ONLINE REPORTING

The Garden Grove Police Department went live with their Citizens Online Crime Reporting System earlier this year. This system is designed to make it easier and more convenient to file a report without having to go to the station or wait for an officer to arrive on scene.

The following incidents can be reported using this system:

- Civil Child Custody Violations
- Credit Card Fraud
- Documentation Report Only
- Supplemental Report
- Harassing Phone Calls or Text Messages
- Traffic Complaint
- Non Injury Hit and Run Traffic Accident
- Non-Injury Traffic Accident
- Information Scams
- Lost Property
- Theft (No Suspect Information)
- Vandalism (no Suspect Information)
- Vandalism to Vehicle (No Suspect Information)
- Vehicle Burglary (Theft From Vehicle)

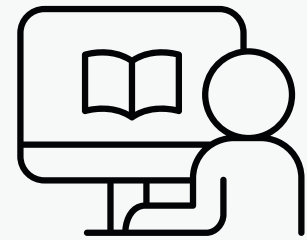

REPORT INTERNET CRIME TO THE FBI

The Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) is the central hub for reporting cyber-enabled crime. It is run by the FBI, which is the primary federal agency responsible for investigating such offences.

The following cybercrimes can be reported to IC3 to strengthen your case:

- Online scams/frauds
- Online Extortion
- Identity Theft
- Cryptocurrency fraud
- Information Scams

SPRING CLEANING & POISON PREVENTION

The time for spring cleaning is here. You will start to see ads for storage totes, cleaning products, and weed killers. Cleaning products are the third cause of poisoning in the U.S. If you buy these items, or already have them in your home, here are some safety tips to help prevent injury and poisoning.

POISON PREVENTION

- Store cleaning products and chemicals away from children and food.
- Keep products in the containers they came in, and do not mix.
 - Follow product label safety instructions.
 - Follow directions for proper disposal.
- Open windows and turn on fans when cleaning to avoid strong odors.
- Wear protective clothing when using any spray products.
 - Weed or insect killers can be absorbed through the skin. Leather gloves and shoes do not protect against these chemicals.
- Tell kids to ask an adult for permission before using a product.
- When done, put cleaning products in a childproof cabinet.

CLEANING SAFETY

- If you're feeling tired or weak, take a break, since that's when mistakes can happen. Remember to stay hydrated and eat well.
- Lift smarter, not harder. Be careful moving large or heavy items.
 - Lift with your legs.
 - Wear closed toed shoes.
 - Ask a friend for help.
- Watch your step!
 - Keep walkways, stairs, and areas around ladders clear.
 - Block off or warn others of wet floors to prevent slipping.
- Wear protective clothing and gear.
 - Ex: Rubber gloves while using cleaners, mask when dusting, etc.
- Do not leave any amount of water unattended. Buckets and sinks can be a drowning hazard for small children.
