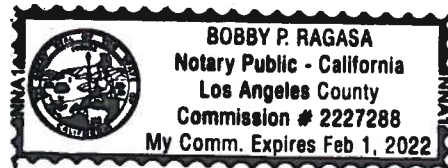



The non-payment arose due to a significant material theft from the job site, where the subcontractor claimed Fast-Track Construction Corp. was responsible to secure its material. Fast-Track Construction Corp. contended that the subcontract put the burden of that loss on the subcontract.

- Parties proceeded to binding arbitration Case # 50 110 T 0054411 American Arbitration Association.
- An interim award of the arbitrator found that the subcontractor was responsible for the theft. Therefore the amount that Fast-Track will be paying to the subcontractor would be roughly \$30,000, rather than the more than \$254,350 sought by the subcontractor.

Case was settled for \$20,000.00.

While the result of the mediation is confidential, to be clear, the primary dispute was over a small portion of a rather large construction contract. The parties referred the case to arbitration before the American Arbitration Association, and then agreed to mediate, where it was settled without a hearing.

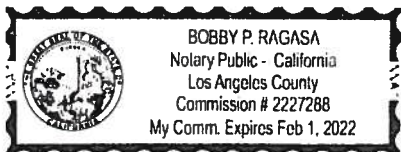
