### Community Update -HOLIDAY EDITION-BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Gift giving is a big part of the holiday season, but make sure it doesn't make you a target. During this time, we often leave gifts or valuables visible in vehicles and in our homes, enticing criminals. Let's be vigilant and stay safe during the holiday season.

#### Practice the following safety tips to avoid becoming a victim:

- Bring packages in ASAP. Schedule deliveries for when you are home, or to be delivered to a pickup location.
- Do not leave packages or presents visible in your vehicle or home. Keep your doors locked.
- Alarms and cameras may help deter thieves, and can help catch them after the fact.
  - Register your home alarm at alarms.ggcity.org
  - Ensure that your cameras and/or alarm system are functioning properly, and familiarize yourself with how to operate them in order to retrieve footage if necessary.
- Don't overshare on social media. Avoid showing your valuables and your location. You may also make your profile private to limit who can view it.
- Stay alert, and change up your daily habits. Don't be a predictable target.

With back to school in full swing at Garden Grove Unified Schools, the Garden Grove Police Department would like to share some safety tips for you and your children during drop-off and pick-up times.

AWARENESS

### Students please remember the following:

- Look both ways before crossing the street, even at a cross walk.
- Stay off of your phone and away from distractions while walking in heavy traffic areas.
- Stay in designated walking or standing areas in front of and around your school.
- Don't run into the street to get to your parents car, wait for them to safely get to your side of the street, or use the cross walk.



#### Drivers please remember the following:

- Stay off of your phone and free of distractions while driving near school campuses.
- Don't make your child cross a busy street to get to your vehicle, encourage them to cross at cross walks or wait for you to drive around.
- Be aware of your surroundings; kids can hide behind small objects, making them difficult to spot.
