Dear Senator Umberg,

The City of Garden Grove is pleased to support your SB 913, which would enhance the oversight and enforcement of existing state licensing laws for alcohol and drug treatment facilities.

Residential recovery housing provides a range of benefits to some of California's most vulnerable residents, and it is critical their needs are prioritized over profits. Compliance with state licensing laws administered through the Department of Health Care Services is essential to safeguarding residents' well-being and maintaining quality care.

SB 913 would augment state licensing efforts by requiring the Department of Health Care Services to adopt a process that allows cities to request approval to conduct site visits and enforce compliance with existing state licensing laws. By collaborating with cities, the state can leverage local resources to supplement its regulatory efforts.

Cities are positioned to respond promptly to emerging issues or changes in their communities. Allowing them to partner with the state to conduct site inspections and enforce licensing laws enables swift action to address violations, ensure compliance, and protect public health and safety.

SB 913 would help meet our shared goals of ensuring treatment facilities meet standards for patient care, which is central to effective treatment outcomes and community well-being.

RE: <u>AB 1886 (Alvarez) Housing Element Law: Substantial Compliance</u> Notice of Opposition (As of April 1, 2024)

Dear Chair Carrillo,

The City of Garden Grove regretfully must oppose measure **AB 1886 (Alvarez)**, because it turns its back to a fundamental provision of housing element law: A city may disagree with HCD; explain why its housing element is in substantial compliance with the law; and then adopt that housing element which is thereafter considered "in substantial compliance with housing element law."

For decades, cities have worked with HCD to draft housing plans that accommodate their fair share of housing at all income levels. These extensive and complex plans can take years to develop, include public involvement and engagement, and environmental review. Cities go to great lengths to ensure that their housing element substantially complies with the law, even if HCD disagrees. Current law acknowledges this fact by allowing cities to "self-certify" their housing element or take the issue to court and have a judge make the final determination of substantial compliance.

AB 1886 encourages "builder's remedy" projects by eliminating self-certification for the purpose of what it means to have a housing element "in substantial compliance with the law." The "builder's remedy" allows a developer to choose any site other than a site that is identified for very low-, low-, or moderate-income housing, and construct a project that is inconsistent with both the city's general plan and zoning. AB 1886 facilitates such projects for those cities that have a good faith disagreement based in substantial evidence.

The City of Garden Grove believes that AB 1886 is counterproductive. What is really needed is for HCD to partner with cities to provide meaningful direction that helps them finalize their housing elements and put those plans to work so that much needed housing construction can occur. For these reasons, the City of Garden Grove must **oppose AB 1886 (Alvarez)**.

Mayor Steve Jones transports Garden Grove back to the future

With a "Back to the Future" theme, Garden Grove Mayor Steve Jones arrived in a DeLorean, clad – initially – like Marty McFly at Thursday's "State of the City" event at the Hyatt Regency Orange County.

Making his final address as the city's top elected official – he's "termed out" – Jones reflected on the community's birth, growth and future.

"Twenty twenty four is a milestone year," he said. "We're celebrating the 150th anniversary's formation in 1874. That's so amazing.

"And while not as history-making as our town's establishment, 2024 also marks my final year as mayor of Garden Grove."



"ALONZO COOK" went back from 1874 to 2024.

Over the course of his address, he thanked city officials and noted progress made in the previous year including the start of the "Civic Center Revitalization Project" which will bring a new three-story police facility (connected to a four-story parking garage) and a new park to the area northeast of Euclid Street and Acacia Parkway.

The planned completion date for the police facility and garage is March of 2026, and summer of 2027 for the park.

More immediate in its impact will be the planned "inauguration" of the Central Cities Navigation Center, a homeless shelter and service facility in Garden Grove in cooperation with the cities of Fountain Valley and Westminster and the County of Orange on Wednesday, June 4.

Underscoring the historical landmark of 2024, there was a special guest appearance by Garden Grove's founder, Alonzo Cook. Portrayed by Matthew Rangel, an actor from the Gem Theater, the bearded founding father, "Cook" praised the community's progress and wrote a memorable finish to the city's biggest annual event.

The "State of the City 2024" was staged jointly by the City of Garden Grove and the Garden Grove Chamber of Commerce. The welcome and closing remarks were from Claudette Baldemor, president and CEO of the chamber.

Singing "The Star-Spangler Banner" was 13-year-old Michelle Nguyen Gordon and making the invocation was Pastor James Scheller, Garden Grove Police Department chaplain.

Opinion: Center city central to Garden Grove's past, future

As a history buff, I never tire of trying to convince people of the connection between their past, the present and the future.

That was done rather adroitly on Wednesday at the annual "State of the City" event held at the Hyatt Regency Orange County.

Held jointly by the City of Garden Grove and the Garden Grove Chamber of Commerce, the event included the usual accolades for civic dignitaries and public servants. The keynote speaker was outgoing long-term Mayor Steve Jones, and he took care to note that 2024 is the 150th anniversary of the founding of Garden Grove by Alonzo Cook and posse in 1874 in the general area of what is now Main Street and Garden Grove Boulevard.

There was even a "guest" appearance by Alonzo himself, complete with beard and a slightly Yiddish accent to note how far Garden Grove had come since its founding two years before Custer's Last Stand.
Among the points made in Jones's remarks were the growth of the downtown/civic center area.

Since its inception 150 years ago on a few hundred acres on a mostly featureless coastal plain, the community has grown upward and outward from a village to a town to a city of over 173,000 people.

Under construction at Euclid Street and Acacia Parkway is a new three-story police facility and an attached four-level parking structure. A new park will be built nearby to take the place of the park displaced by new police HQ facility.

The first of the long-awaited Cottage Industries businesses in the area east of the civic center, SmokeQueen BBQ, has opened and attracted long lines.

The downtown area from which the seminal "Big Strawberry" was originally the central business district has now become a vibrant center of the arts, restaurants, retail business, higher education and more. It may be hard for many of us to see that future. But Alonzo could and Steve Jones does, and we are grateful to both of them for their vision and confidence. The Tribune

Bonds will be issued for 'new' Garden Grove civic center

Another giant step toward a giant change in the city's central core was taken by the Garden Grove City Council at its meeting on Tuesday night.

On a 7-0 vote, the council approved a resolution to issue \$140 million in revenue bonds to finance the construction of the "Civic Center Revitalization Project," which includes the construction of a new police facility, an attached parking garage and the creation of a new park nearby.

The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$152 million. A total of \$12 million was set aside in 2021-22 to begin the planning phase of the project with the balance of \$140 million will be paid through the sale of bonds.

Annual debt service of \$9 million is projected for the next five years.

The new police building will be located at the corner of Acacia Parkway and Euclid Street in the civic centerdowntown area of the city. The existing Civic Center Park will be torn up, including the water elements and bridges created around 1980.

The next meeting of the council will be on Tuesday, April 23.

California Mosquito Awareness Week: Time to Dump and Drain

Garden Grove, Calif. – Heavy rainfall this year has deposited substantial amounts of standing water throughout Orange County. As temperatures rise, stagnant water can become prime breeding grounds for disease-carrying mosquitoes. Invasive *Aedes aegypti* mosquitoes – also known as "ankle biters" – are now well-established in Orange County, and experts are concerned that we could face a lengthy and difficult mosquito season.

To increase awareness of mosquitoes and the diseases they can transmit, Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District (OCMVCD) is participating in California Mosquito Awareness Week from April 14th to 20th. The goal is to teach people the easy measures they can take to safeguard themselves and their families from mosquitoes.

"Nobody likes mosquitoes, so California Mosquito Awareness Week is a great time to remind people of how easy it is to prevent them from breeding," OCMVCD Public Information Officer Brian Brannon said. "By empowering residents with the knowledge of what to look for and what to do, we can help keep our communities safe from the threat of mosquito-borne disease."

During California Mosquito Awareness Week, OCMVCD will share daily tips and educational content on <u>ocvector.org</u> and via social media. Residents can also participate in a social media contest to see who can create the best videos that explain why mosquitoes suck. Prizes will include tickets to the Discovery Cube, the Santa Ana Zoo, and Zoomars.

Here are some ways to prevent mosquito bites:

- Eliminate all sources of standing water, including water in flowerpots, old tires, buckets, pet dishes, and trash cans.
- Install screens on doors and windows and keep them in good repair.
- Repair leaky faucets and broken sprinklers that can create standing water.
- Clean rain gutters.
- Report neglected swimming pools.
- Follow label instructions to apply insect repellent containing an EPA-registered active ingredient such as DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, or IR3535.
- Wear long sleeves and pants, especially while outside during dawn and dusk when the mosquitoes that can spread West Nile virus are most active.

MAYOR GOES BACK TO THE PAST TO DISCUSS CITY'S CURRENT, FUTURE STATE DURING LAST ANNUAL ADDRESS

Today, Garden Grove Mayor Steve Jones delivered his final State of the City address before a full house at the Hyatt Regency Orange County. The program, modeled after the "Back to the Future" movie, featured a DeLorean Time Machine and highlighted current City accomplishments and future developments founded on the community's 150-year history.

Mayor Jones, who completes his last mayoral term at the end of the year, opened the program by saying, "2024 is a milestone year. We're celebrating the 150th anniversary of our town's formation in 1874 . . . and while not as history-making . . . 2024 also marks my final year as mayor of Garden Grove."

The opening video showcased various events over the year, including the dedication of a new playground at Magnolia Park, themed after the City's agricultural history; the ribbon-cutting for the new Home2Suites by Hilton hotel, the first hotel south of the SR-22 Garden Grove Freeway; the groundbreaking for Phase II of the City's largest mixed-use project, Brookhurst Place; and a bridge and plaque dedication for Garden Grove Police Officer Han Cho, who was killed in an off-duty motorcycle accident.

Mayor Goes Back to the Past to Discuss City's Current, Future State 2-2-2

The mayor officially announced the grand opening of the Central Cities Navigation Center, taking place on June 5, 2024. The center, a collaboration between the City of Garden Grove, and the Cities of Fountain Valley, Westminster, and the County of Orange, broke ground last June, meeting the City's goal to be in operation within one year.

Moving to one of the City's most prominent developments, the Garden Grove Civic Center Revitalization Project, Mayor Jones said, "This \$152 million project, located in the heart of our city, propels the Garden Grove Police Department into a modern era of public service."

Divided into two phases, Phase I, comprised of a 3-story, 103,000 square-foot police facility and 4-level parking structure, is slated for completion in March 2026.

"Over the last year, the City invested nearly \$24 million into a capital improvement plan to enhance city streets, parks, facilities, and other essential infrastructure," said Mayor Jones.

The Pavement Management Acceleration Program resulted in substantial improvements to several streets throughout the city.

Citing Garden Grove's extensive and diverse food scene, the mayor singled out the city's newest restaurant addition, Smoke Queen Barbeque.

"Food royalty has come to Garden Grove as the first Smoke Queen Barbecue becomes the anchor tenant for Cottage Industries, the city's unique commercial enclave near the civic center that uses repurposed Craftsman homes," said Mayor Jones.

Focusing on the City's strong tourism presence, Mayor Jones said, "Tourism continues to drive the City's thriving local economy as Transient Occupancy Tax revenues for Fiscal Year 23/24 are on track to surpass \$28 million at the end of June."

He added that financial forecasts indicated that without any negative impacts to the City's revenue base, the City would continue to have a balanced budget for the next five years.

The mayor concluded his presentation with parting words of wisdom.

"As I look back on the past and into the future, I realize how lucky I am that this amazing city has become such an integral part of my being over the past 25 years. It's all about the people. The people I've met and the genuine friendships I've made . . . Thank you for all the wonderful memories I'll keep, and from the bottom of my heart, allowing me to serve in office for all these years. It has been my greatest honor."

A closing video that had been kept under wraps to the mayor, paid homage to his combined 25 years of service to the City.

GARDEN GROVE TO PARTICIPATE IN NATIONAL PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE BACK DAY

On Saturday, April, 27, 2024, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., the Garden Grove Police Department will participate in the Drug Enforcement Administration's (DEA) National Prescription Drug Take Back Day. The event gives the public an opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. Bring your pills for disposal to the Garden Grove Police Department, located at 11301 Acacia Parkway, Garden Grove 92842. (The DEA cannot accept liquids or needles or sharps, only pills or patches.) The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

Last October, Americans turned in 300 tons (over 599,800 pounds) of prescription drugs at 4,675 sites operated by the DEA and its state and local law enforcement partners.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies have shown that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet.

U.S. Supreme Court decides development

impact fee case

The high court sent the case back to the California Court of Appeal for further proceedings

The U.S. Supreme Court on April 12 issued a unanimous decision in *Sheetz v. El Dorado County,* a case involving development impact fees. The court found that such fees may violate the Fifth Amendment if they do not have an "essential nexus" to the government's land use interest and "rough proportionality" to the development's impact on that interest. It determined that impact fees are not exempt from these requirements merely because they are legislatively enacted.

Cal Cities filed an amicus brief with other local government associations in support of the county. Many cities — particularly in California — rely on these fees to pay for new roads and other public infrastructure and facilities related to new development.

Case background

The legal challenge arose after George Sheetz, an El Dorado County resident, sought a permit to build a small, prefabricated home on his rural residential lot. Sheetz had to pay a \$23,420 traffic impact mitigation fee to obtain the permit.

Sheetz paid the fee under protest and then challenged it in state court. He claimed that conditioning the building permit on a traffic impact fee was an unlawful "exaction" — a violation of the Fifth Amendment's Takings Clause. The provision requires public agencies to provide owners with "just compensation" when seizing their property for public use. It also prohibits agencies from imposing unconstitutional conditions on land-use permits.

According to Sheetz, prior federal court decisions required the county's impact fee to have an essential nexus to a government land use purpose and be roughly proportional to the development impacts. He argued the county had to make an individualized determination that the fee amount was necessary to offset traffic congestion caused by his property's development.

A state court rejected the claim, relying on precedent from the California Supreme Court. It found the nexus and rough proportionality requirement only applied to permit conditions imposed on an ad hoc basis — not fees imposed on a broad class of property owners through legislative action. The U.S. Supreme Court granted a review of the case last fall.

What did the Cal Cities brief say?

Cal Cities and other local government associations argued that limiting a new development's contribution to public infrastructure would unfairly burden taxpayers, who already fund the infrastructure. It further explained that impact fees are a critical means to recoup *some* of the costs associated with the infrastructure. The brief also argued that legislatively enacted development impact fees are not equivalent to eminent domain and thus are not a "taking" under the Fifth Amendment.

Supreme Court decision

The Supreme Court recognized the state's authority to regulate land use and condition a building permit to further a "legitimate police-power purpose." However, it noted that withholding or conditioning a building permit for unrelated reasons amounts to "extortion." The court outlined a two-part test developed through case law to address potential abuse of the permitting process.

"First, the permit conditions must have an 'essential nexus' to the government's land use interest, ensuring that the government is acting to further its stated purpose, not leveraging its permitting monopoly to exact private property without paying for it," wrote Justice Amy Coney Barrett for the court. "Second, permit conditions must have 'rough proportionality' to the development's impact on the land-use interest and may not require a landowner to give up (or pay) more than is necessary to mitigate harms resulting from new development."

The Supreme Court noted that nothing in constitutional text, history, or precedent supported exempting legislatively enacted fees from such review. The court did not determine the validity of the county's impact fee in this case, or the degree of specificity required when tailoring an impact fee. Instead, it sent the case back to the state court for further proceedings.

Members of the Cal Cities City Attorneys Department are meeting to discuss this case and its impacts on cities. Cities with questions about the specific impact of the case should consult their city attorney.

California Mosquito Awareness Week: Time to Dump and Drain

Garden Grove, Calif. – Heavy rainfall this year has deposited substantial amounts of standing water throughout Orange County. As temperatures rise, stagnant water can become prime breeding grounds for disease-carrying mosquitoes. Invasive *Aedes aegypti* mosquitoes – also known as "ankle biters" – are now well-established in Orange County, and experts are concerned that we could face a lengthy and difficult mosquito season.

To increase awareness of mosquitoes and the diseases they can transmit, Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District (OCMVCD) is participating in California Mosquito Awareness Week from April 14th to 20th. The goal is to teach people the easy measures they can take to safeguard themselves and their families from mosquitoes.

"Nobody likes mosquitoes, so California Mosquito Awareness Week is a great time to remind people of how easy it is to prevent them from breeding," OCMVCD Public Information Officer Brian Brannon said. "By empowering residents with the knowledge of what to look for and what to do, we can help keep our communities safe from the threat of mosquito-borne disease."

During California Mosquito Awareness Week, OCMVCD will share daily tips and educational content on <u>ocvector.org</u> and via social media. Residents can also participate in a social media contest to see who can create the best videos that explain why mosquitoes suck. Prizes will include tickets to the Discovery Cube, the Santa Ana Zoo, and Zoomars.

Here are some ways to prevent mosquito bites:

- Eliminate all sources of standing water, including water in flowerpots, old tires, buckets, pet dishes, and trash cans.
- Install screens on doors and windows and keep them in good repair.
- Repair leaky faucets and broken sprinklers that can create standing water.
- Clean rain gutters.
- Report neglected swimming pools.
- Follow label instructions to apply insect repellent containing an EPA-registered active ingredient such as DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, or IR3535.
- Wear long sleeves and pants, especially while outside during dawn and dusk when the mosquitoes that can spread West Nile virus are most active.
