While we appreciate the intended goal of this measure and the perceived benefits that some believe utilizing a new domain may provide, we remain deeply concerned about the added costs associated with migrating to a new domain and corresponding email addresses; confusion that will be created by forcing a new website to be utilized; and the absence of any resources to better assist local agencies with this proposed migration. To secure and register a .gov domain, an authorization letter must be submitted to the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA). Competing domain names are not processed on a first come, first served basis, but rather by a review process to determine which agency most closely related will receive it. This process

can take long periods of time with some applicants citing weeks, if not months, to have CISA process and approve a domain. CISA's registrar manages .gov domain hosts and by requiring thousands of California-based local governments to migrate to a .gov domain, it will cause interruptions to support lines, thus creating interruptions and confusion for constituents trying to access critical information on a

The City of Garden Grove respectfully opposes Assembly Bill 1637 (Irwin). This measure would require local agencies to secure and utilize their website through a new .gov or ca.gov domain no later than January 1, 2025. It would also require all

While applying for and obtaining a .gov domain has no fees, there are significant costs that an agency must budget for to recode, establish corresponding e-mail, and network login changes, single sign on/multi-factors authentication, encryption keys, revising and redesign website/url links, updating social media and external entities. All of these costs are increased two-fold to co-exist both the previous and newly acquired domains.

Initial sampling of impacted local governments has identified considerable costs and programmatic impacts. Extrapolated to all local agencies throughout the state, cumulative costs to local agencies are likely to be hundreds of millions of dollars. example, one large local government that recently went through the process of migrating to a .gov domain required 15 full-time information technology professionals and over 14 months to complete the project. This included changing all websites, web applications, emails, and active directory accounts for over 12,000 employees and contractors – a considerable endeavor and exactly what is required, should AB 1637 be enacted as currently drafted. One suburban local government ran preliminary estimates that suggested that the costs for migration to .gov could range from \$750,000 to \$1 million. Additionally, smaller, and rural local governments would also experience considerable costs and not just for matters directly related to migration .gov domains, given that information technology staff would likely have to be pulled off critical information technology infrastructure projects and life and safety projects, such as mapping wildfires via GIS, to complete the .gov migration.

Finally, local authorities and service districts provide critical information to communities every day. Requiring the change in domain names will require staff to expend effort that could take away from critical services at a time when these entities are already providing emergency services on behalf of the state and while dealing with wildfires, snowstorms, and severe flooding. Pulling staff off critical IT projects to work on a domain change could potentially put communities at risk. AB 1637 proposes an aggressive compliance date of January 2025, which will cause significant confusion for vulnerable populations who have relied on using these websites for decades.

For these reasons, the City of Garden Grove must respectfully oppose AB 1637. Please do not hesitate to reach out to us with your questions.

Improvements for three city parks were approved at Tuesday's meeting of the Garden Grove City Council.

The council voted 7-0 in favor of an agreement with the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development for a \$1 million grant.

The grant will be used to:

- Replace the current park playground equipment and playground surface at Jardin de los Ninos on Keel Avenue in the Buena Clinton neighborhood;
- Replace the current playground equipment and playground surface that's on city property in the Haster Basin Park (Lampson Avenue at Haster Street), along with demolition of park restrooms to be replaced with a pre-fabricated structure that will have two bathroom stalls;
- Replace the current park restrooms at West Haven Park, 12252 West St., with a new pre-fabricated building that will have four restroom stalls.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 23 at 5:30 p.m.

The Garden Grove High School campus will soon be going "up."

"Construction is moving along nicely" for the new two-story, 24-classroom building rising on the east side of campus, according to Abby Broyles, public information officer for the Garden Grove Unified School District.

The 26,000-square foot structure will replace a set of portable classrooms – called "P-Town" by students – facing 7th Street. Completion is scheduled for August before the beginning of the fall semester.

A modular building. it will yield enough space to restore up to 50 parking spots or four outdoor basketball courts. The GGUSD board approved the project in June 2022 at a cost of \$4,550,931.

It will be the third two-story classroom building at GGHS. Every other high school in the GGUSD has strictly one-story structures, but GGHS – having been established in 1921 and moved to its current location on Stanford Avenue in 1923 – has a smaller "footprint" than its successors.

The new structure will be ADA-compliant with an elevator. Although it has a modular format, it will be a permanent structure and is less expensive than more conventional construction methods, said Rick Nakano, assistant superintendent for business service at the time of the awarding of the contract.

GGUSD is a K-12 district serving most of Garden Grove as well as parts of Anaheim, Cypress, Fountain Valley, Santa Ana, Cypress and Westminster.

Disney's growth is Grove's gain

The opportunities for growth in Garden Grove's hotel district may be getting a boost from the Disneyland Resort's plans for expansion of the iconic amusement park.

This week, resort officials have begun to schedule "community coffee" events at local parks in Anaheim to explain what their "Disneyland Forward" plans will involve. These plans were first announced in March 2021.

According to published reports, Disney wants to make new additions to "underdeveloped" areas around the park the company owns. Expansion would be near the Disney hotels west of Disneyland/California Adventure and in a parking lot to the east.

The "coffee" events will begin on May 20 at Ponderosa Park, 2100 S. Haster St.

While none of these plans are directly involved with Garden Grove, the dozen or so large hotels constructed along Harbor Boulevard from the Anaheim city limit south have benefitted from the tourist trade generated by the Disney parks, and the nearby Anaheim Convention Center.

At the State of the City event in Garden Grove recently, Mayor Steve Jones noted that "transient occupancy tax" from hotels had generated a record \$27 million in revenue.

Three new hotels are on the drawing boards on Harbor in Garden Grove and a fourth is approaching completion at a site south of Garden Grove Boulevard.

Additionally, Garden Grove's hotel area is allied with Anaheim's under the name "Grove District" seeking to promote tourism to the region.

CITRUS GREENING DISEASE FOUND IN GARDEN GROVE AND OTHER ORANGE COUNTY CITIES

The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) and the United States Department of Agriculture discovered Huanglongbing, also known as HLB or citrus greening disease, in Garden Grove and other Orange County cities.

The disease is spread by a pest called the Asian citrus psyllid, a small insect that feeds on citrus tree leaves, which causes a bacteria, called Huanglongbing, to spread. If a tree is infected, it can die in as little as five years.

HLB kills citrus trees and has no cure. The disease is not harmful to humans or animals.

Treatments are the most effective way to protect trees from the Asian citrus psyllid, and HLB. Residents within the affected areas will be notified in writing at least 48 hours in advance of any treatment from CDFA staff. For specific questions about the treatments, please call (800) 491-1899. If the trees test positive for HLB, they will be removed to prevent the spread of the disease. The removal is done by the CDFA at no cost to the owner.

CITY ANNOUNCES AVAILABLE FUNDING FOR JOBS 1ST PROGRAM TO SUPPORT LOCAL BUSINESSES

The City of Garden Grove announces the availability of funding for its JOBS 1st program, which provides zero-interest loans of up to \$50,000 and grants of up to \$25,000 to eligible businesses that create or retain jobs. The program was originally implemented in June 2020 to assist local businesses that were negatively impacted by COVID-19.

To be eligible for the JOBS 1st program, businesses must be located in Garden Grove and possess a valid business license. Businesses that receive the \$50,000 loan must also verify that they are creating jobs, while businesses that receive the \$25,000 grant must verify they are retaining jobs over a three-month period. In addition, businesses that receive the \$25,000 grant will be required to prove that their business has seen a decrease in revenue of greater than 15% from last year. At this time, businesses that have already received a loan or grant through the Jobs 1st program are not eligible to reapply for assistance.

The JOBS 1st program is part of the Garden Grove Business Resource and Resiliency Plan, designed to assist local businesses, stimulate growth and job creation, while improving Garden Grove's economic vitality.

Cal Cities urges the court to rule that SB 9 unconstitutionally interferes with charter city home rule authority

May 10, 2023

The League of California Cities filed an <u>amicus brief</u> last week urging the Los Angeles County Superior Court to rule in favor of charter cities in an <u>SB 9 (Atkins, 2021)</u> lawsuit. The controversial law circumvents local review processes and allows homeowners to build up to four homes on a single-family parcel of land.

Last year, five charter cities — Redondo Beach, Carson, Torrance, Whittier, and Del Mar — filed a lawsuit in the superior court alleging that SB 9 is unconstitutional because it interferes with charter cities' home rule authority over land use and zoning.

How does SB 9 affect charter cities' land use policies?

SB 9 generally requires cities to ministerially approve applications that would create two lots on any parcel zoned as single-family residential or develop two units of at least 800 square feet on those lots. This effectively requires cities to allow for up to four homes in single-family residential zones.

The five charter cities that sued allege that SB 9 unconstitutionally interferes with the "home rule" authority guaranteed to them under Article XI, Section 5 of the California Constitution. Voters added Article XI, Section 5 on the premise that cities are in a better position than the state to know what their residents need and want. It grants charter cities the exclusive right and privilege to enact local laws that carry out the needs and wants of the city's residents.

When it comes to enacting laws of "municipal affairs," charter cities have supreme authority. The California Supreme Court has held that the state cannot override that authority except to address a "matter of statewide concern," and only if the state law is "reasonably related" to resolve that concern and "narrowly tailored" to avoid unnecessary interference in local governance.

What does Cal Cities' amicus brief say?

Cal Cities' amicus brief argues that SB 9 does not meet the conditions necessary for the state to override charter city authority. The brief first notes that SB 9 fails to clearly articulate the matter

of statewide concern it intends to address. This distinguishes SB 9 from other state housing laws that appellate courts have recently upheld in the face of constitutional challenges.

The brief then argues that even if it is assumed — as stated once in the bill — that the purpose of SB 9 is to "ensure access to affordable housing" statewide, SB 9 is not reasonably related or narrowly tailored to that purpose. SB 9 applies regardless of whether cities have identified sites to accommodate their state-determined share of the regional housing need and does not require the ministerially approved units or lot splits to be restricted for affordable housing.

Instead, SB 9 imposes a "one-size-fits-all" approach that will likely lead to more expensive housing rather than affordable housing. SB 9 is an unnecessarily broad measure that strips charter cities of their discretion to determine the location, density, and site characteristics of housing without any indication that eliminating such discretion will result in the construction of more affordable housing units.

Next steps

The Los Angeles County Superior Court accepted Cal Cities' amicus brief for filing on Friday, May 5. A hearing on the arguments presented will likely occur within the next few months. Cal Cities will continue to report on developments in the case.

The League of California Cities is asking city officials to sign a letter by this Friday urging Assembly leaders to include cities in an upcoming informational hearing on the fentanyl crisis. The letter also calls on lawmakers to take further action to protect communities from the fentanyl crisis.

The Assembly Public Safety Committee held a special hearing on six fentanyl-related measures in late April. Cal Cities and other groups concerned with the alarming increase in fentanyl-related deaths pressured lawmakers to hold the special hearing.

Fentanyl overdoses now kill nearly 6,000 people in California every year.

The rising death toll from fentanyl poisonings is a complex issue that requires a multifaceted and collaborative approach. Cal Cities supports additional state funding and resources to address the substance use crisis through appropriate prevention and intervention efforts, educational campaigns, increased access to life-saving overdose treatments, as well as greater accountability for illicit fentanyl dealers.

Three Cal Cities-supported bills passed out of the special hearing. Collectively, the measures would increase accountability for dealers and improve collaboration between state and local law enforcement. However, much more can be done in this legislative cycle to ensure the state adequately responds to this crisis.

In the past few weeks, Assembly lawmakers traded partisan barbs over possible solutions, with some favoring stronger sentencing for fentanyl dealers and others supporting community investments that drive down the demand for drugs. In response, the Assembly Health and Public Safety committees, as well as members from the Select Committee on Fentanyl, Opioid Addiction, and Overdose Prevention, agreed to hold an informational hearing on May 24 about other possible interventions.

State Bills in Brief: May 10-18

May 10, 2023

A weekly primer on the bills and committee hearings that have a direct impact on cities It's the calm before the storm this week in the Capitol — metaphorically, not meteorologically, this time. Gov. Gavin Newsom is expected to unveil a much more austere state budget proposal

this Friday. The state's budget deficit has only grown since the Governor's <u>January budget</u> <u>proposal</u>. Also, most Californians have until May 15 to file their taxes, making the job of predicting a \$3 trillion economy even harder than usual.

Senate Democrats and the Governor are already divided on how to fill the state's multibillion budget hole. Senate Democrats proposed <u>tax hikes for major corporations</u>. The Newsom administration roundly rejected the idea. Assembly Democrats have yet to unveil their plan, but all signs point to internal division among the party's progressive and moderate wings. Expect another grueling budget fight this year, as lawmakers haggle over spending cuts and trigger reductions — cuts that could be reversed later — to many of the state's biggest priorities, including climate programs and public transportation. You can also expect a city-focused analysis of the latest budget blueprint from the League of California Cities this Friday.

Bills to act on

Lawmakers will debate one of Cal Cities' top priority bills next week.

SB 423 continues the trend of the state overriding its own mandated housing plans

- What now? <u>SB 423 (Wiener)</u> would expand <u>SB 35 (Wiener, 2017)</u> to nearly all cities, allow the state to approve housing developments on its own property, and eliminate SB 35's sunset date. *Cal Cities opposes SB 423*.
- **SB 35 sounds familiar.** The 2017 legislation is one of the highest-profile housing laws in recent memory. SB 35 forces cities to approve certain multifamily housing sites. The law's <u>many requirements and exemptions</u> are detailed on page six of a 2018 Cal Cities publication.
- When is the hearing? Lawmakers will review the bill on May 15 in the Senate Appropriations Committee.

Other bills with major impacts

Several key housing, homelessness, and environmental bills are scheduled for hearings.

Utility bill could energize housing and economic development

- **Here's what the bill would do.** <u>AB 50 (Ward)</u> would decrease the time it takes to connect new projects to the electrical grid and improve information sharing between utility companies and local officials. *Cal Cities supports AB 50.*
- You're saying this could increase housing production? Not just housing! Many local governments have been told it will take anywhere from two to seven years to improve electrical grids. These excessive delays have resulted in delays to housing, economic development, electric vehicle, and decarbonization projects.
- When was the bill heard? Lawmakers debated AB 2 on May 10 in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.

Lawmakers mull accountability measure for state homeless funding

- What are lawmakers proposing? AB 799 (Rivas, Luz) would require the creation of regional plans to address homelessness and create new accountability requirements for local governments accessing state homelessness funding. Cal Cities has a concern position for AB 799.
- This sounds familiar. Last year, the Governor <u>temporarily withheld state</u> funding, citing the need for "more substantial results."
- When was the bill heard? AB 799 was heard on May 10 in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.

There's nothing wasteful about these trash bills

- Spare me the puns; tell me about the bills. AB 2 (Ward) would require producers to create an end-of-life management plan for solar photovoltaic panels. AB 1526 (Committee on Natural Resources) provides additional clarity on SB 54's cost recovery mechanism. Cal Cities supports AB 2 in concept and supports AB 1526.
- When were the bills heard? Both bills were heard on May 10 in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.

Lawmakers propose \$20 billion in climate action and environmental quality bonds

- What are the bills? SB 867 (Allen), SB 638 (Eggman), and AB 1567 (E. Garcia) collectively propose \$20 billion in bonds for safe drinking water, wildfire prevention, drought preparation, flood protection, and extreme heat mitigation.
- What is Cal Cities' position? Cal Cities has a support if amended position for the bills and is seeking changes that increase the available investments for local governments.
- When are the hearings? SB 867 and SB 638 already cleared their respective, presuspense file committee hearings. AB 1567 was heard on May 10 in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.

Funding for the most polluted river in the U.S.

- Which river? AB 1597 (Alvarez) would provide funding for two rivers, the New River and the Tijuana River. The New River is the most polluted river in the U.S., thanks to a potent combination of raw sewage, pathogens, trash, and industrial activities. The Tijuana River is often contaminated by raw sewage. Both rivers flow through the U.S.–Mexico border. *Cal Cities supports the measure.*
- **How much funding?** AB 1597 would provide \$50 million in funding, upon appropriation by the Legislature. Historically, funding has been in short supply for these rivers. Even a modest investment could have a substantial environmental impact and create savings for related health and disaster costs.
- When is the next hearing? The bill was heard on May 10 in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.

An act of the Legislature to change "Act of God" clauses

• What does the measure do? <u>SB 751 (Padilla)</u> would prohibit municipalities from entering into an exclusive franchise agreement for waste hauling services that contains a force

majeure provision that can be triggered by a labor impasse. Cal Cities supports the measure.

- A force what? Sometimes known as an "Act of God," a force majeure frees organizations from obligations due to extraordinary circumstances, such as a natural disaster.
- When will the bill be heard? The Senate Appropriations Committee will debate the bill on May 15.

Proposed prohibition on potable water for nonfunctional turf irrigation

- What is the bill number? AB 1572 (Friedman) would prohibit the use of potable water for irrigation of nonfunctional turf on specified properties. Cal Cities opposes the measure unless it is amended.
- When would this take effect? It depends on the type of property. Commercial, industrial, municipal, and institutional properties would need to comply by Jan. 1, 2027.
- When was the hearing? The Assembly Appropriations Committee heard the bill on May

Cal Cities-sponsored bond agency issues over \$76 million in tax-exempt bonds for housing

May 10, 2023

The California Statewide Communities Development Authority (CSCDA) issued \$76,962,410 in tax-exempt and taxable affordable housing bonds for Acacia Creek in Union City.

Acacia Creek is a continuing care retirement community that includes approximately 152 residential units for seniors. Acacia Creek offers its senior residents several levels of health care and support for successful aging, such as independent living, assisted living, memory care, and skilled nursing. It also provides meals and dietary assistance, shopping assistance, companionship through social programs, and medical, and safety-related services.

CSCDA partnered with the city and others for the acquisition of the properties and issuance of bonds. The new fixed-rate bonds will be used to refinance Acacia Creek's 2013 variable-rate bonds.

CSCDA is a joint powers authority created in 1988 and is sponsored by the League of California Cities and the California State Association of Counties. More than 530 cities, counties, and special districts are program participants in CSCDA, which serves as their conduit issuer and provides access to efficiently financed, locally approved projects.
