Why do a Water Rate Study?

- Ongoing Capital Improvement Needs




Updated Water Demand Data

- Wet weather since July 2022
- July study session: proposed water rates were based on Calendar Year 2022 water demands.
- 2023 water demands are less than 2022 water demands
- Tonight's proposed water rates are based on FY 22/23 water demands




Water Demand Trends: 2022 and 2023



- Metered consumption = amount of water sold to customers in units of hundred cubic feet (hcf)
- Wet weather since July 2022
- FY 22/23 metered consumption ~ 10% less than previous years



LAX Precipitation



• FY 22/23 precipitation almost twice the average amount



Water Demand Trends: Longer-Term



- Water demands decreased during the 2015 drought
- Partial rebound in 2017/2018
- Stable water demands from 2017 through 2021
- Approximately 10% decrease in FY 22/23



Reduced Water Demand: Impact to Water System

- Lower revenues: less water sold
- Lower expenses: less water pumped and less water purchased
- Revenues decrease more than expenses decrease
 - Future PFAS expenses: unchanged
- Financial projections and projected rates modified
 - July study session: proposed rates based on CY 2022 demands
 - August study session: proposed rates based on lower FY 22/23 demands.

- Revised revenue projection has higher revenue increases because of lower water demand projections.
 - July study session: annual 4.7% revenue increases.
- Pass-Through Adjustments are unchanged from July.
 - Pass-Through Adjustments are calculated annually. Council considers these Adjustments every year.

Commodity Delivery Charges: How They Were Calculated

- Tier 1
 - Water source: local groundwater
 - Tier 1 rate based on the cost of local groundwater production
 - ccf included in Tier 1 is based on average water use
- Tier 2
 - Water source: local groundwater (43%) and imported water (57%)
 - Tier 2 rate based on the cost of imported water and the cost of local groundwater
 - Tier 2 rate also includes the cost of conservation programs, including the City's cost to comply with State Water Use Objectives legislation.

• Tier 1:

Increases as PFAS O&M cost increases the cost to produce local groundwater.

• Tier 2:

Increases with the costs of Water Use Objectives and PFAS O&M.

Rate Transitioning

- All rates except 1/1/24 rates are based on the cost-of-service analysis.
- Tier 1 1/1/24 rate is the average of current rates and 1/1/25 cost-of-service rates.

- Fire Service Rates are applicable to private fire service connections
- Fire Service Rates recover the costs of providing and maintaining infrastructure that provides fire protection services (portions of reservoirs and water lines).



Example Bi-Monthly Residential Water Bill

- Proposed rates shown tonight: bi-monthly water bill for an example residential customer:
 - 22 ccf per billing period (calendar year 2022 average)
 - 5/8" x 3/4" water meter
 - Does not include increases from future Pass-Through Adjustments

CARE Senior Discount

- Eligibility:
 - Must be enrolled in Southern California Edison's CARE program
 - Must live at the billing address
 - Water bill must be in resident's name
 - Resident must be 65 years of age or older
- Amount: \$10 discount per billing period
- Staff recommendation:
 - Keep program with no changes



Low Water User Discount

- Eligibility:
 - Any customer using less than 6 ccf in a bi-monthly billing period
- Amount:
 - Customer does not pay the Commodity Delivery Charge for any water use in that billing period.
- Staff recommendation:
 - Discontinue program to ensure water rates are equitable among all ratepayers.

- Rate changes go into effect, if any: Mid January 2024
