Garden Grove Quality of Life Community Engagement Survey Join the Conversation!

Executive Summary


As a part of the Budget Sub-Committee's efforts to address the City's structural budget deficit, the City of Garden Grove partnered with the LEW Edwards Group and FM3 to gauge the community's priorities and preferences. Beginning on October 21, 2017, FM3 surveyed 400 community members, finding that maintaining 911 emergency response times, protecting local drinking water supplies, and fighting gangs and drugs were among residents' top three priorities. In the following months, City staff circulated a supplemental, Community Conversation survey to augment FM3's efforts. City staff met with key community groups throughout all districts and collected approximately 250 survey responses to date. Community engagement efforts are ongoing.



Observations & Findings

Analysis of the Community Conversation survey responses demonstrates that Garden Grove residents generally agree with FM3's conclusions. Observations from both surveys suggest that the Garden Grove community strongly believes in maintaining current public safety levels. In fact, of the 250 survey responses, 46 respondents selected maintaining 911 emergency response times as their top priority while 43 selected preventing cuts to public safety officers and 41 selected maintaining neighborhood police patrols. In line with FM3's findings, respondents' second and third highest priorities also included protecting local drinking water supplies and fighting gangs and drugs. Thus, despite a slightly greater emphasis on other public safety services such as maintaining neighborhood police patrols and preventing cuts to officers, the Community Conversation survey results are consistent with FM3's findings.

Additional Service Priorities

In addition to supporting FM3's findings in favor of maintaining current public safety levels, residents of Garden Grove also expressed concerns with prioritizing other City services. These priorities included the following:

- Increased Code Enforcement
- Graffiti prevention and cleanup
- Better traffic control in neighborhoods
- Street and waste cleanup
- Greater resources for the City's community centers (Buena Clinton & Magnolia)
- City Infrastructure repair (street signs, curbs, etc.)
