUBJECT: Performance Audit of the Orange County Humane Society
Review Period: July 1, 2012 through September 15, 2015

This performance audit was conducted at the request of Carol Jacobs, the Assistant City Manager. While the Orange County Humane Society management was considering its responses to the audit findings and recommendations, the City terminated its Agreement with the Contractor due to performance issues. The audit identifies the performance concerns that lead to the termination of the Agreement.

SUMMARY

- The Contractor is not in compliance with the provisions of the animal sheltering services in the Agreement Scope of Services. The Contractor should hire a full-time Shelter Coordinator to manage the shelter.

- The Contractor does not follow vaccination and parasite control best practices. The Contractor should follow best practices of vaccinating and administering parasite treatment upon intake, in order to provide the best possible care and treatment for the animals.
- The Contractor is not in compliance with the spay and neutering requirements of the California Food and Agricultural Code §30503. The Agricultural Code recommends, “spaying or neutering all animals at the time of adoption, or require adopters to get their animals sterilized soon after placement.”
- The Contractor does not have a sanitation plan with written policies and procedures for employees to follow. The Shelter Coordinator should evaluate shelter operations and develop a sanitation plan that is based on best practices.
- The Contractor is not following the record keeping and billing requirements of the Agreement (Agreement §4 and Scope of Services §4.6). The Contractor should comply with the recordkeeping terms of the Agreement.
- The Contractor has retained City impound fees collected rather than remitting the fees to the City. The City should consider revising the Agreement to clarify that the impound fee should be remitted to the City and consider billing the Contractor for the impound fees he has retained.
- The Contractor is charging sales tax on tax exempt adoptions. The Contractor should discontinue charging sales tax on adoptions.

BACKGROUND

The City of Newport Beach (“City”) and Orange County Humane Society (“Contractor”), a California non-profit corporation, entered into an Agreement for Professional Services (“Agreement”) with on April 26, 2011, to provide dog licensing services and facilities for receiving, sheltering, adoption, and caring for impounded animals.

The Contractor receives a monthly base contract rate for the administrative costs of operating the animal shelter, boarding of animals, basic medical care, euthanasia, and disposal of euthanized animals. The base contract rate is increased by 3.0% annually on the anniversary of the commencement date of the Agreement. The current base monthly contract rate is \$7,878.56. The total base monthly contract rate paid since 2011 is approximately \$390,817.

The Contractor bills the City for any non-emergency medical care requested by Animal Control Officers to be performed above and beyond those non-emergency medical care services that are included in the base monthly contract rate. Per the negotiated terms of the Agreement, all non-emergency medical care billed to the City is charged at 40% off the normal rate. Medical care is provided by AAA Animal Hospital located adjacent to the Contractor. AAA Animal Hospital has received \$20,681 from the City and approximately \$31,672 from the Pick A Pet

program in medical cost reimbursement for impounded animals. Over the course of the three fiscal years, the City has paid approximately \$411,488 for sheltering and caring for impounded animals.

During the last three fiscal years, the Contractor provided care and boarding for approximately 1,182 dogs and cats. Exhibit 1 shows the disposition of dogs and cats from FY 2013 through FY 2015. Seventy three percent of the animals impounded were adopted or returned to owners. In addition to adoptions, Animal Control Officers partner with twelve rescue groups for dogs and cats and special rescue groups such as Bunny Bunch, OC Reptile Rescue, California Turtle and Tortoise Club and Farm Sanctuary for placement of other animals received at the shelter.

OBJECTIVES, SCOPE AND METHODOLOGY

Objective

The objectives of the audit were to determine if payments for services were properly calculated and billed; that the service levels required by the Agreement were provided and whether the Contractor complied with best practices in animal sheltering.

Scope

The Contractor's shelter activities from July 2012 through September 2015 were reviewed. Patient records requested to verify that animals received the medical procedures and treatments paid for by the City and the Pick A Pet Program were not provided.

Methodology

To accomplish our audit objectives, the following steps were performed:

- conducted interviews with City of Newport Beach Animal Control Officers and the Contractor's management and staff;
- reviewed state regulations, best practices and guidelines for standards of care in animal shelters;
- visited and observed shelter cleaning and animal feeding practices;
- compared the Contractor's policies with best practices guidelines established by the Association of Shelter Veterinarians and the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) Guidelines for Animal Shelter Policies;
- reconciled City payments to the Contractor and estimated revenues generated by animals impounded by the City.

Audit Results

Finding 1: The Contractor is not in compliance with the provisions of the animal sheltering services in the Agreement Scope of Services.

The Contractor does not have a full time Shelter Coordinator on-site to manage the shelter and coordinate the animal sheltering services as required by the Agreement (Scope of Services §4.3). The AAA Animal Hospital Office Manager is designated as the Shelter Coordinator, but the hospital Office Manager is not responsible for the daily operational matters of the shelter. The day to day operational management of the shelter is the responsibility of shelter employees who are mainly responsible for the cleaning of the kennels and cages and the feeding of the animals. Two to three part time employees staff the shelter office, maintain records on animals in the shelter, help with adoption paperwork and sell City dog licenses. The absence of a full-time Shelter Coordinator who is accountable and responsible for the management of the shelter has resulted in employees engaging in the unacceptable practices while caring for the animals.

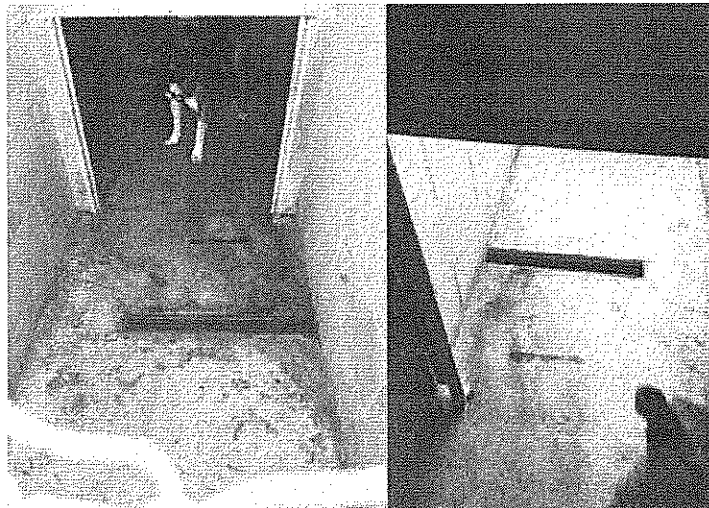
On September 15, 2015, the Contractor received a Notice of Default from the Newport Beach Police Department ("Police Dept.") regarding the issues of the shelter not accepting owner relinquished cats and the cleaning and maintaining of the dog kennels. Best practices for cleaning kennels and cages, published in the 2010, "Guidelines for Standards of Care in Animal Shelters", require "animals to be removed from the cage or kennel, or separated from the area being cleaned by guillotine doors to prevent splatter, soaking of animals and stress. It is an unacceptable practice to spray down kennels or cages while animals remain inside them."

The kennels in the Animal Control portion of the shelter do not have guillotine doors to shield the animals from the water when the kennels are sprayed down. Animal Control officers stated that the animals are not removed from the Animal Control kennels and guillotine doors are not used in the Contractor's kennels when cleaning is taking place. Animal Control Officers frequently found animals soaked or placed in wet kennels. In the written response, from the Contractor following the Notice of Default, the Contractor acknowledged best practices for the cleaning of the kennels and the use of the guillotine doors that allow the kennel to be cleaned without removing the dog. Immediately following the first Notice of Default letter, best practices were not being consistently followed by shelter employees. Animal Control Officers continue to

find wet dogs and kennels. The Contractor received a second Notice of Default regarding the failure to implement corrective action for the two issues of concern.

The Contractor's shelter facility has conditions that may cause injury to the dogs or promote the spread of disease. Thirty three of the sixty four dog kennels are missing grates over the drainage channels. The missing grates, as shown in Exhibit 2, provide an unsafe gap, running two-thirds the width of the kennel, that could cause trauma to the dog's feet and legs if the animal accidentally stepped into the gap. The uncovered drainage channels also create an unsanitary condition for the dogs when solid waste is trapped in the gap. Water bowls, in the Animal Control kennels, are attached by screws to the cage door. The fixed water bowls may contribute to the spread of disease among animals placed in the kennel, if the bowls are not disinfected properly.

Finding 2: The Contractor is not following best practices of vaccinating and treating animals for parasites upon intake at the shelter to prevent transmission of diseases. The Contractor is out of compliance with California Food and Agricultural Code §30503.

The Contractor does not follow best practices in the "Guidelines for Standards of Care in Animal Shelters" regarding vaccinations, parasite control, and surgical sterilization to reduce animal populations, as shown in Exhibit 3. The guidelines state that, generally, animals in shelters should be vaccinated and treated for parasites upon intake because shelter animals are at a high risk of contracting diseases and parasites due to exposure to unvaccinated and unhealthy animals. The Contractor's shelter policy is to vaccinate and treat animals for parasites when the animal is adopted and the adoption fees are paid or at the time an animal develops symptoms of parasite infestation. The policy to treat animals when released from the shelter, rather than upon entering the shelter, increases the probability that healthy animals will contract parasites and diseases. Parasite infestation, along with a lack of sanitation protocols at the shelter, creates an unhealthy environment for the animals and for public health. OCHS is reimbursed for vaccines and parasite treatments from adoption fees negotiated by the City. The adoption

packages include feline core vaccines (FVRCP) for cats, and core vaccines (DHPP and Bordatella for dogs, a rabies vaccine, and two intestinal de-worming treatments.

The best practices for spay and neutering in the "Guidelines for Standards of Care in Animal Shelters" state that "animal shelters should require that cats and dogs who are adopted into homes be spayed or neutered...including kittens and puppies as young as six weeks old. Sterilization remains the most reliable and effective means of preventing unwanted reproduction of cats and dogs and decreasing birth rates." The HSUS minimum standards for an animal shelter also recommend, "spaying or neutering all animals at the time of adoption, or require adopters to get their animals sterilized soon after placement."

In order to decrease the number of unwanted pets in shelters, the State of California adopted Food and Agriculture Code §30503 prohibiting a "public animal control agency or shelter, society for the prevention of cruelty to animals shelter, humane society shelter, or rescue group from selling, or giving away, to a new owner any dog that has not been spayed or neutered." Code §30503 allows an exception to the spay/neutering requirement "...if a licensed California veterinarian certifies that an animal is too sick, injured, or detrimental to the animal's health to be spayed or neutered at the time of adoption." In these cases, the shelter is required to collect a deposit, between \$40 and \$75, from the adopter. The deposit is returnable, once the animal is certified to be healthy by a veterinarian and spayed/neutered within two weeks of the certification.

The Contractor is not in compliance with the California Food and Agriculture Code §30503. The Contractor does not spay or neuter any animal less than six months old and does not collect the State required refundable deposit from the adopter. If an animal is less than six months old, the adopter receives a spay/neuter voucher to return to the AAA Animal Hospital once the animal is at least six months old. The voucher program effectiveness requires consistent tracking, the sending of reminders and following up by the Shelter Coordinator with the owners of adopted animals who left the shelter without being spayed or neutered. The shelter does not have a Shelter Coordinator on staff to manage the voucher program.

Finding 3: The Contractor does not have a sanitation plan with written policies and procedures for employees to follow.

The shelter does not have written policies or procedures instructing employees on how to clean and disinfect the shelter. Ideally, the Shelter Coordinator would be responsible for developing a sanitation plan with policies and procedures to minimize the spread of disease to the animals and to the people who care for them. The Contractor does not have a designated Shelter Coordinator on-site to provide oversight over the cleaning and disinfection practices employed by shelter staff. The potential impact to the shelter of failing to establish sanitation protocols is a higher percentage of sick animals that are unavailable for adoption and require veterinary care.

Last August, the Contractor had a major ringworm outbreak that spread through the shelter's cat population and to several animal caretakers. The outbreak caused the euthanization of several affected cats and the shelter's cat adoption program to shut down for weeks. As a result, the Contractor stopped accepting owner relinquished cats. On September 30, 2015, the Police Dept. sent the Contractor a Notice of Default regarding its refusal to accept owner relinquished cats. In the Contractor's response letter, dated October 6, 2015, the Contractor acknowledged that the shelter was only accepting owner relinquished cats under special circumstances due to the ringworm outbreak. Ten cats in the shelter were still infected with ringworm, a condition that the Contractor stated, "usually takes weeks to months to resolve completely...and can be transmitted through fomites, which makes environmental decontamination essential." A fomite is any object, such as surfaces, towels, clothing, feeding dishes, litter boxes, hands and soap, which is capable of transmitting infectious organisms from one individual to another. Animal sheltering literature confirms that controlling a ringworm outbreak requires a stringent sanitation plan of repeated disinfections and environmental testing for the fungus.

Finding 4: The Contractor is not in compliance with the record keeping and billing requirements of the Agreement (Agreement §4.0 and Scope of Services §4.6).

The Contractor has not complied with the minimum recordkeeping requirement of maintaining monthly reports of the number of City animals processed through the shelter, the disposition of animals, City fees collected and records of licenses sold. For the purposes of this review, City staff relied on Animal Control Impound Logs to determine the number of animals that were processed through the shelter and to estimate the revenue generated by City animals brought to the shelter.

The Agreement Schedule of Billing Rates requires the Contractor to provide a monthly summary sheet listing the charges for each fee and service. The Contractor has not provided the monthly summaries for the review period. The Contractor provides an invoice for the base monthly fee and an invoice for the medical services provided by AAA Animal Hospital. The base monthly fee invoice is submitted in the current month rather than in the month following the work performed. The City has paid the Contractor one month early in thirty seven out of fifty two months the Agreement has been in effect.

City staff overpaid the Contractor \$495 in error for an invoice for medical services. The Contractor bills the City at 40% discount of the Contractor's standard medical service price. City staff accidentally paid the non-discounted price to the Contractor.

Sick and injured animals received medical treatment on a case by case basis from the AAA Animal Hospital. Medical services, requested by Police Dept., were above and beyond the non-emergency medical care services included in the base monthly fee. AAA Animal Hospital has received \$20,681 from the City and approximately \$31,672 from the Pick A Pet program in medical cost reimbursements. The Contractor did not provide patient records requested for the testing of medical procedures invoiced. We are unable to determine if the animals received the medical care and medications invoiced.

Finding 5: The Contractor has retained the impound fees collected rather than remitting the fees to the City.

The current Agreement does not clearly state that impound fees should be remitted to the City. The City impound fee is for the cost recovery of Animal Control Officer's time expended in catching and transporting an animal to the shelter. Estimated impound fees of \$15,680, collected by the Contractor, have not been remitted to the City. The Contractor did not provide the records of actual impound fees collected. Impound fees were estimated based on the number of animals impounded between July 1, 2012 and September 2015.

Finding 6: The Contractor is charging sales tax on tax exempt adoptions.

The Contractor is charging sales tax on adoptions. Adoptions by non-profit animal welfare organizations are exempt from sales tax as stated in Exhibit 4 (§6010.40 of the California Sales and Use Tax Law). City residents have overpaid for the animal adoptions.

State Board of Equalization Sales and Use Tax Law for Pet Adoptions**

"6010.40. "Sale" and "purchase"; pet adoptions. "Sale" and "purchase," for the purpose of this part, do not include the transfer by a city, city and county, county, or other local government animal shelter or a nonprofit animal welfare organization of any animal to an individual for use as a pet, or any charges made by the government shelter or nonprofit organization for services in connection with the transfer of that animal, including, but not limited to, the spaying or neutering or future spaying or neutering of the animal, or any vaccination, future vaccination, or similar service. For purposes of this section, "nonprofit animal welfare organization" means any organization formed and operated for the primary purpose of prevention of abuse, neglect, or exploitation of animals and that qualifies for the exemption from taxation pursuant to Section 23701d."

Recommendations

1. The Contractor should hire a full-time Shelter Coordinator, as required by the Agreement, to manage the shelter operations and be responsible for the implementation of recommended best practices for shelter management. Areas of review should include:
 - a) facility maintenance and repairs,
 - b) employee training on best practices for the care of animals and sanitation,
 - c) monitoring and maintaining records of the types of diseases present at intake and diseases acquired during the shelter stay to assist in evaluating sanitation protocols and environmental conditions that may promote the spread of diseases, and
 - d) maintaining the records required by the Agreement.
2. The Contractor should follow best practices of vaccinating and administering parasite treatments upon intake, in order to provide the best possible care and treatment for the animals as required by the Agreement. The Contractor should comply with the State of California requirement to spay or neuter all animals adopted before release from the shelter.
3. The Shelter Coordinator should evaluate shelter operations and develop a sanitation plan that is based on best practices in the "Guidelines for Standards of Care in Animal Shelters" by the Association of Shelter Veterinarians, HSUS guidelines and by the Koret Shelter Medicine Program. The Shelter Coordinator should establish written policies and procedures to ensure employees are provided guidance in:
 - a) types of cleaning agents and disinfectants and the application procedures,
 - b) the concentration of the cleaning agents and disinfectants,
 - c) best practices in the cleaning of cages, kennels and shelter surfaces.
4. The Contractor should comply with the recordkeeping terms of the Agreement by maintaining separate logs of fees and revenues generated by City animals impounded at the shelter. The Contractor should submit the base monthly fee invoice in the month following the month the service was provided. The Police Dept. should review and adhere to requirements of the Records and Schedule of Billing Rates Sections of the Agreement. The City should consider requesting a refund of the \$495 overpayment paid in error or ask for a credit against a current medical services invoice.
5. The City should consider revising the Agreement to clarify that the impound fee should be remitted to the City and consider billing the Contractor for the impound fees he has retained.
6. The Contractor should discontinue charging sales tax on adoptions. The Contractor should either return the excess tax reimbursement for pet adoptions to the pet owners overcharged, or provide the City proof of remittance of the excess tax reimbursement to the Board of Equalization. (Sales and Use Tax Regulation 1700(b) (2)).

Management Response

OCHS management was provided a draft of this report for review and comment of the findings and recommendations. The City terminated the OCHS Agreement on December 1, 2015. Management chose not to provide comments to the report after the termination of the agreement.

We conducted this compliance audit in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards. Those standards require that the audit is planned and performed to obtain sufficient, appropriate evidence to afford a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based our audit objectives. Hello

My name is Eric Hueg and I with my wife are the founders of OC Shelter Partners. We are the shelter intervention program at OCAS. We are a non profit all volunteer group dedicated to keeping pets in homes and out of the shelter. 25 hours a week, my wife Liz sits in an office behind the intake window and talks to everyone attempting to turn in a pet to see if she can help with food, medical help, training or advice. If it is obvious that it is impossible to keep the pet at home she networks with local rescues. Since late November, over 250 pets have avoided going into the shelter because of our shelter intervention program.

I was hoping to be at your city council meeting tonight but due to family obligations, it is not possible. I grew up in Garden Grove and have high regards for the city and its people. I know that tonight you are making a decision to either stay with OCAS or go to the Humane Society.

I believe making a change to the Humane Society is not in the best interest of your city or the pets of your city. As a shelter it is looking backwards whereas the now upcoming shelter in Tustin will be state of the art.

I have to question why the city would want to take on the rest of the tasks and duties that are part of your contract with OCAS. Does the city really want to manage and tackle animal cruelty cases? dying or dead wild animals on the side of the road? Animal hoarders? Stray animals that are not friendly? Feral cats? These are just a few of the scenarios of the types of services that the county provides.

I firmly believe that setting up your own animal services department will be a huge costly headache and end up costing the city more money in the long run.

We believe, Dr. Hawkins, the Director of OCAS is forward thinking and in our experience, she is making positive changes that are long overdue.

I hope you take all of this in consideration when you make your decision tonight.

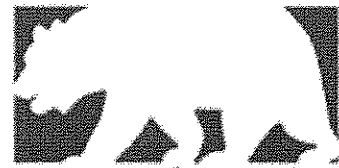

At the community meeting on April 13, 2016, the applicant, Heaven's Gate Funeral Home, proposed a plan to build a funeral home which will include a mortuary and a crematory. We would like your assistance in opposing the above proposal. The public hearing with the Planning Commission is scheduled on May 19, 2016 at 7pm. The meeting will take place at the Council Chamber of the Community Meeting Center, located at 11300 Stanford Avenue, Garden Grove, CA 92840.

We as a community adamantly oppose the proposal of building a new funeral home in our neighborhood. As you know, there are many schools and churches in this area, such as Riverdale Elementary School, Samueli Academy High School, Doig Intermediate School, Santiago High School, Shepherd's Grove Church, Formosan Presbyterian Church, Christ Cathedral Church, Orange View Church of Christ, and Wintersburg Presbyterian Church. The fears of dead bodies being stored behind our homes and the dangers of air pollution have caused tremendous stress and anxiety in the community, especially for our children. Many of the children have asked their parents if they can just move out of the area. This neighborhood has been our cherished home for decades and it is impossible for us to just pick up and leave.

We enjoy the peace and safe environment we currently have here in the community. We would like you, as our city representatives, to honor and protect our rights for a safe and peaceful environment. As you know, the toxins in the crematory emissions will affect many citizens, especially our children in the surrounding homes and schools. Mercury is one of the poisonous chemicals released during cremation. When heated, it is released into the air as a colorless and odorless gas. As it is breathed in and accumulated in the human body, it permanently damages the brain, kidneys, and nervous system. Also, chronic exposure to mercury has been documented and proven to cause fatigue, anorexia, weight loss, tremors, memory loss, insomnia, depression, and loss of vision.

In addition to mercury, there are many more toxic chemicals being emitted into the air during cremation, such as cadmium, dioxin, hydrogen chloride, sulfur oxide, nitrogen oxide, and chromium. These toxins and heavy metals—known for their potent toxicity, especially in environmental contexts—have devastating impact on human health. We vehemently want to avoid exposing our children to these toxins which will pose many serious health problems to them and future generations.

We as a community are asking you once again, as our city representatives, to help protect our community. We would like to thank you in advance for your support. We believe that you will always do what is best for the people in this community, especially our children. Please treat them as your own children and provide them a peaceful neighborhood with toxin-free air to nurture their lives. We count on you to make the right decision, in the best interest of the children. In return, you have our gratitude and you can always count on our support so that you may continue to provide and protect all citizens in the community. We appreciate all your efforts to put a halt to the plan of a new funeral home in our neighborhood. Please find attached copies of the community's signatures in opposition to the funeral home.

The City of Garden Grove is hosting two upcoming community meetings in May seeking input on the regulation of medical marijuana dispensaries in the city. The meetings take place on Tuesday, May 3, and Wednesday, May 18, from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m., in the Garden Grove Community Meeting Center, located at 11300 Stanford Avenue.

The purpose of the meetings is to allow the City to study best practices for regulating medical marijuana businesses and receive input from residents, businesses, and industry representatives. The study will include reviewing operations in other communities that currently permit medical marijuana businesses, to ultimately consider establishing a framework for developing an ordinance to regulate medical marijuana activities in the city.

The City has not regulated marijuana dispensaries, and formally established a ban on marijuana dispensaries in 2008. Although the City has considered regulations in the past, the ban has not been lifted since it was established.

The City Council has named a task force led by Mayor Bao Nguyen and Council Member Phat Bui to conduct the regulatory study, including a marijuana dispensary tax measure. The task force will lead the upcoming community meetings.





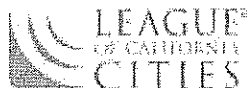

Rich Cook Cook Community Bridge Award - 2016

The Rich Cook Community Bridge Award was created to honor those who personify the mission of MenAlive; those who have a positive impact in and for the LGBT community.

The single most empowering thing an LGBT person can do is to come out. This is particularly true when it applies to public officials. Not only are they a positive role model, but they are in a unique position to change laws and policies, making it much more difficult for homophobes to continue their relentless demonizing.

Tonight we are pleased to honor City of Garden Grove Mayor Bao Nguyen

He was born in Thailand at a Doctors Without Borders clinic in a UN refugee camp, to Vietnamese parents who brought him here soon after.

He graduated in 1998 from Garden Grove's Pacifica High School where he won the "Most Spirited" award from his graduating class.

He completed a bachelor's degree in Political Science at UCI and a master's degree in religious studies at Naropa University in Boulder, CO.

While serving a term as Vice President of the Garden Grove USD Board of Education, he fought against the exclusion of LGBT Vietnamese youth from the annual Little Saigon Tet Parade

In 2014, he unseated a 22-year incumbent to become the first Vietnamese-American Mayor of a large US city and the youngest Mayor of Garden Grove.

As Mayor, Bao has sought to improve Garden Grove's transparency and accountability, making city finance records available online. He also strives to:

End discrimination in housing and employment on the basis of sexual orientation or gender identity

Ensure that equal rights, equal treatment and respect are guaranteed to every citizen

Mayor Nguyen publicly came out at the first official visit to Orange County of openly-gay US Ambassador to Vietnam **Ted Osius**. He thanked him for his work on behalf of the Vietnamese people — and, from one gay man to another, for his leadership as a leading gay political figure. In its own way, it was one of those small events that contribute to the earth-shattering sea change in public awareness and acceptance of gays and lesbians.

Bao's decision to be "out and proud" — to go beyond being a supporter of the right of the "Vietnamese Rainbow OC" to march in the Tet Parade - to someone who is now openly a member — is both gutsier and more consequential than you might think. Much of the Vietnamese community — like many other immigrant ethnic communities — has been publicly antagonistic to homosexuality, although there have been many differences about how to deal with it, ranging from acceptance, to acceptance if it is kept hidden, to expulsion from home and ostracism in public. What this action may mean to "Vietnamese Rainbow OC" — and to future LGBT youth who might become a part of it — is incalculable.

We look forward to the impact Bao will have in the LGBT community and beyond as he seeks Loretta Sanchez's Congressional Seat. We applaud and are very pleased to present tonight the Rich Cook Community Bridge Award to City of Garden Grove Mayor Bao Nguyen.
