Sorry I am resending this but I sent to several of the wrong chiefs earlier and had to do a new list so some of you have received this twice! We have not yet received the data for the UCR survey we sent out at the beginning of the month and we really need your responses to make our survey complete! Please assist us in collecting the crime data we need for 2015 by forwarding this survey link to your records team. Thanks!

As everyone knows, CPCA believes the implementation of AB 109 followed by Prop. 47 has resulted in a change in crime rates in California and not for the better. Already, supporters of those proposals are fighting back, criticizing individual efforts of chiefs to suggest that recent crime increases in their cities are related to one, the other, or both major public policy changes.

Proponents are correct about one thing - there has been a massive decrease in prison and jail populations directly attributable to these changes. They argue that it's too early for police chiefs and other opponents to say that AB 109 and/or Prop 47 are responsible for recent crime increases. They're probably correct about both.

CPCA is committed to definitively answering the question as early as possible. We are assembling nationwide data from the FBI for the last several years so that a comparison between California and the rest of the country can be made. The FBI just released national crime statistics for 2014. Because FBI data for 2015 (the first full year of Prop. 47) won't be available until October 2016, we are hoping to collect UCR data from each police department for each month of CY2015 from January through September. A separate request will be made for October - December data in January 2016.

Please use raw data and include only whole numbers. The data that is collected is from "Return A" of the UCR report your city submits to DOJ every month. The data requested should be the same data you submit to DOJ. It may be easiest to just have whomever completes this form for your agency fill in these numbers. Please return by October 31st if at all possible.

CPCA will provide updated information as soon as it becomes available. Our goal is to provide chiefs with talking points to explain crime changes in your cities relative to AB109 and Prop 47 and make speakers available to the subject on a statewide basis. It is critical we have as timely and complete information as possible and your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

FELON OUT ON THE STREETS DUE TO PROP 47 LAW CHANGE CHARGED WITH  
ATTEMPTED MURDER ON PEACE OFFICERS

SANTA ANA, Calif. - A felon who had two of his prior felony convictions reduced to misdemeanors under Proposition 47 (Prop 47), which resulted in his release from custody, was charged today with shooting his firearm at police officers while leading them on a chase. Jimmy Hoang Troung, 28, Santa Ana, is charged with two felony counts of attempted murder on peace officers, two felony counts of assault with a semiautomatic firearm on peace officers, one felony count of being a felon in possession of a firearm, one felony count of evading peace officers while driving recklessly, and sentencing enhancements for the use of a firearm. If convicted, Troung faces a maximum sentence of life in state prison. He is being held without bail and is expected to be arraigned tomorrow, Tuesday, Nov. 10, 2015, at 10:00 a.m. in Department CJ-1, Central Jail, Santa Ana.

**Circumstances of the Case**

At approximately 9:30 p.m. on Nov. 7, 2015, Santa Ana Police Department (SAPD) officers initiated a traffic stop near Euclid Street and McFadden Street on Troung, who was driving a sedan. Troung is accused of ignoring the traffic stop and leading officers on a pursuit. He is accused of driving for approximately two hours

in and around the Santa Ana area. During the chase, Troung is accused of firing a gun at the pursuing SAPD officers, who were not struck by the bullets. SAPD never fired their weapons back at Troung.

At approximately 11:30 p.m., SAPD officers stopped Troung's vehicle with spike strips and used their vehicles to block in Troung. The defendant is accused of refusing to exit his car. The SAPD SWAT and the Hostage Negotiation Team responded to the scene. Troung is accused of refusing to cooperate and surrender for three hours.

At approximately 2:40 a.m. on Nov. 8, 2015, Troung is accused of exiting his vehicle and was then arrested by SAPD, who also investigated this case.

#### Troung's Orange County Criminal Background

On Sept. 20, 2012, Troung was convicted of a felony drug possession (Case #12WF2510), and again a year later, on Sept. 25, 2013, Troung was convicted of felony drug possession (Case #13WF2395).

On Dec. 2, 2014, Troung had both of his felony convictions reduced to misdemeanors under Prop 47, and he was not placed on parole, probation, or post-release community supervision. Five months later, on April 3, 2015, Troung was arrested for carrying a switch blade knife on his person. Three days later, on April 6, 2015, he was arrested again for being in possession of a controlled substance.

On May 26, 2015, Troung was charged with a misdemeanor count of carrying a switch blade knife on his person (Case #15WM06095).

On June 1, 2015, he was charged with two misdemeanor counts, including possession of controlled substance paraphernalia and possession of a controlled substance (Case #15WM06283).

#### Prop 47

On Nov. 4, 2014, the voters of California adopted Prop 47, a referendum which reduced the status of certain property and drug offenses from felonies to misdemeanors. Prop 47, referred to as The Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act, stated the law would reduce prison overcrowding and would allow leftover funds due to the measure be used on school truancy, dropout prevention, victim services, mental health and drug abuse treatment, and other programs designed to keep offenders out of custody.

On Jan. 20, 2015, during his State of Public Safety in Orange County address, District Attorney Tony Rackauckas told the audience, "[We] are working together to carefully navigate the litigation that is coming up in the Proposition 47 cases so that only the defendants who are eligible will get the benefit of the law. Unfortunately, many dangerous felons will be let back into the community early, and I fear that this law will result in the increase of crime."

It is projected that in 2015 there will be 51,997 filing requests for misdemeanor crimes, which is 12,520 more than in the previous year and an increase of 31.7 percent. It is also projected that in 2015 there will be 12,133 filing requests for felony crimes, which is 6,524 less filing requests than in the previous year and a 35 percent decrease. It is projected that in 2015 there will be 64,189 filing requests for felony and misdemeanor crimes combined, which is 6,055 more than in the previous year, resulting in an overall increase of 10.4 percent.

"Mr. Troung's actions endangered the community and our officers,"

said Santa Ana ! Police Chief Carlos Rojas. "Our officers did an outstanding job in bringing this incident to a successful conclusion with the surrender and arrest of Mr. Troung. However, it is concerning that while he is facing numerous felony charges, his possession of the stolen handgun that he used to shoot at our officers is likely a misdemeanor, in accordance with Proposition 47, due its value being under \$950."

"The Santa Ana Police Department should be commended for resolving this extremely dangerous situation without a civilian or police officer getting shot," said District Attorney Rackauckas.

Assistant District Attorney Ebrahim Baytieh of the Special Prosecutions Unit is prosecuting this case.

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# POLICE DEPARTMENT

**The mission of the Garden Grove Police Department, through a Community Partnership, is to improve the quality of life in the City and provide a sense of safety and security to community members.**

The Garden Grove Police Department is committed to providing quality, customer-based law enforcement services to residents, merchants, and visitors alike. In doing so, we will maintain a Community Policing, problem-solving approach to the protection of life and property, and we will commit to resolve the concerns of those we serve in a timely, effective manner. Our highest priority is to ensure our city remains a safe community, and that residents and business owners live and work without the fear of crime and with an improvement in their overall quality of life.

The Police Department consists of three Bureaus: Community Policing Bureau, Support Services Bureau, and Administrative Services Bureau. The significant achievements of FY 2014-2015 for the Police Department included the following:

## **PD Tracking of AB109 Early Releases and Proposition 47 Mandate**

Assembly Bill 109 (AB109) - The Public Safety Realignment Act - has resulted in the early release of thousands of offenders into local communities due to prison over population. In November 2014, California voters approved Proposition 47, which reassigned many felony charges to misdemeanor charges. The impact felt on this change of law was immediate as the Orange County Jail stopped accepting arrestees for crimes such as possession of drugs and some property crimes. The Orange County Jail also reevaluated their population and released hundreds of prisoners who were serving time for crimes now deemed as misdemeanors per Proposition 47.

The Garden Grove Police Department increased its participation in the County's program on monitoring early release prisoners. At least twice every month the PD does proactive interaction compliance checks on early release prisoners. In FY 2014/2015, the PD conducted a total of 36 of these checks that resulted in 494 searched locations with 70

re-arrests of early release prisoners for either new charges or for violations of their existing probation and parole conditions.

### **PD RECRUITMENT**

In FY 2014/2015 newly appointed Police Chief Todd D. Elgin directed the Professional Standards Division of the Police Department to increase the recruitment of females and minorities from within the community so that the PD's work force is more reflective of its service area. Concerted efforts were made to recruit new hire candidates for all positions by focusing on career days at junior and four-year college campuses, visits to local police academies, and a creation of social media accounts (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Etc.) to promote the Police Department and to increase awareness of its desire to recruit. Fruits of these efforts will take at least one year to materialize.

During FY 2014/2015, the Professional Standards Division participated in seven recruiting events at local college campuses, a public safety fair, and visits to all GGUSD high schools. As a result of these efforts, 20 full- or part-time employees were brought on board. Positions include: seven police recruits, one lateral police officer, two police recruit officers (In-Academy), two records specialists, and eight cadets/police office aides.

### **PD TECHNOLOGY**

The PD saw a great change in technology during the year. It began with the continued installation and implementation of the Spillman Computer Aided Dispatch/Records Department-wide computer system, which integrates 5 previous separate police computer systems into one well-defined user-friendly system. The police records division, police communications center, the Garden Grove Jail, the Crime Analysis Unit and all Garden Grove Police patrol cars are now operating under the Spillman computer system.

The onset of the new Department-wide computer system allows for less time spent on merging, uploading, and verifying police data between the old computer systems, which means a more timely response and a less duplication of effort for the end-user. An example of the new computer system success is the Garden Grove Jail's digital camera system that takes high-definition pictures of arrestees and allows for the booking information to be automatically uploaded to the new Department-wide computer system. Also, all Garden Grove Police patrol cars received new mobile computer terminals (MCT) that provide for the latest in mobile technology, the ability to remotely connect to Department-wide computer system, and compatibility with the Spillman software.

The PD also began the process of automating all paper police reports for the years of 2006-2013, which will allow easier access for review via the New Spillman CAD/Records computer system. This automation process should be completed by early 2016.

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## POLICE DEPARTMENT FAST FACTS

During FY 2014-15 the Police Department responded to 46,072 calls for service with an average response time of 4 minutes, 12 seconds for priority calls. Specific statistics regarding calls for service and response times are contained in the following tables:

## Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to ensure appropriate use of an event deconfliction pointer system. Event deconfliction, the sharing of information with other law enforcement agencies, and proper case activation procedures enhance officer safety and the efficiency of criminal investigations. As such, the following policy will be adhered to when executing a planned operation or conducting a felony level criminal investigation.

## Definition of Event Deconfliction

Event deconfliction is the process of determining when law enforcement personnel are conducting events in close proximity to one another at the same time. By notifying a central location of a planned event prior to its execution, officers will not unknowingly target or conflict with another law enforcement officer or compromise another investigation. This is particularly important for agencies in concurrent or contiguous jurisdictions that are involved in high risk activities such as undercover operations, surveillances, execution of search warrants, or fugitive apprehensions.

When certain elements (e.g. location, date and time) are matched between two or more events/operations, a hit (or conflict) results. Immediate notification is then made by the deconfliction system to the involved agency personnel. The event deconfliction process is a pointer system, alerting officers that they are operating near one another.

When a conflict exists, both agencies are put in contact with each other to determine the nature of the conflict and individually they can decide the extent to which they wish to share case details.

## Policy

It is the policy of the (*Insert Agency Name*) to engage in event deconfliction in an attempt to avoid dangerous confrontations and/or unintentional consequences for law enforcement personnel and our citizens by entering qualifying events into the (*Insert system name - Case Explorer, RISSafe or SafeTNet*) system.

All information entered is considered confidential and law enforcement sensitive.

The following activities/events shall be entered into the event deconfliction system:

1. The service of search warrants;
2. The service of arrest warrants;
3. The planned arrest of a person immediately after he or she has delivered or received, or attempted to deliver or receive, contraband to or from an officer or informant (buy-busts, reverse sting operations, controlled drug deliveries, stolen or burglarized property, etc.);

4. Taking delivery of any contraband from a suspect who is not arrested, but permitted to leave pending further investigation (ibuy-walk);
5. Informant or officer face-to-face meetings with suspects for the purpose of receiving, delivering, or negotiating the receipt or delivery of any contraband;
6. Approaching a person at his or her place of domicile and requesting permission to search for any contraband (iknock and talk); especially in anticipation of activities involving a felony crime or drug related crime;
7. Predetermined surveillances, whether stationary or mobile, including those occurring in our own jurisdiction or the jurisdiction of a non-participating law enforcement agency;
8. Covert activity by officers, or by informants acting under the direction of officers, that could initiate a response from citizens or local police who may reasonably believe that a crime is in progress;
9. Fugitive operations;
10. Long term covert operations (storefronts);
11. Any other high-risk or specialized law enforcement activities which would benefit from event deconfliction.

Personnel conducting field operations as described above shall ensure that these operations are entered into the event deconfliction system either online or by telephone (*Insert Watch Center Number if system allows*). All operations requiring entry into the event deconfliction system shall be made as soon as information is available, but at least two hours prior to the event taking place, if possible.

Information entered into the deconfliction system shall include:

1. Date and time of planned operation;
2. Type of operation;
3. Location of the operation, including any staging areas;
4. Information about the suspect(s), including full names, aliases or street names, date of birth, vehicle information, phone numbers, contraband to be purchased and amount of money involved;
5. Lead and participating agency names;
6. Name and agency of the person entering the operation, including cellular telephone number, along with a secondary point of contact for the operation.
7. Specify the radius of deconfliction (if not preset by the deconfliction system).

If a conflict with other law enforcement activity is identified both of the contact personnel will be notified by the event deconfliction system or watch center personnel. Each affected law enforcement entity is responsible for contacting one another and resolving the conflict before taking further action. Investigating personnel must refrain from executing any operations until identified conflicts have been resolved.

Unresolved operational conflicts will be immediately referred to command level personnel.

Any exemption or deviation from this procedure shall be considered on a case-by-case basis and approved only by a command level officer.

## **Target and Investigative Information Deconfliction**

Event deconfliction applies to geographical conflicts that occur at the same time and in the same proximity. Target and investigative activity deconfliction applies to subjects, gangs, locations, telephone numbers, vehicles, and other information about criminal activity.

Upon opening an investigation on any crime, information shall be queried/stored through available regional systems to determine whether another agency has an ongoing investigation with common investigative information, to reduce parallel investigations and to promote investigative collaboration. If a conflict is discovered in either target or investigative activity, contact shall be made with the other agency to resolve and coordinate issues and information.

## **Training and Access**

All personnel with assignments that may require them to perform event deconfliction shall receive training enabling them to obtain appropriate security access and to navigate through the event deconfliction system. Training is available through (*indicate the in-region access control agency*).

## **Compliance**

Deconfliction is a key component of officer safety for planned street operations and felony level investigations. Consequently, failure to comply with this policy may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination.

This is particularly important for agencies in concurrent or contiguous jurisdictions that are involved in high risk activities such as undercover operations, surveillances, execution of search warrants, or fugitive apprehensions.

When certain elements (e.g. location, date and time) are matched between two or more events/operations, a hit (or conflict) results. Immediate notification is then made by the deconfliction system to the involved agency personnel. The event deconfliction process is a pointer system, alerting officers that they are operating near one another.

When a conflict exists, both agencies are put in contact with each other to determine the nature of the conflict and individually they can decide the extent to which they wish to share case details.

**Contact Resources**

**Practice:** The present practice of the Garden Grove Police Department is to engage in event deconfliction to avoid dangerous confrontations and/or unintentional consequences for law enforcement personnel and our citizens by entering qualifying events into the Western States Information Network (WSIN), LA-CLEAR, Regional

Information Sharing Systems Program (RISS), Orange County Cooperating Individuals Index (OCCII) or SafeTNet system. All information entered is considered confidential and law enforcement sensitive.

### **Qualifying Events**

The following activities/events shall be entered into the event deconfliction system:

1. The service of search warrants;
2. The service of arrest warrants;
3. The planned arrest of a person immediately after he or she has delivered or received, or attempted to deliver or receive, contraband to or from an officer or informant (buy-busts, reverse sting operations, controlled drug deliveries, stolen or burglarized property, etc.);
4. Taking delivery of any contraband from a suspect who is not arrested, but permitted to leave pending further investigation ("buy-walk");
5. Informant or officer face-to-face meetings with suspects for the purpose of receiving, delivering, or negotiating the receipt or delivery of any contraband;
6. Approaching a person at his or her place of domicile and requesting permission to search for any contraband ("knock and talk"); especially in anticipation of activities involving a felony crime or drug related crime;
7. Predetermined surveillances, whether stationary or mobile, including those occurring in our own jurisdiction or the jurisdiction of a non-participating law enforcement agency;
8. Covert activity by officers, or by informants acting under the direction of officers, that could initiate a response from citizens or local police who may reasonably believe that a crime is in progress;
9. Fugitive operations;
10. Long term covert operations (storefronts);
11. Any other high-risk or specialized law enforcement activities that would benefit from event deconfliction.

### **Authorized Users of WSIN and Orange County Cooperating Individuals Index (OCCII) Deconfliction Systems**

#### **WSIN**

The WSIN deconfliction system requires individual users be from law enforcement member agencies. Individuals must register and receive training. Only those member agency users may access the system to enter or receive information.

Currently, All officers that work in SIU and some from Gangs have registered, taken the training and can access the system. All other department personnel conducting operations that fall within the deconfliction system must get one of the authorized users to input the operational information.

## **OCCII**

This is an Orange County narcotics intelligence index. Only Orange County narcotics investigators can access the system to enter or receive information.

### **Release of information to system providers**

Personnel conducting field operations as described above shall ensure that these operations are entered into the event deconfliction system by telephone. All operations requiring entry into the event deconfliction system shall be made as soon as information is available.


Information entered into the deconfliction system shall include:

1. Date and time of planned operation;
2. Type of operation;
3. Location of the operation, including any staging areas;
4. Information about the suspect(s), including full names, aliases or street names, date of birth, vehicle information, phone numbers, contraband to be purchased and amount of money involved;
5. Lead and participating agency names;
6. Name and agency of the person entering the operation, including cellular telephone number, along with a secondary point of contact for the operation.
7. Specify the radius of deconfliction (if not preset by the deconfliction system).

### **Conflict procedures**

If a conflict with other law enforcement activity is identified, then the event deconfliction system or watch center personnel should notify both contact personnel. Each affected law enforcement entity is responsible for contacting one another and resolving the conflict before taking further action. Investigating personnel must refrain from executing any operations until identified conflicts have been resolved. Unresolved operational conflicts will be immediately referred to command level personnel.

Any exemption or deviation from this procedure shall be considered on a case-by-case basis and approved only by a command level officer.



**Proof of Compliance:** Deconfliction is a key component of officer safety for planned street operations and felony level investigations. Therefore, I am directing each investigator to properly use the proper deconfliction system and document utilization of the deconfliction system by maintaining a log that references the date, case number, and employee I.D. number for each time the deconfliction system is used.

## What is de-confliction?

To resolve "Blue on Blue" situations by plotting locations of live field operations and ensuring that these operations do not interfere with other live operations currently in progress, based upon close proximity, similar dollar and drug amounts, or same location, subject or vehicle.

When a conflict occurs, the agents, task force, or teams who posted the operation in progress and the new operation are both notified immediately, and are advised that friendly units are conflicting with their operation. Contact names and telephone, cellular, or pager numbers will be given to each team.

### When submitting an inquiry, please provide:

- Your name
- Your agency
- Two phone numbers where you can be reached quickly (usually cell and pager numbers are the best)
- The drug involved (or criminal activity, if terrorism, gang, or other activity is involved)
- Retention (6 months or 5 years storage in the RISS database, 5 year retention requires a case number and/or case name)
- Dissemination (Whether you want your inquiry information open, or limited release)
- No release will involve talking with a supervisor to initiate this status

### When posting a critical event (operation):

- Your name
- Your agency
- Two phone numbers where you can be reached quickly (usually cell and pager numbers are the best)
- The drug involved (or criminal activity, if terrorism, gang, or other activity is involved)
- The operation type (if money/drugs are to be exchanged, specify quantity of drug and dollar amount if possible)
- Start date and time (Operations are posted for twenty-four hours unless otherwise specified).
- Participating agencies, if any
- Street address, type of location, including space or apartment number, city, and cross street (NOT nearest major cross street or parallel street, as our mapping system requires intersecting streets to zero in on a location)

Agents need to contact LA CLEAR whenever they have a contact number change such as an office telephone, cellular or pager.

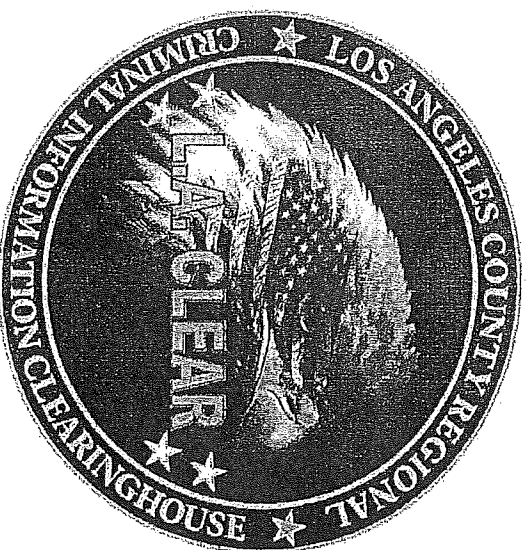

For Inquiries and Operations



## INTRODUCTION

The purpose of LA CLEAR is to enhance officer safety and the efficiency of operations through the exchange of operational and tactical information. Participation is open to all law enforcement agencies in the Los Angeles Metropolitan High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (L.A. HIDTA-consisting of Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino counties) that meet the qualifications for, and are members of the Western States Information Network (WSIN).

## DUTIES OF MEMBERSHIP

Only through the active and regular participation of member agencies can the objectives of LA CLEAR be accomplished. Member agencies, through each of its representatives, are responsible for complying with WSIN Bylaws.

Member agencies are responsible for:

- Providing each crew, team, group or unit supervisor with a copy of the participation agreement.

Additionally, representatives are responsible for:

- Making an inquiry, via the LA CLEAR War Room or remote-site SINS terminal, when enforcement action is intended during an investigation on a violator.
- Confering with members from other agencies having concurrent investigative interests.
- Notifying LA CLEAR War Room, as soon as possible, on all pending narcotics related operations and events.

## 28 CFR Part 23

28 CFR Part 23 is the federal guideline that governs the operation of federally funded criminal intelligence systems and is designed for agencies that operate multifunctional criminal intelligence systems. The focus is on the collection and dissemination of information in accordance with the federal guideline, so as to protect the privacy and constitutional rights of individuals.

### Examples:

Subjects / Addresses / Vehicles / Phone Numbers etc...

- Known or suspected of being involved in criminal activities

### Business / Gang Entry

- Stipulates that the business/gang is suspected of being or having illegally operated, controlled, finances, or infiltrated by known or suspected crime figures.

### UC Phones / Names / Vehicles

- Can be stored for the protection of undercover officers.

## LA CLEAR Mission Statement

The mission of the LA CLEAR (Los Angeles County Regional Criminal Information Clearinghouse) is to produce and provide intelligence products, enhance information sharing and advanced systems technology to local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies in order to ensure officer safety, enhance operational efficiency and effectiveness.

## LA CLEAR Call-in Tips

- If you are planning an operation and need to know about any pertinent items of information (i.e. subject, location, phone #, vehicle, weapon, etc.), always call in your request in advance. Simply include all information you need researched and/or stored. LA CLEAR will automatically inquire on all information submitted, enter your information in the RISS database and/or post it as an operation.
- To ensure OFFICER SAFETY, call in AT LEAST one hour prior to the beginning of your operation. Last minute calls to LA CLEAR are handled as promptly as possible. However, entering an operation takes an average of 15 minutes to post on the War Board. This 15-minute delay, plus the time required to call back agents via phone, can mean the difference between life and death in certain high-risk operations.
- When making inquiries, submitting just the name of a subject is not sufficient because some names are very common (i.e. Smith, Lopez, Nguyen, etc.). A date of birth and other physical descriptors are mandatory for inquiring and entering information into the RISS database. Submitting sufficient information greatly increases the likelihood of further investigative leads.
- Whenever you enter information into RISS, that information is stored under your name and agency for the retention time you specified (six months or five years). During the retention period, any inquiries specific to your information will result in notification via telephonic communication to you, your supervisor, or agency. You WILL be notified each and every time there is an inquiry or hit to your information.
- A prompt response to a page or telephone call is critical in guaranteeing timely dissemination of information to agents, thereby maintaining officer safety.

Note: Requests of six or more inquiries or operations should be faxed.

I'm going back over there again today to verify what kind of viable "band aid" I can put on it to get us through the winter and mitigate the tripping hazards.

I'm thinking we will remove and replace some of the worst areas that are flexing/pumping, grind the high spots and then do a thin overlay on the entire lot to buy us a year. We will coordinate with you as your parking will definitely be a problem once we begin. The band aid will take me a week and we will give you plenty of advance notice and explain the impact on your avail parking at that time. Just please work with me on the parking logistics. Expect me doing one half at a time so you will lose 50% parking during construction. If I could get the whole lot cleared that would be ideal but I'm thinking that will impact you bigtime...let me know if clearing the whole lot is an option.

Again, it will only be a band aid but it will eliminate the tripping hazards for the short term. Once we get through the winter, I AM intending upon tearing that whole thing out and re-doing it all.

We are expecting a huge rainy season this year and we are feverously trying to winterize as many streets as possible before those rains come in, that is why I'm strapped for avail. time.

Bear with me guys, we are coming but I don't have a firm date yet. It may run as late as October (worst case scenario) but I'm hoping to be there sooner. I will keep you all in the loop on progress.

If you wish, I can meet with you over there to further explain, but this is pretty much how it will go.



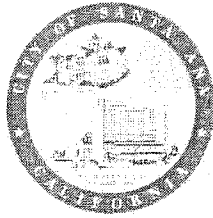

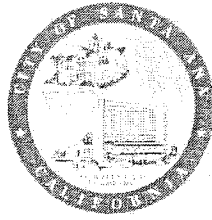

Sgt. Colegrove,

I spoke with our UASI Training Coordinator and Kerrstyn from the City of Anaheim to clear up any confusion regarding the reimbursement of overtime and backfill for approved UASI training instructors. Both Sgt. Sheldon and Kerrstyn were in agreement with the information you and I discussed over the phone. Overtime and backfill are allowable for GGPD personnel who teach course deliveries of UASI funded training. We cannot reimbursement for the regular duty of an instructor but can pay for the backfill costs incurred for the expense of paying overtime to fill the vacated position of that specific instructor on the day of the training. I apologize for any confusion regarding these costs. Please see our ASUA Sub-Recipient Grant Guide, pages 13-14 (FY2014 guide) or pages 14-15 (FY2015), for more information and reference on training reimbursement.

Over the phone you also mentioned reimbursement claims that were already submitted but did not include any backfill costs. We will be able to accept additional claims for courses that occurred within the 2015 calendar year, however, we will need supporting documentation showing the officer that was assigned to work backfill for the instructor who was assisting in class. Would your scheduling system or timecards show this information? Let me know if I can be of any help in verifying the documentation for backfill expenses.

Our deadline for FY14 UASI Training packets is December 31, 2015. If you feel additional time will be needed, please let me know and I will talk to Kerrstyn.

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# **Flood Response Guidelines**



**GARDEN GROVE**

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## PURPOSE

This Plan will assist Law Enforcement, Fire Department, Public Works Department and Emergency Operations Center (EOC) staff in response to impending flooding within the City of Garden Grove. It is designed to provide coordination and improve effectiveness in the appropriate response to the potential flooding.

## SITUATION ASSESSMENT

The information below covers the broad range of issues to consider when contemplating shelter-in-place and/or ordering a mandatory evacuation or warning.

Identify the following to determine the response and recovery measures to be implemented. Refer to the Flood Response map, Attachment A. This information will help determine the number of people to be evacuated, time available in which to effect the evacuation, and the time and distance of travel necessary to ensure safety.

- Location of emergency
- Size of involved area; actual and potential
- Emergency conditions that could occur and that would require evacuation or shelter-in-place
- Characteristics of the hazard or threat
  - magnitude
  - intensity
  - speed of onset
  - duration
  - impact on local community
- Weather conditions and any expected changes
- Particular areas or facilities which will not require evacuation because of their location or similar circumstances
- Areas potentially subject to evacuation
- Type of area (business, residential, etc.)
- Population groups requiring assistance during evacuation, including the identification of medical / health issues
  - develop a plan with County Public Health Department through the County's EOC for evacuating the medically fragile, including those in care facilities that should receive a precautionary warning prior to general evacuation announcements
  - Requests for Shelters should go through the American Red Cross and/or Orange County EOC
- Number of affected residents
- Number and type of casualties/injuries
- Direction of movement of evacuees
- Ingress/egress routes for emergency vehicles
- Location of staging area
- Emergency assistance required (ambulance, fire, public utility, heavy equipment)

## ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

When a flood warning message is received, the Emergency Manager shall alert relevant agencies. Depending upon the scale of potential flooding, the main difficulties are:

- Care of evacuated, hurt or homeless people
- Protecting of utilities

- Flood alleviation e.g. clearing blocked culverts and drains
- Providing road barriers and signs
- Coordinating emergency support

### **Police Department**

#### Primary Police responsibilities:

- Coordinate with emergency services, local authorities, media etc
- Assist in evacuation
- Secure, protect and preserve the scene, and control traffic
- Coordinate with the Orange County Coroner to organize and disseminate casualty information
- Coordinate with the Orange County Coroner to provisionally identify deceased people
- Restore normality

### **Fire & Rescue Services**

#### Primary fire service responsibilities:

- Rescue trapped casualties
- Control fires, released chemicals and other hazards
- Assess hazards concerning evacuation
- Ensure safety of rescue personnel
- Minimize environmental dangers
- Liaison with medical services
- Recover deceased in conjunction with the police and coroner
- Stand by during recovery

### **Emergency Manager**

#### Primary emergency manager responsibilities:

- Prepare Emergency Plans for local resources and useful equipment
- Advise residents of flood prone areas to obtain sandbags
- A single point of contact for information
- Issuing warning messages to local authorities
- Advise on weather, water flow, warnings and evacuation
- Issue media statements

### **Public Works**

#### Primary public works responsibilities:

- Clear water drainage facilities
- Repair breaches in flood defenses
- Issue situation updates
- Deploy sandbags for flood defense
- City infrastructure protection of all water entry points including air bricks, air vents and utility openings in public buildings in the inundation area
- Assist public safety with deploying traffic barricades
- Clear roadways as necessary

### **Advice for Public**

#### **PRIOR TO FLOODING**

- Prepare a Personal Flood Plan:
  - Make a flood kit: medications, warm clothing, sealed food, bottled water, blankets, matches, candles, flashlights, portable radio, spare batteries, rubber gloves, personal documents
  - Discuss the plan with family members, friends and neighbors
  - Know how to disconnect gas, electricity and water supplies

- Know where to move vehicles in an emergency.
- Store valuable property in a raised secure location
- If you live in a flood risk area, have the following on hand:
  - Sufficient sandbags or other devices to block doors, ventilators and openings
  - Appropriate insurance coverage

#### **FLOOD WARNING: 'GO IN, STAY IN, TUNE IN'**

- Stay calm
- Ensure that neighbors know of the warning, and be prepared to help them
- Keep a list of useful telephone numbers
- Monitor local radio
- Avoid using flood waters or local water until it has been ensured safe
- Care for the needs of pets and domestic animals

#### **PUBLIC ALERT & WARNING:**

1. Warning residents within the risk area will be initiated by the following means:
  - a. Reverse 911: Notification lists have been established and evacuation messages have been pre-recorded for Garden Grove Police dispatchers to activate. Notification lists are both published and unpublished and dependent upon public phone service.
  - b. Emergency Alert System (EAS) Broadcast: The County Office of Emergency Services can activate the EAS System which is located at the County Office of Emergency Services Office, to alert residents of imminent dangers. Draft messages can be made and given to the County's Staff Duty Officer for dissemination on EAS.
  - c. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Weather Radio: The National Weather Service will issue a Flash Flood Watch for potential flood areas. These notifications will be tone alerted over NOAA Weather Radios and/or sent over EAS.
  - d. Mobile public address systems and sirens: First Responders using vehicle loud speakers and sirens may slowly drive roads in the affected area announcing the need to evacuate and indicating the best available routes for evacuation.
  - e. Door to Door notification: Responders will systematically notify residents in the affected area. List of addresses notified will be kept and homes will be marked with a large X with tape on the front door to prevent duplication of efforts. Any resident that refuses to evacuate will be notified of the severity of the situation and required to supply name and phone number of a relative.

#### **PUBLIC INFORMATION**

1. The City's Emergency Services Manager and local organizations knowledgeable in disaster preparedness education will be responsible for all pre-emergency public education and information.
2. The Fire Department Public Information Officer (PIO), as designated by the City Administrator, or designee, will provide all public information during the emergency event
3. The Fire Department PIO will determine the size of team needed and will begin call back procedures to cover needed sections within the Team.
4. If applicable, after the EOC is activated the PIO will be encouraged to send a PIO representative for the City to a Joint Public Information Center (JPIC) along with the County PIO to coordinate the dissemination of public information.
5. The local radio stations will broadcast immediate updates on the situation.
6. The PIO will make sure that all information is available on the City's webpage and City TV Channel 3.

## INTRODUCTION

### County Protocols

To provide quantitative information for flood warning and detection, Orange County began installing its ALERT (Automated Local Evaluation in Real Time) system in 1983. Operated by the County's Environmental Resources Section of Orange County Public Works (OCPW) in cooperation with the National Weather Service, ALERT uses remote sensors located in rivers, channels and creeks to transmit environmental data to a central computer in real time. Sensors have been installed along the Santa Ana River, San Juan Creek, Arroyo Trabuco Creek, Oso Creek and Aliso Creek, as well as other flood control channels and basins. The field sensors transmit hydrologic and other data (e.g., precipitation data, water levels, temperature, wind speed, etc.) to base station computers for display and analysis. In addition, six pump stations (Huntington Beach, Cypress, Seal Beach, Los Alamitos, Harbor-Edinger, and South Park) regulating storm water discharge to flood control channels are also instrumented. Their monitoring system includes automated call-out of operations personnel in the event of a problem.

The Storm Center operated by OCPW is activated when heavy rainfall occurs or is predicted, and/or when storm run-off conditions indicate probable flood damage. The Storm Center monitors the situation on a 24-hour basis, and response may include patrols of flood control channels, and deployment of equipment and personnel to reinforce levees if needed. Storm Center activation and various emergency response actions are based on the following Emergency Readiness Stages:

- **Stage I** - Mild rainfall (*Flood advisory stage*)
- **Stage II** - Heavy rainfall or potential thereof. OCPW Storm Operations Center activated and surveillance of flood control facilities in effect (*Flood watch stage*)
- **Stage III** - Continued heavy rainfall or deterioration of facilities. County Public Works Director in charge. County personnel assume assigned emergency duties (*Flood warning stage*).
- **Stage IV** - Conditions are or are likely to be beyond County control. Board of Supervisors, or DES/OAC when the Board is not in session, proclaims Local Emergency and assumes special powers. Mutual Aid requested (*Flood warning stage*)
- **Stage V** - Damage beyond control of all Local Resources. State forces are required. Governor requested to proclaim State of Emergency (*Flood warning stage*)
- **Stage VI** - Damage beyond control of Local and State Resources. Federal forces are required. President requested to declare Major Disaster (*Flood warning stage*)



The following pages capture Trigger Points with concept of operations and corresponding recommended actions that will assist the City in responding to the National Weather Service (NWS) Advisories.

### **Descriptions:**

**Trigger Point 1 – Flood Advisory Definition:** A Flood Advisory (Advisory) highlights special weather conditions that are less serious than a warning. An Advisory is issued for events that may cause significant inconvenience, and if caution is not exercised, could lead to situations which may threaten life and/or property. *(County Stage I)*

**Trigger Point 2 – Flood Watch Definition:** National Weather Service issues a watch to inform the public and cooperating agencies that current and developing hydro meteorological conditions are such that there is a threat of flooding, but the occurrence is neither certain nor imminent *(County stage II)*

**Trigger Point 3 – Flood Warning Definition:** National Weather Service issues a warning to inform the public of flooding along larger streams in which there is a serious threat to life or property. A flood warning will usually contain river stage (level) forecasts *(County stage III)*

**\*\*Anything above County Stage III would rely on County Mutual Aid and EOC protocols would be assumed**

**Trigger Point 4 – Recovery:** Each department and agency will coordinate its efforts to restore utility systems and services during recovery operations. The City will ensure that debris removal and cleanup operations are expedited. On the basis of the City assessments, structures that pose a public safety concern will be demolished.

## AUTHORITIES

Three Penal Code provisions are of particular importance when emergencies arise. They are Penal Code sections 409, 409.5 and 409.6.

409 Pertains to remaining at the place of a riot or unlawful assembly after being given an order to disperse.

Governs closing an area because of an emergency. The section describes power that is granted to certain named law enforcement groups and may be exercised by them either independently of the Emergency Services Act or in conjunction with it.

These groups may close the area where the menace exists for the duration thereof by means of ropes, markers, or guards to any and all persons not authorized by the lifeguard or officer to enter or remain within the enclosed area.

The advantage of Penal Code section 409.5 is that any of the named law enforcement officers may close an area by a verbal order on an immediate and/or selective basis. The disadvantage is that the announcement or orders may vary from officer to officer, thereby increasing the possibility of liability. Close supervision and coordination are essential.

Similar to section 409.5, but applies to avalanches, which includes snow or mudslides. Varies from 409.5 in that 409.6 specifically provides for the use of reasonable force to remove a person who has been given notice to leave the closed area.

## Glossary of Terms

**Advisory – Outlook** – Issued by the National Weather Service (NWS) a weather Advisory/Outlook highlights special weather conditions that are less serious than a warning. They are for events that may cause significant inconvenience, and if caution is not exercised, it could lead to situations that may threaten life and/or property.

**Evacuation Order** – Movement of community members out of a defined area due to an immediate threat to life and property from an emergency incident.

**Evacuation Warning** – Alerting of community members in a defined area of a potential threat to life and property from an emergency incident. An evacuation may be ordered as a result of the threat. Facilitate the pre-evacuation of special needs population and large animals.

**Flash Flood Warning** – Issued by the NWS to inform the public of flooding along larger streams in which there is a serious threat to life or property. A flood warning will usually contain river stage (level) forecasts.

**Flash Flood Watch** - Issued by the NWS to inform the public and cooperating agencies that current and developing conditions are such that there is a threat of flooding, but the occurrence is neither certain nor imminent.

**Shelter-in-Place** – Directs community members to stay secured inside their current location. Only used if the safety of the citizens can be assured if they remain; or if evacuation will cause a higher potential for loss of life.

**Safe Refuge Area** – A temporary safe location to hold evacuees until evacuation routes are open.

**Response** – Appropriate actions taken by respective agencies to address Flood / Watershed incidents.

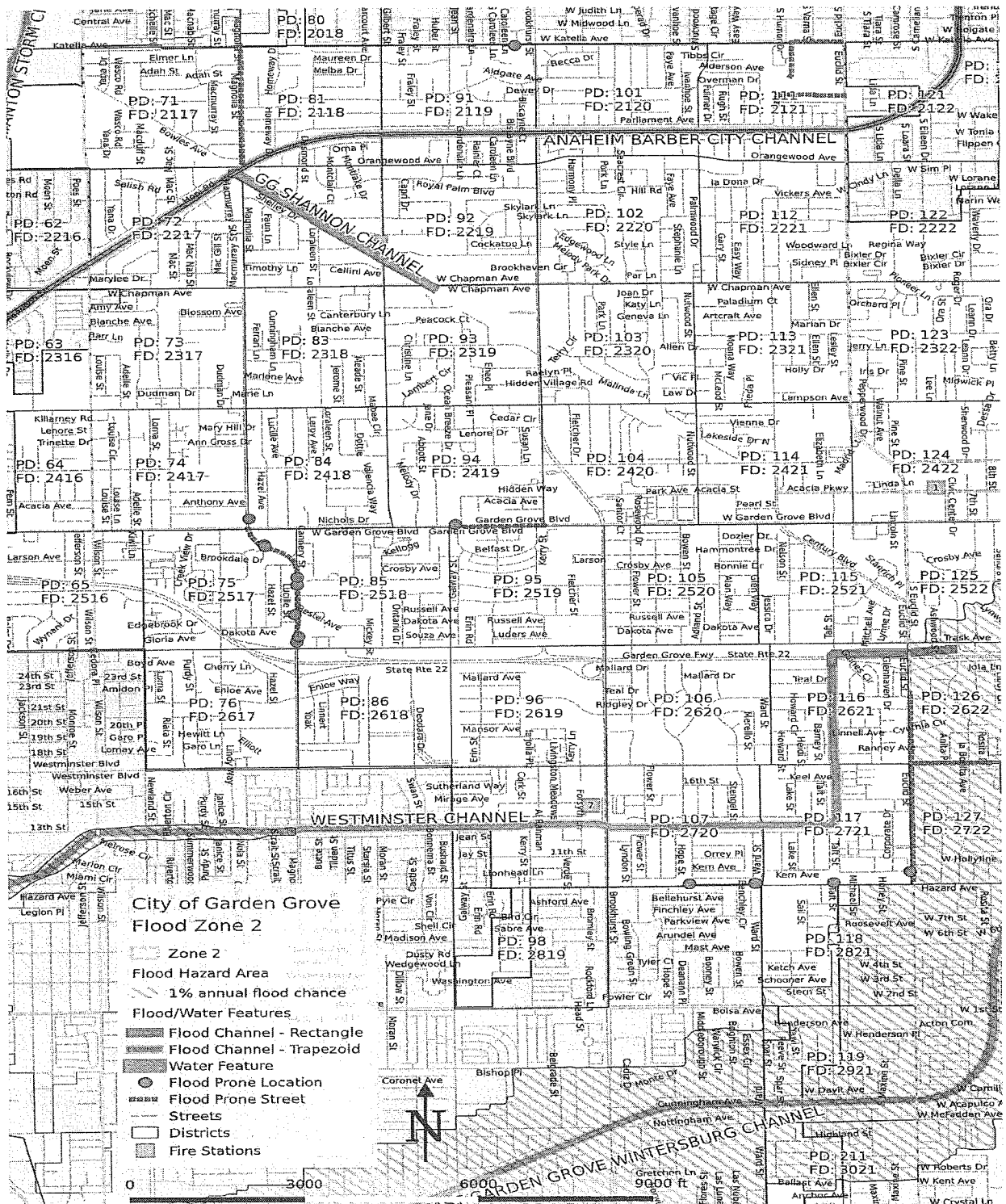

## Attachment A.4

**Orange County Operational Area El Nino/Flooding EOC Activation Triggers**

The Orange County Operational Area Emergency Operations Plan lists the following EOC activation triggers:

- On Request - A local government within the OA has activated its EOC and requested activation of the OA EOC to support its emergency operations. Jurisdiction(s) determine that additional response resources beyond that which would normally be covered by mutual aid are required and assistance from the OA may be necessary.
- Two City Local Emergency - Two or more cities within the OA have proclaimed a Local Emergency.
- County and City Local Emergency - The County and one or more cities have proclaimed a Local Emergency.
- Request for Governor's Proclamation - A city, city and County, or County has requested a Governor's proclamation of a State of Emergency, as defined in Government Code 8558(b).

The Operational Area Emergency Operations Center may activate if one or more of the following occur during a storm event:

- OC Public Works advises the Storm Operations Manual has been activated to Stage 3 or higher.
- At the request of OCPW -- Operational Area Coordinator.
- National Weather Service has issued a Flash Flood Warning in a recent Orange County Burn Scar area and/or pre-identified debris flow triggers are met as indicated in specific plans.
- Incident extend beyond (2) operational periods and actual rainfall amount is:
  - 6 inches or greater in a 24 hour period (100 year storm)
- Hydrology-Soil Saturation levels from back to back storms:

In areas identified by Public Works as an area of concern: Existing conditions prior to the storm can influence the amount of storm water runoff. Dry soil allows greater infiltration of rainfall and reduces the amount of runoff entering the stream. Conversely, soil that is already wet from previous rains has a lower capacity for infiltration, allowing more runoff to enter the stream.

- Actual or identified land slippage in 2 or more areas.
- USACE notification of 8,000 CFS or greater release of water from Prado Dam.
- Overtopping or degradation of flood channels and river beds.
- Disaster shelter operations for 1000 or more people.
- Flooding and erosion of beach areas, and local jurisdictions requesting assistance.
- Damage Assessment is required and/or Recovery phase is expected.



## El Nino Operational Area Conference Call Triggers

### Pre-Storm OA Conference Call

The Operational Area will conduct conference calls when emergency action or community protective measures are expected. A conference call will be convened before a storm arrives based on the following criteria:

- Incoming rain predicted to extend beyond (2) operational periods and rainfall amount predicted to be 6 inches or greater in a 24 hour period (100 year storm)
- Hydrology-Soil Saturation levels from back to back storms identified by Public Works as an area of concern in multiple jurisdictions.
- USACE preparing for 8,000 CFS or greater release of water from Prado Dam.
- Overtopping or degradation of flood channels and river beds is possible.

### OA EOC is activated – Storm Conference Call

Conference calls will be conducted when the following events are occurring:

- The Operational Area EOC is activated AND:
  - Actual or identified land slippage in 2 or more areas.
  - USACE notification of 8,000 CFS or greater release of water from Prado Dam.
  - Overtopping or degradation of flood channels and river beds.
  - Shelter operations for 1000 or more people.
  - Flooding and erosion of beach areas, and local jurisdictions requesting assistance.
  - Damage Assessment is required and/or Recovery phase is expected.
  - COAD has been requested to respond.

*Help Wanted! Your Garden Grove Police Department is trying to grow to meet the ever increasing community needs of Garden Grove. Normally, the Department has matched it hiring levels to the anticipated retirements and attrition rates for this police organization. I want the Police Department's workforce growth to be more reflective of the city's demographics while also paralleling the increases in the city's population and the number of police calls for service. In 1995 the City of Garden Grove had a population of 148,044 with a police officer staffing of 165 sworn officers, which equaled a ratio of one police officer to every 897 citizens. Today, the population is approximately 180,000 with a staffing of 154 sworn officers, which is one police officer to over 1,100 citizens. Over the past twenty years advances in technology, improved training techniques, and more efficient deployment of personnel have allowed for such a reduction in police officer to population ratio without posing a significant risk to the general public's safety. But I believe now is the time to increase overall Department staffing to better serve the community.*

*In 2016 the Department is looking to hire at least 15 new police officers, which includes two new positions to increase our patrol staffing. The staffing of Field Community Service Officers will increase also in 2016 in order to meet the ever increasing non-emergency service portion of our commitment to the public.*

*Additionally, the Department wants to increase its Police Cadet program by 10 Cadets. The Cadet program allows for young people to become a viable candidate for the position of Police Officer, which saves time and money in the future by having a pool of qualified candidates. The Cadet program is comprised of college-aged students who must be successfully enrolled in a collegiate institution and maintain passing grades in order to stay in the program.*

*The Department has always had a Reserve Police Officer program where part time individuals become police officers on a part time basis. Increasing the ranks of the Reserve Police Officer program by five people can allow for better staffing on large scale events such as the Strawberry Festival and the 'Open Streets' events.*

*The Department desires to hire three new Police Dispatchers, who operate the 911 telephone system and then dispatch the calls to the field patrol officers and two Records Specialists who will be trained on the new Spillman Records Computer System.*

*In closing, I am asking the readers to spread the word that the Garden Grove Police Department is hiring in 2016! 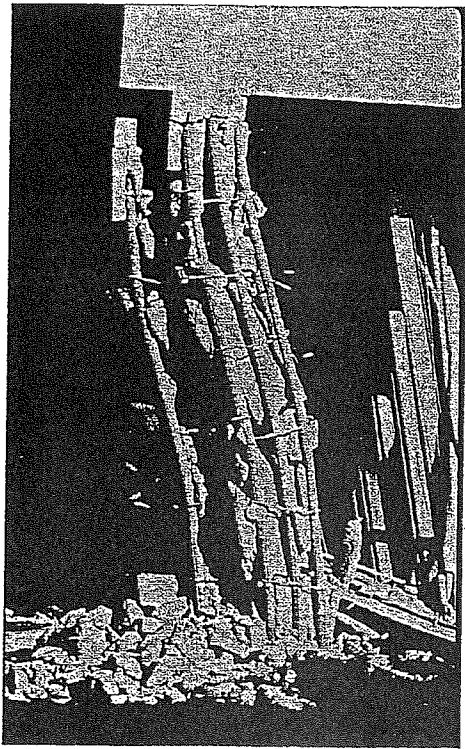

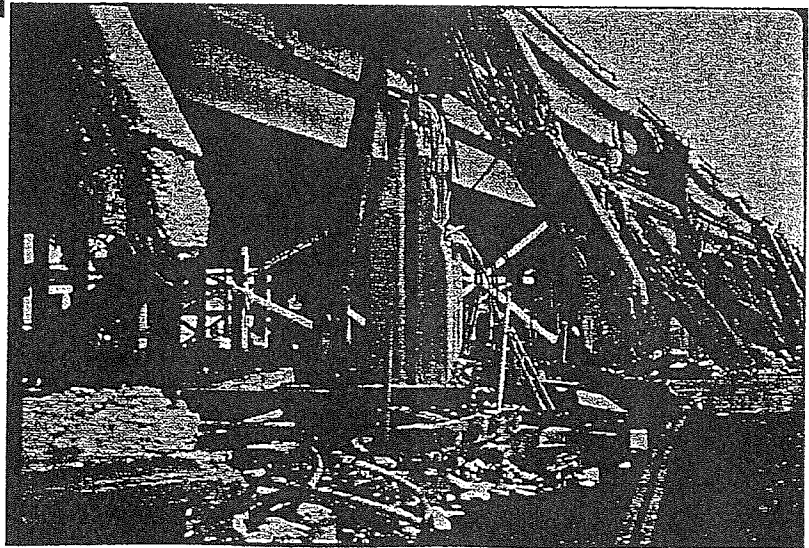

## I. BACKGROUND / GOAL:

The City of Garden Grove views emergency management as a priority to protect lives and property of the residents and visitors to the area. The City's Emergency Management Plan has been updated in order to comply with the California Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS) format.

This exercise has been developed by the Training Division of the Garden Grove Fire Department, in conjunction with Federal Emergency Management (FEMA) guidelines.

### **Goal**

To assess and improve the operational readiness of the City of Garden Grove EOC staff and identify training needs.

## II. CONCEPT / PURPOSE / OBJECTIVE:

### **Concept**

The first hour will be a real-time functional exercise. In conjunction with and subsequent to an earthquake drill, conducted during a Central Management Meeting, the exercise scenario will be read, the City's EOC activated and the exercise begun. The activation of the EOC will serve as the first step of the exercise. Thereafter, participants will respond to the pre-scripted messages contained in the Exercise Plan. The EOC staff will utilize the Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) to mitigate and minimize the effects of a simulated earthquake which results in breakage of one of the reservoirs at Trask and Magnolia. The water flow will require evacuation and damage assessment of the surrounding residential area as well as an extensive cleanup and recovery effort.

### **Purpose**

To improve, through a functional exercise, the City's EOC response to major emergencies under the recommended SEMS procedures, utilizing an earthquake and flooding scenario.

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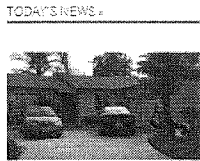

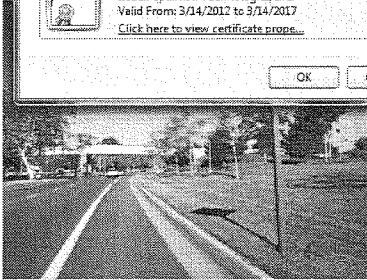
