Keep this in Mind for your Kids' Safety

- Always check their social media accounts, text messages, and other applications. Monitor conversations to ensure they are appropriate.
- Now that your child has moved to a new grade level, new friends are going to be made. Be sure to check that the person they are friending on their accounts is someone from their school.
- Don't post on your social media, or on your children's regarding what after school programs they are participating in. This gives criminals a chance to monitor where your kids will be.
