DISCUSSION ITEMS:

4-a. Recreational and Oversized Vehicle Parking on City Streets

The staff report dated May 2, 2017 was introduced.

Four residents addressed the Commission voicing their opinions regarding the hardship of having to rent a storage space to park their RV instead of being able to park in front

of their own homes. It was noted that by adding more laws or ordinances it would not be effective; as the City has a difficult time enforcing the ones it already has.

Various concerns:

- Safety-Pedestrian Safety, Crosswalks, Intersections
- Sight Visibility
- Parking in "school zones"
- Transient parking-RV's that can't park in their own cities come to Garden Grove to park
- Spend too much time marking tires and not being able to enforce an actual code
- Dumping waste water (black or gray), drug paraphernalia, trash
- A city this size should have a "parking enforcement" division rather than pushing the existing problem onto law enforcement
- PD will not issue the permits
- Staff time to review applications
- No Overnight parking in City Parks

Staff noted that a permit system could be put into place for RV parking through the City's IT department.

FIRST MOTION:

It was moved and seconded to add the " $2/10^{th}$ rule" to Section 10.56.100: Seventy-two (72) Hour Limitation. (All Vehicles) If the vehicle has already been given a warning of this violation (72 hour limitation) and has to be warned a second time within $2/10^{th}$ of a mile it can be towed immediately then the 72 hour time limitation no longer applies.

It was moved and seconded to have no parking of RVs on any street under any circumstances with the following exceptions:

Application of a permit shall be made for a forty-eight (48) hour period to go to or come back from a trip for the sole purpose of loading or unloading, and/or cleaning and shall be parked in front of the residence that applied for the guest permit. At no time shall hookups be applied.

Application of a guest exemption shall be made for four (4) non-consecutive weeks within one (1) calendar year- January 1 through December 31st. No hookups shall be applied any time the vehicle is parked on the street. In both exceptions the RV shall be parked only in front of the property of the address that is on the application.

Shall not exceed thirty six (36) feet and;

Shall be drivable under its own power and;
