OBJECTIVE

To inform the City Council about the new youth football and cheer program in Garden Grove.

BACKGROUND

The Garden Grove Pop Warner Bulldogs offered youth football and cheer programming at Garden Grove Park for nearly twenty years. Boys and girls, ages 5 to 15 participated in tackle football and cheer programs led by volunteer coaches and board members. Garden Grove last played for a National Championship in 2018. That same year, the Varsity Cheer won Nationals and was recognized by the Garden Grove City Council. The Garden Grove Pop Warner Bulldogs ended programming in 2022.

DISCUSSION

In December 2023, Community Services received a request from a Garden Grove resident interested in reestablishing a youth football and cheer program and was referred to the Orange Empire Conference (OEC) for further consideration. The OEC is a California non-profit organization that oversees the various pop warner programs in Southern California, including Garden Grove. The OEC vetted two volunteers, including a Garden Grove resident, whom expressed their interests in reviving the youth football and cheer program in Garden Grove. To date, they've developed a Board of Directors, set goals for the program, sought sponsorships, and applied with the State of California as a new non-profit named the Garden Grove Panthers. The OEC has committed to providing guidance and resources for the new Garden Grove program.

SUMMARY

The Garden Grove Panthers is the new youth football and cheer program that will be offered at Garden Grove Park, with the inaugural season scheduled for fall 2024.

Moving experiences move on

February 14



Two measures involving moving around Garden Grove were approved at Tuesday's meeting of the city council.

One was adoption of a resolution approving participation in a state program worth \$441,000 for improving the Medal of Honor Bike and Pedestrian Trail that runs diagonally across the city from Brookhurst Street in the northeast to Nelson Street near the downtown area.

The improvements would include bike racks, benches, exercise equipment, trash cans, "litter abatement signage," landscaping/mulch and more.

Also adopted was a resolution authorizing an application to apply for a grant from the Orange County Transit Authority for traffic circulators in Garden Grove. If the grant was approved it would create an on-demand service using electric vehicles intended to supplement existing public transit.

The grant, if approved, would be for \$2.27 million over a seven-year period. Both were approved on a 6-0 vote with Mayor Steve Jones absent.

Townhome project approved

A 30-unit townhouse development to be built on the site of a former restaurant won initial approval from the Garden Grove City Council on Tuesday night.

With Mayor Steve Jones absent, the council voted 6-0 to approve the first reading of an ordinance for the 30-unit project to be built at the corner of Brookhurst Street and Central Avenue.

In addition to a site plan and tentative tract map, the applicant asked for a rezone from neighborhood commercial (C-1) and limited multiple residential (R-3).

The project would include three affordable residential units for "moderate income" households on the 1.22-acre site where the Marie Callender's restaurant once stood.

Of the 30 units, 22 would be two-bedroom units and eight would be four-bedroom units. Each unit would have a two-car garage (standard or tandem) and a balcony on the second floor and an open patio in the front.

Proposed is about 3,290 square feet of common recreation area with a barbecue area, wood structure shades and tables, seating, outdoor furniture, community gardens and a community dog bag station.

Nhiều người không có chỗ đậu xe xung quanh Phố Hoa, đành phải đậu ở chợ Costco và Home Depot gần đó, rồi băng qua đường.

Hai xe cảnh sát chắn hai đầu Phố Hoa, một chiếc bên đường Garden Grove, một chiếc bên đường Acacia.

Ngay lối vào chính bên đường Garden Grove là con số "2024" rất lớn, để trước một mô hình một cánh hoa khổng lồ, được làm bằng hàng chục bó nhang đủ màu, xung quanh có các chậu hoa cúc đại đóa bao bọc. Bên phải là một con rồng lớn, bên trái là một đàn ngỗng đang bay.

Hai bên đường của Phố Hoa là những gian làm bằng lá, bằng tre, bằng gỗ...có đủ các loại hoa, mô hình bánh chưng, bánh tét, dưa hấu, thỏi vàng, nón lá, mẹt, quang gánh... xe Honda, xe Vespa, xe Lambreta, xe xích lô... những đồ vật mang đậm nét văn hóa Việt Nam.



Nhìn vào con đường lịch sử của Garden Grove chỉ thấy toàn là hoa và người, đa số mặc áo dài đủ màu, đủ kiểu.

Mọi người, đa số mang theo cả gia đình, thay nhau ngồi hoặc đứng trong các gian để chụp hình. Các thiếu nữ trẻ đứng làm dáng, xoay qua xoay lại, để chụp hình và "selfie."

Cha mẹ bế con cái, có những em còn rất nhỏ, trong các bộ áo dài rất dễ thương, đến Phố Hoa để chụp hình.

"Rất tuyệt vời, đây là một sự kiện đoàn kết cộng đồng, cùng nhau chào mừng năm con rồng, và tôi rất vui khi thấy nhiều người mặc áo dài đủ màu đi ngắm phố hoa," bà Lisa Kim, tổng quản trị Garden Grove, nói với phóng viên nhật báo Người Việt. "Tôi hy vọng năm tới Phố Hoa sẽ lớn hơn, cộng đồng chúng ta sẽ mạnh mẽ hơn."

Ông Phú Nguyễn, ủy viên Học Khu Fountain Valley, cùng vợ và ba người con, tất cả đều mặc áo dài, đi từng gian để chụp hình, cho biết ông ngạc nhiên khi lần đầu tiên đến Phố Hoa Garden Grove. "Rất tuyệt! Tôi thấy làm Phố Hoa bên ngoài như vậy đẹp hơn, vì các cơ sở thương mại có thể bảo trợ và quảng cáo hữu hiệu. Phải nói là các cơ sở thương mại làm một công việc rất tốt. Nhờ đi Phố Hoa mà tôi biết thêm một số vật dụng của người Việt mình ngày xưa."

Trong khi nhiều người mặc áo dài có hình con rồng, ông Charles Johnson, cư dân Garden Grove, mặc một áo dài có hình con cá.

Ông giải thích: "Tôi có vợ người Việt và ba đứa con. Vợ tôi mua cho tôi áo này năm ngoái. Con cá không nằm trong 12 con giáp, nên tôi có thể mặc năm nào cũng được."

"Tôi rất vui khi thấy nhiều người mặc áo dài đi Phố Hoa, nhất là những chàng trai và cô gái rất trẻ, xếp hàng chờ chụp hình, rồi có người 'selfie,' trông rất hạnh phúc," ông nói tiếp.

Cô Lisabet Bành, cư dân Calgary, Canada, cho biết cô cũng rất thích không khí vui nhộn ngày Xuân của Phố Hoa.

"Tôi thấy có nhiều hoa đẹp, trang trí đẹp mắt, mọi người nói chuyện qua lay, ríu rít, ồn ào, nhưng vui nhộn. Tôi cũng thích nhiều gian trưng hoa quả, đồ vật ngày xưa, mang tính văn hóa và truyền thống," cô Lisabet nói tiếp.

Ngồi chờ người nhà xếp hàng dài mua nước trong tiệm Phúc Long, cô Stacy Trần, cư dân San Jose, khen cảnh Phố Hoa rất đẹp và đầy tính văn hóa.

Cô nói: "Trước hết là tôi thấy vui. Kế đến là trang trí rất đẹp. Đây là lần đầu tiên tôi đến đây, rất ngạc nhiên với Phố Hoa. Tuy không lớn bằng đại lộ Nguyễn Huệ của ngày xưa, nhưng lại có nét văn hóa rất cao. Điều đặc biệt nữa là chỉ có Little Saigon có Phố Hoa, chứ ở San Jose tôi chưa có. Có điều, ban tổ chức nên có thêm nơi bán thức ăn và nước uống, vừa để doanh nghiệp phát triển vừa để phục vụ khách du Xuân."

Được biết ý tưởng thực hiện Phố Hoa là do ông Linh Nguyễn, chủ tịch Vietnamese Soccer Association of So Cal, đưa ra, theo bà Lisa Kim.

"Lý do tôi muốn thực hiện Phố Hoa vì thấy những hội chợ trong cộng đồng Việt Nam không có nhiều hoa. Tôi muốn thấy hình ảnh gia đình đi chơi ngày Tết có hoa để chụp hình kỷ niệm, chưa thấy ở Mỹ," ông Linh bày tỏ. "Trong khi đó, tôi thấy đường Main rất đẹp, rất phù hợp với Phố Hoa. Thế là tôi đề nghị với thành phố."

Ông Linh cũng cho biết, lần đầu tổ chức vào năm 2023 bị lỗ nhiều, năm nay đạt được 70%, và "tôi hy vọng năm tới sẽ đạt 100% vốn."

Ông nói thêm: "Nhân đây, tôi cũng xin cám ơn các doanh nghiệp bảo trợ, những tình nguyện viên, các mạnh thường quân, giúp chúng tôi thực hiện Phố Hoa Garden Grove, qua công việc chuẩn bị từ ba tháng trước, nhất là trời lạnh trong mấy ngày qua."

California city managers receive statewide

honors for contributions to the field

The City Managers Department last week handed top honors to members from Monrovia, Watsonville, and Aliso Viejo for their contributions to the city management profession.



Lauren Vasquez, Monrovia assistant city manager, received the Award for the Advancement of Diverse Communities. She helped enact over 40 programs and policies aimed at boosting diversity, equity, and inclusion within the city.

Fellow City Manager Dylan Feik drew attention to her work removing implicit bias from the city's hiring processes. Using voluntary demographic information, the city now actively looks for and reduces "bottlenecks" that stop qualified candidates from advancing. Feik's work already moved the needle in one department: The number of women in the police force doubled in two years.



Tamara Vides, an assistant city manager for Watsonville, received the John H. Hail Memorial Work for her contributions to the field. She mobilized the city's emergency operations last year when an underpredicted winter storm sent water gushing out of Corralitos Creek. At the time, most city staff were away for the holidays.

Vides also secured transportation, shelter, and food for affected residents. She later oversaw cleanup efforts, coordinated additional emergency responses, and even drove several hours to buy thousands of sandbags. Rene Mendez — who nominated Vides — said her "tireless" and "hands-on approach" demonstrated a genuine commitment to the city and public service as a whole.



Dennis Wilberg, Aliso Viejo city manager, received the Wes McClure Award for his decades-long dedication to mentoring others. Wilberg has served as an advisor for city managers throughout the state and is the longest-tenured city manager in Orange County. He has mentored future city managers through a university fellowship program, as well as regional and international organizations.

Wilberg also worked with other city officials to create the second-largest animal shelter in Orange County, build an advanced water treatment facility, and increase public safety. He has had leadership roles with Cal Cities and the Orange County Council of Governments.

Here's how Cal Cities is opposing the CBRT-sponsored ballot initiative

As part of those efforts, the <u>Regional Public Affairs team</u> is launching a one-stop-shop series about the biggest ballot measures for cities heading into the 2024 elections. It's an easy way to learn what Cal Cities has done, what other cities are doing, and how your city can join our efforts.

Just what is the ballot measure about?

By far the most consequential ballot measure for cities is the deceptively named <u>"Taxpayer Protection and Government Accountability Act."</u> According to the California Attorney General, the initiative would limit the ability of local voters and state and local governments to raise revenue measures for government services. It could make it harder to raise revenues for a range of services — from emergency services to road maintenance. A group of the state's wealthiest corporations, the California Business Roundtable, is bankrolling the measure.

Cal Cities estimates the measure could reduce state and local government funding for core public services by billions annually. The measure's unclear language would need to be clarified in the courts, putting an additional financial burden on cities and taxpayers.

Cal Cities is taking a three-pronged approach by opposing the measure in the <u>Legislature</u>, in the <u>courts</u>, and in the field through campaign outreach plans and meetings with city officials.

Together with our coalition partners, Cal Cities this past Sunday also took out a <u>full-page ad</u> in the *Los Angeles Times* and the *San Francisco Chronicle* calling out the companies behind this measure. (You can read more about that effort in the Monday edition of *Politico California Playbook* and the *Los Angeles Times*.)

Cal Cities opposes the measure as a dangerous, irresponsible overreach that will have a catastrophic impact on California's future.

A 100% success rate

Cal Cities formed the Regional Public Affairs team over 20 years ago specifically to protect local funding and oppose measures like this. Made up of 16 professional campaign organizers around the state, the team has over 300 years of experience. Members have worked for governors, legislators, and campaign consultants.

But more important is our win rate. Our team has helped defeat or pass nearly all of the ballot measures Cal Cities has engaged in.

'DART is like a second family,' says

member of award-winning youth program

When it comes to making an impact, it's often

not what you spend but how you spend it. A recent study found that the Duarte Area Resource Team (DART) reduced juvenile arrests by over 60% over a three-year period. They did this by spending just \$25,000 per year in city funds, supplemented by state funding.



This success is even more evident when comparing Duarte to another city in the study, which experienced a 41% increase in juvenile arrests.

"DART is really 'one of a kind," said Cesar Garcia, the mayor pro-tem of Duarte and a former DART participant. "And it wouldn't be what it is without the staff that has dedicated years to making it what it is and who have made genuine connections with the students."

DART has its roots in a 1999 youth engagement program, which was limited in scope and did not fully address issues of youth violence and gang recruitment. In 2010, the Duarte Public Safety Department secured state funding to expand the program to address youth gang recruitment and focus on lowering juvenile arrests. Now known as DART, the program is a beacon of hope for youth ages 13 to 19.

Thanks to the funding, the program has expanded its team by hiring support staff and prioritizing training future generations of community role models. "I have been fortunate enough to continue working as a mentor to watch new generations of students grow in confidence, leadership, and love," states Alex Tapia, a DART graduate and current intern. Tapia will graduate college this year to pursue a teaching career.

A holistic approach to youth development

Like many nearby cities, Duarte is a bedroom community hemmed in by the San Gabriel Mountains to the north. In the last fifty years, street gangs have become a problem. Duarte is also a minority-majority city, with many families living at or below the poverty line. Some of the city's youth feel marginalized and seek a sense of social identity, which gangs capitalize on in recruitment.



DART operates within the Public Safety Department/Sheriff's Substation and includes a crime prevention specialist, a school resource sheriff's deputy, and college interns. The key to DART's continued success is its robust relationships with internal and external stakeholders, including the school district, the city's Parks and Recreation Department, The Boys and Girls Club, and other youth organizations.

A significant number of DART participants are first-generation Americans and face challenges accessing resources due to discrimination and economic inequality.

"I would not be where I am now had it not been for the DART program," said Laura Cortez. "As a first-generation student, I didn't have guidance about career options or college. In fact, growing up, I used to think attending a university would never be feasible due to the lack of affordability and qualifications."

DART focuses on reducing delinquency and fostering pro-social behaviors by mentoring students and getting them involved in their community. Beyond traditional prevention, intervention, and reintegration programs, DART mentors and city staff go the extra mile by attending parent-teacher conferences, helping with work and college applications, and advocating for the youth. This comprehensive approach helps ensure that students receive the support they need.

During her time in DART, Cortez volunteered for the city of Hope and attended several college tours, including one at the University of California, Los Angeles. She graduated from UCLA in 2017 and is now a registered nurse at City of Hope. "I am forever grateful for the roots that made this all possible," Cortez said.

Expanding impact and success

A 2022 independent study revealed that DART participants felt a heightened sense of security, belonging, and significance as they became integral parts of their own community. Youth adopted more pro-social behaviors — acts of kindness, collaboration, empathy, and selflessness — leading to decreased recidivism rates. These behaviors are nurtured through community services, further increasing community well-being. This significantly reduces the likelihood of negative and criminal activities, such as property defacement and theft. Self-reported surveys also found positive shifts in attitudes toward delinquency, commitment to school, collective efficacy, and parental supervision.

However, DART's success lies in its ability to evolve and address current issues facing youth. Although it was initially designed for gang and juvenile crime prevention, the program has adapted to address emerging challenges, such as increased vaping, cyberbullying, and the mental and physical health effects of COVID-19.

"Since I joined DART, my screen time has decreased by a third," said Viridiana Garcia, a current member. "I also do things I only saw on social media, like volunteering and other fun group hangouts."



A local program gains global recognition

Initially serving around 20 youths annually with a \$10,000 budget, DART now reaches approximately 50 youths annually.

The exceptional work of the program has not gone unnoticed. Recently, the International City/County Management Association honored DART with a Local Government Excellence Award for its innovative and successful approach to community safety, health, and wellness. DART has not only reduced juvenile arrests but has positively transformed the lives of countless young individuals — and, by extension, their communities.

"DART has changed me in many ways — like being outgoing and making others laugh," said Athziri Villa, another current member. "... If you ask me what DART means to me, I will say that DART is like a second family, and the support that I have gotten from being in DART I would not change for the world. DART has given me a lot of fun memories and a lot of cool friends."
