## ORDINANCE NO. 129

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 29 OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE, CALIFORNIA.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

## SECTION 1:

Section 4702 of the 1955 Edition of the Uniform Building Code, Volume I, as adopted by Ordinance No. 29 of the City of Garden Grove, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SECTION 4702. Materials shall conform to the following standards: U.B.C.

DESIGNATION

Aggregate.

Sand. (a) On and after April 1, 1959, all sand shall be washed and when used with portland cement for scrath-coat plastering the amount of sand retained on a No. 8 sieve shall be not less than 10 per cent or more than 30 per cent.

(b) Until April 1, 1959, sand shall meet either of the following standards:

U.B.C. Designation 47-1 or ASTM Designation C35-54T with the exception that the amount of sand retained on the No. 8 and No. 16 sieves shall total no less than 18 per cent, with a minimum of 4 per cent and no more than 30 per cent of sand retained on the No. 8 sieve when used with portland cement for scratch-coat plastering.

Until April 1, 1959, sand shall be tested and reports of such tests made as follows:

The pit operator shall have a continuing analysis of the materials in the pit taken by an approved testing laboratory. One sample shall be taken from the bunker on at least three different days for each five working days or five different days for each seven working days. The laboratory inspector shall

determine when to take the samples. Tests to be run from the samples shall include: Screen test, Organic test and wash tests. Sand that does not meet the minimum requirements set out above shall not be used. The Building Department may make field tests for silt on 'on the site' materials and require laboratory analysis on any of these materials that apparently will not meet the minimum requirements. Materials that are faulty shall be removed from the job site before additional sand is delivered.

A short form stating the name of the pit, date of the test, and acceptability of the sand, as a result of the analysis, shall be mailed to the Building Department of the City of Garden Grove. Such reports shall be mailed as soon as the laboratory tests are completed and not later than 36 hours after the samples have been taken, provided that a report shall be made on faulty materials immediately.
