They also report statistically significant associations between ASDs and **pyrethroid application both preconception and during the third trimester**, **as well as an association between carbamate application and developmental delay......**

Good afternoon,

I am writing you in order to express my concern that local efforts to spray mosquitoes will adversely affect our health and the environment. As the mother of a newborn who is extremely susceptible to the negative effects of chemicals used in pesticides, this is of great concern to me. We try to carefully select organic food (and use our non-treated fruit trees) to feed our family in order to avoid these types of pesticides as much as possible

Having a newborn, of course I am also concerned about West Nile Virus. However, my family and I believe that mosquitoes, and by extension, the spread of West Nile virus and other mosquito-borne diseases, can be controlled by less toxic means, rather than spraying pesticides. There is no credible evidence that spraying pesticides used to kill adult mosquitoes reduce or prevent mosquito-borne incidents or illnesses. In fact, one study from the Harvard School of Public Health found that aerosol plumes fail to contact the target mosquitoes and may not effectively reduce mosquito populations. This means that the vast majority of pesticide is allowed to enter the air and environment to trigger asthma responses, rashes, headaches, nausea, and chronic effects in the communities where spraying occurs, in addition to contaminating water supplies and endangering non-target insects such as pollinators, birds and fish.

An ideal mosquito management strategy emphasizes public education, prevention, and monitoring methods. Spraying should be used only as a last resort. Our community should focus our resources on these principles. Here are a few examples:

### 1. Cleanup

- \*Ensure continuous flow of water in streams by eliminating border vegetation that produces habitat for mosquito development.
- \*Drain or fill back-water pools and swamps where stagnant water accumulates. Sanitary landfills which can often be used in such locations will eliminate mosquito breeding sites and improve the value of the land.
- \*Remove overgrown vegetation and debris from along the banks of the lakes and ponds to discourage mosquito breeding. Such bodies of water should have a steep clean shoreline with as little vegetation as possible to prevent vegetation from causing stagnant pools of water.

### 2. Use Natural Predators

Use indigenous fish populations to eat mosquito larvae in shallow waters and ornamental pools. Certain freshwater fish, such as mosquitofish, fathead minnows, killifish, and bluegill can eat their weight in mosquito larvae. These predactions fish are used successfully in the marshes in New York, New Jersey and other parts of the U.S.

Recently New Jersey introduced 10,000 tiny copepod crustaceans to eat mosquito larvae in ditches, pools and other areas of stagnant water. Louisiana has also been successful with copepods for larval control.

### 3. Least-toxic Pesticide Options

Utilize *Bacillus thuringiensis israelensis (Bti), a* biological larvicide that prevents mosquitoes from developing into breeding, biting adults. This product can be placed in standing waters or pools that cannot be drained.

We are writing to voice support of AB 2125 (Chiu) which will lead to nail salons choosing less toxic products and practices, benefiting the overall health of the nail salon industry including its workforce and consumers.

Nail salons represent a significant business sector in California. According to the State Board of Barbering and Cosmetology, there are 129,000 licensed manicurists, and over 53,000 licensed businesses providing nail and other beauty or barber services. There are over 312,000 licensed cosmetologists, many of whom work as nail salon technicians.

Every day, nail salon workers handle solvents, glues, polishes and other products containing chemicals known or suspected to cause cancer, allergies, respiratory, neurological and reproductive harm. They report serious acute health concerns such as headaches and breathing difficulties. Most nail salon workers are women of reproductive age and are predominately Vietnamese immigrants, often with limited English skills.

Some California cities and counties have adopted Healthy Nail Salon Recognition Programs (HNSRPs) to address some of these issues. These are voluntary programs that support nail salons that use less toxic nail polishes and other products, improve ventilation, and participate in trainings on best safety and health practices. Salons that meet the programs' criteria are given recognition with a certificate, window sticker or poster, and/or by being listed as a healthier nail salon on a government website.

In order to ensure that more Californians are able to enjoy the benefits of these programs, AB 2125 requires the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) in CalEPA to outreach to local governments regarding implementing HNSRPs, publish program models and guidelines, and implement a consumer education program.

We think AB 2125 is essential to ensure greater awareness and improved health for the workforce and consumers in the nail salon industry across California. Please sign AB 2125.

Duet which Vector Control wants to spray on our homes, parks, yards, schools, churches, waterways, and streets has a main ingredient called Sumtthrin. Sumithrin is known to wipe out and kill bees and all pollinators including birds - it is highly toxic to non target insects and aquatic life. The bee population declined 45% last year worldwide, clearly this is not good news, as we need bees for food production. Spraying Duet still will kill the bees as soon as they go to forage on flowers they will be poisoned.

The MYTH that Duet magically disappears when the sun comes up has not been supported by a shred of evidence. Nothing disappears after being sprayed - it either gets absrobed - stays there evaporates into the air - carried off by water but it is not true that pesticides disappear after spraying. In fact all one needs to do is look at our water quality report to see the pesticides that are in our drinking water and the pesticides that are accumulating in the ocean.

Nothing magically disappears when the sun comes up as they would have you believe about Duet. Nice sales pitch though.

Vector Control will spray at night to try to not harm the pollinators, we have all heard meeting after meeting that the mosquitos they want to kill are day biters so I dont see the point of trying to kill them when they are not out at night.

Aerial spray is at best 10% effective - however, the non target insect and human health costs will be the other 90% which is simply not worth it. WN and Zika are asymptomatic for 70 -80 % of the population - it is not right to harm us all when so few will be affected, if any. We did not spray last year and everything turned out just fine.



South Korea is the home to global companies, such as Hyundai, Kia, Samsung, LG, Daewoo, SK and POSCO, which is why it is so shocking that an estimated 2.5 million dogs are tortured and slaughtered every year within South Korea, because of the greed of dog eaters and the dog meat industry; while the majority of those Koreans, who don't actually participate in this offensive trade, show a profound indifference by doing nothing at all to stop it.

We know how loyal and faithful our dogs across the world are; and we all ask a lot of them - they serve us in innumerable ways: farm work, war work, police and guard duties, search and rescue, help for the disabled, guiding and guardianship, and, of course, as our loving and trusting companions.

Dogs were first domesticated many thousands of years ago, and so much do they want to be part of our 'human' family that they have learned to understand our gestures and our language - the language of another species, which shows remarkable willingness and intelligence.

Anyang is one of the largest dog meat consumption areas in South Korea. If you have ever wondered what hell would be like, just visit or watch the videos of dog slaughterhouses, markets and restaurants scattered all throughout Anyang. There are countless dog slaughterhouses, markets and restaurants where the dogs, who are tortured their entire lives, end up being slaughtered in the most inhumane ways, such as by electrocution, hanging or beating; and then thrown into boiling water – sometimes while they are still alive. In many places, dogs are being killed in full view of other terrified, caged dogs; and this takes place in public and in broad daylight. Please inform Anyang Mayor Pil-Un Lee that citizens of Garden Grove and their friends insist that they issue an official document mandating that the following existing laws be enforced:

Livestock Product Sanitary Control Act, Article 2, Item 1 which governs the raising, slaughter and disposal of livestock and the processing, distribution and inspection of livestock products, does not categorize dogs as livestock that can be processed as food. Therefore this makes the dog meat industry technically illegal.

Food Sanitation Act, Article 7, Clause 1, Korean Food Standards Codex specified by the Food and Drug Administration, does not include dogs in the list of raw materials that can be processed and cooked as food, therefore making raising and slaughtering dogs for consumption illegal.

Animal Protection Act:

### ARTICLE 3. BASIC PRINCIPLES FOR PROTECTION OF ANIMALS

Each person shall endeavor to observe the following principles in raising, caring for, or protecting an animal:

- 1. Each person shall ensure that an animal maintains its natural behavior and original physical shape to live an ordinary life;
- 2. Each person shall ensure that an animal does not suffer from thirst, hunger, or malnutrition;
- 3. Each person shall ensure that an animal is free to express normal behavior without experiencing discomfort;
- 4. Each person shall ensure that an animal is free from pain, injury, and disease;
- 5. Each person shall ensure that an animal is free from fear and distress.

### ARTICLE 8. PROHIBITION OF ANIMAL ABUSE

① No one shall commit the following acts toward animals:

1. Act of killing by brutal methods, such as hanging	
2. Act of Killing in public or in another animal's presence	
③ No one shall commit the following acts toward abandoned or abused animals:	
1. Act of capture and sell or kill.	
2. Act of trade or purchase knowing that the animals are abandoned or abused.	
ARTICLE 9. ANIMAL TRANSPORTATION	
① Anyone transporting an animal that has been selected by decree from the Ministry for Food, Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries must make an effort to abide by the following:	
1. Ensure that the animals are properly fed, watered and drive carefully so that animals are not shocked or harmed from sudden departures or stops.	
2. The vehicle used for transportation must be built to prevent any harm during transportation and to minimize any pain due to poor ventilation or sudden changes in temperature, etc.	
3. When a person transports an ailing animal, a youngling, a pregnant animal, or an animal with a suckling, he/she shall install partitions or take other necessary measures to prevent such animal from being hurt by other animals in transit.

### Portion of pesticide sprays that hit flying insects

First, the portion of sprays that actually reach mosquitoes is miniscule. Sprays must be composed of tiny particles that will float in the air rather than falling to the ground: To ensure insects fly into the insecticide spray droplets, they must have a size of 2- to 16 micron." [Lofgren, et al, 1973]

The wind easily blows such "ultra low volume" (ULV) mists away from the target population. This problem is so extreme that a study of DDT used to control Heliothis (corn moth) estimated that less than

0.000001% (one part per billion) reached the target.

Many other studies have looked at the amount of sprayed pesticides that reach insects. The highest found in published research is 10%.

Cornell University professor David Pimentel reviewed published research on pesticide sprays and concluded that the average for all pesticides is that less than 0.1% reaches target pests. [Pimentel, 1995]

But this included crawling insects. When he looked specifically at flying insects like mosquitoes, the average was less than 0.0001%. This is one part per million. In order to get the equivalent of one

container of pesticides to reach mosquitoes, it is necessary to

# spray one million containers.





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

Nail salons represent a significant business sector in California. According to the State Board of Barbering and Cosmetology, there are 129,000 licensed manicurists, and over 53,000 licensed businesses providing nail and other beauty or barber services. There are over 312,000 licensed cosmetologists, many of whom work as nail salon technicians.

Every day, nail salon workers handle solvents, glues, polishes and other products containing chemicals known or suspected to cause cancer, allergies, respiratory, neurological and reproductive harm. They report serious acute health concerns such as headaches and breathing difficulties. Most nail salon workers are women of reproductive age and are predominately Vietnamese immigrants, often with limited English skills.

Some California cities and counties have adopted Healthy Nail Salon Recognition Programs (HNSRPs) to address some of these issues. Since the arrival of West Nile Virus, public health officials have felt increased pressure to act decisively on mosquito control. **There are three main reasons that adulticiding is not effective**. First, mosquitoes are tiny, and spraying pesticides out of planes is an extremely inefficient way to kill them. According to Dr. David Pimentel, an entomologist at Cornell University, 0.1% of sprayed pesticides actually hit the target pest (Pimentel, D. 1995. Amounts of Pesticides Reaching Target Pests: Environmental Impacts and Ethics. Journal of Agricultural and Environmental Ethics 8(1): 17-29). 99.9 % of the sprayed chemical is at best a waste of money, and at worst, a public health hazard.

Second, adulticiding programs target mosquitoes at the wrong stage. Such programs do not get at the mosquitoes until after they have matured and are biting, and do not restrict or control mosquitoes from continuing to breed. After Hurricane Andrew caused a surge in mosquito populations in Florida, state officials took bite counts before and after widespread aerial spraying, and found that mosquito populations surged back to pre-spray levels within three days of the treatment (News and Observer 1996. State alters mosquito plans. 9/21/96).

Third, there is strong evidence that adult WNV-carrying mosquitoes are **developing resistance to organophosphate insecticides.** "Insecticide Resistance in Mosquito Vectors." Nature 423: 136-137).

Furthermore, Duet will kill all flying insects it actually contacts, including mosquito predators such as dragonflies.

Depending on the species, dragonflies take from several weeks up to a year to complete their life cycle, while mosquitoes take just a few weeks, leaving populations with fewer natural controls.

While traditional adulticide methods look like action, in actuality they accomplish very little. Fortunately, there are more effective alternatives available for mosquito control. Thus, many communities around the US have moved away from broadcast spraying of adulticides to find more effective mosquito management practices that pose fewer risks to human health, wildlife, and water quality.

In adopting the ordinance, the Council found that "the risk/benefit analysis conducted by experts clearly indicates that the dangers of WNV are minimal and affect a very small segment of the population and that the long-term health and environmental risks of spraying with synthetic pesticides poses a much greater risk."(Beyond Pesticides. 2003. - Health officials in swampy Washington, DC continue their no-spray policy, stating that pesticide spraying is
  inappropriate in a heavily populated area with many asthma patients. Instead, officials are focusing on

In areas where mosquitoes do breed, larvaciding (killing mosquitoes in their larval stage) allows control measures to be used in targeted areas, while mosquito larvae are still concentrated in breeding pools and before adult mosquitoes spread throughout the community. This effective mosquito control method typically uses **Bascillus thuringiensis var. israelensis**, one of the most popular biological controls. It is a bacterial strain that, when introduced into larval pools, is ingested by feeding larvae and kills them. Bt poses little threat to humans or wildlife, both because of its minimal toxicity, and because the application method ensures there is very little chance of coming into contact with it. A larvacide program could have been put in place immediately after the storm hit. One Bt treatment will remain effective on mosquito larvae for months, even if a pool of water dries out and is refilled (Burns, Robert. Most Mosquito Knockout Devices Only Hammer the Buyer's Pocketbook Texas A&M Ag News, 4/23/03).

Duet is not an appropriate choice for use in areas where people live. I have already mentioned mosquito resistance to organophosphates, which are among the most highly toxic pesticides available today. The main ingredients in Duet are a developmental and reproductive toxin. There is simply no need to employ such a high-risk chemical when lower- risk alternatives are readily available. Pregnant women, infants, and children are at greater risk of harm from pesticides, and these populations are rarely taken into account in traditional risk-assessment studies. Spraying puts everyone at risk of exposure, including populations such as pregnant women, the elderly, those with chronic respiratory illness, and children all of whom deserve special protection.

I would like to request that you protect our County from the ill health effects of massive poison being sprayed. Sincerely,

Acute poisoning risks are clear, and understanding of chronic health implications from both acute and chronic exposure are emerging. Epidemiologic evidence demonstrates associations between early life exposure to pesticides and pediatric cancers, decreased cognitive function, and behavioral problems. Related animal toxicology studies provide supportive biological plausibility for these findings. Recognizing and reducing problematic exposures will require attention to current inadequacies in medical training, public health tracking, and regulatory action on pesticides. Ongoing research describing toxicologic vulnerabilities and exposure factors across the life span are needed to inform regulatory needs and appropriate interventions. Policies that promote integrated pest management, comprehensive pesticide labeling, and marketing practices that incorporate child health considerations will enhance safe use.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WESTMINSTER DESIGNATING OCTOBER  $26^{\rm TH}$  OF EACH YEAR AS REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM DAY TO HONOR THE JUST CAUSE AND COMMEMORATE THE CONTRIBUTIONS AND SACRIFICES OF THE ARMY, PEOPLE, ELECTED AND GOVERNMENTAL OFFICIALS OF THE REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM AS WELL AS AMERICAN SOLDIERS, VIETNAM WAR VETERANS, ALLIED ARMIES AND THEIR FAMILIES

WHEREAS, the Vietnamese American community of Westminster was originally a community of Vietnamese refugees consisting of the citizens of all backgrounds from the Republic of Vietnam fleeing their country after the Vietnam War, which was launched by the Vietnamese Communists from 1955 to 1975 and ended on April 30, 1975, in order to protect their lives and cultural heritage from being damaged or possibly destroyed;

WHEREAS, during the Vietnam War the Government of the Republic of Vietnam and its armed forces, people, elected, and governmental officials struggled continuously and bravely to defend and protect the freedom, lives, and property of the people, to safeguard the Republic and the new born democratic government created after the reestablishment of independence from French colonial rule;

WHEREAS, during the Vietnam War against the invasion of the Vietnamese Communists, the United States and its allied armies from Australia, South Korea, Thailand, New Zealand, and Philippines also made enormous contributions and sacrifices in protecting freedom, democracy, lives, and property of the Vietnamese people and the

WHEREAS, the Vietnamese American community with a population of nearly two million, consisting of many industrious and talented members, after four decades of integration has matured with numerous successes in all fields from culture to education, business and politics, science and technology, electronics and internet, trading and financing, court and military, and has contributed a significant effort to the maintaining of the development, and protecting the fabric of the American society at the local, state and federal government levels;

WHEREAS, the just cause of the struggle to defend and protect freedom, democracy, lives and property of the people and the Republic of Vietnam, and the enormous sacrifices and contributions of the army, people, elected and governmental officials and their families have been ignored or forgotten after the end of the Vietnam War in April 1975; and

WHEREAS, even in the United States, the sacrifices of more than 58,000 American soldiers and the contributions of about three million former servicemen and servicewomen as well as their families during the Vietnam War have not been recognized and honored properly.
