### **OBJECTIVE**

To report on the performance rating for the Garden Grove Housing Authority.

### **BACKGROUND**

The SEMAP (Section 8 Management Assessment Program) Certification represents the Housing Authority's performance for the fiscal year 2022-2023. The Certification represents fourteen areas, on which the Housing Authority is rated. The Housing Authority is required to conduct a self-audit of a random sampling of its files for a portion of the fourteen indicators. The other indicators are scored based on the electronic reporting the Housing Authority is required to submit. The results were summarized in a report and submitted to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on August 10, 2023.

### SUMMARY

The Garden Grove Housing Authority received notification from the Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) that they have confirmed our rating and that we have earned a total of 145 points out of 145 possible points. This gives a score of 100% and designates the Housing Authority as a High Performing Agency.

# NOTICE OF APPLICATION SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS REQUEST TO CHANGE RATES FOR GAS TRANSPORTATION

### (VENTURA COMPRESSOR MODERNIZATION (VCM) PROJECT)

### **APPLICATION FILING A.23-08-019**

### Why am I receiving this notice?

On August 24, 2023, Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas®) filed the Ventura Compressor Modernization (VCM) Project Application (A.23-08-019) with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). The application is requesting a total of \$578 million. If the CPUC approves this application, SoCalGas will recover costs beginning in 2032. This will impact your monthly bill.

### Why is SoCalGas requesting this rate change?

The VCM Project will support continued reliable supply of natural gas to residential, business, industrial, and agricultural customers in Ventura and along the Central Coast of California. It also facilitates maintaining adequate inventory in the La Goleta storage field, by replacing the three existing nearly 40-year-old natural gas compressors with two electric and two natural gas compressors. Modernization of the facility is critical and needed due to the limited functionality and reliability of the existing equipment, coupled with changes in local gas supply. This project is estimated to result in a nearly 75% reduction in permitted oxides of nitrogen (NO<sub>x</sub>) emissions as compared to the existing facility.

### How could this affect my monthly gas rates?

If SoCalGas' rate request is approved by the CPUC, the average residential monthly bill using 36 therms per month would increase by approximately [\$.27] or [0.4%] per month in 2034. Recovery in rates for the proposed project would occur from 2032-2083 (50 years).

This application will be assigned to a CPUC Administrative Law Judge who will consider proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process. The Administrative Law Judge will issue a proposed decision that may adopt SoCalGas's application, modify it, or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision with a different outcome. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners at a public CPUC Voting Meeting.

Parties to the proceeding may review SoCalGas' application, including the Public Advocates Office. The Public Advocates Office is an independent consumer advocate within the CPUC that represents customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. ## CITY HOSTS PUBLIC WORKSHOP TO DISCUSS PROPOSED WATER RATE INCREASE

The City of Garden Grove's Public Works Department will be hosting a public workshop to discuss the results of a water rate study and a proposed water rate increase. The workshop takes place on Wednesday, September 27, 2023, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., at the Garden Grove Community Meeting Center, located at 11300 Stanford Avenue.

The meeting will address specific aspects, such as required capital improvement projects and costs, regulatory compliance, and a proposed initial 4.2% increase for an average residential water customer. The City's Public Works Water Services Division and consultants will be on hand to make a presentation, answer questions, and calculate individual water bill amounts using the proposed water rates.

Water customers will receive a 45-day mailed notice in October for a public hearing on the proposed water rates.

Korean, Spanish, and Vietnamese translators will be available to assist at the public workshop.

### Patti Widdicombe is honored

September 12



PATTI WIDDICOMBE was honored at the Garden Grove City Council meeting Tuesday

More than a half-century ago, when fast food restaurants were few and far between, the Widdicombe family brought a McDonald's restaurant to Harbor Boulevard in Garden Grove, one of the first in Orange County.

The restaurant, and its imitators, changed the way Americans ate and socialized and is a familiar sight all across the globe.

A descendent of those hamburger pioneers, Patti Widdicombe, was honored at Tuesday night's meeting of the Garden Grove City Council. The network of "McD's" in the city she owns and operates has 300 employees.

Its noteworthy contributions to the community include helping workers pay for college education, donate food for civic events, and host a COVID-19 vaccination event that served 1,200 people, who got a coupon for a food item in addition to the inoculation.

Also on Tuesday night, the council voted to adopt a proclamation to recognize August as Muslim Appreciation and Awareness Month in Garden Grove and to adopt a proclamation celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month in the city.

### GG's growth rode on the rails

Garden Grove was founded in 1874, making next year the 150th anniversary of the establishment of the community. This is the second in a series of articles about the early days of the community, excerpted from the book by Jim Tortolano.

The schools, churches and farms of the village era were held to modest dimensions by the issue of transportation. Roads were few and universally unpaved; some were mere cow paths that turned to sticky muck under the rain. The automobile was still a creature of the next century. The vehicle of dreams for Garden Grove and all of Santa Ana Valley was the locomotive.

The Southern Pacific Railroad, created in 1870, was the entity that brought reliable, cheap transportation – as well as growth – to what were then the "outlying" areas of Southern California.

The SP publicized the paradise of sunny SoCal across the nation, leading to an influx of hopeful new residents to the Los Angeles area. The railroad pushed its lines toward the edges of the populated counties, with the SP reaching Anaheim in 1875. The arrival of the railroad spurred the growth of the Santa Ana Valley, and gave a hint of what the iron horse could do for – and to – a community.

Henry Huntington's Pacific Electric system – soon to be famous for the "Red Car" line – began to snake its way out from central L.A. in the late 1880s. By 1905 it reached Garden Grove, slicing diagonally through the community and bringing the village into the closer embrace of the world outside.

With a railroad depot, the crossroads changed almost overnight into a burgeoning town, as farmers and growers took advantage of the shipping facilities offered. Packing houses

grew up nearby and a general increase in population and economic activity was reflected in the expansion of the once-tiny business district.

Banks, newspapers, retail operations of all kinds, new subdivisions and more appeared quickly, fertilized by the promise offered by a convenient connection with customers and suppliers from beyond the meadow. The second phase of the community's life was about to begin.

In 1910, just a few years after the Pacific Electric brought regular passenger and freight service to town, the population was put at about 1200, triple what it had been in 1890. In 1940, just before the end of the era, the figure had risen to about 5,500, but even that number was just a hint of the possibilities to beckon after the world came back from war.

The biggest catalyst for the town era was the railroad: the Pacific Electric railway. Henry Huntington in 1903 decided to extend the P.E. south and east to Santa Ana and a diagonal route was chosen that cut across Buena Park, Stanton and Garden Grove. Construction started on Oct. 1, 1904 and through service to Santa Ana began on Nov. 6, 1905.

Garden Grove's depot was located west of Euclid (now Main) Street and north of Garden Grove Boulevard. Ironically, the Home Depot parking lot is now the site of the former rail depot. The angle at which the railway right-of-way ran created some odd-shaped parcels and cut chunks of land and city blocks in half.

Instantly, the railroad worked a major change in the community. It provided not just passenger but shipping service. An industrial park of sorts sprang up around the depot, led by large orange packing facilities. These buildings went through many incarnations – packing house, thrift store, mattress outlet, etc. – before finally being leveled in the late 1980s. .

The railway made Garden Grove into a significant shipping point for farmers and growers in the surrounding area, which in turn spurred the growth of businesses in the small community. The downtown of old, which has been a somewhat scraggly accumulation of wooden and stone structures blossomed into a brick-and-mortar center of greater permanence, and many of the leading institutions of the community – chamber of commerce, newspaper, etc. – date from this time and this rail-fired boom.

Best known to contemporary residents is the old "Red Car" interurban railways of legend. The Red Car connected Garden Grove with locations all across Orange and Los Angeles counties, making trips to Newport or Pasadena (in the era before wide, paved roads) relatively easy, quick and convenient.

The rail not only made it possible for Garden Grove to export its products and recreate its residents, but it also brought the world here. Midwestern families seeking to come to the milder climate of California were part of the "boxcar culture" that fueled the community's modest but steady growth.


Families, or groups of families, would rent a boxcar in Iowa or Michigan and fill it with animals, furniture, kith and kin and make the long, aromatic but inexpensive trip across the plains, up and over the big divide and finally to arrive at this bustling little town.

Early Garden Grovers would gather at the depot to see what new family was arriving; some friendships, business relationships and perhaps, even romances were kindled that first day on the rough wooden steps of that depot.

The original electric line gave way to diesel engines, and after the demise of the Red Car line in the late 1940s, freight service became the main purpose of the line. Baby boomers who grew up in Garden Grove can easily recall the long, slow progress of the trains through the summer days, the motormen returning the excited waves of kids, who always seem to be fascinated by trains.

# ACTION UPDATES ON CONNECT SOCAL 2024 & STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

This month, SCAG's Joint Policy Committee recommended the draft Connect SoCal 2024 Plan to the Regional Council for approval to release for circulation in November. The committee heard a presentation previewing the contents of the Plan, which showcased key policies and strategies to be included in the draft Plan to address existing and emerging challenges facing the region. The presentation also showed how the Plan is based on the best available information, and rooted in local planning and policy actions.

In anticipation of the draft Plan release, SCAG staff continue to engage key stakeholders and provide standing updates at SCAG's policy committees and working groups. Further discussions, along with other necessary engagement and consultation with tribal governments, elected official briefings and public hearings, will occur during the public review period.

Following the public review and comment period, including a concurrent review and comment period for the program environmental impact report, the final Connect SoCal Plan is expected to be put forward for approval in April 2024. # ACTION REGIONAL COUNCIL APPROVES RHNA REFORM RECOMMENDATIONS

In September, the <u>Regional Council approved the release of SCAG's recommendations</u> on the reformation of the <u>Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) process</u>. These recommendations will be provided to the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) in a formal letter to be included in a report of recommendations to the California State Legislature.

On Aug. 16, SCAG staff presented a total of thirteen recommendations at a special meeting of the Community, Economic and Human Development Committee, with changes to the regional determination, methodology and appeals processes. The committee acted to recommend the draft recommendations be moved to the Regional Council for further action.

Some recommendations will also require legislation to implement changes while others will be evaluated as part of the 7th RHNA cycle. The Legislative/Communications & Membership Committee will now use the recommendations to prepare multiple proposals for potential SCAG-sponsored bills and to advocate for bills containing high-priority RHNA reform concepts. SCAG will continue to monitor and report on HCD's process and explore ways to implement the approved recommendations.

# ACTION REGIONAL COUNCIL APPROVES UPDATES TO PATH GUIDELINES, RUSH CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

At its September meeting, the Regional Council approved updates to the Programs to Accelerate Transformative Housing (PATH) guidelines, setting up the release of the Regional Utilities Supporting Housing (RUSH) Pilot Program Call for Applications this fall. This represents \$35 million from the Regional Early Action Plan (REAP) 2.0 Program that will be focused on funding utility infrastructure planning and shovel-ready capital improvements that will help meet housing production goals.

These updates incorporate input from the RUSH forum earlier this year and are part of ongoing work to distribute the \$237 million awarded to SCAG from the California Department of Housing & Community Development for the REAP 2.0 Program. SCAG staff continue work to launch funding programs focused on accelerating infill

development, connecting infill housing to daily services and increasing travel options, and building capacity for planning innovation through data-driven decision-making tools. For more information, visit <a href="scag.ca.gov/reap2021">scag.ca.gov/reap2021</a>.

#### **REGIONAL EARLY ACTION PLANNING 2.0 UPDATE**

In July, the HCD approved SCAG's full REAP 2.0 application, formally awarding \$237 million to the SCAG region. SCAG has issued Calls for Applications for five programs to sub-allocate a significant portion of the REAP 2.0 funds to eligible entities in the SCAG region. In July, the Regional Council approved \$80 million in projects under the County Transportation Commission Partnership Program. The Regional Council will consider the approval of awards for the Sustainable Communities Program, Housing Infill on Public and Private Lands Pilot Program and Notice of Funds Available for Lasting Affordability this fall. ### SCAG CLEAN CITIES REDESIGNATION

SCAG Leadership met remotely last month with leadership from the Department of Energy's Clean Cities Coalition redesignation committee. SCAG Regional Council Second Vice President Cindy Allen, Immediate Past President Jan Harnik and Regional Council member Oscar Ortiz attended and shared their support for the program along with members of the SCAG Executive team who shared the importance of this work, as well as the California regulatory drivers and the need for more funding in this area.

SCAG staff provided a detailed presentation outlining SCAG's coalition structure, recent accomplishments, and activities and future work plan, highlighting the Passenger Electric Vehicle Atlas, the Zero Emission Truck Infrastructure Study and the Last Mile Freight Program. Stakeholder outreach and engagement were also demonstrated by participation from Clean Cities Coalition collaborators. A formal letter of redesignation is forthcoming. ### GREENPRINT TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE SECOND MEETING

SCAG held the second meeting of the SoCal Greenprint Technical Advisory Committee on Aug. 28. The meeting included a discussion of potential draft data standards for identifying, evaluating and selecting data. This work supports the TAC's purpose of ensuring the future SoCal Greenprint tool is aligned with policy objectives identified in the approved Regional Advanced Mitigation Planning policy framework. The final TAC meeting is scheduled for Sept. 25 and will include discussions on revisions to the draft data standards, tool functionality and beta testing. After this final meeting, SCAG will continue to integrate committee input into staff recommendations for further development of the Greenprint tool, which will be brought to the Energy and Environment Committee in November for consideration.
