Hi Pam,

Good speaking with you earlier. As shared, I'm writing you today asking that Garden Grove Mayor Bao Nguyen consider endorsing the Medi-Cal Funding and Accountability Act, which has already qualified for the November 2016 California ballot.

Following is a brief capsule on the Act. I have also attached as background a Fact Sheet, Q&A, current Master Coalition List, Initiative Text, and Endorsement Form. We are seeking support as soon as possible, but are certainly sensitive to your approval processes. Please let me know your feedback, or if the Mayor has any questions.

On Dec. 3, 2015, the Board of Directors of the California Association of Counties voted 51-0 to support the Act. Today, the Act is endorsed by a diverse coalition of sectors in California, including more than 900 hospitals and health systems, health care advocacy groups, medical and dental groups, community benefit organizations, senior and children's organizations and the business community. The <u>Coalition Website</u> has also been updated with additional information.

Synopsis

Thanks to a historic bipartisan legislative agreement in 2013, without a single "No" vote and with the Governor's signature (SB 239 on 10/8/2013), California will receive billions of dollars a year in new federal funding for health care for children and seniors. However, this law expires on 12.31.2016. That's why we need your help.

The Medi-Cal Funding and Accountability Act is a simple, common sense solution that makes the existing program permanent and guarantees ongoing federal health care funding to support these important health

care services.

Background on the initiative: In the fall of 2013, Governor Brown signed Senate Bill 239 (Hernandez), which was passed by the state Legislature without a single "No" vote. The legislation established an initial three-year Medi-Cal hospital fee program to ensure that California can unlock billions annually in federal matching funds for supplemental Medi-Cal payments to hospitals. The Act makes the fee program and the protections permanent to create more certainty and to deliver approximately \$10 billion in matching funds during the first three years.

The Act also ensures that these funds cannot be diverted for other purposes. Without ongoing protections for the hospital fee program, hospitals that care for children, seniors and low-income residents will be vulnerable to payment cuts or other budget politics. Funding protected by the Act will help prevent closures or cutbacks in local hospitals and will help preserve access for millions of men, women and children. California is home to more than 13 million Medi-Cal beneficiaries, more than half of whom are children. Thanks in advance for your consideration. 

- A. The federal government established the Medicaid program to help pay for health care services provided to low-income patients, including the elderly, persons with disabilities, and children. In California this program is called Medi-Cal. In order for any state to receive federal Medicaid funds, the State has to contribute a matching amount of its own money.
- B. In 2009, a new program was created whereby California hospitals began paying a fee to help the State obtain available federal Medicaid funds, at no cost to California taxpayers. This program has helped pay for health care for low-income children and resulted in California hospitals receiving approximately \$2 billion per year in additional federal money to help hospitals to meet the needs of Medi-Cal patients.

SECTION 2. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

To ensure that the fee paid by hospitals to the State for the purpose of maximizing the available federal matching funds is used for the intended purpose, the People hereby amend the Constitution to:

A. Require voter approval of changes to the hospital fee program to ensure that the State uses these funds for the intended purpose of supporting hospital care to Medi-Cal patients and to help pay for health care for low-income children.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

Section 3.5 of Article XVI of the California Constitution is added to read:

- Sec. 3.5(a) No statute amending or adding to the provisions of the Medi-Cal Hospital Reimbursement Improvement Act of 2013 shall become effective unless approved by the electors in the same manner as statutes amending initiative statutes pursuant to section 10(c) of Article II, except that the Legislature may, by statute passed in each house by roll call vote entered into the journal, two-thirds of the membership concurring, amend or add provisions that further the purposes of the Act.
 - (b) For purposes of this section:
- (1) "Act" means the Medi-Cal Hospital Reimbursement Improvement Act of 2013 (enacted by Senate Bill 239 of the 2013-14 Regular Session of the Legislature, and any non-substantive amendments to the Act enacted by a later bill in the same Session of the Legislature).
- (2) "Non-substantive amendments" shall only mean minor, technical, grammatical, or clarifying amendments.
 - (3) "Provisions that further the purposes of the Act" shall only mean:
- (i) amendments or additions necessary to obtain or maintain federal approval of the implementation of the Act, including the fee imposed and related quality assurance payments to hospitals made pursuant to the Act;
- (ii) amendments or additions to the methodology used for the development of the fee and quality assurance payments to hospitals made pursuant to the Act.

- (c) Nothing in this section shall prohibit the Legislature from repealing the Act in its entirety by statute passed in each house by roll call vote entered into the journal, two-thirds of the membership concurring, except that the Legislature shall not be permitted to repeal the Act and replace it with a similar statute imposing a tax, fee, or assessment unless that similar statute is either: (i) a provision that furthers the purposes of the Act as defined herein; or (ii) is approved by the electors in the same manner as statutes amending initiative statutes pursuant to section 10(c) of Article II.
- (d) The proceeds of the fee imposed by the Act and all interest earned on such proceeds shall not be considered revenues, General Fund revenues, General Fund proceeds of taxes, or allocated local proceeds of taxes, for purposes of Sections 8 and 8.5 of this Article or for the purposes of article XIIIB. The appropriation of the proceeds in the Trust Fund referred to in the Act for hospital services to Medi-Cal beneficiaries or other beneficiaries in any other similar federal program shall not be subject to the prohibitions or restrictions in Sections 3 or 5 of this Article.
- SECTION 4. Amendments to Medi-Cal Hospital Reimbursement Improvement Act of 2013 (language added is designated in <u>underlined</u> type and language deleted is designated in <u>strikeout</u> type)

 Section 14169.72 of Article 5.230 of the Welfare and Institutions Code is amended to read:
 - §14169.72. This article shall become inoperative if any of the following occurs:
- (a) The effective date of a final judicial determination made by any court of appellate jurisdiction or a final determination by the United States Department of Health and Human Services or the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services that the quality assurance fee established pursuant to this article, or Section 14169.54 or 14169.55, cannot be implemented. This subdivision shall not apply to any final judicial determination made by any court of appellate jurisdiction in a case brought by hospitals located outside the state.
- (b) The federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services denies approval for, or does not approve on or before the last day of a program period, the implementation of Section 14169.52, 14169.53, 14169.54, and 14169.55, and the department fails to modify Section 14169.52, 14169.53, 14169.54, and 14169.55 pursuant to subdivision (d) of Section 14169.53 in order to meet the requirements of federal law or to obtain federal approval.
- (c) The Legislature fails to appropriate moneys in the Hospital Quality Assurance Revenue Fund in the annual Budget Act, or fails to appropriate such moneys in a separate bill enacted within thirty (30) days following enactment of the annual Budget Act. A final judicial determination by the California Supreme Court or any California Court of Appeal that the revenues collected pursuant to this article that are deposited in the Hospital Quality Assurance Revenue Fund are either of the following:
- (1) "General Fund proceeds of taxes appropriated pursuant to Article XIII B of the California Constitution," as used in subdivision (b) of Section 8 of Article XVI of the California Constitution.
- (2) "Allocated local proceeds of taxes," as used in subdivision (b) of Section 8 of Article XVI of the California Constitution.
- (d) The department has sought but has not received federal financial participation for the supplemental payments and other costs required by this article for which federal financial participation has been sought.

- (e) A lawsuit related to this article is filed against the state and a preliminary injunction or other order has been issued that results in a financial disadvantage to the state. For purposes of this subdivision, "financial disadvantage to the state" means either of the following:
 - (1) A loss of federal financial participation.
- (2) A <u>net cost to the General Fund cost incurred due to the Act</u> that is equal to or greater than one-quarter of 1 percent of the General Fund expenditures authorized in the most recent annual Budget Act.
- (f) The proceeds of the fee and any interest and dividends earned on deposits are not deposited into the Hospital Quality Assurance Revenue Fund or are not used as provided in section 14169.53
- (g) The proceeds of the fee, the matching amount provided by the federal government, and interest and dividends earned on deposits in the Hospital Quality Assurance Revenue Fund are not used as provided in section 14169.68.

Section 14169.75 of Article 5.230 of the Welfare and Institutions Code is amended to read:

§14169.75. Notwithstanding subdivision (k) of section 14167.35, subdivisions (a), (i), and (j) of section 14167.35, creating the Hospital Quality Assurance Revenue Fund, are not repealed and shall remain operative as long as this article remains operative. Notwithstanding Section 14169.72, this article shall become inoperative on January 1, 2018. No hospital shall be required to pay the fee after that date unless the fee was owed during the period in which the article was operative, and no payments authorized under Section 14169.53 shall be made unless the payments were owed during the period in which the article was operative.

SECTION 5. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- (a) If any provision of this measure, or any part thereof, is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions shall not be affected, but shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this measure are severable.
- (b) This measure is intended to be comprehensive. It is the intent of the People that in the event this measure or measures relating to the same subject shall appear on the same statewide election ballot, the provisions of the other measure or measures shall be deemed to be in conflict with this measure. In the event that this measure receives a greater number of affirmative votes, the provisions of this measure shall prevail in their entirety, and all provisions of the other measure or measures shall be null and void.

Providing Care for 12 Million Children, Seniors and Working Families

Thanks to a historic bipartisan legislative agreement in 2013, without a single "No" vote and with the governor's signature, California will receive billions a year in new federal funding for health care for children and seniors. However, this law expires in 2017.

The Medi-Cal Funding and Accountability Act (Act) is a simple, common sense solution that makes the reforms permanent and guarantees ongoing federal health care funding. This change is needed now to ensure that California receives its fair share from Washington DC and to ensure the money is spent as intended.

Government Accountability

At a time of great uncertainty about health care, the Act ensures new federal matching funds are used for those who truly need it. The Act holds the Legislature accountable and prohibits government, bureaucrats or other special interests from diverting funds away from health care for unrelated purposes. Any changes to the use of the funds would have to be approved by voters first.

\$3 Billion Annually in New Federal Matching Funds

Hospitals have agreed to participate in a program that unlocks approximately \$3 billion a year in new federal matching funds, maximizing California's share. The money must be spent to provide health care services to children and resources for Medi-Cal to serve elderly and low-income Californians. Without these resources, the money would have to come from privately insured patients.

Protect Taxpayers and Access to Hospital Care

People with private insurance shouldn't have their premiums increased to subsidize Medi-Cal when federal money is available to help cover the cost. Funding guaranteed by the Act will also help prevent closures or cutbacks in local hospitals and emergency rooms.

Statewide Support

Hospitals and health care providers across California have joined together to sponsor this common sense solution, which protects services for children and seniors. There is no organized opposition to the measure.

Highlights of 2015 CALNET Leadership Retreat

The Asian Pacific American Leadership Foundation (APALF) hosted the 2nd Annual Leadership Retreat for the California Asian Leadership Network of Electeds (CALNET) on December 3⁻⁴, 2015, in Half Moon Bay, CA. 

California State Secretary and past President of the National Association of Latino Elected and Appointed Officials (NALEO), Alex Padilla opened the 2nd day luncheon program by drawing parallels between CALNET's growth and the early stages of the NALEO. Secretary Padilla also emphasized CALNET as a resource to APA elected and appointed officials in California and the potential of the network to scale up nationwide.

Good speaking with you earlier. As shared, I'm writing you today asking that Garden Grove Mayor Bao Nguyen consider endorsing the Medi-Cal Funding and Accountability Act, which has already qualified for the November 2016 California ballot.

Following is a brief capsule on the Act. I have also attached as background a Fact Sheet, Q&A, current Master Coalition List, Initiative Text, and Endorsement Form. We are seeking support as soon as possible, but are certainly sensitive to your approval processes. Please let me know your feedback, or if the Mayor has any questions.

On Dec. 3, 2015, the Board of Directors of the California Association of Counties voted 51-0 to support the Act. Today, the Act is endorsed by a diverse coalition of sectors in California, including more than 900 hospitals and health systems, health care advocacy groups, medical and dental groups, community benefit organizations, senior and children's organizations and the business community. The <u>Coalition Website</u> has also been updated with additional information.

Synopsis

Thanks to a historic bipartisan legislative agreement in 2013, without a single "No" vote and with the Governor's signature (SB 239 on 10/8/2013), California will receive billions of dollars a year in new federal funding for health care for children and seniors. However, this law expires on 12.31.2016. That's why we need your help.

The Medi-Cal Funding and Accountability Act is a simple, common sense solution that makes the existing program permanent and guarantees ongoing federal health care funding to support these important health care services.

Background on the initiative: In the fall of 2013, Governor Brown signed Senate Bill 239 (Hernandez), which was passed by the state Legislature without a single "No" vote. The legislation established an initial three-year Medi-Cal hospital fee program to ensure that California can unlock billions annually in federal matching funds for supplemental Medi-Cal payments to hospitals. The Act makes the fee program and the protections permanent to create more certainty and to deliver approximately \$10 billion in matching funds during the first three years.

The Act also ensures that these funds *cannot be diverted for other purposes*. Without ongoing protections for the hospital fee program, hospitals that care for children, seniors and low-income residents will be vulnerable to payment cuts or other budget politics. Funding protected by the Act will help prevent closures or cutbacks in local hospitals and will help preserve access for millions of men, women and children. California is home to more than 13 million Medi-Cal beneficiaries, more than half of whom are children. Thanks in advance for your consideration. Why do we need Prop 58?

The insecticide you are going to spray for mosquitoes, Duet, is not safe. It is a synthetic pyrethroid. Synthetic pyrethroids are known to be able to cause lymphoma and leukemia in children and can cause pregnant women to have autistic children. Also the active ingredient,

Prallethrin: (RS)-2-methyl-4-oxo-3-(2-propynyl) cyclopent- 2-enyl-(1RS)-cis, trans-chrysanthemate, has acute contact toxicity with honeybees acute dietary toxicity with some birds and even reproductive toxicity with some birds. It will kill other insects as well, but probably very few mosquitoes. It won't affect Aedes aegypti mosquitoes as they are daytime biters and are hiding at night and will not come in contact with the pesticide.

In reality, government agencies shouldn't be spraying for mosquitoes anyway. It is up to homeowners to keep standing water off their property and to wear good insect repellents when they go outside. Folks should make sure they have good screens on your windows and doors to keep mosquitoes and other insects out. They should empty standing water from flower pots, buckets, barrels and similar containers and change the water in bird baths weekly. Keep wading pools empty and on their sides when not in use. In other words, don't provide breeding grounds for the mosquitoes. City and county agencies can put larvicides such as Bt in any ponds or pools of standing water on city and county property and that will help stop the breeding process of mosquitoes.

Please refrain from endangering the people in the area. Mosquito control is about education, not wholesale spraying of toxic pesticides.

Please consider the health of our community including environmental impacts and most importantly the health of our citizens especially the most vulnerable members including our children. As a parent this issue is very important to me. I have included below a brief description and the conclusion of just one study from the National Institute of Health concerning the dangers of aerial spraying. Please take the time to read the study and become as informed as possible regarding the myriad dangers of spraying chemicals over our community in this manner. I am counting on you to keep our children safe.

This study looked at the onset and course of puberty are under the control of the **neuroendocrine system**. Factors affecting the timing and regulation of the functions of this system may alter the onset and course of puberty. **Several environmental endocrine disruptors (EDs)** with **significant influences on the normal course of puberty** have been identified. Numerous animal and human studies concerning EDs have been conducted showing that these **substances may extensively affect human health**; nevertheless, there are still several issues that remain to be clarified. In this paper, the available evidence from animal and human studies on the effects of environmental EDs with the potential to cause precocious or delayed puberty was reviewed.

In conclusion, it is worth noting that for EDs, to cause impairment of endocrine functions, time of exposure is as important as dose, duration and age at exposure. Moreover, a single chemical substance may result in multiple endocrine system dysfunctions via several mechanisms. To date, various EDs have been shown to exert unwanted effects on pubertal development. It is possible that there are numerous other chemicals with potential harmful effects on pubertal development. Future population-based studies are warranted for further investigation.



Ernie Allen is a world leader in the fight against child abduction, sexual exploitation, sexual violence and human trafficking and pornography. As founding Chairman of the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children in 1984, Ernie Allen served as president and CEO until 2012. During his tenure, more than 180,000 missing children were recovered. The recovery rate increased from 62% in 1990 to 97% in 2012. He created

the national 24-hour missing children hotline and established the national CyberTipline for reporting child sexual exploitation. He also created the Child Victim Identification Program to analyze millions of child pornography images to rescue child victims and help capture their sex offenders.

Dear Mr. Gosselin:

Firstly, the palms you are referring to were NOT recently planted as you so stated in your letter, but, in fact, were planted four years ago in an effort to improve the general appearance of our curb appeal much like you're wanting to improve the general appearance of the city.

Secondly, the Municipal Code "hardship for pedestrians and/or vehicles" does not apply in this instance since our house is located on a cul-de-sac, with **no through traffic or pedestrian.** The only exception are the homeless who do on occasion illegally trespass through the freeway easement and through our property. However, the City of Garden Grove, has chosen to ignore this issue. Furthermore, street sweepers and Waste Management vehicles have never encountered any such problems with the palms so I'm confused as to why we need to remove them.

The palms you are referring to are planted on a small strip adjacent to our driveway which I was under the impression was part of my property. In fact, this small strip of land has always been maintained by us the homeowners and our gardner is who keeps it clean on a weekly basis. For this reason, and the fact that the palms planted are small, I did not think it was necessary to seek approval prior to planting the palms. If the palms were not there and I did not maintain this area then this strip would look abandoned, un-manicured and take away from the curb appeal of my home.

Over the past 30 years of living in this property, Caltrans has never lifted a finger to maintain that easement (which is in very close proximity to my house) from debris, over-grown shrubbery, dried foliage, etc., nor has the


