My name is Eleanor Nicklin. I recently graduated from Pacifica high school, and I live in District One of Garden Grove. It has come to my attention that many members of our community do not support the ideas represented by the mural painted on Chapman and Knott. I decided to make a petition to have it removed, as I felt the painting was divisive, and does not represent the voices of our community.

This is what I wrote in the description of the petition: "A few months ago, a woman named Jody Williams got permission from Council Member George S. Brietigam III (who represents District 1) to paint a 'Blue Lives Matter' mural on an electrical box in our neighborhood. It is located on Chapman and and Knott. Recently, that painting was vandalized, with graffiti referencing the Black Lives Matter movement. Jody then redid the painting, replacing 'Blue Lives Matter' with 'Support Our GGPD.' She also repainted the white cop as a black cop, with a quote that reads, 'Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that MATTER! Martin Luther King Jr.' The painting still features a prominent 'thin blue line,' which is a pro-police symbol. Jody put up a sign addressed to the vandals next to this revised mural, suggesting that she will 'repaint or clean this box 1,000 times to show our police officers support.' Many of us in Garden Grove believe that this painting is divisive, offensive, and not representative of our community. It is political artwork that twists the words of MLK Jr. and uses other wording and symbolism which goes against many activist movements going on. By signing this petition, you are calling the Mayor, members of the council, and specifically the district 1 rep., George S. Brietigam III, to have this painting removed." (end quote)

In light of the protests in our country against law-enforcement, police brutality, and racism, about 2,700 people have signed this petition in support of the mural's removal.

To add, the mural has been vandalized and changed since then, now with a bible verse instead of the inaccurate MLK Jr. quote. So now, that side of the mural has gone from a white cop, to a black cop with an MLK Jr. misquote, to a bible verse. It's evident that this mural will always be redone with some aspects which are not representative of our community, with it currently being that not everyone in Garden Grove is Christian. While I do not support vandalism, I do believe that this painting will continue to invite it.

To clarify, this petition was never meant to be an attack on the artist or the quality of the art. Jody is talented in the eyes of many and we understand that her intentions were not malicious. However, everyone who signed this petition agrees that the sentiment of this mural does not represent district one, or Garden Grove as a whole, and is leading to a waste of time and resources. Many black people from our community have personally expressed their disdain toward the mural to me, explaining that it is tone deaf and offensive.

All 2,700 of us ask that you reconsider your permissions for Jody Williams, and specifically reconsider the allowance of this mural.

The Rise Up Willowick Coalition ("the Coalition") is comprised of residents from the City of Santa Ana, the City of Garden Grove ("the City"), and neighboring Orange County Cities as well as local organizations whose goal is to ensure that the Willowick Golf Course property ("Willowick") is developed to meet the needs of current local residents and their vision—especially the most vulnerable such as, but not limited to, working class individuals, youth, and immigrant residents—which includes deep affordable housing, parkland for active recreational use, and open-space. The entities at the end of the letter are signing on in support of this letter.

The purpose of this letter is to express support for the Trust for Public Land, Clifford Beers Housing and the Coastal Conservancy's Letter of Interest as the City of Garden Grove's 60-day notification period closes and the City enters the 90-day negotiating period as required by the CA Surplus Land Act (SLA).

Since April of 2019 the Rise Up Willowick Coalition has advocated to keep Willowick as open space to provide residents the much needed access to parks, affordable housing and community centered spaces. Willowick is one of the last remaining open spaces in central Orange County and it is incumbent upon you, the elected representatives of the community, to approach public land not as a commodity but as a valued public resource that can meet the goals of redressing the inequities of lack of access to parks and open space in Garden Grove and Santa Ana.

The City's attempts to use Willowick to "generate revenue" by selling and/or leasing the land for private development is not only unnecessary given that the City could create revenue by reallocating other parts of the budget, it is counterproductive to creating benefits for the community, and in fact, negatively impacts residents. The COVID-19 pandemic has unveiled the critical link between open spaces and physical and mental health, therefore the

Trust for Public Land's mission of advocating and creating close-to-home parks aligns with our mission of creating these opportunities for low-income communities of color. Mayor Steve Jones has signed on to Trust for Public Land's #10MinuteWalk campaign.

Additionally, Mayor Steve Jones and the Garden Grove City Council passed a resolution on May 12th, 2020 recognizing May 16th as "Parks to Kids Day." While it is necessary to acknowledge that open space is important, it is nowhere near enough to meet the residents' actual needs. The City must take immediate and direct action to address the lack of open space for residents and it can achieve this through Willowick.

The City of Garden Grove declared Willowick as surplus land on February 25, 2020 due to Rise Up Willowick's advocacy efforts, which included filing a lawsuit against both the City of Garden Grove and Santa Ana, and since then has issued Notices of Intent to dispose of this surplus property as required by the Surplus Land Act as amended by AB 1486. Currently, we know those same developers which submitted a proposal in April of 2019 when the City of Garden Grove issued an RFP, will most likely submit Letters of Interest. We urge you to remember the City of Garden Grove must comply with the CA Surplus Land Act and the Amendments provided by AB 1486 which grants first priority to an entity that agrees to use the site for park or recreational purposes if the land being offered is already being used and will continue to be used for park or recreational purposes. In terms of affordable housing "priority" is given to the entity proposing the most units at the deepest affordability. The community has continuously stated that they would like to use and are in need of quality park space and deeply affordable housing on the Willowick site, uses that as stated, are prioritized under the Surplus Land Act as amended by AB 1486.

Given that Willowick is a public resource, community residents should have the right to understand the process by which the City is making the decisions to dispose of Willowick and so we ask you for the following:

- Prioritize meeting with residents from the Rise Up Willowick Coalition
- Discuss process of disposal during the open-session city council meetings
- Organize public meetings to specifically discuss Willowick
- Solicit community input with RiseUpWillowick advocates

Understanding the importance of Willowick and the rare opportunity it provides to meet urgent community needs, we urge you to meet the residents' needs for quality parks and truly accessible affordable housing. Subject: Defund Garden Grove's Police Department

My name is Andrew Ha and I am a resident of Garden Grove. I am writing to demand that the City Council adopts a people's budget that prioritizes community wellbeing and redirects funding away from the police department to much-needed social services.

This past week, our nation has been gripped by protests calling for a rapid and meaningful reconsideration of the role of policing in communities, in addition to an end to racism and anti-Blackness in America. It has come to my attention that the city government, like many others across the country, is struggling to balance budgets in the midst of the coronavirus pandemic.

Last year, the City Council approved <u>a \$6.4 million increase</u> for police's salary raises and benefits, while publicly estimating that it would only cost \$3.1 million. The approved GGPD budget for 2020-21 is \$67 million, most of which comes from the Garden Grove general fund. The GGPD costs us taxpayers significantly more than maintaining the costs of facilities, parks maintenance, and human/recreation services combined.

This is unacceptable, especially since the city has less budget flexibility during this economic downturn and how Garden Grove has struggled with structural deficit for over a decade," according to finance director Patricia Song.

These are examples when the police had no obligation to protect people - children or adults.

In the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School shooting in Florida, the armed officer hired to be at the school left the premises as the shooting began. The officer was not found to have any duty to protest the students or the premises. Then why is there an officer there at all? Students do not need more guns on campus. India has 1.3 BILLION people and yet they have 900 thousand cases of Covid-19 and only 23 thousand deaths. I've been to India twice—in the northwest in the state of Rajasthan and way in the south in the state of Tamil Nadu—and I can say with honesty that I have never seen a more densely packed place. And yet their Covid-19 response is lightyears better than ours—despite the fact that it's one of the ten worst in the world.

It's no secret why the United States lags so far behind the developed and developing world. There are common sense and relatively inexpensive steps we can take to limit the spread of Covid-19, and we're not doing them. If we were failing to do them out of carelessness, I might understand it, but many are actively flouting these measures—reveling in the opportunity to show their disdain for them both in public and online. Many go further and attack those who are taking precautions, which absolutely defies understanding.

Council member Nguyen's suggestion that face masks be worn in public spaces is the literal bare minimum we can do in the fight against Covid-19. It's simple, it's effective (if done correctly), and it's fairly inexpensive—even free, as there are many who have been donating masks since we started sheltering in place. Adopting this measure should be a no brainer, and yet I imagine it will require debate, with many quoting a lot of Facebook science. I ask you today, despite your reservations, to adopt this without debate for a very specific reason.

Wearing masks only works if everyone does it at the required times (so not for a casual stroll around the block where the walkers do their best to stay 6 feet away from everyone else, but at businesses, etc.). Whether this resolution is passed or not, there are many who

While many have argued against the use of cloth face coverings, citing its inefficacy in preventing disease, many such claims are either unsubstantiated (from an unreliable, non-peer-reviewed journal source) or rely on results from controlled laboratory environments, which are not externally valid. On the contrary, studies show that in real-life settings, the face covering mandates *are* effective in curbing the daily COVID-19 growth rate. Two such "natural experiment" studies, also known as quasi-experimental studies, by Lyu & Wehby (2020) and Leffler et al. (2020) form the basis for this understanding.

Garden Grove residents are not all compliant with state guidance, which may contribute to rising trends in COVID-19 case growth. The proposed resolution, which would promote the state's guidance, provide residents with informational resources, and create a means to enforce the wearing of masks in indoor spaces, would prevent excess morbidity and mortality, which in turn would allow our economy to recover faster in the medium-term.






CITY OF GARDEN GROVE COMMUNITY WORKFORCE AGREEMENT

This Community Workforce Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the City of Garden Grove, a municipal corporation ("City"), the Los Angeles/Orange Counties Building and Construction Trades Council ("Council"), and the signatory Craft Councils and Local Unions signing this Agreement (collectively, the "Union" or "Unions"). This Agreement establishes the labor relations Policies and Procedures for the City and for the craft employees represented by the Unions engaged in the City's Project Work as more fully described below. The City, Council and Unions are hereinafter referred to herein, as the context may require, as "Party" or "Parties."

It is understood by the Parties to this Agreement that if this Agreement is acceptable to the City, it will become the policy of the City for the Project Work to be contracted exclusively to Contractors who agree to execute and be bound by the terms of this Agreement, directly or through the Letter of Assent (a form of which is attached as "Attachment A"), and to require each of its subcontractors, of whatever tier, to become bound. The City shall include, directly or by incorporation by reference, the requirements of this Agreement in the advertisement of and/or specifications for each and every contract for Project Work to be awarded by the City.

Public officials and employees are bound to observe in their official acts the highest standards of morality and to discharge faithfully the outies of their offices, regardless of personal considerations; recognizing that the public interest must be their primary concern, and that conduct in both their official and private affairs should be above reproach. 

2.02.060 Obligations to Citizens

- A. CONFLICT WITH PROPER DISCHARGE OF DUTIES. No public official or employee, while serving as such, shall have any interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, or engage in any business or transaction or professional activity, or incur any obligation of any nature that is in substantial conflict with the proper discharge of his or her duties in the public interest and of his or her responsibilities as prescribed by law.
- B. INCOMPATIBLE EMPLOYMENT. No public official or employee shall accept other employment that he or she has reason to believe will either impair his or her independence of judgment as to his or her official duties or require him or her or induce him or her to disclose confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties.
- C. DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. No public official or employee shall willfully and knowingly disclose for peruniary gain to any other person confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties not shall any public official or employee use any such information for the purpose of peruniary gain.
 - D. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. A conflict of interest exists in a matter before a public official for consideration or determination if
- 1. The public official has a substantial financial or substantial personal interest in the outcome or as owner, member, partner, officer, employee, or stockholder of any corporation or other professional enterprise that will be affected by the outcome, and such interest is or may be adverse to the public interest in the proper performance of governmental duties by the public official;
 - 2. The public official has reason to believe or expect that he or she will derive direct monetary gain or suffer a direct monetary loss, as the case may be, by reason of his or her official activity;
- 3. The public official, because of bias, prejudice, or because he or she has prejudged a matter set for public hearing, is incapable because of such bias, prejudice or prejudgment of granting to the matter before him or her a fair and impartial hearing.
 - 4. Personal interest as distinguished from financial interest is defined as including, among other matters, an interest arising from blood or marriage relationships, or close business association. (2813 § 1, 2012; 1301 § 1, 1972)

- A Any Councilmember who has a conflict of interest as defined herein, in any matter before the City Council, shall disclose such fact on the record of the City Council and refrain from participating in any discussion of voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.
- B. Any member of any official board, commission, or committee who has a conflict of interest as defined herein in any matter before the board, commission, or committee of which he or she is a member, shall disclose such fact on the record of such board, commission, or committee and refrain from participating in any discussion or voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.
- C. Any employee who has a financial or other special interest in a matter before the City Council or any board, commission, or committee and who participates in discussion with, or gives an official opinion to the City Council or such board, commission, or committee relating to such matter, shall disclose on the record of the City Council or such board, commission, or committee, as the case may be, the nature and extent of such interest. (2813 § 1, 2012; 1301 § 1, 1972)

§ 18700. Basic Rule and Guide to Conflict of Interest Regulations.

(a) Basic Rule: A public official at any level of state or local government has a prohibited conflict of interest and may not make, participate in making, or in any way use or attempt to use his or her official position to influence a governmental decision when he or she knows or has reason to know he or she has a disqualifying financial interest. A public official has a disqualifying financial interest if the decision will have a reasonably foreseeable material financial effect, distinguishable from the effect on the public generally, directly on the official, or his or her immediate family, or on any financial interest described in subdivision (c)(6)(A-F) herein. (Sections 87100, 87101, & 87103.)

(Regulations of the Fair Political Practices Commission, Title 2, Division 6, California Code of Regulations.)

§ 18702.4. Materiality Standard: Financial Interest in Source of Gift.

The financial effect of a governmental decision on the source of a gift to a public official, as identified in Section 87103(e), is material if:

- (a) The source is a claimant, applicant, respondent, contracting party, or is otherwise named or identified as the subject of the proceeding; or
- (b) The source is an individual that will be financially affected under the standards applied to an official in Regulation 18702.5, or the official knows or has reason to know that the individual has an interest in a business entity or real property that will be financially affected under the standards applied to a financial interest in Regulation 18702.1 or 18702.2, respectively; or
- (c) The source is a nonprofit organization that will be financially affected under the materiality standards applied to a nonprofit source of income interest in Regulation 18702.3; or
- (d) The source is a business entity that will be financially affected under the standards as applied to a financial interest in Regulation 18702.1.

Conflicts of Interest Rules

Under the Act, a public official has a disqualifying conflict of interest in a governmental decision if it is foreseeable that the decision will have a financial impact on his or her personal finances or other financial interests. In such cases, there is a risk of biased decision-making that could sacrifice the public's interest in favor of the official's private financial interests. To avoid actual bias or the appearance of possible improprieties, the public official is prohibited from participating in the decision.

Disqualifying Financial Interests...

There are five types of interests that may result in disqualification.

- Business Entity. A business entity in which the official has an investment of \$2,000 or more in which he or she is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or manager.
- Real Property. Real property in which the official has an interest of \$2,000 or more including leaseholds. (However, month-to-month leases are not considered real property interests.)
- Income. An individual or an entity from whom the official has received income or promised income aggregating to \$500 or more in the previous 12
 months, including the official's community property interest in the income of his or her spouse or registered domestic partner.
- · Gifts. An individual or an entity from whom the official has received gifts aggregating to \$500 or more in the previous 12 months.
- Personal Finances. The official's personal finances including his or her expenses, income, assets, or liabilities, as well as those of his or her immediate family.


The Three Components of a Conflict of Interest Code

- 1. Incorporation Section (Terms of the Code) This section designates where the Form 700s are filed and retained (i.e., the agency or the FPPC). This section also must reference Regulation 18730, which provides the rules for disqualification procedures, reporting financial interests, and references the current gift limit. A sample is available here.
- 2. List of Designated Positions The code must list all agency positions that involve the making or participation in making of decisions that "may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest." This covers agency members, officers and employees, and it may include volunteers on a committee if the members make or participate in making government decisions.
- Detailed Disclosure Categories A disclosure category is a description of the types of financial interests officials in one or more job classifications
 must disclose on their Form 700s. The categories must be tailored to the financial interests affected, and must not require public officials to disclose
 private financial information that does not relate to their public employment.

FPPC Regulations

FPPC Regulations are located at Title 2, Division 6, Sections 18109-18997 of the California Code of Regulations, the state's official compilation and publication of regulations adopted, amended, or repealed by state agencies

Recusal Requirements

An official with a disqualifying conflict of interest may not make, participate in making, or use his or her position to influence a governmental decision. When appearing before his or her own agency or an agency subject to the authority or budgetary control of his or her agency, an official is making, participating in making, or using his or her position to influence a decision any time the official takes any action to influence the decision including directing a decision, voting, providing information or a recommendation, or contacting or appearing before any other agency official. When appearing before any other agency the official must not act or purport to act in his or her official capacity or on behalf of his or her agency.

Certain officials (including city council members, planning commissioners, and members of the boards of supervisors) have a mandated manner in which they must disqualify from decisions made at a public meeting (including closed session decisions) and must publicly identify a conflict of interest and leave the room before the item is discussed.

While there are limited exceptions that allow a public official to participate as a member of the public and speak to the press, the exceptions are interpreted narrowly and may require advice from your agency's counsel or the FPPC.



While the FPPC may have jurisdiction over their laws, rules and regulations, we citizens believe that our City Council has jurisdiction over the Municipal Code. Please keep in mind that the issue in this matter is the allegation of a Conflict of Interest and not "income", wherein a "contribution or contributions" (Govt. Code 82015 attached) were received and accepted by Council Member Nguyen. A contribution or contributions received within 12 months from the same named and identified source that was the subject of a governmental decision on a matter before the Council on 5/12/20.




2.02.060 Obligations to Citizens

- A. CONFLICT WITH PROPER DISCHARGE OF DUTIES. No public official or employee, while serving as such. shall have any interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, or engage in any business or transaction or professional activity, or incur any obligation of any nature that is in substantial conflict with the proper discharge of his or her duties in the public interest and of his or her responsibilities as prescribed by law.
- B. INCOMPATIBLE EMPLOYMENT. No public official or employee shall accept other employment that he or she has reason to believe will either impair his or her independence of judgment as to his or her official duties or require him or her or induce him or her to disclose confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties.
- C. DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. No public official or employee shall willfully and knowingly disclose for pecuniary gain to any other person confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties nor shall any public official or employee use any such information for the purpose of pecuniary gain.
- D. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. <u>A conflict of interest exists</u> in a matter before a public official for consideration or determination <u>if</u>:
- 1. The public official has a substantial financial or substantial personal interest in the outcome or as owner, member, partner, officer, employee, or stockholder of any corporation or other professional enterprise that will be affected by the outcome, and such interest is or may be adverse to the public interest in the proper performance of governmental duties by the public official:
- The public official has reason to believe or expect that he or <u>she will derive direct</u> <u>monetary gain</u> or suffer a direct monetary loss, as the case may be, by reason of his or her official activity;
- 3. The public official, because of bias, prejudice, or because he or she has prejudged a matter set for public hearing, is incapable because of such bias, prejudice or prejudgment of granting to the matter before him or her a fair and impartial hearing.
- 4. Personal interest as distinguished from financial interest is defined as including among other matters, an interest arising from blood or marriage relationships, or close business association. (2813 § 1, 2012; 1301 § 1, 1972)



2.02.070 Disclosure of Interest and Disqualification

- A. Any Councilmember who has a conflict of interest as defined herein, in any matter before the City Council, shall disclose such fact on the record of the City Council and refrain from participating in any discussion of voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.
- B. Any member of any official board, commission, or committee who has a conflict of interest as defined herein in any matter before the board, commission, or committee of which he or she is a member, shall disclose such fact on the record of such board, commission, or committee and refrain from participating in any discussion or voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.
- C. Any employee who has a financial or other special interest in a matter before the City Council or any board, commission, or committee and who participates in discussion with, or gives an official opinion to the City Council, or to such board, commission, or committee relating to such matter, shall disclose on the record of the City Council or such board, commission, or committee, as the case may be, the nature and extent of such interest (2813 § 1, 2012: 1301 § 1, 1972)







This Agreement establishes the labor relations Policies and Procedures for the City and for the craft employees represented by the Unions engaged in the City's Project Work as more fully described below. The City Council and Unions are hereinafter referred to herein, as the context may require, as "Party" or "Parties."

It is understood by the Parties to this Agreement that if this Agreement is acceptable to the City, it will become the policy of the City for the Project Work to be contracted exclusively to Contractors who agree to execute and be bound by the terms of this Agreement, directly or through the Letter of Assent (a form of which is attached as "Attachment A"), and to require each of its subcontractors, of whatever tier, to become bound. The City shall include, directly or by incorporation by reference, the requirements of this Agreement in the advertisement of and or specifications for each and every contract for Project Work to be awarded by the City.

- A. CONFLICT WITH PROPER DISCHARGE OF DUTIES. No public official or employee, while serving as such, shall have any interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, or engage in any business or transaction or professional activity, or incur any obligation of any nature that is in substantial conflict with the proper discharge of his or her duties in the public interest and of his or her responsibilities as prescribed by law.
- B. INCOMPATIBLE EMPLOYMENT. No public official or employee shall accept other employment that he or she has reason to believe will either impair his or her independence of judgment as to his or her official duties or require him or her or induce him or her to disclose confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties
- C. DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. No public official or employee shall willfully and knowingly disclose for pecuniary gain to any other person confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties nor shall any public official or employee use any such information for the purpose of pecuniary gain.
 - D. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. A conflict of interest exists in a matter before a public official for consideration or determination if
- 1. The public official has a substantial financial or substantial personal interest in the outcome or as owner, member, partner, officer, employee, or stockholder of any corporation or other professional enterprise that will be affected by the outcome, and such interest is or may be adverse to the public interest in the proper performance of governmental duties by the public official,
 - 2. The public official has reason to believe or expect that he or she will derive direct monetary gain or suffer a direct monetary loss, as the case may be, by reason of his or her official activity;
- 3. The public official, because of bias, prejudice, or because he or she has prejudged a matter set for public hearing, is incapable because of such bias, prejudice or prejudgment of granting to the matter before him or her a fair and impartial hearing.
 - 4. Personal interest as distinguished from financial interest is defined as including, among other matters, an interest arising from blood or marriage relationships, or close business association. (2813 § 1, 2012; 1301 § 1, 1972)

- C. Any employee who has a financial or other special interest in a matter before the City Council or any board, commission, or committee and who participates in discussion with, or gives an official opinion to the City Council, or to such board, commission, or committee relating to such matter, shall disclose on the record of the City Council or such board, commission, or committee, as the case may be, the nature and extent of such interest. § 18700. Basic Rule and Guide to Conflict of Interest Regulations.

(a) Basic Rule: A public official at any level of state or local government has a prohibited conflict of interest and may not make, participate in making, or in any way use or attempt to use his or her official position to influence a governmental decision when he or she knows or has reason to know he or she has a disqualifying financial interest. A public official has a disqualifying financial interest if the decision will have a reasonably foreseeable material financial effect, distinguishable from the effect on the public generally, directly on the official, or his or her immediate family, or on any financial interest described in subdivision (c)(6)(A-F) herein. (Sections 87100, 87101, & 87103.)

§ 18702.4. Materiality Standard: Financial Interest in Source of Gift.

The financial effect of a governmental decision on the source of a gift to a public official, as identified in Section 87103(e), is material if:

- (a) The source is a claimant, applicant, respondent, contracting party, or is otherwise named or identified as the subject of the proceeding; or
- (b) The source is an individual that will be financially affected under the standards applied to an official in Regulation 18702.5, or the official knows or has reason to know that the individual has an interest in a business entity or real property that will be financially affected under the standards applied to a financial interest in Regulation 18702.1 or 18702.2, respectively; or
- (c) The source is a nonprofit organization that will be financially affected under the materiality standards applied to a nonprofit source of income interest in Regulation 18702.3; or
- (d) The source is a business entity that will be financially affected under the standards as applied to a financial interest in Regulation 18702.1.


- Incorporation Section (Terms of the Code) This section designates where the Form 700s are filed and retained (i.e., the agency or the FPPC). This section also must reference Regulation 18730, which provides the rules for disqualification procedures, reporting financial interests, and references the current gift limit. A sample is available here.
- 2 List of Designated Positions The code must list all agency positions that involve the making or participation in making of decisions that "may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest." This covers agency members, officers and employees, and it may include volunteers on a committee if the members make or participate in making government decisions.
- 3. Detailed Disclosure Categories A disclosure category is a description of the types of financial interests officials in one or more job classifications must disclose on their Form 700s. The categories must be tailored to the financial interests affected, and must not require public officials to disclose private financial information that does not relate to their public employment.



2.02.060 Obligations to Citizens

- A. CONFLICT WITH PROPER DISCHARGE OF DUTIES. No public official or employee, while serving as such. shall have any interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, or engage in any business or transaction or professional activity, or incur any obligation of any nature that is in substantial conflict with the proper discharge of his or her duties in the public interest and of his or her responsibilities as prescribed by law.
- B. INCOMPATIBLE EMPLOYMENT. No public official or employee shall accept other employment that he or she has reason to believe will either impair his or her independence of judgment as to his or her official duties or require him or her or induce him or her to disclose confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties.
- C. DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. No public official or employee shall willfully and knowingly disclose for pecuniary gain to any other person confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties nor shall any public official or employee use any such information for the purpose of pecuniary gain.
- D. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. A conflict of interest exists in a matter before a public official for consideration or determination if:
- The public official has a substantial financial or substantial personal interest in the
 outcome or as owner, member, partner, officer, employee, or stockholder of any
 corporation or other professional enterprise that will be affected by the outcome, and such
 interest is or may be adverse to the public interest in the proper performance of
 governmental duties by the public official;
- The public official has reason to believe or expect that he or <u>she will derive direct</u> <u>monetary gain</u> or suffer a direct monetary loss, as the case may be, by reason of his or her official activity;
- The public official, because of bias, prejudice, or because he or she has prejudged a matter set for public hearing, is incapable because of such bias, prejudice or prejudgment of granting to the matter before him or her a fair and impartial hearing.
- 4. Personal interest as distinguished from financial interest is defined as including among other matters. an interest arising from blood or marriage relationships, or close business association. (2813 § 1, 2012; 1301 § 1, 1972)



2.02.070 Disclosure of Interest and Disqualification

- A. Any Councilmember who has a conflict of interest as defined herein, in any matter before the City Council shall disclose such fact on the record of the City Council and refrain from participating in any discussion of voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.
- B. Any member of any official board, commission, or committee who has a conflict of interest as defined herein in any matter before the board, commission, or committee of which he or she is a member, shall disclose such fact on the record of such board. commission, or committee and refrain from participating in any discussion or voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.

Any employee who has a financial or other special interest in a matter before the City Council or any board, commission, or committee and who participates in discussion with, or gives an official opinion to the City Council, or to such board, commission, or committee relating to such matter, shall disclose on the record of the City Council or such board, commission, or committee, as the case may be, the nature and extent of such interest (2813 § 1, 2012; 1301 § 1, 1972)

The violation of any provision of this chapter shall be:

This Agreement establishes the labor relations Policies and Procedures for the City and for the craft employees represented by the Unions engaged in the City's Project Work as more fully described below. The City, Council and Unions are hereinafter referred to herein, as the context may require, as "Party" or "Parties."

It is understood by the Parties to this Agreement that if this Agreement is acceptable to the City, it will become the policy of the City for the Project Work to be contracted exclusively to Contractors who agree to execute and be bound by the terms of this Agreement, directly or through the Letter of Assent (a form of which is attached as "Attachment A"), and to require each of its subcontractors, of whatever tier, to become bound. The City shall include, directly or by incorporation by reference, the requirements of this Agreement in the advertisement of and or specifications for each and every contract for Project Work to be awarded by the City.

2.02.060 Obligations to Citizens

- A. CONFLICT WITH PROPER DISCHARGE OF DUTIES No public official or employee, while serving as such, shall have any interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, or engage in any business or transaction or professional activity, or incur any obligation of any nature that is in substantial conflict with the proper discharge of his or her duties in the public interest and of his or her responsibilities as prescribed by law.
- B. ENCOMPATIBLE EMPLOYMENT. No public official or employee shall accept other employment that he or she has reason to believe will either impair his or her independence of judgment as to his or her official duties or require him or her or induce him or her to disclose confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties.
- C. DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. No public official or employee shall willfully and knowingly disclose for pecuniary gain to any other person confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties nor shall any public official or employee use any such information for the purpose of pecuniary gain.
 - D. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. A conflict of interest exists in a matter before a public official for consideration or determination if:
- 1. The public official has a substantial financial or substantial personal interest in the outcome or as owner, member, partner, officer, employee, or stockholder of any corporation or other professional enterprise that will be affected by the outcome, and such interest is or may be adverse to the public interest in the proper performance of governmental duties by the public official
 - 2. The public official has reason to believe or expect that he or she will derive direct monetary gain or suffer a direct monetary loss, as the case may be, by reason of his or her official activity.
- 3. The public official, because of bias, prejudice, or because he or she has prejudged a matter set for public hearing, is incapable because of such bias, prejudice or prejudgment of granting to the matter before him or her a fair and impartial hearing.
 - 4. Personal interest as distinguished from financial interest is defined as including, among other matters, an interest arising from blood or marriage relationships, or close business association. (2813 § 1, 2012; 1301 § 1, 1972)

2.02.070 Disclosure of Interest and Disqualification

- A. Any Councilmember who has a conflict of interest as defined herein, in any matter before the City Council, shall disclose such fact on the record of the City Council and refrain from participating in any discussion of voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.
- B. Any member of any official board, commission, or committee who has a conflict of interest as defined herein in any matter before the board, commission, or committee of which he or she is a member, shall disclose such fact on the record of such board, commission, or committee and refrain from participating in any discussion or voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.
- Any employee who has a financial or other special interest in a matter before the City Council or any board, commission, or committee and who participates in discussion with, or gives an official opinion to the City Council or such board, commission, or committee, as the case may be, the nature and extent of such interest. (2\$13 § 1, 2012; 1301 § 1, 1972)

2.02.090 Violations—Actions

The violation of any provision of this chapter shall be

As to any prosecution of any elected public official, the City Council shall make findings of fact by at least a vote of three City Councilmembers that an elected public official has, in fact, violated this chapter as a prerequisite to prosecution. § 18700. Basic Rule and Guide to Conflict of Interest Regulations.

(a) Basic Rule: A public official at any level of state or local government has a prohibited conflict of interest and may not make, participate in making, or in any way use or attempt to use his or her official position to influence a governmental decision when he or she knows or has reason to know he or she has a disqualifying financial interest. A public official has a disqualifying financial interest if the decision will have a reasonably foreseeable material financial effect, distinguishable from the effect on the public generally, directly on the official, or his or her immediate family, or on any financial interest described in subdivision (c)(6)(A-F) herein. (Sections 87100, 87101, & 87103.)

(Regulations of the Fair Political Practices Commission, Title 2, Division 6, California Code of Regulations.)

§ 18702.4. Materiality Standard: Financial Interest in Source of Gift.

The financial effect of a governmental decision on the source of a gift to a public official, as identified in Section 87103(e), is material if:

- (a) The source is a claimant, applicant, respondent, contracting party, or is otherwise named or identified as the subject of the proceeding; or
- (b) The source is an individual that will be financially affected under the standards applied to an official in Regulation 18702.5, or the official knows or has reason to know that the individual has an interest in a business entity or real property that will be financially affected under the standards applied to a financial interest in Regulation 18702.1 or 18702.2, respectively; or
- (c) The source is a nonprofit organization that will be financially affected under the materiality standards applied to a nonprofit source of income interest in Regulation 18702.3; or
- (d) The source is a business entity that will be financially affected under the standards as applied to a financial interest in Regulation 18702.1.

Conflicts of Interest Rules

Under the Act, a public official has a disqualifying conflict of interest in a governmental decision if it is foreseeable that the decision will have a financial impact on his or her personal finances or other financial interests. In such cases, there is a risk of biased decision-making that could sacrifice the public's interest in favor of the official's private financial interests. To avoid actual bias or the appearance of possible improprieties, the public official is prohibited from participating in the decision.

Disqualifying Financial Interests

There are five types of interests that may result in disqualification.

- · Business Entity. A business entity in which the official has an investment of \$2,000 or more in which he or she is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or manager.
- · Real Property. Real property in which the official has an interest of \$2,000 or more including leaseholds. (However, month-to-month leases are not considered real property interests)
- Income. An individual or an entity from whom the official has received income or promised income aggregating to \$500 or more in the previous 12 months, including the official's community property interest in the income of his or her spouse or registered domestic partner
- · Gifts. An individual or an entity from whom the official has received gifts aggregating to \$500 or more in the previous 12 months
- · Personal Finances. The official's personal finances including his or her expenses, income, assets, or liabilities, as well as those of his or her immediate family

- C. DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. No public official or employee shall willfully and knowingly disclose for pecuniary gain to any other person confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties nor shall any public official or employee use any such information for the purpose of pecuniary gain.
- D. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. <u>A conflict of interest exists</u> in a matter before a public official for consideration or determination <u>if</u>:
- The public official has a substantial financial or substantial personal interest in the
 outcome or as owner, member, partner, officer, employee, or stockholder of any
 corporation or other professional enterprise that will be affected by the outcome, and such
 interest is or may be adverse to the public interest in the proper performance of
 governmental duties by the public official:



- 3. The public official, because of bias, prejudice, or because he or she has prejudged a matter set for public hearing, is incapable because of such bias, prejudice or prejudgment of granting to the matter before him or her a fair and impartial hearing.



We also thank you for providing us with a copy of Govt. Code 82030(b)(1) and for your suggestion that we contact the FPPC, as this matter could potentially fall under their jurisdiction. Please note that the FPPC has been contacted and a complaint has been filed regarding the alleged Conflict of Interest issue. (FPPC Complaint number COM-07022020-01134)

While the FPPC may have jurisdiction over their laws, rules and regulations, we citizens believe that our City Council has jurisdiction over the Municipal Code. Please keep in mind that the issue in this matter is the allegation of a Conflict of Interest and not "income", wherein a "contribution or contributions" (Govt. Code 82015 attached) were received and accepted by Council Member Nguyen. A contribution or contributions received within 12 months from the same named and identified source that was the subject of a governmental decision on a matter before the Council on 5/12/20.

Please see the GGMCs that we believe apply in this matter and why we allege that they may have been violated by Council Member Nguyen:



Preferential consideration of the request or petition of any individual citizen or group of citizens shall not be given. No person shall receive special advantages beyond that which are available to any other citizen. (2813 § 1, 2012; 1301 § 1, 1972)




Public officials are all elective officials of the City and the members of all official boards, commissions and committees of the City. Public officials and employees are bound to uphold the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State and to carry out the laws of the nation, state, and municipality. Public officials and employees are bound to observe in their official acts the highest standards of morality and to discharge faithfully the duties of their offices, regardless of personal considerations; recognizing that the public interest must be their primary concern, and that conduct in both their official and private affairs should be above reproach. (2813 § 1. 2012; 1301 § 1. 1972)




2.02.060 Obligations to Citizens

- A. CONFLICT WITH PROPER DISCHARGE OF DUTIES. No public official or employee, while serving as such, shall have any interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, or engage in any business or transaction or professional activity, or incur any obligation of any nature that is in substantial conflict with the proper discharge of his or her duties in the public interest and of his or her responsibilities as prescribed by law.
- B. INCOMPATIBLE EMPLOYMENT. No public official or employee shall accept other employment that he or she has reason to believe will either impair his or her independence of judgment as to his or her official duties or require him or her or induce him or her to disclose confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties.
- C. DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. No public official or employee shall willfully and knowingly disclose for pecuniary gain to any other person confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties nor shall any public official or employee use any such information for the purpose of pecuniary gain.
- D. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. <u>A conflict of interest exists</u> in a matter before a public official for consideration or determination <u>if</u>:
- The public official has a substantial financial or substantial personal interest in the
 outcome or as owner, member, partner, officer, employee, or stockholder of any
 corporation or other professional enterprise that will be affected by the outcome, and such
 interest is or may be adverse to the public interest in the proper performance of
 governmental duties by the public official:
- The public official has reason to believe or expect that he or she will derive direct
 monetary gain or suffer a direct monetary loss, as the case may be, by reason of his or
 her official activity;
- The public official, because of bias, prejudice, or because he or she has
 prejudged a matter set for public hearing, is incapable because of such bias, prejudice or
 prejudgment of granting to the matter before him or her a fair and impartial hearing.
- 4. Personal interest as distinguished from financial interest is defined as including, among other matters, an interest arising from blood or marriage relationships, or close business association. (2813 \S 1, 2012; 1301 \S 1, 1972)



2.02.070 Disclosure of Interest and Disqualification

- A. Any Councilmember who has a conflict of interest as defined herein, in any matter before the City Council, shall disclose such fact on the record of the City Council and refrain from participating in any discussion of voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.
- B. Any member of any official board, commission, or committee who has a conflict of interest as defined herein in any matter before the board, commission, or committee of which he or she is a member, shall disclose such fact on the record of such board, commission, or committee and refrain from participating in any discussion or voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.
- C. Any employee who has a financial or other special interest in a matter before the City Council or any board, commission, or committee and who participates in discussion with, or gives an official opinion to the City Council, or to such board, commission, or committee relating to such matter, shall disclose on the record of the City Council or such board, commission, or committee, as the case may be, the nature and extent of such interest. (2813 § 1. 2012; 1301 § 1. 1972)



2.02.090 Violations—Actions

The violation of any provision of this chapter shall be:

- A. As to all City employees, grounds for dismissal from City employment:
- B. As to any appointed position on any board, commission, or committee, grounds for removal from any such board, commission, or committee;
- C. As to any prosecution of any elected public official, the City Council shall make findings of fact by at least a vote of three City Councilmembers that an elected public official has, in fact, violated this chapter as a prerequisite to prosecution. (2813 § 1, 2012: 1301 § 1, 1972)



No public official or employee shall willfully and knowingly disclose for pecuniary gain to any other person confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties nor shall any public official or employee use any such information for the purpose of pecuniary gain.
 - D. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. A conflict of interest exists in a matter before a public official for consideration or determination if:
- 1. The public official has a substantial financial or substantial personal interest in the outcome or as owner, member, partner, officer, employee, or stockholder of any corporation or other professional enterprise that will be affected by the outcome, and such interest is or may be adverse to the public interest in the proper performance of governmental duties by the public official,
 - 2. The public official has reason to believe or expect that he or she will derive direct monetary gain or suffer a direct monetary loss, as the case may be, by reason of his or her official activity;
- 3. The public official, because of bias, prejudice, or because he or she has prejudged a matter set for public hearing, is incapable because of such bias, prejudice or prejudgment of granting to the matter before him or her a fair and impartial hearing.
 - 4. Personal interest as distinguished from financial interest is defined as including, among other matters, an interest arising from blood or marriage relationships, or close business association. (2813 § 1, 2012, 1301 § 1, 1972)



We also thank you for providing us with a copy of Govt. Code 82030(b)(1) and for your suggestion that we contact the FPPC, as this matter could potentially fall under their jurisdiction. Please note that the FPPC has been contacted and a complaint has been filed regarding the alleged Conflict of Interest issue. (FPPC Complaint number COM-07022020-01134)

While the FPPC may have jurisdiction over their laws, rules and regulations, we citizens believe that our City Council has jurisdiction over the Municipal Code. Please keep in mind that the issue in this matter is the allegation of a Conflict of Interest and not "income", wherein a "contribution or contributions" (Govt. Code 82015 attached) were received and accepted by Council Member Nguyen. A contribution or contributions received within 12 months from the same named and identified source that was the subject of a governmental decision on a matter before the Council on 5/12/20.

Please see the GGMCs that we believe apply in this matter and why we allege that they may have been violated by Council Member Nguyen:

2.02.020 Responsibilities of Public Office

Public officials are all elective officials of the City and the members of all official boards commissions and committees of the City. Public officials and employees are bound to uphold the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State and to carry out the laws of the nation, state, and municipality. Public officials and employees are bound to observe in their official acts the highest standards of morality and to discharge faithfully the duties of their offices, regardless of personal considerations; recognizing that the public interest must be their primary concern, and that conduct in both their official and private affairs should be above reproach. (2813 § 1, 2012; 1301 § 1, 1972)

2.02.060 Obligations to Citizens

- A. CONFLICT WITH PROPER DISCHARGE OF DUTIES. No public official or employee, while serving as such shall have any interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, or engage in any business or transaction or professional activity, or incur any obligation of any nature that is in substantial conflict with the proper discharge of his or her duties in the public interest and of his or her responsibilities as prescribed by law.
- B. INCOMPATIBLE EMPLOYMENT. No public official or employee shall accept other employment that he or she has reason to believe will either impair his or her independence of judgment as to his or her official duties or require him or her or induce him or her to disclose confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties.
- C. DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. - D. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. <u>A conflict of interest exists</u> in a matter before a public official for consideration or determination <u>if</u>:
- The public official has a substantial financial or substantial personal interest in the
 outcome or as owner, member, partner, officer, employee, or stockholder of any
 corporation or other professional enterprise that will be affected by the outcome, and such
 interest is or may be adverse to the public interest in the proper performance of
 governmental duties by the public official:
- The public official has reason to believe or expect that he or <u>she will derive direct</u>
 <u>monetary gain</u> or suffer a direct monetary loss, as the case may be, by reason of his or
 her official activity;
- The public official, because of bias, prejudice, or because be or she has
 prejudged a matter set for public hearing, is incapable because of such bias, prejudice or
 prejudgment of granting to the matter before him or her a fair and impartial hearing.
- 4. Personal interest as distinguished from financial interest is defined as including among other matters. an interest arising from blood or marriage relationships, or close business association. (2813 § 1, 2012; 1301 § 1, 1972)



2.02.070 Disclosure of Interest and Disqualification

- A. Any Councilmember who has a conflict of interest as defined herein, in any matter before the City Council shall disclose such fact on the record of the City Council and refrain from participating in any discussion of voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.
- B. Any member of any official board, commission, or committee who has a conflict of interest as defined herein in any matter before the board, commission, or committee of which he or she is a member, shall disclose such fact on the record of such board, commission, or committee and refrain from participating in any discussion or voting thereon, provided that such exceptions shall be observed as are required by law.
- C. Any employee who has a financial or other special interest in a matter before the City Council or any board, commission, or committee and who participates in discussion with, or gives an official opinion to the City Council, or to such board, commission, or committee relating to such matter, shall disclose on the record of the City Council or such board, commission, or committee, as the case may be, the nature and extent of such interest $(2813 \S 1, 2012; 1301 \S 1, 1972)$



The violation of any provision of this chapter shall be:

- A. As to all City employees, grounds for dismissal from City employment;
- B. As to any appointed position on any board, commission, or committee, grounds for removal from any such board, commission, or committee;
- C. As to any prosecution of any elected public official, the City Council shall make findings of fact by at least a vote of three City Councilmembers that an elected public official has, in fact, violated this chapter as a prerequisite to prosecution. (2813 § 1, 2012: 1301 § 1, 1972)



No public official or employee shall willfully and knowingly disclose for pecuniary gain to any other person confidential information acquired by him or her in the course of and by reason of his or her official duties nor shall any public official or employee use any such information for the purpose of pecuniary gain.
 - D. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. A conflict of interest exists in a matter before a public official for consideration or determination if:
- 1. The public official has a substantial financial or substantial personal interest in the outcome or as owner, member, partner, officer, employee, or stockholder of any corporation or other professional enterprise that will be affected by the outcome, and such interest is or may be adverse to the public interest in the proper performance of governmental duties by the public official.
 - 2. The public official has reason to believe or expect that he or she will derive direct monetary gain or suffer a direct monetary loss, as the case may be, by reason of his or her official activity,
- 3. The public official, because of bias, prejudice, or because he or she has prejudged a matter set for public hearing, is incapable because of such bias, prejudice or prejudgment of granting to the matter before him or her a fair and impartial hearing.

Personal interest as distinguished from financial interest is defined as including, among other matters, an interest arising from blood or marriage relationships, or close business association. (2813 § 1, 2012, 1301 § 1, 1972)

On February 15, 2018 the City of Garden Grove held a Youth in Government Day program for the first time in over 25 years. This interactive program aimed to offer high school seniors from the Garden Grove Unified School District a firsthand look at how their city government works.

ORDINANCE NO. 1238

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE AMENDING THE GARDEN GROVE MUNICIPAL CODE AND PARTICULARLY ARTICLE II THEREOF, ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION"

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Part 9A is added to Article II, Chapter 3 of the Garden Grove Municipal Code to read as follows:

PART 9A - YOUTH COMMISSION

SECTION 2390A. CREATED - MEMBERSHIP.

There is hereby created an advisory Youth Commission consisting of nine (9) members, to wit: One (1) from Bolsa Grande High School service area; one (1) from Garden Grove High School service area; one (1) from Pacifica High School service area; one (1) from Rancho Alamitos High School service area; one (1) from Santiago High School service area; and four (4) at-large Garden Grove Youths appointed by the Mayor subject to the approval of at least two other members of the City Council, and in addition thereto shall be served with staff liaison from the City Manager's office in a non-voting capacity; all commission members shall be local residents of the City at the time of their appointment and during their term of office; members shall not have reached their 18th birthday at the time of their appointment.

- (a) To facilitate the selection of Commissioners, the Commission members may serve as a screening committee to advertise and promote the concept of a Youth Commission, receive applications of interested young citizens of Garden Grove and refer them to the City Council for consideration.
- (b) All members of the Commission shall serve at the will of the City Council.

SECTION 2391A. TERMS OF OFFICE.

All Commission members shall be appointed effective January 1st for one (1) year and are eligible for reappointment each January 1st thereafter within the guidelines set forth in Section 2390A(a).

SECTION 2392A. VACANCY.

- (a) If any member of said Commission ceases to be a resident of Garden Grove, said member shall be terminated, his position declared vacant and the Mayor, subject to the approval of at least two other members of the City Council, shall reappoint a qualified representative as prescribed herein.
- (b) If any member of a school service area of said Commission ceases to reside in that respective area, his appointment to the Youth Commission shall be filled in the manner prescribed herein.
- (c) Appointments to fill vacancies in the Youth Commission shall be made for the unexpired term by the Mayor subject to approval of at least two other members of the City Council and shall not be interpreted as a full term under

- (I) To establish and recommend priorities in matters pertaining to youth which should be brought to Council, and also indicate recommendations for program support.
- (g) To assist in interpreting local ordinances which affect young people and to disseminate these findings and effects.
- (h) To provide a resource for evaluating City services from a young citizen's point of view.
- To maintain a satisfactory record of business transacted, findings, determinations and other matters of record.
- (j) To disseminate matters not directly under the realm of the City's jurisdiction to the appropriate agency, subject to City Council approval.

SECTION 2398A. COMPENSATION.

Each member of the Youth Commission shall receive Ten Dollars (\$10.00) compensation for each regular meeting of the Commission which he is in attendance.

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after adoption and shall within fifteen (15) days of adoption be published with the names of the Councilmen voting for and against the same in the Orange County Evening News, a newspaper of general circulation, printed published and circulated in the City of Garden Grove.

The foregoing ordinance was passed by the City Council of the City of Garden Grove this <u>26th</u> day of <u>October</u> , 1971.
