On 10-14-2018 at 9:42am I was contacted by battalion Chief Truhill an instructed to respond to 12242 Diane St and conduct a fire investigation. I was informed that Garden Grove Police Office Mushetto would meet me at the loss location. Upon arrival I made contact with Officer Mushetto. He informed me that he was called out by the vehicle owner who had discovered the fire damage to the loss vehicle.

The fire originated in the interior of the loss vehicle. The more specific area of origin is on the passenger side of the loss vehicle. The vehicle was identified as a 2006 Chevy truck, 2500 diesel with approximately 240,000 miles. The VIN is 1GBHC29D26E283111 with a California license plate number 50800G2 and a current tag that expires July 2019. During my scene examination I observed the driver side window broken from mechanical damage. The broken pieces of glass were located on the inside the vehicle consistent with it being struck from the exterior. Located on the driver side front seat was a plastic Gatorade bottle filled with a liquid that had an odor similar to gasoline. The cap was in the open position upon initial examination. The greatest fire damage was observed on the passenger seat toward the door and the headliner. Minimal heat damage was observed on the rear passenger seat head rest consistent with fire originating in the passenger seat. The plastic bottle was collected as evidence and was given to Office Mushetto. He will log into evidence and send in to be tested for DNA, fingerprints and sample of the liquid in the plastic container. The fire is classified as incendiary by unknown persons or person.

During my scene examination I contacted and conducted an interview with Dawns Wells who identified herself as the wife of the owner of the loss vehicle. She can be reached at 714-260-6851. She stated that her husband Sean Odasso had walked outside getting the kids ready for softball when he observed the fire damage to the truck. He returned in the house and told her to call the police department. He told her the driver side window was broken and that there was a bottle filled with fluid in the driver seat. She informed me that they purchased the loss vehicle approximately one and a half years ago as a salvage and paid it off six months ago. She denies having any issues or repairs made to the vehicle. Mrs. Wells stated that her husband runs his own business installing appliances and that they recently had an issue with and employee Chris Helmer. Mr. Helmer can be reached at 909-522-8921. She stated that he has a history of drug use but has been clean for a while. He has been residing in their house for approximately six months until two weeks prior to the fire. She stated that he was acting as if he was using drug again and Mr. Odasso had asked him to leave until he is clean again. Mr. Helmer had come by twice in the last two weeks for personal items and was not upset.

During my scene examination I conducted a telephone interview with Sean Odasso, the owner of the loss vehicle. He can be reached at 714-862-5167. He informed me that he text Mr. Helmer and then called and left a message on the morning of the fire. He indicated that he called again and it went right to voicemail. He indicated stated that there was no bad feeling between him of Mr. Helmer and he had spoken with him the Thursday before the fire and was getting clean again.
