Dear Assembly Member Solache,

The City of Garden Grove is pleased to support **AB 1708** (Solache), which would create a new pathway for cities with populations under 300,000 to access state homelessness funding.

Since 2019, the state's flagship homelessness grant program, the Homeless Housing, Assistance, and Prevention (HHAP) Grant program, has provided direct funding to cities with populations over 300,000, all 58 counties, and the 44 Continuums of Care (CoC) across California.

This structure has left most cities without a consistent pathway to access HHAP funding, despite investing significant General Fund resources to prevent and reduce homelessness in their communities. AB 1708 would address this by creating a new opportunity for the 469 California cities with populations under 300,000 to apply for HHAP funding through their CoC.

Specifically, AB 1708 would require CoCs, before allocating funding to other subrecipients in their region, to accept applications for 30 days only from cities with populations under 300,000. This measure would strike a reasonable balance between access and accountability, requiring interested cities to commit to regionally coordinated action plans and adhere to state housing and encampment policies.

AB 1708 would also require CoCs to prioritize applications from cities that have existing partnerships with non-profits, other cities, or have already leveraged state and local funding for existing projects in their communities. This would ensure that limited state resources are deployed efficiently and deliver measurable results in reducing homelessness.

As the Governor and the Legislature consider future investments in the HHAP program, it is important to ensure the program is structured to maximize its reach

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and impact. Providing all cities with a pathway to participate in HHAP would strengthen regional collaboration and ensure state resources are deployed where they can most effectively serve unhoused Californians.

Local governments are best positioned to identify the programs and partnerships that will have the greatest impact in our communities. AB 1708 recognizes this, creating a clearly defined opportunity for all cities to compete for state resources, so that communities of all sizes can have a meaningful role in the state's homelessness response efforts.

For these reasons, the City of Garden Grove is pleased to support **AB 1708 (Solache)**.

Dear Chair Haney:

On behalf of the City of Garden Grove, I write in support of Assembly Bill (AB) 2002, authored by Assemblymember José Luis Solache (D-Lynwood), which would codify the Regional Early Action Planning (REAP 1.0) grant program and preserve a critical housing program that helped foster effective regional housing planning and provide technical assistance for California's 541 cities and counties.

California's housing shortage requires strong local planning capacity to meet our housing goals. Cities and counties are responsible for updating housing elements, identifying and rezoning sites, and navigating increasingly complex state requirements, often with limited staff and resources. REAP 1.0 helped address these challenges by providing funding that allowed the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) – and other councils of governments – to support direct technical assistance, subregional coordination, housing element updates, data tools, and other locally driven planning efforts.

In Garden Grove, the REAP 1.0 program provided planning assistance and implementation of accessory dwelling unit policies and programs, helping meet our state housing requirements more efficiently and with greater certainty.

Since REAP 1.0 was implemented as a temporary program, this critical support expired, despite the growing cost and complexity of housing compliance driven by new requirements from recent legislation, with the 7<sup>th</sup> Cycle RHNA projected to be the costliest in state history. AB 2002 would establish REAP 1.0 in statute, ensuring the Legislature can continue investing in the local planning resources necessary for cities and counties to meet housing goals and promote housing production.

#### OBJECTIVE

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide an update on recent Business Retention and Expansion (BRE) visitation efforts conducted by the Economic Development and Housing Department (EDHD) with local Garden Grove businesses.

#### DISCUSSION

During the months of February and March 2026, EDHD staff conducted a series of Business Retention and Expansion (BRE) visitation meetings with local businesses. These meetings were held on-site at each respective business location and provided an opportunity for staff to engage directly with business owners and managers to better understand their operations, business history, and future goals.

BRE visitations allow staff to identify opportunities to support business growth, address operational needs, and strengthen relationships between the City and the local business community. These visitations are an important component of the City's proactive economic development strategy, allowing staff to maintain direct communication with local businesses while identifying opportunities to support business retention, expansion, and long-term investment in Garden Grove.

During these visits, staff reinforced the City's commitment to supporting local businesses and shared information regarding available City resources and programs that may assist businesses in maintaining and expanding their operations within Garden Grove. Several businesses shared positive updates regarding their operations, continued growth, and long-term presence in the community.

Highlights from these visits include the following:

#### Tuesday, February 24 – GKDI Design

Staff met with representatives from GKDI Design Group, a locally based design consultancy specializing in industrial design, product development, and design research. During the meeting, staff learned about the company's history, its involvement with the local Chamber of Commerce, and opportunities to continue strengthening connections within the Garden Grove business community.

Monday, March 2 – Shawarma House

Staff met with the business owner and manager to discuss the continued success of the restaurant, which has served Garden Grove since 2018. During the meeting, staff shared information about available City resources, including the Grow Garden Grove Fund and the MicroBiz Loan Program, and provided information regarding homelessness resources.

Tuesday, March 3 – Amarith Farmhouse

Staff met with the family-owned restaurant to better understand the business's operations, history, and accomplishments, and to discuss potential opportunities for future growth and expansion within the City. Amarith Farmhouse has served the Garden Grove community since 2023. Following the meeting, the business owner was provided information on available properties within the City to support potential expansion.

Tuesday, March 3 – Bake & Che

Staff met with the business owner to discuss the company's continued growth and explore potential opportunities for expansion within the City. Bake & Che is a Vietnamese dessert café known for its modern approach to traditional desserts and continues to attract customers from across the region.

Thursday, March 26- Grove Body Shop

The Mayor and City staff met with the owners of Grove Body Shop, a legacy business that has served the community for over 50 years, and toured their facility. During the visit, they discussed the company's current operations as well as potential future opportunities for the site and its continued success. The meeting was productive and reaffirmed the City's commitment to supporting long-standing local businesses. Staff also provided information on available City resources, including the Grow Garden Grove Fund, the MicroBiz Loan Program, and services addressing homelessness.

Photos below highlight recent Business Retention and Expansion visitation meetings conducted by EDHD staff with Garden Grove business owners.

#### CONCLUSION

The City remains committed to supporting local businesses through ongoing engagement and outreach. Business Retention and Expansion visits provide valuable opportunities for staff to strengthen relationships with the business community. EDHD will continue conducting BRE visitations as part of its ongoing efforts to foster a strong and resilient local economy.

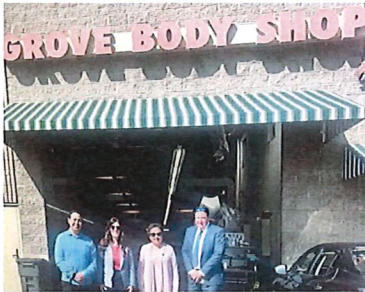

Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby submits this Tier 1 Advice Letter to the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission or CPUC) to provide the information requested in Ordering Paragraph 1 of Decision (D.) 21-10-020.

**PURPOSE**

This Advice Letter provides information required by Ordering Paragraph (OP) 1 of D. 21-10-020 regarding SCE's restoration and reconstruction activities related to the January 2025 Windstorm Event (City of Rancho Cucamonga), 2025 Mid-September Storm, and 2025 Late December Storms. The Governor declared a State of Emergency for the 2025 Mid-September Storm on December 23, 2025, January 2025 Windstorm Event on December 23, 2025, and 2025 Late December Storm on December 24, 2025.

**BACKGROUND**

Ordering Paragraph 1 of D. 21-10-020 requires an electric Investor Owned Utility (IOU) to file a Tier 1 Advice Letter in the event (1) the Governor of California or the President of the United States issues a disaster declaration, and (2) there is damage to IOU's facility or a service outage. Ordering Paragraph 1 states:

"In the event of a disaster, declared either by the Governor of California or the President of the United States, that also damages their facilities or leads to a service outage, Investor-Owned Utilities (IOUs) shall file a Tier 1 Advice Letter within 15 business days from when they are allowed into a disaster area to assess the damage to their facilities. IOUs shall file this Advice Letter with the Commission's Energy Division, with a copy sent to the Communications Division at [TD\\_PAL@cpuc.ca.gov](mailto:TD_PAL@cpuc.ca.gov). The Advice Letter also must be provided to the appropriate local government

contained within the disaster area, including the chief executive or leader of the city, township or Tribal government. In the case of an unincorporated area, the communication must be established with the appropriate County. In the case of Tribal governments, the Advice Letter must be provided to any Tribe(s) that have Tribal lands or ancestral territory overlapping with any portion of the disaster area.”

The Advice Letter shall include the following details:

- a. a report of what facilities or equipment was damaged;
- b. restoration and/or rebuild plans, including a description of what is being repaired, replaced or added, and maps of where the restoration will occur;
- c. the date the investor-owned utility received access to the damaged area;
- d. the timeline to make repairs;
- e. any changes to any energy/communication infrastructure required; and
- f. the contact information of the individual responsible for community engagement in these instances.”

Below, SCE provides the requested information for the disaster declarations covered in this advice letter.<sup>1</sup>

**January 2025 Windstorm**

The January 2025 Windstorm occurred in SCE service territory commencing on or about January 7, 2025. On or about December 23, 2025, a State of Emergency Proclamation for San Bernardino County, which is located in SCE service territory, was issued by Governor Newsom and posted at <https://www.caloes.ca.gov/office-of-the-director/policy-administration/legal-affairs/emergency-proclamations/> and <https://www.ftb.ca.gov/file/business/deductions/disaster-codes.html> (Website). As of February 13, 2025, restoration activities were completed.

SCE began the service restoration as soon as it was safe to conduct the work, on January 7, 2025. SCE's current restoration efforts involve replacing equipment like for like as needed in order to restore power to customers. Restoration efforts are completed as of February 13, 2026.

**C. Date received access to damaged areas**

SCE was not under restricted access at the request of fire authorities or any other government agency. Access to some of the affected areas was limited by safety concerns, rugged terrain, inclement weather, and a number of downed trees. SCE first received access to some of the affected areas on January 7, 2025 and to the remaining affected areas by January 23, 2025.

**D. Timeline to make repairs**

SCE completed service restoration from January 7, 2025 to January 27, 2025. At this time restoration efforts are completed.

**E. Changes to infrastructure**

Service restoration was accomplished by replacing equipment on a like-for-like basis in order to restore power to customers that can safely be restored.

**F. Contact information or community engagement**

This was a service restoration activity accomplished by replacement of equipment on a like-for-like basis, not a rebuild effort. Because this was a service restoration effort requiring immediate action, SCE did not engage with community stakeholders prior to the restoration work as contemplated by OP 2 of D. 21-10-020 prior to commencing the work. Accordingly, SCE will not be submitting a second Advice Letter as contemplated in OP 3. SCE engaged with the proper authorities to accomplish the initial service restoration activity as noted above. .

**2025 Mid-September Storm**

The 2025 Mid-September Storm occurred in SCE service territory commencing on or about September 19, 2025. On or about December 23, 2025, a State of Emergency Proclamation for Los Angeles County and San Bernardino County, both of which are located in SCE service territory, was issued by Governor Newsom and posted on the Website. SCE began restoration activities on September 19, 2025 and as of February 13, 2026, restoration activities are still ongoing.

SoCalGas is requesting an increase in revenue of \$8.2 million from 2028-2031 for the Public Purpose Program Surcharge (PPPS) to continue funding energy efficiency programs through its four-year program portfolio.

For the program portfolio SoCalGas is requesting funding approval of \$150 million in 2028, \$150 million in 2029, \$150 million in 2030, and \$150 million in 2031, totaling \$600 million. A reduction of \$16 million when compared to the most recent authorized program portfolio. The program portfolio contains detailed program strategies, annual budgets, totaling to a four-year revenue, cost-effectiveness, and implementation plans (or links to them) for all programs that are currently operating or planned to operate during that time. The exception being third-party programs where the contract has not been awarded yet.

The application also includes the funding request of the Regional Energy Networks (RENs) for their program portfolios that operate within SoCalGas's service territory totaling \$103.4 million for the four years. An increase of \$40.7 million when compared to the most recent authorized program portfolio. This will result in an increase in gas rates phased in over the four years, starting January 1, 2028.

## HOW WOULD THIS IMPACT THE AVERAGE RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMER?

If the request is approved, the average residential customer using 35 therms per month would see a bill increase of approximately \$0.03. This reflects the peak-year increase in 2031. The actual impact will vary according to usage levels, baseline territory, and other factors.

# California's historic investments to curb retail theft result in 29,060 arrests \$226 million in recovered goods in two years

**What you need to know:** Governor Newsom announced significant updates to California's fight to stop organized retail theft – leading to over 29,060 arrests and recovering \$226 million in stolen property – in two years.

**SACRAMENTO** – As a direct result of state investment and Governor Gavin Newsom's sustained commitment to disrupting criminal activity, local law enforcement agencies arrested 29,060 suspects and referred nearly 22,896 cases for prosecution related to organized retail theft over a two-year period. From October 2023 to September 2025, law enforcement agencies, assisted by historic state funding, have helped increase public safety and crack down on organized retail theft.

We are sending a clear message: organized retail crime has no place in our communities. Through strong partnerships with local law enforcement, we are disrupting criminal enterprises, protecting small businesses, and making sure those responsible face consequences for their actions.

Governor Gavin Newsom



Most recently, from July to September 2025, local law enforcement agencies conducted over 3,300 arrests and recovered nearly \$36 million in stolen goods. These results drove the total amount of recovered stolen goods that agencies have been able to recover to more than [\\$226 million](#), a total increase of nearly 19% over the three-month period.

In 2023, as part of California's [Public Safety Plan](#), the Governor announced the [largest-ever](#) investment to combat organized retail crime in state history. Through the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC), the organized retail theft grants have provided 38 law enforcement agencies with over \$242 million in funding to purchase new equipment, launch enhanced enforcement operations, hire new staff, and establish partnerships with the retail community.

"The ORT grants are providing local law enforcement the tools necessary to strategically dismantle retail crime networks," said **BSCC Board Chair Linda Penner**. "With thousands of arrests and millions of dollars in recovered goods, we are successfully building a more secure environment for California's businesses and residents alike."

The grants continue to bolster the success of local law enforcement in supporting the retail community and combating retail crime.

**Notable highlights include:**

Equipment purchased through grant funds assisted the **Delano Police Department** in locating and [arresting an armed robbery suspect](#) who had brandished a firearm and demanded money at a local bank.

The **Garden Grove Police Department** noted a remarkable decrease in auto thefts of 38% since the implementation of programs funded by the grant.

The **Irvine Police Department** detectives used grant funds to identify and arrest suspects who stole merchandise from the Irvine Ulta, as well as suspects involved in [additional thefts](#) in nearby Lake Forest and Mission Viejo, totaling \$10,000. The suspects were documented gang members with prior weapons violations.

Several cargo theft arrests were made by the **Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department**, including suspects responsible for a Kohl's warehouse theft valued at \$340,000, a Compton area warehouse theft that included 68 pallets of Monster energy drinks and 35 pallets of New Balance shoes valued at \$550,000 dollars, and, in another surveillance-driven operation in coordination with the **Riverside County Sheriff's Department** and **Redlands Police Department**, a crew of South American Theft Group suspects were arrested in connection with multiple thefts at the Cabazon Outlets.

The **Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department** also arrested eight suspects through an investigation of multiple vehicles, a trailer, and 40 pallets of computers valued at [\\$1.4 million dollars](#). The operation resulted in a full recovery of goods, and suspects were also arrested for weapons and drug charges.

The Los Angeles Police Department's Cargo Theft Unit worked collaboratively with the **Union Pacific Police Department** and the **Los Angeles Port Police** to execute a search warrant that resulted in the [recovery of \\$4.5 million](#) of stolen cargo and rail goods. The **Sacramento County Sheriff's Department** conducted multiple blitz operations during the reporting quarter, resulting in 24 arrests. The department notes an overall decrease in recent arrests and credits grant-funded efforts to combat retail theft. One notable case involved the [arrest of a repeat offender](#) responsible for reselling over \$70,000 in stolen cordless tools and batteries.

The **Santa Clara County Sheriff's Department** investigated an [online marketplace](#) account believed to be selling stolen goods. Working with Target investigators, the department executed a search warrant that yielded over \$38,000 in stolen goods from Target, Home Depot, and Lowe's.

**Prosecuting organized retail theft rings**

In addition, the BSCC has also provided over **\$24 million to 13 district attorneys' offices** through a vertical prosecution grant program that allows the same prosecutors to focus on a case from beginning to end, providing victims and law enforcement a single point of contact.

Although independent of the prevention grant outcomes, 2,219 people were convicted by grantees of theft-related property crimes, an increase of over 17% from the last quarter of data. Of those, 755 convictions were specifically related to organized retail theft, including 654 felony convictions, or over 86%. Grantees expect the number of convictions achieved through the grant program to continue to rise in the next few quarters.

**Notable highlights include:**

The **Placer County District Attorney's Office** [successfully prosecuted](#) a prolific organized retail theft suspect responsible for nearly \$30,000 in theft from Lululemon stores, including cases from multiple counties across the state. The defendant was found guilty of all counts and is now serving a ten-year prison sentence.

Arrests in one of the [largest retail theft cases](#) in the nation involved a high-level, sophisticated theft ring responsible for multiple Home Depot thefts totaling \$10 million. Grant funds allowed the **Ventura County District Attorney's Office** to spend several months in an active investigation that led to the arrest of nine suspects for multiple felonies. The [FastPass](#) retail theft prosecution program, created through grant funds by the **Yolo County District Attorney's Office**, continues to build strong relationships with the local retail community, enhancing their collective ability to address retail theft. The program now operates county-wide, creating greater opportunities for reporting organized retail crime and facilitating prosecution.

In total, \$267 million in grant funding to 55 communities have enabled cities and counties to hire more police and secure more felony charges against suspects.

#### **Complementing the work done by the CHP**

In addition to this vital funding for local law enforcement, the state also works to stop retail theft through the California Highway Patrol's Organized Retail Crime Task Force. State officers work with local and federal partners to tackle retail crime statewide. Since the [inception of this task force in 2019](#), the CHP has been involved in over 4,300 investigations, leading to the arrest of over 5,000 suspects and the recovery of over 1.5 million stolen goods valued at nearly \$70 million as of December 31, 2025. Through various partnerships and investments, the state is seeing real progress at increasing public safety and stopping bad actors once and for all.

#### **Investing in California's public safety**

While Republicans in Congress pushed their "big beautiful betrayal" bill, cutting funding to vital public safety programs, California demonstrated what real public safety looks like: serious investments, strong enforcement, and real results. California has [invested \\$2.1 billion](#) since 2019 to fight crime, help local governments hire more police, and improve public safety.

In August 2024, Governor Newsom signed into law [the most significant bipartisan legislation to crack down on property crime in modern California history](#). Building on the state's robust laws and record public safety funding, these bipartisan bills offer new tools to bolster ongoing efforts to hold criminals accountable for smash-and-grab robberies, property crime, retail theft, and auto burglaries. While California's crime rate remains near-historic lows, these laws help the state adapt to evolving criminal tactics, ensuring that perpetrators are held accountable.

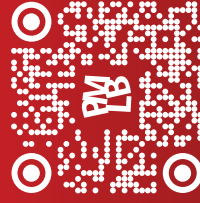

The City of Garden Grove and the Garden Grove Tourism Improvement District (GGTID) today officially launched Grove District Transit, a new shuttle service connecting participating Garden Grove hotels to the Disneyland Resort.

“Garden Grove is a welcoming destination and an important part of the region’s visitor economy,” said Mayor Stephanie Klopfenstein. “With the launch of Grove District Transit, we are improving access for hotel guests and reinforcing Garden Grove as a convenient place to stay while visiting the Disneyland Resort”

With service now underway, Grove District Transit provides guests at 10 participating Garden Grove hotels with a convenient new way to reach the Disneyland Resort while supporting an important part of Garden Grove’s visitor economy. Grove District Transit vehicles are ADA accessible, helping expand transportation access for hotel guests and supporting a more inclusive visitor experience.

“We are proud to launch Grove District Transit as a new amenity for participating hotels and their guests,” said GGTID President Dieter Hissin. “This service provides a convenient new way to reach the Disneyland Resort and strengthens the visitor experience for those staying in Garden Grove.”

Three routes serve participating Garden Grove hotels and the Disneyland Resort, with service beginning at 7:15 a.m. and continuing through 12:45 a.m. at approximately 30-minute intervals. The routes include:

- Route 3 – Serves Embassy Suites by Hilton Anaheim South, Hilton Garden Inn Anaheim/Garden Grove and Hampton Inn & Suites Anaheim/Garden Grove, with estimated travel times of about 15 minutes.

The City of Garden Grove Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will offer the public a safe way to dispose of expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs on Saturday, April 25, 2026, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., helping prevent abuse and theft.

Anyone can bring unwanted pills for disposal to the Garden Grove Police Department, located at 11301 Acacia Parkway, Garden Grove, CA 92840. Garden Grove Police personnel will be stationed at the entrance of the police lobby with collection bins and information. The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked. Please note the DEA cannot accept liquids or needles or sharps, ONLY pills or patches.

In October 2025, Americans turned in 286 tons (over 570,000 pounds) of prescription drugs at over 4,317 sites operated by the DEA, in partnership with state and local law enforcement agencies.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies have shown that most abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet.

In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—both pose potential safety and health hazards.

## **NIGHTTIME STORM DRAIN REPAIRS TO IMPACT TRAFFIC AT KNOTT STREET AND LAMPSON AVENUE**

The City of Garden Grove will begin nighttime storm drain repairs at the intersection of Knott Street and Lampson Avenue on [Sunday, March 29, 2026](#). Repair work is expected to continue through [June 2026](#) and will result in traffic restrictions in the area.

During construction, northbound Knott Street will be reduced to one lane and Lampson Avenue will be closed to through traffic at the intersection. Work will take place from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., [Sunday](#) night through [Friday](#) morning, to reduce impacts on daytime traffic.

# Becerra, Mahan, and Yee to appear at 2026 Cities Gubernatorial Candidate Forum

Cal Cities is holding an [onstage conversation](#) with gubernatorial candidates on April 23 in Sacramento as part of the [City Leaders Summit](#). City officials can hear directly from the candidates about issues most important to cities, including housing and homelessness, public safety, climate and energy, affordability, and more.

Scott Shafer, senior politics and government editor at *KQED* and co-host of the award-winning podcast *Political Breakdown*, will moderate the conversation. Shafer will also delve into leadership, values, and the person behind each candidate, offering a deeper understanding of their potential partnership with cities.

## Who will be there?

Cal Cities invited the top 11 candidates to the forum: Xavier Becerra, Matt Mahan, and Betty Yee agreed to attend; confirmations from two other candidates are pending.

[Xavier Becerra](#), the son of Mexican American immigrants, has spent 35 years serving California — from the State Assembly to the U.S. Congress, as California’s Attorney General, and the U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services. He is best known for his work on the Affordable Care Act, high-profile fights with the Trump administration, and successful efforts to lower prescription drug prices.

[Matt Mahan](#) is the mayor of San José. After serving on several neighborhood and civic boards, he decided to run for city council in 2020. During his time in office, he has focused on making city hall more responsive and accountable, especially on the issues of public safety, homelessness, and housing. He was also one of the main proponents of Proposition 36 in 2024 and continues to advocate new approaches to the state’s problems.

[Betty Yee](#) was elected as California’s Controller in 2014, following two terms on the California Board of Equalization (BOE). As state controller, she and her team uncovered \$7.5 billion in misspending. Her work on the BOE resulted in Amazon collecting and remitting sales tax and the recognition of marriage equality. Yee has also held key positions in other statewide organizations, including the Chief Deputy Director of the California Department of Finance.

## City Leaders Summit registration information

## Cal Cities doubles down on Prop. 36 funding request

Cal Cities is urging lawmakers to fully fund Proposition 36. The ballot measure — [overwhelmingly approved by voters](#) in 2024 — made changes to drug and property theft crimes and created a new treatment-mandated felony to address a surge in retail theft and shoplifting.

This year, Cal Cities is part of a coalition that includes the Chief Probation Officers of California, the California State Sheriffs Association, and the California District Attorneys Association. The group is requesting funding for probation and other services needed at the local level and has met with lawmakers several times, including Sen. Laura Richardson, who chairs a key budget subcommittee.

Carolyn Coleman, Cal Cities executive director and CEO, last week sent [a letter to legislators](#) urging them to approve a \$400 million request from [Asm. Stephanie Nguyen and Sen. Catherine Blakespear](#) for probation, accountability, and assessment. Cal Cities also testified in support of the funding during an Assembly Budget subcommittee in mid-March. These investments are necessary to expand service capacity, secure in-custody treatment, and allow for individualized planning and monitoring. Absent real consequences and accountability, local governments cannot maximize treatment success, a key goal of Prop. 36. The Senate Budget Subcommittee #5 on Public Safety will hear the request on April 16. Cities should send letters in support of the \$400 million request to their legislators.

Last year, the Legislature provided \$100 million for trial courts, behavioral health, and public defenders. While this was a good start, it did not fully fund all the necessary services needed to ensure the successful implementation of Prop. 36.

# Cities without access to state homelessness funding would need to report on programs outside their control under new bill

Sen. Catherine Blakespear introduced legislation that, [for the second year in a row](#), attempts to require all but 14 cities to add extensive homelessness reporting requirements to their housing elements. Cal Cities opposes [SB 866](#) unless it is amended and is urging cities to [contact their legislators and voice their concerns](#).

## How would SB 866 work?

Currently, funding from the state's Homeless Housing, Assistance and Prevention (HHAP) grant program goes directly to California's 14 largest cities, all 58 counties, and 44 Continuums of Care — leaving the other 469 cities without direct state support. To receive HHAP funding, recipients must submit regional plans that include performance metrics.

SB 866 would require cities that do not receive HHAP funding to add these same metrics — that include services and systems largely outside their control — to their housing elements.

These metrics would include detailed information about homelessness in cities, such as how many people become homeless after leaving jails, prisons, or hospitals, as well as how many people fall back into homelessness after they are placed in permanent housing. Cities would also need to explain how they are coordinating services under the Behavioral Health Services Act and identify available mental health funding — county-led functions that cities are not positioned to fulfill.

## What changes does Cal Cities want?

Most cities cannot collect this data on their own. In fact, gathering it would require extensive coordination with counties, hospitals, jails, and other partners. Moreover, housing elements are long-term planning documents that, for many cities, are updated every eight years. The data would quickly become outdated and fail to reflect the needs of people experiencing homelessness.

Cal Cities is urging the author to amend SB 866 to include all cities in the existing regional planning processes, which would provide transparency into the metrics that SB 866 includes, but through the same process already used by California's largest cities.

## How can my city help?

SB 866 has not received a hearing date. However, the Senate Housing Committee will likely review the bill by April 21. Cal Cities is asking cities to [submit letters](#) urging lawmakers to oppose the bill unless amended to address these concerns.



## Bill Talk: Recess ends, as does the calm for cities

The Legislature reconvened on Monday from Spring Recess. Lawmakers have a little over a month to get their bills out of their first set of policy committee hurdles.

This week's lineup initially included a rather alarming attempt to get around local short-term rental regulations. However, the author pulled the bill after strong opposition from Cal Cities and others. Lawmakers are also taking action on drunk driving after a series of [scathing investigations from CalMatters](#), and could bring back a popular planning grant program that helped cities meet their housing element deadlines. Cal Cities supports both bills.

On the public safety front: Carolyn Coleman, Cal Cities executive director and CEO, last week sent [a letter to key senators](#) urging them to approve a \$400 million request from [Asm. Stephanie Nguyen and Sen. Catherine Blakespear](#) for Proposition 36 (2024) implementation. The money would go toward probation, accountability, and assessment needs.

### Homelessness reporting bill returns

Cal Cities issued an [action alert](#) this week urging cities to submit letters to voice their concerns about [SB 866 \(Blakespear\)](#). The bill would require all but 14 cities to add extensive homelessness reporting requirements to their housing elements. The measure is similar to a bill by Catherine Blakespear from last year, [which she parked](#) after opposition from Cal Cities and other homeless and affordable housing advocates.

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Cal Cities is urging the author to amend SB 866 to include all cities in the *existing* regional planning processes, which would provide transparency into the metrics that SB 866 includes, but through the same regional process already used by California's largest cities.

Cal Cities opposes the measure unless amended. The Senate Housing Committee will hear the bill by April 21.

### Sponsored HHAP bill amended

Cal Cities is working on amendments to [AB 1708 \(Solache\)](#) to address concerns raised by several organizations and the Assembly Housing Committee that would have made it impossible to move the measure forward in its current form. The bill seeks to increase access to [state homelessness funding](#) for cities with populations under 300,000 and will go before the Assembly Housing Committee on April 15 in its amended form.

### Short-term rental bill undermines local control and hard-fought reforms

The Assembly Arts, Entertainment, Sports and Tourism Committee was scheduled to review a bill seeking to skirt local short-term rental regulations, including prohibitions or limits on the number of locally permitted units. Specifically, [AB 1953 \(Lowenthal\)](#) would allow the state to issue local short-term rental permits during a declared state of emergency or a “special event” such as the World Cup or Olympic Games.

Aside from potential unconstitutional zoning interference, the bill does not provide a framework that ensures local taxes are collected or that rentals cease operating once the declared event ends. Many cities already lack access to basic property-level data, such as addresses, needed to ensure compliance with local ordinances and tax requirements. AB 1953 would undermine [recent, successful efforts by Cal Cities](#) to improve data transparency and accountability.

The author pulled the bill from the hearing early on Monday after feedback from a robust coalition of opposition. Cal Cities opposes the measure.

### Drunk driving and victims’ restitution measures set for hearings

Legislators have introduced several bills targeting drunk drivers in response to an ongoing [CalMatters investigation](#) that found the state allows drivers with long histories of dangerous driving to remain on the road. Cal Cities is supporting many of those measures. Among these is [SB 907](#) by Sen. Bob Archuleta, which the Senate Public Safety Committee approved on April 7. This measure would strengthen California’s DUI enforcement and sentencing laws, particularly for repeat offenders. The bill focuses on five core components:

- Increasing penalties for drivers with prior DUIs.
- Allowing second-degree murder charges for drunk drivers who cause a death after a Watson Warning — a formal warning that driving under the influence can result in a murder charge if someone is killed.
- Enhancing hit-and-run punishments.
- Adding vehicular manslaughter offenses to the violent felony list.
- Permitting full-term consecutive sentencing for multiple violations of gross vehicular manslaughter.

Also on Tuesday, the Assembly Public Safety Committee okayed [AB 2297](#) by Asm. Catherine Stefani. That bill would require courts to order restitution to a victim when a defendant participates in a diversion program. This would help ensure that the continued utilization of diversion is not at the expense of a victim’s right to seek restitution. Cal Cities supports the bill, as victims’ restitution plays a crucial role in healing, financial security, and accountability. Both bills have city sample letters on Cal Cities’ website.

### Impact fee and inspection under the microscope

Both the Senate and Assembly housing committees will meet this week to discuss development impact fees, inspections and permitting for residential housing, and financial support for housing elements.

In the Assembly on Wednesday morning, lawmakers heard [AB 1621 \(Wilson\)](#) and [AB 2002 \(Solache\)](#). AB 1621 would cap the number of times a city can formally review a building permit to no more than two, except for health and safety issues. As drafted, the proposal does not acknowledge regulations not directly related to health and safety that cities must consider and enforce when reviewing project applications, such as air quality or solar energy, or even

incomplete applications that may require additional plan checks. Cal Cities and a coalition of local governments oppose the measure unless it is amended to address those concerns. AB 2002 would establish the Regional Early Action Planning fund, which would help cities and other jurisdictions meet the requirements of the fast-approaching 7th Regional Housing Needs Allocation Cycle. Local agencies could use the funds to complete housing elements, establish trust funds for affordable housing, and meet other planning requirements. Cal Cities is leading a coalition of local governments in support of the measure, as funding for local governments is key to meeting the state's housing requirements.

Legislators in the Senate approved [SB 1117 \(Cervantes\)](#) this week. The bill would dramatically limit the amount of impact fees cities could collect for accessory dwelling units larger than 750 square feet. For example, if a project applicant proposes a 1,000-square-foot unit, local governments could only charge impact fees for 250 square feet. This would severely limit the funding for essential infrastructure and public services. Local agencies can only charge the amount necessary to provide services and infrastructure; these fees are not used to generate revenue. Cal Cities and a coalition of several local government groups oppose the measure.

[Is this the year for a nitrous oxide crackdown?](#)

Legislators are trying to crack down on nitrous oxide, an odorless, colorless chemical that has become a popular and [dangerous recreational drug](#). On April 7, the Assembly Judiciary Committee advanced [AB 2076 \(Lowenthal\)](#). Supported by Cal Cities, this bill would narrow minors' access to nitrous oxide within online marketplaces by adding it to a list of dangerous products that require stricter age verification. A [sample letter of support](#) is available online. On Wednesday, Cal Cities provided lead support testimony on [SB 1314 \(Menjivar\)](#) in the Senate Revenue and Taxation Committee. The Cal Cities-supported measure would, starting January 2027, prohibit smoke shops from opening within 600 feet of a school or daycare center. The measure would also prohibit the sale of nitrous oxide at smoke shops — similar to a [Cal Cities-sponsored bill by Sen. Tom Umberg](#). The bill passed out of the committee and is now headed to the Senate Health Committee.

# Lawmakers try to get a grip on dangerous e-bike behavior

Legislators are racing to address some of the unintended side effects of e-bikes' sudden popularity, particularly among younger riders. Although the surge in usage has expanded mobility and reduced car emissions, it has also [created real public safety challenges](#) on streets, sidewalks, school campuses, and other community spaces.

Late last year, Cal Cities began to deliberately update its e-bike policy, starting with a member survey and roundtable with local elected officials and law enforcement. That effort led to a working group, which developed policy guidance on rider education, infrastructure safety, and manufacturing and marketing standards. These efforts have created a balanced framework that seeks to improve public safety while preserving local control.

## Which bills is Cal Cities engaged on?

Lawmakers have introduced at least 10 e-bike measures, three of which Cal Cities supports: [AB 1569 \(Davies\)](#), [AB 1614 \(Dixon\)](#), and [AB 2346 \(Wilson\)](#). The three measures all address common issues with e-bikes while balancing statewide consistency with local flexibility.

AB 1569 seeks to take a preventative approach by focusing on education. It would require students to complete a safety training program focused on traffic laws, right-of-way, and safe operation before parking on school campuses. For cities, this is critical. Students are frequent peak-hour riders, and many collisions stem from a lack of basic safety knowledge. The measure is receiving pushback from schools for its potential costs.

AB 1614 addresses safety on Class I bikeways — multiuse paths that serve cyclists, pedestrians, and families. It would enact a one rider per seat to prevent multiple passengers “hanging off” an e-bike designed for one passenger. The measure reinforces a simple principle: Safe infrastructure must be matched by safe behavior.

AB 2346 would establish commonsense equipment standards for e-bikes, including speedometers and lighting, to improve speed awareness and visibility. It would also require manufacturers and retailers to provide clear information on California's e-bike laws at the point of sale, addressing a persistent lack of public awareness that often underlies unsafe behavior.

Equally important, AB 2346 would allow cities to set reasonable speed limits on bike paths and multiuse trails and establish baseline limits in high pedestrian areas. It also includes added protections for younger riders.

Taken together, these measures form a cohesive strategy grounded in education, infrastructure safety, equipment standards, and local control. All three measures have been referred to the Assembly Transportation Committee, which will hear the measures before May 1.

### What's next?

Cal Cities is also working with legislators on several other proposals. [SB 1167 \(Blakespear\)](#) would reclassify some more powerful e-bikes as mopeds, thus requiring licensing. [AB 1942 \(Bauer-Kahan\)](#) would require registration and license plates for Class 2 and 3 e-bikes. [AB 1557 \(Papan\)](#) would close a loophole that [the author says](#) allows e-motorcycles to be marketed as e-bikes.

Cal Cities will take a formal position on these measures after the Cal Cities Board adopts an updated e-bike policy in April.

The Senate and Assembly Transportation Committee will likely convene an informational hearing on e-bike policies this summer, which will give cities an opportunity to share more details about the challenges that unsafe e-bike riders create.
