CARES ACT Funding, Round 1

April 2, 2020 - HUD awarded the City CARES Act CDBG (CDBG-CV) and ESG (ESG-CV) funding through the passage of the CARES Act on March 27, 2020.

- ▶ The CARES Act funding is designed to assist low-income households and business owners that were negatively impacted by the COVID-19.

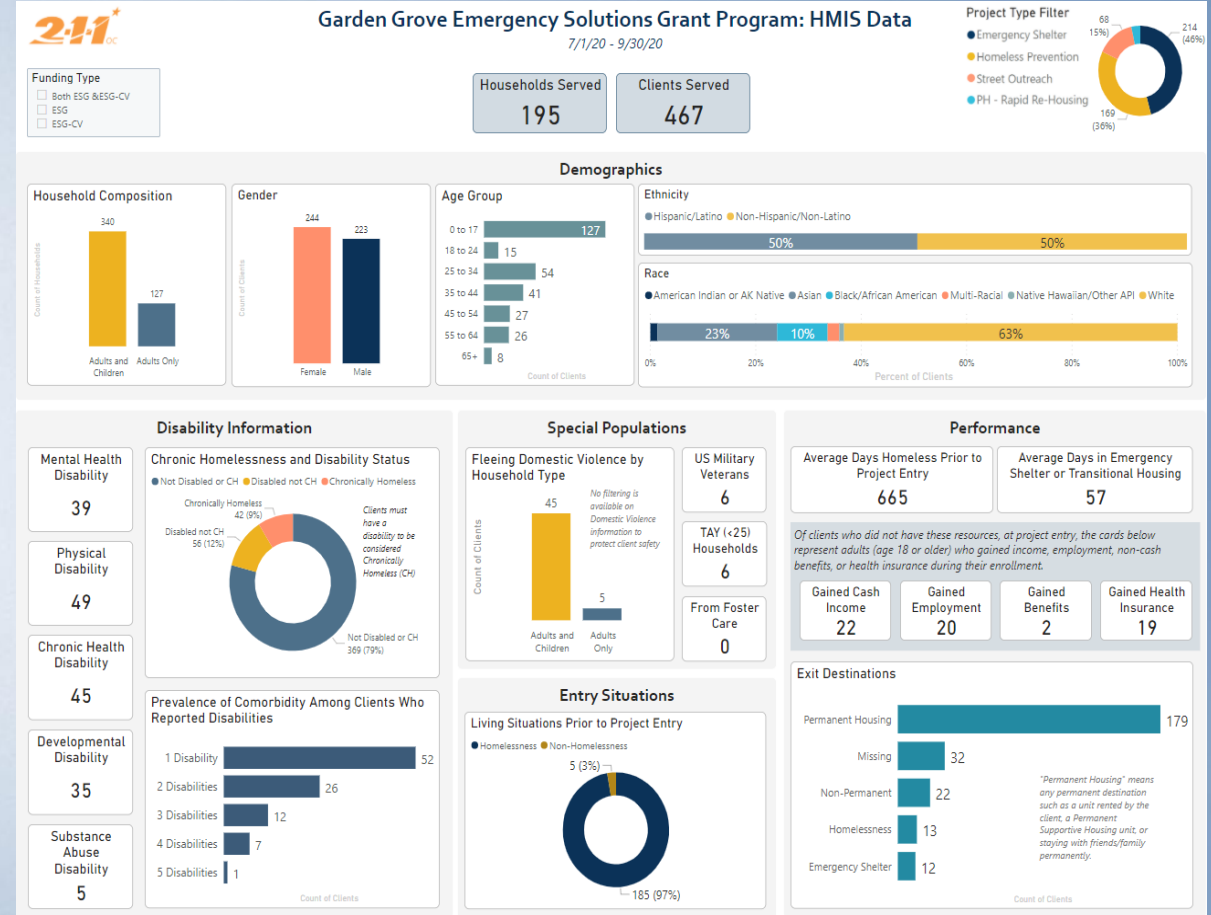
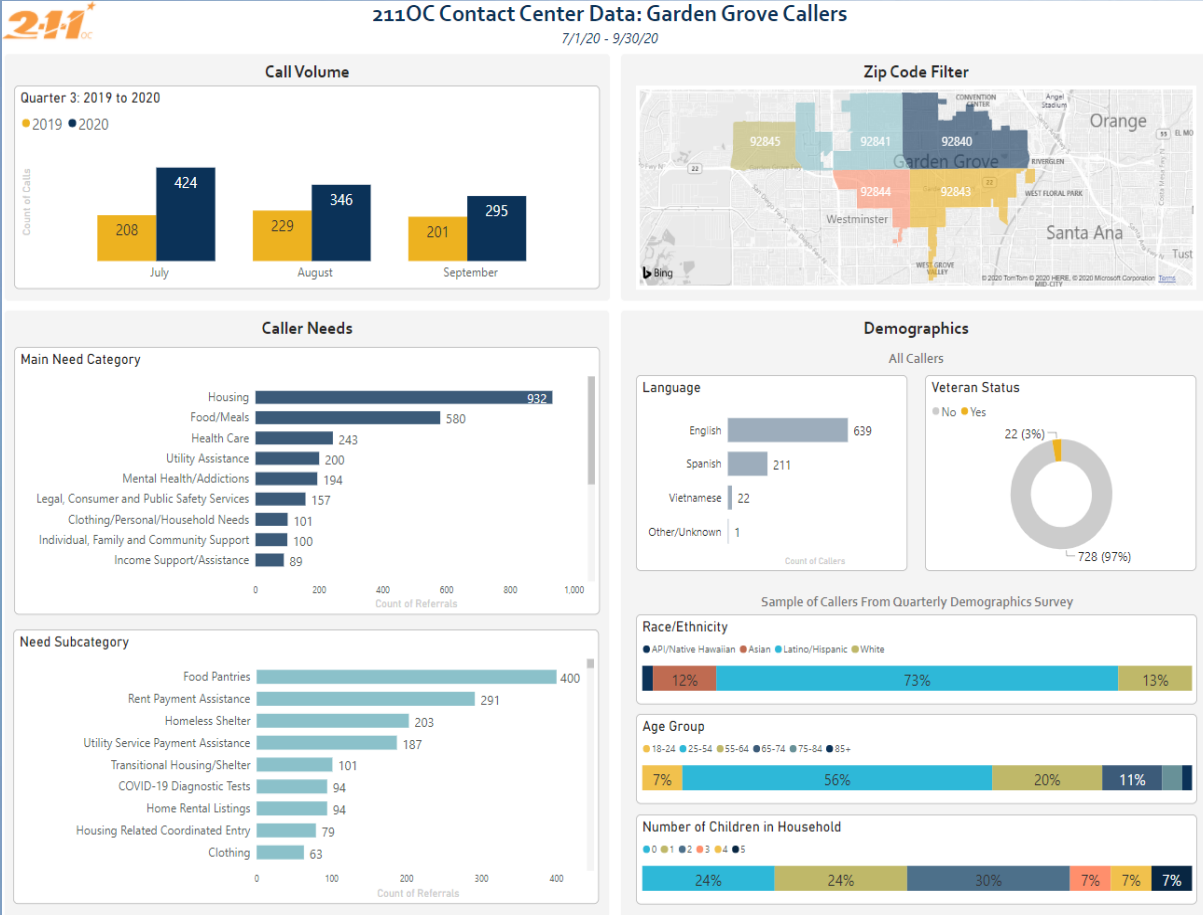
