PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made this day of March 2018, by the CITY OF GARDEN GROVE, a municipal corporation, ("CITY") and Stray Cat Alliance, herein after referred to as "CONTRACTOR".

RECITALS

The following recitals are a substantive part of this Agreement:

- 1. This Agreement is entered into pursuant to Garden Grove Council Resolution No. 9212-14 (January 28, 2014).
- 2. CITY desires to utilize the services of CONTRACTOR to Provide Services for a Return-to-Field (RTF) Program per Attachment A.
- 3. CONTRACTOR is qualified by virtue of experience, training, education and expertise to accomplish services.

<u>AGREEMENT</u>

THE PARTIES MUTUALLY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Term and Termination The term of the agreement shall be for period of one (1) year from full execution of the agreement, with an option to extend said agreement additional four (4) years, for a total performance period of five (5) years. Option years shall be exercised one (1) year at a time, at the sole option of the CITY. This agreement may be terminated by the CITY without cause. In such event, the CITY will compensate CONTRACTOR for work performed to date in accordance with proposal which is attached as Attachment A and is hereby incorporated by reference. Contractor is required to present evidence to support performed work.
- 2. **Services to be Provided.** The services to be performed by CONTRACTOR shall consist of tasks as set forth in the Proposal. The Proposal is attached as Attachment A, and is incorporated herein by reference. The Proposal and this Agreement do not guarantee any specific amount of work.
- 3. **Compensation.** CONTRACTOR shall be compensated as follows:
 - 3.1 <u>AMOUNT</u>. Total Compensation under this agreement shall not exceed (NTE) amount of Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00), per year, payable in arrears and in accordance with proposal in Attachment "A".

- 3.2 <u>Payment</u>. For work under this Agreement, payment shall be made per invoice for work completed. For extra work not a part of this Agreement, a written authorization by CITY will be required, and payment shall be based on schedule included in Proposal (Attachment A).
- 3.3 Records of Expenses. CONTRACTOR shall keep complete and accurate records of all costs and expenses incidental to services covered by this Agreement. These records will be made available at reasonable times to CITY.
- 3.4 <u>Termination</u>. CITY and CONTRACTOR shall have the right to terminate this agreement, without cause, by giving thirty (30) days written notice of termination. If the Agreement is terminated by CITY, then the provisions of paragraph 3 would apply to that portion of the work completed.

4. Insurance requirements.

- 4.1 <u>COMMENCEMENT OF WORK</u>. CONTRACTOR shall not commence work under this Agreement until all certificates and endorsements have been received and approved by the CITY. All insurance required by this Agreement shall contain a Statement of Obligation on the part of the carrier to notify the CITY of any material change, cancellation, or termination at least thirty (30) days in advance.
- 4.2 <u>WORKERS COMPENSATION INSURANCE</u>. During the duration of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR and all subcontractors shall maintain Workers Compensation Insurance in the amount and type required by law, if applicable.
- 4.3 <u>INSURANCE AMOUNTS</u>. CONTRACTOR shall maintain the following insurance for the duration of this Agreement:
- (a) Commercial general liability in an amount of \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence (claims made and modified occurrence policies are not acceptable); Insurance companies must be acceptable to CITY and have a Best's Guide Rating of A-, Class VII or better, as approved by the CITY.
- (b) Automobile liability in an amount of \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit (claims made and modified occurrence policies are not acceptable); Insurance companies must be acceptable to CITY and have a Best's Guide Rating of A-, Class VII or better, as approved by the CITY.

(c) Professional liability in an amount not less than \$1,000,000. Insurance companies must be admitted and licensed In California and have a Best's Guide Rating of A-,Class VII or better, as approved by the City. If the policy is written on a "claims made" basis, the policy shall be continued in full force and effect at all times during the term of the agreement, and for a period of three (3) years from the date of the completion of services provided. In the event of termination, cancellation, or material change in the policy, professional/consultant shall obtain continuing insurance coverage for the prior acts or omissions of professional/consultant during the course of performing services under the term of the agreement. The coverage shall be evidenced either by a new policy evidencing no gap in coverage, or by obtaining separate extended "tail" coverage with the present or new carrier.

An **On-Going and Completed Operations Additional Insured Endorsement** for the policy under section 4.3 (a) shall designate CITY, it's officers, officials, employees, agents, and volunteers as additional insureds for liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR shall provide to CITY proof of insurance and endorsement forms that conform to CITY's requirements, as approved by the CITY.

An Additional Insured Endorsement for the policy under section 4.3 (b) shall designate CITY, it's officers, officials, employees, agents, and volunteers as additional insureds for automobiles, owned, leased, hired, or borrowed by the CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR shall provide to CITY proof of insurance and endorsement forms that conform to CITY's requirements, as approved by the CITY.

For any claims related to this Agreement, CONTRACTOR's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects CITY, it's officers, officials, employees, agents, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the CITY, it's officers, officials, employees, agents, and volunteers shall be excess of the CONTRACTOR's insurance and shall not contribute with it.

If CONTRACTOR maintains higher insurance limits than the minimums shown above, CONTRACTOR shall provide coverage for the higher insurance limits otherwise maintained by the CONTRACTOR.

- 5. Non-Liability of Officials and Employees of the CITY. No official or employee of CITY shall be personally liable to CONTRACTOR in the event of any default or breach by CITY, or for any amount which may become due to CONTRACTOR.
- 6. **Non-Discrimination.** CONTRACTOR covenants there shall be no discrimination against any person or group due to race, color, creed, religion, sex, marital status, age, handicap, national origin, or ancestry, in any activity pursuant to this Agreement.
- 7. **Independent Contractor.** It is agreed to that CONTRACTOR shall act and be an independent contractor and not an agent or employee of the CITY, and shall obtain no rights to any benefits which accrue to CITY'S employees.
- 8. <u>Compliance with Law.</u> CONTRACTOR shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, codes, and regulations of the federal, state, and local government. CONTRACTOR shall comply with, and shall be responsible for causing all contractors and subcontractors performing any of the work pursuant to this Agreement to comply with, all applicable federal and state labor standards, including, to the extent applicable, the prevailing wage requirements promulgated by the Director of Industrial Relations of the State of California Department of Labor. The City makes no warranty or representation concerning whether any of the work performed pursuant to this Agreement constitutes public works subject to the prevailing wage requirements.
- 9. **Notices.** All notices shall be personally delivered or mailed to the below listed address, or to such other addresses as may be designated by written notice. These addresses shall be used for delivery of service of process.

10. **CONTRACTOR'S PROPOSAL.** This Agreement shall include CONTRACTOR'S proposal or bid which shall be incorporated herein by reference. In the event of any inconsistency between the terms of the proposal and this Agreement, this Agreement shall govern.

- 11. <u>Licenses, Permits, and Fees</u>. At its sole expense, CONTRACTOR shall obtain a Garden Grove Business License, all permits, and licenses as may be required by this Agreement.
- 12. Familiarity with Work. By executing this Agreement, CONTRACTOR warrants that: (1) it has investigated the work to be performed; (2) it has investigated the site of the work and is aware of all conditions there; and (3) it understands the facilities, difficulties, and restrictions of the work under this Agreement. Should Contractor discover any latent or unknown conditions materially differing from those inherent in the work or as represented by CITY, it shall immediately inform CITY of this and shall not proceed, except at CONTRACTOR'S risk, until written instructions are received from CITY.
- 13. <u>Time of Essence</u>. Time is of the essence in the performance of this Agreement.
- 14. Limitations Upon Subcontracting and Assignment. The experience, knowledge, capability, and reputation of CONTRACTOR, its principals and employees were a substantial inducement for CITY to enter into this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall not contract with any other entity to perform the services required without written approval of the CITY. This Agreement may not be assigned voluntarily or by operation of law, without the prior written approval of CITY. If CONTRACTOR is permitted to subcontract any part of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall be responsible to CITY for the acts and omissions of its subcontractor as it is for persons directly employed. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall create any contractual relationship between any subcontractor and CITY. All persons engaged in the work will be considered employees of CONTRACTOR. CITY will deal directly with and will make all payments to CONTRACTOR.
- 15. Authority to Execute. The persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the parties warrant that they are duly authorized to execute this Agreement and that by executing this Agreement, the parties are formally bound.
- Indemnification. To the fullest extent permitted by law, CONTRACTOR shall defend, and hold harmless CITY and its elective or appointive boards, officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims, liabilities, expenses, or damages of any nature, including attorneys' fees, for injury or death of any person, or damages of any nature, including interference with use of property, arising out of, or in any way connected with the negligence, recklessness and/or intentional wrongful conduct of CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR'S agents, officers, employees, subcontractors, or independent contractors hired by CONTRACTOR in the performance of the Agreement. The only exception to CONTRACTOR'S responsibility to protect, defend, and hold harmless CITY, is due to the sole negligence, recklessness and/or wrongful conduct of CITY, or any of its elective or appointive boards, officers, agents, or employees.

This hold harmless agreement shall apply to all liability regardless of whether any insurance policies are applicable. The policy limits do not act as a limitation upon the amount of indemnification to be provided by CONTRACTOR.

17. **Appropriations.** This Agreement is subject to and contingent upon funds being appropriated therefor by the Garden Grove City Council for each fiscal year covered by the term of this Agreement. If such appropriations are not made, this Agreement shall automatically terminate without penalty to the CITY.

PROPOSAL Stray Cat Alliance and Garden Grove Animal Care Services

This proposaloutlines roles and responsibilities among Stray Cat Alliance ("SCA"), the City of Garden Grove (CiTY) for Feral and Community Cats in Garden Grove

About Stray Cat Alliance

SCA is a nonprofit organization with a mission "to educates and empowers the community to advocate for every cat's right to be safe, healthy, and valued." SCA currently runs the Return-To-Field program for The City of Long Beach Animal Care services with excellent results.

PURPOSE & SCOPE

Spay and neuter continues to be one of the most effective methods of reducing shelter intake and subsequent euthanasia, especially for cats. SCA and CITY wish to work together to create a multi-pronged cat program in order to decrease the number of cats entering and thus euthanized at the contracted shelter: Orange County Human Society ("OCHS). We also wish to decrease the number of cats and kittens living on the streets and decrease the number of complaint calls being made to CITY.

Together, the SCA and CITY wish to enter into an agreement to decrease shelter euthanasia, decrease the number of free roaming cats on the streets, and decrease complaint calls to CITY. Accordingly, the parties operating under this proposal agree as follows:

PROGRAMS

There are two components to the program included in this proposal:

- 1. Return-To-Field ("RTF") Program This program involves stray cats that are brought to the shelter by the public and animal control by means of a carrier or trap. Stray cats that qualify for this program will be brought to a contracted veterinary clinic, medically evaluated, altered, microchipped, vaccinated, and treated for fleas. SCA will then retrieve the cats after medical treatment, spay/neuter, and return them to their homes at the address provided. It is CITY's desire to see lower populations of cats in the community served, resulting in lower shelter intake of cats and kittens, lower shelter euthanasia of cats, and lower field services calls regarding cats.
- 2. Targeted Trap Neuter Return ("TTNR") Program When cats are returned to their address, the remaining cats in that colony are also trapped and sterilized to prevent breeding and stabilize the area. This will ultimately reduce the number of kittens born and possibly brought to the shelter. SCA will also use data provided by CITY to determine areas of higher impounds of cats and kittens to target hot spots resulting in high kitten and cat impound (Dependent on Funding).

PROGRAM TASKS

The parties agree to the following tasks:

SCA will appoint a representative(s) with appropriate knowledge and decision-making authority to attend monthly program update meetings. In addition, SCA will:

- 1. RTF: Utilize best efforts to return approximately 450 cats in the first twelve months of the program (greater than three months of age) impounded by CITY to their known address/home; and maintain agreed upon data.
- 2. TTNR: Utilize best efforts to TTNR 900 cats for the first twelve months of the program. It has been estimated that the most successful RTF programs sterilize two times the amount of cats that are RTF (450 shelter cats RTF x 2=900). SCA will work to secure funding for personnel and spay/neuter.
- 3. Public Information: SCA will provide information to the public on RTF and TTNR when and where appropriate.

CITYwill appoint a representative(s) with appropriate knowledge and decision-making authority to attend monthly program update meetings. In addition, CITY will:

- 1. Allow SCA to RTF 450 cats from the City of Garden Grove;
- 2. Allow SCA to Target TNR 900 cats from the City of Garden Grove;
- 3. CITY officers will remotely impound healthy community cats and bring them to a SCA approved spay/neuter provider;
- 4. CITY will allocate SCA \$35,000 for this program for services.
- 5. CITY and its current contracted shelter will cooperate with SCA and its needs for a successful, life-saving program;
- 6. CITY will instruct OCHS to treat any cats impounded at OCHS with a good, fair, or guarded prognosis. Aliments including but not limited to manage, ringworm, URI, abscesses, shall be treated and cats retrieved when healthy for RTF; and
- 7. CITY will provide any and all intake and outcome data needed to design the program and assess the program's success, including but not limited to geographical data for intake location of kittens and cats for the past three years (Data is being coordinated between CITY, SCA, and OCHS).

TERM

The term of this PROPOSAL is one (1) year from (**Dates to be determined**). The PROPOSAL shall be reviewed each year to ensure that all terms are being met and to make any necessary revisions. The PROPOSAL will automatically renew each year upon mutual agreement of both parties. The PROPOSAL may be terminated by either party with 60 days written notice.

PUBLICITY

In connection with the Programs and Tasks described above, no party will use another party's name, marks, or logos in any advertising, promotional material, press release, publication, public announcements, or through other media, whether written or oral, without prior consent of the other parties.

ACCOUNTABILITY

Except where the parties have expressed a clear intent to be bound, the provisions set forth will not be legally binding, and no party will have any liability or obligation to the other party/parties with respect to such provisions.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Each party will appoint a person to serve as the official contact and coordinate the Program Tasks of each organization in carrying out the proposal:

This insurance does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurring after:

- 1. All work, including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work, on the project (other than service, maintenance or repairs) to be performed by or on behalf of the additional insured(s) at the location of the covered operations has been completed; or
- 2. That portion of "your work" out of which injury or damage arises has been put to its intended use by any person or organization other than another contractor or subcontractor engaged in performing operations for a principal as a part of the same project.
- C. The following is added to SECTION III LIMITS OF INSURANCE:

The limits of insurance applicable to the additional insured(s) are those specified in the written contract between you and the additional insured(s), or the limits available under this policy, whichever are less. These limits are part of and not in addition to the limits of insurance under this policy.

- D. With respect to the insurance provided to the additional insured(s), Condition 4. Other Insurance of SECTION IV COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY CONDITIONS is replaced by the following:
 - 4. Other Insurance
 - a. Primary Insurance

This insurance is primary if you have agreed in a written contract or written agreement:

- (1) That this insurance be primary. If other insurance is also primary, we will share with all that other insurance as described in **c**. below; or
- (2) The coverage afforded by this insurance is primary and non-contributory with the additional insured(s)' own insurance.

Paragraphs (1) and (2) do not apply to other insurance to which the additional insured(s) has been added as an additional insured or to other insurance described in paragraph **b**, below.

b. Excess Insurance

This insurance is excess over:

- Any of the other insurance, whether primary, excess, contingent or on any other basis:
 - (a) That is Fire, Extended Coverage, Builder's Risk, Installation Risk or similar coverage for "your work";
 - (b) That is fire, lightning, or explosion insurance for premises rented to you or temporarily occupied by you with permission of the owner;
 - (c) That is insurance purchased by you to cover your liability as a tenant for "property damage" to premises temporarily occupied by you with permission of the owner; or
 - (d) If the loss arises out of the maintenance or use of aircraft, "autos" or watercraft to the extent not subject to Exclusion g. of SECTION I – COVERAGE A – BODILY INJURY AND PROPERTY DAMAGE.
 - (e) Any other insurance available to an additional insured(s) under this Endorsement covering liability for damages which are subject to this endorsement and for which the additional insured(s) has been added as an additional insured by that other insurance.
- (1) When this insurance is excess, we will have no duty under Coverages A or B to defend the additional insured(s) against any "suit" if any other insurer has a duty to defend the additional insured(s) against that "suit". If no other insurer defends, we will undertake to do so, but we will be entitled to the additional insured(s)' rights against all those other insurers.
- (2) When this insurance is excess over other insurance, we will pay only our share of the amount of the loss, if any, that exceeds the sum of:
 - (a) The total amount that all such other insurance would pay for the loss in the absence of this insurance; and
 - (b) The total of all deductible and self-insured amounts under all that other insurance.
- (3) We will share the remaining loss, if any, with any other insurance that is not described in this Excess Insurance provision and was not bought specifically to apply in excess of the Limits of Insurance shown in the Declarations of this Coverage Part.

c. Methods of Sharing

If all of the other insurance available to the additional insured(s) permits contribution by equal shares, we will follow this method also. Under this approach each insurer contributes equal amounts until it has paid its applicable limit of insurance or none of the loss remains, whichever comes first.

If any other the other insurance available to the additional insured(s) does not permit contribution by equal shares, we will contribute by limits. Under this method, each insurer's share is based on the ratio of its applicable limit of insurance to the total applicable limits of insurance of all insurers.
